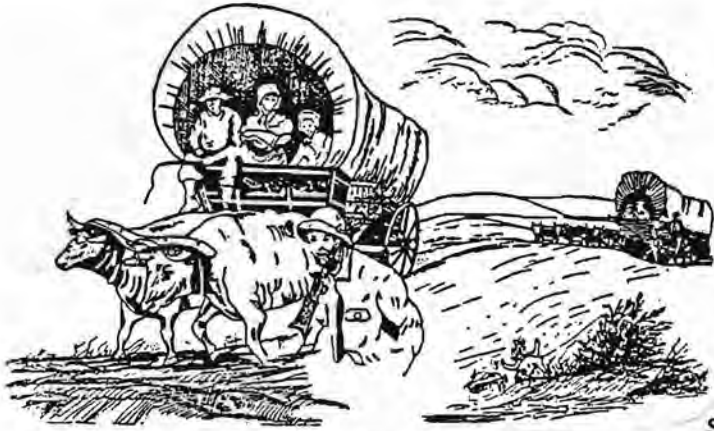

SOME EAST TEXAS FAMILIES

Continued from Vol II #2

Jacob Chesby RHODES
Of Scotch extraction, the family came to America and settled in SC. They were farmers and in ante-bellum days were slaveholders. John RHODES, the

father, was born in Newberry District, SC, but died in Van Zandt county Aug 1901, at the age of 86. Jacob was born in Marshall county MS 11 Nov 1850. He was reared on the farm, attended the common schools & Cooper Institute becoming a teacher. He left the school room for a time to engage in commercial pursuits. In Nov 1880, he married Miss Julia F JAMES in Mineola, TX. They had 5 children, 2 daughters being teachers. The home community of Rhodesburg is named in his honor.

Rev. Joseph Guyton NUNNALLY

The family came from AL but lived in MS for some years. J B NUNNALLY, the father, lived in AL, married a Miss AYERS in MS in 1844 & became the parents of 8 children. Our subject was born in 1864 in MS & educated in Ripley and Mt. Sylvan, TX. A member & minister of the Christian Church, he began preaching in 1891. Besides being a preacher, he is a man of affairs & is quite competent as a merchant & business man, especially in his dealings with the general public. In Feb 1890, he married Miss Sarah TULL of Canton, TX, dau of G W TULL.

Marion REED

His grandfather, James REED, was born in AL; his father, Andrew REED, a farmer was born in MS, neither came to TX. Andrew married Miss Safrona HARRIS and Marion was born in Leake co MS 1 Dec 1862. Andrew then served in the Civil War in 1863. Marion was educated in MS & chose farming as his vocation. He married Miss Mary Jane BERRY in Nov 1882 & they moved to AR. They later moved to TX. He was a Baptist, a Mason & a Woodman of the World. His farm contained 153 acres near Edgewood and raised cotton and other crops.

Prof. John P SEALE

His father, E P SEALE, came to TX at an early age & has farmed all these years. John was born 7 Jan 1875 in Limestone co TX. He helped on the farm in younger years but always felt the urge to teach. After being educated in the public schools he attended advanced schools, normals, etc. He is an excellent teacher and loves music, a bright future awaits Prof. SEALE.

Willis Jarrell HALE

W J HALE is a pioneer in this section of the country in syrup making. His family are English, coming to this country in an

early day. His father, James HALE, was born in NC & farmed. He came to TX in 1873. He had married Miss Ann McCARTY, who was born & reared in GA. They were married in 1824 & had eight children. James died in 1884, the wife Ann died in 1876. Willis was born 1844 in Monroe co GA & educated principally in Newton, MS & chose farming. He married Miss Julia MONROE of Newton co MS in 1870 & they raised 4 children. He came to TX in 1873 from MS. He served in the Civil War & is a member of the Baptist Church. For 19 years he has been manufacturing a very fine quality of syrup from the regular ribbon sugar cane. He has his land so he can irrigate it, hence makes a sure crop, frequently making 600 gallons to an acre. When this syrup is finished he puts it into jugs and seals it hermetically, & in this form it is kept for use, so that at any age when the jug is opened, the syrup is fresh. His syrup is good for the best price in the market & never goes begging for a customer.

Dr. Cornelius E FARELL

The FARRELLS are from GA. They came to north LA in an early day. The father, James C FARRELL, was born & reared in LA & came to TX in 1869. Here he met Miss Elenora MOORE from TN. Her father had come in an early day & Elenora was reared in TX. James & Elenora were married in 1870 & Cornelius was the second child of this union, he being born 22 Nov 1873 near the village of Jackson. The father was a farmer & ginner. Cornelius went to the county schools finishing at Myrtle Springs High School. He chose medicine, attending & taking courses from Baylor Univ. He married Miss Etta MAYFIELD, dau of S A MAYFIELD, 16 Jun 1895. At this time, they are the parents of 2 children. Dr. FARRELL has a bright future ahead with his large & growing practice.

Wilson Green CHAMBLEE

The parents of Mr. CHAMBLEE lived in MS & were farmers. They died, however, in his early childhood & he was reared an orphan. He was born 8 Feb 1862 & was reared in the farming profession. He came to TX with an uncle & they settled in the Kaufman co area from the north MS of his birth. He was married to Miss Katie MILLER 6 Mar 1884. He now has 455 acres with 150 in cultivation, raising corn, cotton, Irish potatoes, tomatoes, berries & fruit, sweet potatoes & syrup. He says that with a little effort he could have something to sell every day in the year. He has 9 children & is a Methodist & an active member of the farmers union.

Lawrence McDonald NORMAN

The NORMANS are Scotch-Irish. The mother of Lawrence, who was a Miss Julia BERRY prior to her marriage to Mr NORMAN was of German extraction. The father, Finley NORMAN, was reared on the farm in TN, went to MS & married there. Then to LA, then back to MS & in 1869 he came to TX where he died in 1885. Lawrence was born 30 Dec 1856 in the MS home. He was reared on the farm but early became a teacher. He married Miss Dora Lee HERRIN on 25 Feb 1885 and soon left the school room & went back to the farm.

He owned & operated a gin in Stone Point TX for 7 seven years then embarked in the mercantile business, while operating 3 small farms nearby.

Judge J G KEARBY

The family originally came from KY, but immediately from AR to TX. The grandfather was born in KY & farmed. The father, Edward Porter KEARBY, was born & reared in KY & educated in for a physician, but afterwards practiced law. He came to TX in 1857 after marrying Mary PEYTON of TN in 1844 or 45. They had 3 children. J G was born 3 Dec 1848 in Hot Springs co AR, but educated in TX. He began the practice of law in 1874 & was State Senator beginning in 1891. He married Miss Ella M NEAL on 12 Nov 1872. He is a Methodist, a Mason, a K of H & WOW. J G's father Edward, was regimental surgeon in the Confederacy.

Edward M CHRESTMAN

The CHRESTMAN family came from NC to TX in 1845. The grandfather was John W CHRESTMAN & a farmer. The father, L M CHRESTMAN, was commonly known as Pone. He was also a farmer in the Grand Saline area. He married Miss ALLEN, who was born in AR & reared in TN, in 1871. They were the parents of 4 children. Edward was born 21 Sep 1872 in Van Zandt co & educated in the county schools & Summer Hill select School. He was elected mayor Grand Saline Apr 1903. ON 24 Dec 1893 he married Miss Flora SIMPSON. he is a Baptist, a W O W, & is identified with the salt manufacture of the city as well as his city duties.

Robert Bruce BELL

Dr. BELL's father was Cushi BELL, born in Raleigh, NC & was a navigator & was for years on the Mississippi & its tributaries & on the Gulf & was known widely as Capt. C BELL. Dr. BELL's mother was a MARS & married Capt BELL in MS. Robert was one of twins, 4 children having been previously born. He was born 22 Feb 1860 in Rapids parish LA. His father moved to Cherokee co TX soon after the Civil War where Robert was reared to manhood. He attended the country schools & later attended Baylor Univ about 1881-2. At the age of 18, Robert selected medicine as his life work & began to prepare for his profession. In Jan 1896 he married Miss Bertha PETERSON in the city of Waco & they have 1 dau, Ira Lucile. He is a Mason, a W O W, & a member of the Fraternal Union of America. Outside of his practice, he has a good farm & is greatly interested in the development of agriculture & good markets.

Edward J McFARLAND

The McFARLANDs are a combination of Scotch & French blood, the streams of those 2 lines of life having been joined in old VA some generations past. Augustus McFARLAND was born, lived & died in old VA & was a doctor. He was the grandfather of Edward. The father of Edward was also reared in VA, was a farmer & surveyor. Edward was born 8 Nov 1856 in VA & an only child. He was educated there & lacked only a short time of

graduation. In 1882 he married Miss N B CLARK in Wanaker, VA & by 1890, he was a merchant in Edgewood TX. They have 1 son. He has acquired a goodly amount of real estate, a member of the church, an IOOF & a substantial citizen.

Julius A GERMANY

The family, though German in name, is Irish in blood & are more immediately from NC. The grandfather, John, was born in NC but lived & later died in MS. His vocation was farming. The father, J W GERMANY, was born in MS, was a general business man & came to TX in 1866. The mother, a TUMLINSON, was born & reared in Van Zandt co. & married the father in 1868. & were the parents of 8 children. Julius was born in 1870, educated in the common schools & graduated from Southwestern Univ. He began the practice of law in 1893. In 1896 he married Miss BLACK, of Madisonville, TX, & they had 3 children. He a member of the order of Elks and K of P.

Lewis Henry TOWNLEY

The TOWNLEYS are of English extraction but came to America in the infancy of our National life. The grandfather, Henry Morris TOWNLEY, lived in SC. He lived to a ripe old age & died in the 1850s, having moved from SC to AL. The father, Timothy TOWNLEY, was born in SC in 1818, but his father moved with him to AL, when he was 4. He was therefore reared & educated in AL. He married Miss MALVERN, also of AL. She was related to the HOBBS family in TX. Of their 6 children, our subject, Lewis, was the second. Timothy moved his family to TX in 1850 & settled 13 miles west of Tyler. He died 30 Nov 1889, he & his wife being consistent members of the church all their lives. Lewis was born 13 Jan 1845 in the AL home. He was 5 years when the father moved to TX. Lewis was most often called Henry & grew up a stout boy in a frontier life & his school days were limited. At the age of 19 he married a Miss Margaret BRAKEFIELD, who lived until 27 Jul 1877. She had 4 children: Martha Ann, Timothy Franklin, John Henry & James LaFayette. In 1878, he married again to Miss Elizabeth BURNETT. She was the mother of 2 sons: Walter Allen & William Cary. Mr. TOWNLEY has lived on his present home since 1866, it being well arranged & well equipped. He also is an exemplary church member.

Eli J SIDES

The SIDES family are of German extraction, the grandfather having come from Germany. The father of Uncle Eli (as he was generally called) was named Benjamin SIDES & lived in AL, having moved to that state from GA. He died in AL in 1844, being twice married & the father of 12 children; 9 by the first union, 3 by the last. Our subject, Eli, was one of these last 3 whose mother was a Miss WILLIAMS. She also was twice married having united with Mr. HEAD prior to her union with Mr. SIDES. Of the 3 children, Eli was the first & was born in Taledoga co AL 31 Jan 1837. His father died when he was 7 years old & he was left an orphan & his mother a widow. He received only a limited

education & at the age of 18, being in 1855, the family moved to Van Zandt county. He found the RILEYs, the HOBBS, the GIBBS, the HEADS & the COXes. In the GIBBS family, a daughter of E W GIBBS, Miss Christina Francis, became his bride 29 Jul 1858. E W GIBBS was French & his wife was German. Eli & Christina were the parents of 11 children. He lived on the same farm for 29 years & during those years he has been of inestimable benefit to his community & the state in valuable experiments in farming. Among his first experiments was to make 97½ bushels of corn on one acre. He put 100 bushels of cotton seed on this acre and the rows were 5 feet apart & the stalks were 2 feet apart in the drill. Next year without any additional fertilizer 2800 pounds of seed cotton were raised on this same acre. Another crop at the rates of 3150 pounds seed cotton was raised on this same land. In 1892, the dryest of the years, he raised 350 bushels of yam potatoes, one hill of these potatoes had on it, 17 good sized potatoes that weighed 20 pounds. His record on sugar cane is from 400 to 500 gallons of syrup to the acre. He makes above 300 bushels of Irish potatoes to the acre. On the farm is an orchard of peaches, pears, plums, Japanese persimmons & apples. One of the apple trees, one season bore 24 bushels of marketable apples. A son of Eli, M A SIDES, has an excellent orchard of 25 acres nearby & a part of the old homestead. Mr. SIDES has discovered a grass which he thinks is destined to revolutionize this country. It is evergreen, thrifty, prolific, juicy, esculent & sweet, stock love it well. He has now enough to set 100 acres, which has been secured from a single seed in 1900. It makes most excellent pasture & grows best in Sept, Oct, Nov, Feb, Mar, Apr, May & Jun but remains green all the year round. He was a Methodist & Mason.

Franklin Lycurgus EILAND

Prof. EILAND is of Scotch-Irish descent, the family coming to America in an early day & settling in GA. They were farmers & extensive slave holders. The grandfather, Enoch EILAND, had a son, James, who was in turn father of our subject, Franklin. born in GA, James & family moved to AL when he was 12 years. He was educated in the AL schools & became a teacher. He married Miss Sarah Ann SAVAGE & 10 children were born to them. Our subject, Franklin, was the next to youngest & was born in Noxubee co MS 25 Mar 1860. He was reared on the farm & attended the old field school. He traveled some & came to TX to remain in 1882. He married Miss Mary E NISBETT on 13 Nov 1884. She was from Robertson co & lived only 9 years. In 1894 he married Miss Ella May KENNEDY. She lived only 10 days. On 21 Oct 1896 he married again to Miss Minnie Jarushia VALENTINE from McLennan co. They had 1 dau, Mary Ella Oree (another dau, Elva Lynn died at age 1). Prof. EILAND is the only of his family to embark in the music business. He was inclined to music as a child & in 1884 he attended a meeting that set his career as a musician. He began teaching & studied to become a composer. In 1893 he began publishing music & bought out a company. From

this beginning, came The Trio Music Co & a Musical Journal in which Franklin in the editor. They have published 12 books of song & theory. He now lives in Myrtle Springs for the benefit of the waters on an elegant home & 3 farms nearby. He is a member of the Christian church.

James Addison CLARK

The CLARKs are of Irish extraction. Mr. CLARK's mother was of Scotch descent. The grandfather came to VA in an early day. The father moved to SC & married there to Miss Mary ROSMANT. They moved to GA where he died & the widow moved to AL, then to TX in 1872. James was born in SC 20 Apr 1830 into an antebellum home. His education was in AL but in 1851 he moved to Freestone co TX. In 1860 he came to live near Owllet Green. In 1862 he joined the army & in 1863 his health failed & he hired a substitute as a soldier & was elected sheriff of the county. Under reconstruction, he was removed from office in the political caldron. Tired of public life, he moved to his farm & lived in quietness. His farm has frequently made 1½ bales of cotton to the acre & 50 bushels of corn per acre, also 20 bushels of wheat.

Dan D RICHARDSON

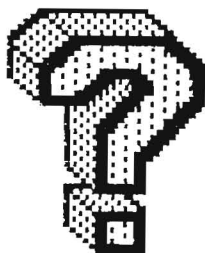
The family came from SC. The grandfather, Levi RICHARDSON, moved from SC to GA in an early day. He was a farmer & stock raiser. A son, James R RICHARDSON, was born in Congers GA in 1844. He grew up a farmer & married Miss Lucretia NEW in 1839. They were the parents of 13 children, of whom Dan was number 9. He was born 11 Dec 1859 in Congers, GA & moved with the family at age 10 to TX. He attended public schools & in Sep 1884 the father, James, died. Dan's mother died in Oct 1890. Dan married Miss Emily ROSE on 8 Jun 1882 & they were the parents of 3 children, only 1 living. Dan not only farmed, but also was engaged in the mill & gin business for 12 years. He also entered the Baptist ministry & pastors a church at Small along with his manufacturing establishment.

James Thomas HATTON

The HATTONs were Virginians. The father, Thomas W, was born in VA but came to SC & married there in 1834 to Miss Anna Eliza LAKE. They were farmers & parents of 12 children. James was born in AL 2 Mar 1842. In 1849 the family moved to Rusk co TX & to Van Zandt co in 1857. James served 3 years in the Civil War. He married Miss Mary C YOUNG on 16 Jan 1868, she became the mother of 8 children & she died 30 Apr 1885. He then married Miss M J RIDDLE who had 2 children & died 19 Apr 1901. James lived on the farm for 33 years, always a farmer & greatly honored by the people of his town & county.

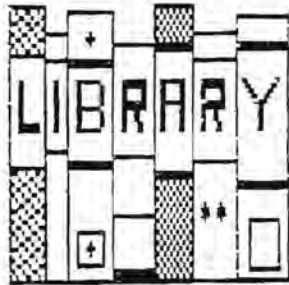

WILLIAM B BRIDGES
One of AUSTIN's 300 Colony, TX

William b BRIDGES received a Stephen F AUSTIN land grant dated 17 Jul 1824. This land was located on the Lavaca River north-east of the present town of Edna, TX in Jackson County. His first child by his second wife, Cynitha, was born in Victoria County, TX. Little is known about William before he arrived in TX, except what my great-grandfather gave in a disposition in a Lyons' land dispute in Lavaca District Court. According to this document, William BRIDGES' first wife and children died in MS prior to his marriage to Cynitha (maiden name unknown) ROSS. Family tradition says that she divorced James J ROSS in AR, then

married William in MS. They had 3 daughters: Mary, Martha and Elizabeth. Cynitha died in 1831.

William married Eliza LYONS TRIBBLE in 1836. She was the sister of Seymour Clinton LYONS, Mary's first husband. Eliza and William moved back to Black Jack Springs, Fayette County, TX, where he died in 1852.

(Ed note: the above is the ancestor of member Violet McELHINNEY and she recently received her certificate showing her acceptance into the society of AUSTIN's 300. Congradulations, Violet.)

Civil War Ancestors of Violet RANNE McELHINNEY:

William Alexander RANNE - Co R, 33 Cavalry, Capt John T BRACKENRIDGE's Co. Military records show he was a 2nd Lt, enlisted at Camp Esperanza 5 Mar 1862, on roster for 13 Jan 1864 Victoria, TX & on a strength of troop sub. Mil. Dist. of the Rio Grande commanded by Gen. H P BEE. He is buried at Pleasant Cemetery, Nolanville, TX, being born 26 Oct 1823 Washington PA & died 4 Jan 1911 Nolanville, TX

Samuel Hampton COX - Co D, 18th TX Cavalry, DARNELL's Regt that became Com. H GRANBURY's Consolid TX brig 9 Apr 1865. His records show he enlisted 15 Jan 1862 & was discharged at Camp McCULLOCK, Indian Nation, 27 Apr 1862 for disability on Surgeons Certificate. He is buried at Pleasant Hill Cemetery, Nolanville, TX being born 3 Sep 1831 & died 3 Mar 1918 Nolanville, TX.

Doctor Peola THOMPSON - Co D & F, 18th TX Regt. Records show he enlisted 18 Jan 1862 for 3 years or the war. They show his name was on a list of Confederate Army captured at Fort Hidman, AR Post, AR 11 Jan 1863. On his certificate of Disability for retiring invalid soldiers, D.P. was listed as having a skull injury & index finger fractured at Atlanta 21 Jul 1864. He is buried in McDOWELL Cemetery, Nolanville, TX being born 12 May 1830 Haywood County NC & died 13 Nov 1913, Nolanville, TX.

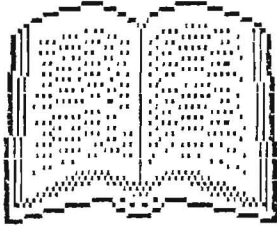

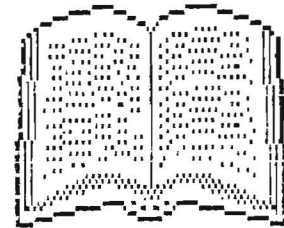

This can be acquired from the recorder of the county in which the land is located. There may be a fee for this service.
