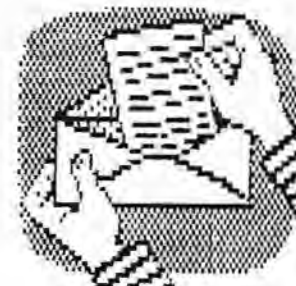

POSTMASTERS COATES BLUFF/SHREVEPORT,  
Caddo Parish, Louisiana

Coates Bluff, first post office in the Shreveport area, was established 10 Apr 1838. The office in Natchitoches Parish (Caddo Parish was then a part of Natchitoches) was located near the site of the present veterans hospital. The name was changed to Shreveport 15 May 1838 and in the same year began serving newly established Caddo Parish.

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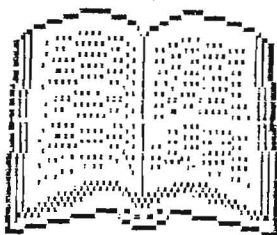
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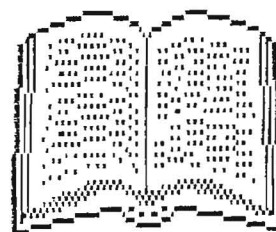
