Continuing from Vol 1 #1, from the records of George L WOODARD.

Roster Caddo Guards
Company "A" 25th Regt. La. Vol.

Raised in Shreveport, La. by Captain W. ROBSON, Captain Samuel O. HEAD and Dr. G.W. KENDALL. Left Shreveport on the Steamer Col. Ferry, Tom MOORE Commander on the 14th March 1862, arrived in New Orleans the 18th March 1862 and quartered in the La. Cotton Press.

There was an organization for a new regiment..S.W. FINK-Col., J.C. LEWIS-Lt. Col., F.O. ZACHARIE-Major, and they became Co. "A". S.C. HEAD was appointed Quarter Master of the regiment and G.W. KENDALL was appointed Commissary.

Company organized under Confederate States Government.





This is in reply to your recent letter regarding genealogical research.

The U.S. Railroad Retirement Board administers a Federal retirement and survivor benefit program covering the nation's railroad workers and their families. The records it maintains deal primarily with the administration and payment of these benefits.

While the Board will provide information from its records on deceased persons for the purpose of genealogical research, it will not release information from the records of beneficiaries who are still living without the consent of the beneficiary.

I should point out that the Railroad Retirement Board was not established until the mid-1930's, and it began maintaining its own records of all covered rail service in 1937. Therefore, our records are essentially limited to individuals who worked in the rail industry after 1936 and who qualified for a railroad retirement annuity. The Board would not have any records of persons who died prior to its inception. Nor would it generally have any pertinent records of persons whose rail service was performed on a casual basis and/or was of short duration. Some old records it did maintain have subsequently been destroyed according to Federal record retention schedules.

Most of the Board's records are kept by the railroad employee's social security number. If that number is not available, as much of the following information as possible should be included in any request to the Board:

- . The railroad employee's full name, including middle name or initial;
- . The employee's date of birth;
- . The employee's place of birth;
- . The year he or she last worked in the rail industry;
- . The employee's date of death.

I hope this provides the information you required.
