FROM THE PRESIDENT

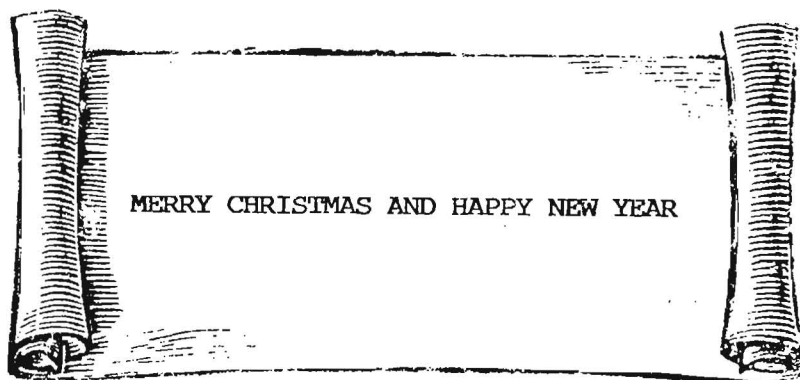

OFFICIAL STATE CHURCH OF VIRGINIA BEFORE 1786

Before 1786 the Episcopal Church was the official state church of Virginia. All children regardless of religious affiliation were required to be baptized by Episcopal ministers. The baptism, together with name, date of birth and names of parents were recorded in the parish registers. Surviving church records are preserved at the Virginia State Library in Richmond, Virginia.

THE SHREVEPORT SNIPS

The Snip club, a young men's dancing club of Shreveport, organized in the late 1870's, was an exclusive fraternity but nameless until an outsider, barred from the select lists, gave them the name which they adopted as their own. "They are a darn bunch of snips" he said. And of course the word was passed around-"Snips". So the Shreveport Snip Club they became. They had small gold pins made, with the monogram, "S.S.C.," and each member wore his proudly. They gave their dances about once a month. In the winter the dances were in TALLEY's opera house, opposite the City Hotel. In the summer, if the weather permitted, they danced at the open pavillion of the park at Buckner Street and Margaret Place--or Lacey Street, as it was then.

The Blue Danube Waltz was the favorite. The members danced the Schottische, the Polka & the intricate figures of the Square Dance. The club kept a list of the girls who were to be invited to the dances & each member wrote his name opposite the girl he intended to invite. Ice cream & cake, the usual refreshments, were furnished by Jules GUERRE, who had a soda fountain on Market Street. The dancing began at 9:30 p.m. & lasted until the small hours of the morning. The dances were formal affairs & were carefully planned. Some of the couples went to the dances in carriages, but there were always 20 or so who rode in the "Black Maria" which they rented from Levi & Simon COOPER's livery stable. The big bus carried them comfortably & then there was all the fun of driving around, picking up the different couples. Old Pete BONNER taught a number of these young men to dance. Pete was an ex-slave, a huge Negro, but very graceful, & with all the natural rhythm of a born dancer. He was never happier than when, dressed in his Prince Albert coat, he showed the involved steps which he loved. Pete played his fiddle for some of the earlier dances, but later the Snips found 2 Italian boys who furnished the music. One of them played a harp, the other a violin, & many said that never had such music been made.

Members were automatically retired when they married, but thereafter they & their wives attended the dances as honor guests. Some of the early members were:

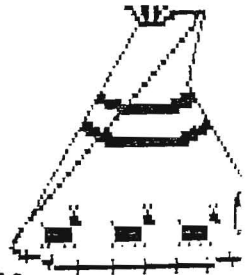

INDIAN VILLAGE, OUACHITA PARISH, LOUISIANA



Indian Village, a post-hamlet in the western part of Ouachita Parish, was 4 miles southwest of Calhoun.

Early in 1800, a small tribe of Mississippi Indians, about 50 families with their chief Tusquahoma, came to Ouachita Parish & were given permission to settle in the site. This privilege was given by the Spanish government. The tribe belonged to the Chickasaw or Choctaw tribe, of the Muskogean family. The group lived peaceably among the settlers, but by 1820, the fate of the Indians was decided. In this year Chief Tusquahoma sold to Stephen W MADDUX, for \$600.00, all the rights, title, interest & demand which the Indians had in the Village, & all the rights which they derived under the Spanish Government by grant, settlement or otherwise. Soon after the sale, they moved to OK.

Stephen MADDUX sold the plantation called Indian Village to Jane HUEY COATS. It is known that she & MADDUX sold land to the settlers arriving from MS, AL and other states. Among the early settlers who bought land were Wade BRYAN & his wife Sarah.

Wade BRYAN was born in 1792 & his wife in 1794. They were the parents of 6 children:

John T BRYAN-marr Elvina (maiden name unknown), their children: Lottie who marr Dr. Boyd HODGE; Judge E who marr Annie Lee SCALES; Johnnie who marr Howard PEEVY. After Elvina's death, John T marr 2nd Sarah Jane MILLER SHANNON. Their children were: Joseph who marr Mattie BARNES; Johnnie who marr Priscilla BRYAN; William who married Adelaide BUTLER & Ellie who married Benjamin ROGERS.

Wade BRYAN, Jr-he marr Jane HUEY, their children:

Dock; Priscilla; Frances; Annie & Mary

Barlow BRYAN-marr 1st Emily, 1 child, marr 2nd Maud, 4 children.

Dollie BRYAN-marr Louis GRIGGS, their children: Miles; Jane;

John; Dock; Sallie; Parlee; Philip; Joseph; William; Lizzie.

Other families who settled at Indian Village were the GRIGGS, THOMPSONS, FULLERS, GASTONS, BUTLERS, McCLENDONS, COLLINS, CHILDS, BURROUGHS, BOUDS & John LEE. In the last decade of the 19th century, Indian Village had 4 doctors--SIMONTON, CREDELL, MANN & McCLENDON. There was a two-story school building. The teachers were Charlie HARRIS, James ASWELL, Miss Alice HENRY, Daisy McDOWELL, Lillian COLLINS, T E WRIGHT, J E PETTY, M M BARLOW, J T SHELL & Mr. SPRINGER.

The church at Indian Village was the first building erected before the Civil War. It was of log construction & was known as the Springhill Methodist Church. In 1888, it was torn down. Ministers between 1876 to 1906 were: John HEARN, PARISH, GODFREY, HOCUTT, HERLONG, COLLIER, STIVERS, CROCKER, MARY, REAMS, CORNET, STAPLES, ISBELL, HOWELL, JENKINS, MANDAVILLE, WAFER & LEDBETTER. Twelve preachers received licenses at this church, known are: Frank &

William PLATTE, Nick CROCKER, J M GRIGGS, P E MAY, INABET, J R
DOWNS, Joe RUTLEDGE & R H SHEPPARD.

The present church is a neat, white frame building, beautifully
kept. The huge oak trees shade the nearby cemetery where some
of the early settlers sleep.

MY LESLIE FAMILY
Submitted by Jane LESLIE NEWBERRY

Nathan McClure LESLIE (1829-1919) who immigrated to TX in the 1880's was probably born in Augusta or Rockbridge County, VA, 17 Aug 1829. He was the son of Samuel and Elizabeth WINEGAR LESLIE(LESLEY). Samuel & Elizabeth were married 28 Jul 1814 by Samuel HOUSTON at the Old Oxford Presbyterian Church in Rockbridge County, VA. Samuel is listed as the son of John and Margery PAXTON LESLIE (the daughter of William WINEGAR). Samuel is shown on the 1840 census in Rockbridge County & a taxpayer in 1841. In 1850, he is shown in the Augusta County, VA census, age 57, & Elizabeth, age 56.

According to the information from History of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Botetourt County, VA by Rev. E. W. LESLIE, A.M., published in 1910, David A. LESLIE was the son of Samuel & Elizabeth LESLIE. David A. was born near Fancy Hill, Rockbridge County, VA 14 Jun 1831. It can be assumed that Nathan McClure LESLIE could have been born either in Rockbridge or Augusta Counties. The article further states that the family moved ca 1837 to Alleghany County, VA, then back to Rockbridge where they lived at Collierstown. Ca 1841, the family moved to Augusta County where they probably remained until 1850 as Samuel is shown on the 1850 census in Augusta. Nathan is shown on the 1850 census living with James LESLIE in Botetourt County. It is assumed that James was his brother. Then Samuel and his family moved back to Rockbridge County and lived near Brownsburg. Ca 1851-1852, Samuel planned to move to Wythe County, VA, but became ill. He then moved to the home of a relative in Bedford County. Samuel and his wife Elizabeth are buried at the Zion Church at Locust Bottom in Bedford County. The known children of Samuel & Elizabeth were: Nathan McClure b. 1829; David A. b. 1831; Elizabeth b. 1832; Pansy b. 1834; & Martha b. 1840. James was born in 1822. There was also a William listed in the 1850 Botetourt census who may have been a son.

David A. married Elizabeth LEMON, daughter of Christopher and Sidney LEMON 14 Apr 1858. He moved to Blue Springs where he worked as a carpenter. David served in Co. K, 28th VA Regiment, & also made coffins for the CSA at Lynchburg. Although his father had been a strict Presbyterian, David joined the Lutheran Church as a young man. He helped build the Lutheran Church at Glade Creek, Blue Ridge Community. Both David & Elizabeth LESLIE are buried at the Glade Creek Church Cemetery which is now a Baptist Church.

When Nathan McClure LESLIE married Susan WAGGONER 18 Dec 1851 at Fincastle, VA, he was listed as a farmer in Botetourt County where at least 3 of his children were born. Sometime between 1851 and 1860, Nathan became a Baptist minister. Bedford court records indicate that he presented himself to the court in Oct of 1860 and was granted permission to perform marriages in Bedford

County as a licensed Baptist minister. He is listed in the Strawberry Baptist Association minutes as the minister of Flint Hill Baptist Church in Bedford County. His post office addresses during the 1870's included Thaxton, Troutville & Fincastle (1871-1873). The VA Baptist Historical Society, Richmond, VA, indicated that Nathan LESLIE pastored churches at Cove in Alum Springs, New Bethel, Rose or Rosey Hill, Enon, Natural Bridge and at Flint Hill. The society was unable to furnish further information about Nathan.

In the 1862 Confederate records of Bedford County, VA, it is noted that David A. LESLIE asked to be released from military service with the CSA to help operate Plott's Mill with his partner-brother, N. M. LESLIE. It is noted above that David did serve later in the military. Nathan's son, Alonzo remembered the Yankees coming to his father's house at meal time and taking all the available food. Then they destroyed the mill which Nathan and his brother operated.

Prior to 1880, Susan WAGGONER LESLIE had died as Nathan is listed as a widower in the 1880 census of Botetourt County. Susan may be buried near Buchanan. Her father, John WAGGONER and his wife Mary POWERS lived near Buchanan. John is shown in the Fincastle records as having made the shingles for the court house built in 1820 in Fincastle. He is shown in the 1860 census with his wife Mary, born in 1798 in VA. Her parents were Yancy & Nancy POWERS. Nancy is shown in the 1870 census, aged 105, living with the widowed Mary. John's father, Jacob, was still living in Botetourt County in 1850. He was born in New Jersey in 1764. John WAGGONER died in 1868 & the probate of his estate named Nathan McClure LESLIE & wife Susan among the heirs. John WAGGONER is buried at the Mt. Moriah Lutheran Church, located near Lapsley Run & Eagle Rock, northwest of Fincastle, Botetourt County, VA.

In Oct 1881, Nathan McClure married second Susan A. LAYMON in VA. Part of the family went to TX about 1886 on an immigrant train, according to William S. LESLIE, Nathan's grandson. At Dallas, the family purchased or hired a team & wagon and settled south of Dallas at Fairy (?). At that time it seems that the large family was divided with the older children remaining in VA. There was no issue with the second marriage.

Nathan & Susan WAGGONER LESLIE's children were: Josephus A. b. 1854; Lora Virginia b. 1855; Nannie Judson b. 1852; Alonzo Chalmer b. 1860; Andrew M. b. 1866; William Walter b. 1868; Anna b. 1869; Howard b. 1870; Charles Edward b. 1873 & Ellira b. 1876. Josephus, Anna, Walter & Nannie remained in VA. Lora Virginia moved to OK where she died rather young. Later Andrew Mack and Howard went to OK. Alonzo Chalmer (called "Uncle Doc") went first to TX, began his practice of medicine, and sent for the rest of the family. After remaining near Dallas for four years, the family moved by covered wagon in 1890 to the plains of West

Texas. They settled near Hermleigh, Scurry County, TX where Nathan took up state land at \$1.00 per acre with 40 years to pay. The family lived for sometime in a dugout. Nathan continued to preach, and his son, Charles Edward, also became a Baptist preacher. Nathan McClure LESLIE died 15 Feb 1919 & is buried in the Snyder Cemetery in Snyder, TX near his son Dr. Alonzo C. LESLIE and his wife.

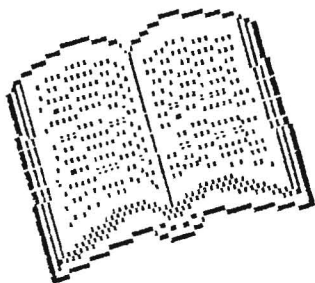

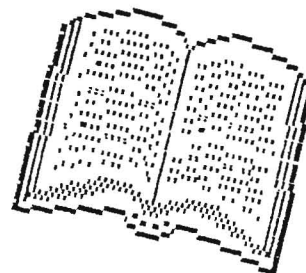
