Louisiana descendants



North Louisiana has its own love story of pathos and drama that resulted in the haunting words and music of 'In the Gloaming'. The romantic scene was set in the little town of Marion in Union Parish at the home of Rev. Elias GEORGE. He had 9 children to educate and it was his desire to secure a governess and someone to instruct his daughters in music. A small ad was placed in a New Orleans newspaper, to be answered by a Mrs. HARRISON, who not only wrote of her qualifications; but also those of her 18 year old daughter Ann Fortescue HARRISON, who was gifted in piano and violin. A few miles from town was the GOLDSBY family farm where the young Miles Walton GOLDSBY, Jr lived, except during college time at the University of Louisiana (now Tulane) where he became a graduate of medicine. Before long the dashing Miles had captured the heart of Ann, to the disapproval of Mrs. HARRISON. Even though their love was great, the mother convinced Ann that they could never share a life together because of his boldness and dominance of will, and she a quiet, lover of music. Without a word of adieu between the two lovers and while Miles was away, Ann and Mrs. HARRISON left Marion; never to see her beloved Miles again. Some time after her arrival back in New Orleans, Ann, heart broken and lonely, composed the music to the memorable song 'In The Gloaming'. The words, written by Meta ORRED were inspired by Ann's description of the doomed romance at Marion:

"In the gloaming, O my darling,
When the lights are dim and low,
And the quiet shadows falling,
Softly come and softly go,
When the winds are sobbing faintly,
With a gentle, unknown woe,
Will you think of me and love me,
As you did once long ago?
In the gloaming, O my darling,
Think not bitterly of me!
Though I passed away in silence,
Left you lonely, set you free;
For my heart was crushed with longing,
What had been could never be;
It was best to leave you thus, dear,
Best for you and best for me."

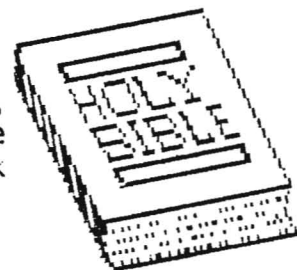

(obit from newspaper loosely in Bible) Thursday Morning, April 19, 1883: Death & Burial of Deacon BULLOCK

The announcement by telegraph of the death of V.V. BULLOCK, who was visiting his son ex-Gov. BULLOCK, at Atlanta, Ga, was received with sincere regret by our whole community of Thursday of last week. He had been in poor health during the winter, and it was hoped that the change of climate would prove beneficial. But his constitution had become too seriously impaired, and after only a few days serious illness, without pain or suffering he passed peacefully over the river.

His remains accompanied by his son ex-Gov. BULLOCK, Mrs. Freeman CLARKE and two sons, reached Albion on the 11:25 train Sunday morning and were removed to the family residence on Park street where they were viewed by a large concourse of friends and neighbors till the hour for the funeral 2 P.M. when they were removed to the church. The expression on the countenance of deceased was very natural, composed and calm, indication that he had dropped into a quiet, peaceful sleep. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Geo F CAIN, assisted by Rev Dr. WALSWORTH

And Rev. W.H. SLOAN. The former preached an appropriate sermon on the occasion from the expressive text from Job, "I know that my Redeemer liveth." Rev. Mr. CAIN also read the following beautiful lines cut from the Buffalo Sunday Courier, which were found in the pocket-book of Deacon BULLOCK: (the poem, quite long is IF IT BE TRUE, poem not listed here) Rev. Dr. WALSWORTH, a long time personal friend of the deceased spoke feelingly of him and eulogized in fitting terms the character of his departed friend. An elegant casket with becoming floral decorations, a large cross, a large crown, a sheaf of wheat and a pillow with the word "Father" surrounded and enclosed ... (paper torn--continuing:) Judge J.G. SAWYER, N.S. FIELD, Hon. L.R. REYNOLDS, Henry SEARS, Wm H. PENDRY, George H. SICKELS, Judge Arad THOMAS, U.C. ROGERS and J.H. ROYCE.

Among the mourners were ex-Gov. R.B. BULLOCK, of Ga, F.C. BULLOCK of Omaha, Neb, sons of deceased; a son and daughter of the former; Mrs. BROWN and daughter of Detroit; Mrs. Freeman CLARKE, Ward CLARKE and Edward S. CLARKE of Rochester; A.V. CLARK of this village, and other friends.

During the funeral exercises the officers of the church sat on the rostrum, the vacant chair of Deacon BULLOCK and his family pew being draped in black. The attendance of citizens on the solemn and impressive ceremonies was large. The general feeling is that a good man has departed and there is no one left to just fill his place.

We understand that the deceased has accumulated a comfortable competence in good paying securities, besides his handsome home on Park street. The property we learn is divided by will between Mr. F.C. BULLOCK who is a bachelor, and the sons and daughter of ex-Gov. BULLOCK, who are the only grandchildren.

Volkert Veeder BULLOCK was born in Bethlehem, Albany county Nov 4, 1806 and died April 11, 1883, aged 76. Mr. BULLOCK's father, Mr. Joseph BULLOCK, was an English gentleman who married Miss Elizabeth VEEDER, daughter of Peter VEEDER Esq, one of the Holland Dutch settlers of the Hudson river country near Albany, and the owner of large landed estates in the vicinity. The English and Knickerbecker stock were therefore united in Mr. BULLOCK. On Sept 15, 1830, he married Miss Jane Eliza, the daughter of Rufus BROWN Esq of Albany, and with their wedding attendants the bridal party made the trip by special stage from Albany to Niagara Falls and return stopping en route at Albion, then a very small place, to visit with their relatives, Messrs. Freeman and Roswell CLARKE, who as young merchants were then just starting in life here.

Mr. BULLOCK removed from Albany to Albion in 1840 and soon after locating here started the stove foundry, which after several years successful operation and about the year 1849, he sold to Mr. Seth L. KING.

The telegraph at this time began to attract the attention of public spirited men, and in connection with Mr. Royal CHAMBERLAIN, Mr. Freeman CLARKE, Ira R. ELWOOD and others, Mr. BULLOCK pushed through the organization of the House Printing Telegraph Co and the construction of its lines from New York to Buffalo.

After the telegraph companies were consolidated and the House lines were swallowed up by Western Union, about 1859, Mr. BULLOCK took an active interest in promoting the construction of Gas works in this village, and being one of the largest local stockholders became Treasurer and continued to give his personal attention to the Company's affairs up to the day of his death. For all this kind of responsibility he was eminently fitted by a natural genius for mechanics, and thorough and extensive reading and experiences. He was skillful, prompt, methodical, industrious and economical, and knew the value of them, and constant attention and oversight to its minutest details, and was a valuable accession to any enterprise that was entrusted to his supervision.

In 1856 Mr. BULLOCK was elected Justice of the Peace of the old town of Barre, holding his office in Albion for the next four years beginning Jan 1, 1857. He discharged the duties of that office with intelligence, decision and impartiality, and to the general acceptance of the community. His education at the Albany Academy and his extensive reading had turned his attention to the law, which he would have pursued as a profession, had it not been for his unfortunate infirmity of deafness. He was a life long Whig and Republican, always acting with his party, as he fully believed its principles were most conducive to the welfare and prosperity of his country.

Mr. BULLOCK was always found among the most liberal and active in all good works for the improvement of the town and the benefit of his fellow citizens. He was among the first to advocate and support the free school system and the cause of public education. For over 20 years he was sole trustee and School Commissioner. Under his able administration and care was built up the foundation upon which our present magnificent Union School system rests.

Mr. BULLOCK was also a sincere and consistent Christian and during all his residence in Albion was an officer of the Presbyterian church and since the death of Deacon Harvey GOODRICH, its senior ruling Elder, and one of its safest counsellors. His religious convictions were strong and firm. He knew in whom he trusted. His beloved wife preceded him to the tomb in March, 1882, and now they sleep together in Mount Albion, the sleep of the just, awaiting the resurrection morn. They leave two children, ex-Gov Rufus Brown BULLOCK of Georgia and Freeman Clarke BULLOCK of Nebraska. (another poem follows)

Burial of the Distinguished Mason, Jurist and Arthur at
Albion Yesterday (newspaper article in Bible)

At Albion yesterday at noon, occurred one of the largest Masonic funerals ever witnessed in the village, that of the late Robert Hewitt BROWN, of Renovation Lodge No. 97. Members of Rochester Consistory, to which deceased also belonged, were present, and formed a guard of honor in full uniform.

The remains were neatly dressed and wearing the regalia of the Rose La Croix order. The casket presented a neat and tasteful appearance profusely decorated with valuable and beautiful floral tributes. Taking the remains in charge the lodge marched in usual order to the First Baptist Church, entering it precisely

as the clock struck high twelve, in the following order:

Rev Conant SAWYER preached an effective funeral discourse, at the close of which occurred the following biographical sketch: "Judge BROWN, whose death we now deplore, was born in Albany on the 25th of March 1830 and was therefore, at the time of his decease, which occurred at 12 o'clock on the evening of Wednesday, August 15, 1883, a little more than 53 years old. By profession he was a lawyer. He first read law with Hon. A. Hyde COLE, and afterwards with Hon. William K. McALLISTER, of Albion. He graduated at the Ballston Law school and was admitted to practice as an attorney and counselor about 1851, at the age of 21 years. He opened an office in Detroit, Mich and practiced his profession there 9 or 10 years. For a considerable portion of the time in which he lived in Detroit, he held the position of a circuit court commissioner. From Detroit he removed to Georgia, in 1860 or 1861, and at the close of the war he was appointed one of the commissioners for revising the code of that state. The duties of the position were arduous and very responsible, but Judge BROWN is believed to have acquitted himself with decided honor and to the satisfaction of the legal profession generally. For a number of years past he has been in very poor health, and has resided in this village, devoting his time mostly to literary pursuits. His literary tastes were of a very high order and some of the productions of his pen would have done honor to the best writers of the age. He was an easy and graceful writer; his style was vigorous, smooth and polished....He was a Mason of long standing and had taken all the degrees of the order, to and including the 32nd degree. He was a perfect encyclopedia of Masonic knowledge. The only near relative whom he left surviving is a brother, General Joseph B BROWN of the United States Army. After the services at the church, the remains were taken to Albion cemetery for interment where the Masonic ritual service was read by W.B., Alexander HAYS of Renovation Lodge. The pallbearers were: John G SAWYER, Edwin PORTER, John N. WHITE, John BIDELMAN, Samuel H TAYLOR, & George H BRACE. Among those present from out of town: Gen BROWN, ex-Gov BULLOCK, Hon A P BUTTS, Geo NEWELL, Mr HURD, Thomas GLIDDEN & L. Ward CLARKE.

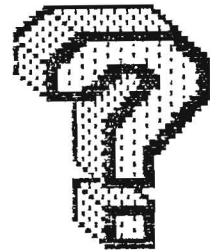

GIDEON DOUGLAS

Gideon was born 19 Aug 1857 in Van Zandt Co TX. Grandfather Mathew and father Preston were Missouri farmers. Preston came to Texas prior to the war, married 1853 Adeline Dorcas BROWN, born MS, and reared 5 children. Gideon married Hattie COAKER on 26 Dec 1889, and they had 10 children. His plantation contained 1,000 acres, 400 of which were tenanted by colored people.

JAMES CURRY McCOLLOUGH

This family is of Scotch extraction, settling in SC in an early day. Subject's grandfather was named David. Thos. D., son of David, and father of James who was born 6 Sep 1852 in AL. Before coming to Texas, he sold goods in Magnolia, AR. James married in Texas to Emma CASON, the step-daughter of Sam Q. RICHARDSON. They had no children. His business interests were varied.

DR. C. R. FOX

Dr. FOX was born in Van Zandt Co TX. His father, C.J. FOX, was born in AL, came from MS to Texas where he married a Miss BURTON. Our subject was born 12 Jun 1860, attended the University of Louisville, and entered practice in 1883. On 24 Aug 1894 he married Miss Ed Willie WHITE, daughter of E. M. WHITE. They had 3 children. They were members of the Christian church; Dr. Fox was a member of WOW.

PROF. METSA HALE

Refer to The Journal, VOL II #3, p 94, which gives an account of Willis Jarrell HALE, father of Metsa. Prof. HALE, a teacher and member of the Baptist church, was born 17 Oct 1878 in AL, the father coming to Texas in 1879.

WILEY A. DAVIDSON

Wiley A. DAVIDSON, a lawyer, was born in Van Zandt Co TX, the son of Leaston DAVIDSON, and brother to Judge Jno. W. DAVIDSON.

N. A. MATTHEWS

N. A. MATTHEWS came to Texas from Georgia when a young man. He was a member of the M.E. church South, and a Mason, serving as past master, secretary, Past High Priest, and District Deputy Grand Master of Masons of Texas. He also served as alderman and city secretary, and city council member of Wills Point.

TOM RUSK YANTIS

The YANTIS family came from KY to Texas. Enoch was the grandfather, and James L. was the father of Judge YANTIS. James L. married a Miss SUDDUTH in 1847 and came to Texas in 1852. Judge YANTIS was born 9 Apr 1857 in Rusk Co. TX. In 1879 he came from Gregg Co to Van Zandt where he began law practice in 1881, serving as judge of the county from 1892 to 1896. On 16 Oct 1890 he married Miss Belle RILEY, daughter of D.L. RILEY. Judge YANTIS was a Mason, WOW and Knight of Labor and Knight of Honor.

CHARLES LEE HUBBARD

Freeman HUBBARD, father of Charles, came to Texas from TN in 1852. He married Miss E.M. WINKLE, born NC, and they had 6 children. Charles, born 3 JUL 1870 in Van Zandt Co, was Deputy County Clerk for many years, and District Clerk 1896-1898. On 9 Jun 1896 he married Miss Gertrude HIGH, and they have 1 child. A law partnership was formed with Judge Tom YANTIS in 1903. He was a member of the I.O.O.F., and WOW.

JOHN ALLEN THARP

Referred to as refugees from Louisiana, but originally from Georgia, J. A. THARP, Sr., the father, came to Texas in 1859 with a number of slaves and settled in Ellis Co. His son, our subject, was born 2 Mar 1846, DeSoto Pr LA. On 28 Jul 1868 he married Miss Emily FISHER whose father was also a refugee from LA. John, the father of 9 children, settled in Van Zandt Co and practiced diversified farming. He was a member of the Free Methodist Church.

JAMES LEONARD VINEYARD

He is of German-Irish extraction, the son of Dr. J. L. VINEYARD, and was born 1 Jun 1854 in AL. Miss Mary CUMBIE, an orphan, born 19 Dec 1857, was married to our subject on 21 Dec 1876 and the following year they moved to Texas. After a 2 year stay in Smith Co they arrived in Van Zandt Co in 1879. They had 9 children. He is a member of the Baptist church, and a Mason.

MAYOR THOMAS J. McKAIN

Thomas C. McKAIN, grandfather of Thomas J., was born Sterling, Scot. His son, also Thomas C., father of Mayor McKain, was born in Scot and the family came to Philadelphia when he was young. He married Miss Mary WHIDDON in 1849; they had 6 children. Thomas J. was born in Florida in 1850, came to Texas in 1874, the year he married Miss Mattie C. BAGBY. They had 4 children. He served as mayor of Wills Point 3 years, and was a member of the Methodist church, and a Mason.

WILLIAM PILLEY

William Pilley was postmaster at Wills Point for a total of 10 years. His family came from Massachusetts. His grandfather was W. J. Pilley, a sailor, born in Ireland, who lived and died in North Carolina. His son J.R. Pilley, father of William, married a Miss PARKINSON of TN in 1844 and they were parents of 10 children. William was born 8 Sep 1846 in Washington Co AR and was educated in Fort Smith. In 1897 he married Mrs. S. J. BARKER and they have 2 children. He came from Arkansas to Kaufman Co in 1868, then later to Van Zandt Co. He was a member of the Methodist church, and a Mason. He served as a private in the civil war.

W. A. LAWRENCE

He was the son of H. H. LAWRENCE who was born in NC in an early day. W. A., one of 11 children, was born 11 Mar 1854 and was educated in Woodbury, GA, Concord, GA, Georgia Telegraphic School, Poughkeepsie, NY, and Portner's Select School of Terrell, Tx. He taught in both GA and TX, and was postmaster and merchant at Edom.

DR. J. T. TUCKER

Elder Truehart Tucker was a pioneer Baptist minister who went to AL from VA in 1838. He married Mary A. ANDERSON of AL and they had 2 girls and one boy. The boy, J. Truehart TUCKER and his mother moved to Van Zandt after the father's death. J.T. began the study of medicine at age 14, graduating in 1892 from Memphis Hospital Medical College. Miss A.J. COX, to whom he was married in 1881, only lived 6 years and in 1882 he married (2) Miss Delilah LaTruss(?). He was a partner with A.J. ADRAIN in the drug business.

HENRY THOMAS CONSTANT

The CONSTANT family lived in Kentucky. John CONSTANT, the father, married Eliza HODGES and they had several children. Both John and Eliza died in Texas. Henry was educated in the common schools in Texas. He came from KY to TX in 1876?, first to Kaufman Co then to Van Zandt Co, and married Mertie SMITH. They had issue. He was a Baptist, Mason and an Odd Fellow. (Abstractor's note: Original article was very poor quality. Interested researchers should use with caution).

JOHN WILLIAM FUGATE

A family of farmers who originally lived in VA, later moved to KY, and in 1855 William, the father, came to Van Zandt, and a few years later John M. came. J.W. (Bud), the 3rd boy, was born 7 Dec 1861, and spent his entire life in Van Zandt Co. On 20 Mar 1881 he married Miss Callie FOSTER, a niece of Judge FOSTER of Canton. He was a member of the firm Fugate & Johnson, Tundra, owners and operators of gin and mill outfits.

JOSEPH EDWARD JOHNSON

The Johnsons were of German extraction and located in NC in an early day. William, father of Joseph Edward, was born and reared in NC, and Joseph was 7 years of age when the family moved to Texas. In August of 1892 he married Miss Cora EVANS and they became parents of 3 children. He is a member of FUGATE & JOHNSON, a Cumberland, and WOW.

W. B. COX

The COXES are intimately related to the RILEYS who came to the county in 1850. W. B. COX is a grandson of Love RILEY who came from Alabama. The parents of W. B. were Tillman L. COX, who was reared in AL, and Miss Nancy RILEY. They married in 1855 and reared a family of 12 children in Van Zandt Co. W. B. was born 10 Aug 1856 in Van Zandt Co. On 3 Jul 1880 he married Miss Anna HALLMAN and they raised a large family. He served as postmaster at Ben Wheeler, and operated a telephone exchange. Dr. Love COX of Martins Mill is his brother.

DAVID PHILIP PIPES

Born and raised in Lincoln Pr, LA, whose father was a farmer and also a Methodist minister. He married Miss Luella McCALLA who bore 3 children and who only lived a few years. In May of 1889 he married Miss Rebecca CRAWFORD and they have 4 children. This family moved from North Louisiana to the Roddy area, Van Zandt Co. His farming pursuits included the raising of registered Berkshire hogs. He was a Methodist.

ELDER JOHN R. HOBBS

The grandfather, William HOBBS, lived and died in Alabama. Louis Harrison HOBBS, the father of John R., was reared in Logan Co, KY and died in TX. He came to TX in 1850 along with the families of RILEYS, SIDES, and others. He married Miss Winnie SIDES, who was reared in AL, in 1836, and had 14 children. He died 15 Jan 1874 and she 25 Sep 1896, both in Van Zandt. John R. was born 4 Dec 1842 in Talladega, AL and was age 18 when coming to the county. On 27 Feb 1868 he married Miss Amanda A. MAYFIELD, and they have 3 children. Elder HOBBS was ordained to the ministry in June, 1899. He served as a private, CSA.

THOS. M. HOBBS

The son of Elder John R. HOBBS referred to above. Thos. M. was born in the family home 25 Oct 1869, and was educated in the common schools. He married 26 Feb 1891 Miss Ellen BROWN, dau. of H.W. BROWN. She died 1 Apr 1894. On 29 Dec 1901 he married Miss Mamie BRIDGES. There were 2 children from the 1st marriage, and 1 by the second. He farms 444 acres, and is a member of the firm WELLS & HOBBS, is an active church worker, and a member of WOW.

ARCH DAVIDSON

The Davidson family is quite extensive in SE Van Zandt Co. Wm. DAVIDSON was the grandfather and lived in TN; John W. was his father and lived in GA. His mother's maiden name was Emeline SPENCE. The parents married in 1842 and were the parents of 9 children, 7 living. Arch DAVIDSON was born 25 Apr 1853 in FL, and educated in Van Zandt. In Feb. 1878 he married Miss Eugenia HAYS of Smith Co. who died in 1881, and on 4 Dec 1884 he married Miss A. JOHNSON of Henderson Co. Mr. Davidson is a steward in the M.E. church, a trustee of the public school, and has 400 acres of land.

DUE MILLSAPS

Reuben MILLSAPS was born 1773 in NC, served in the revolutionary war under Gen. George Washington, died in 1845. His son William MILLSAPS was born 1791 in NC, and served under Gen. Andrew Jackson in the war of 1812. In 1811 he married Miss Levina WILLIAMS, and of their 10 children, 4 were boys: Hiram, Temple, Reuben and Thomas. Thomas, the surviving son, married Miss Mandy McGOWAN in 1852. They had 14 children, and 4 sons and 4 daughters survived. The sons were Reuben, Volley, Welton and Dew (sic). Walton (sic) was state supt. for New York Life Ins. Co., state of Louisiana; Volley was a dry goods salesman in Jackson, MS. Reuben and Due were in partnership in Ben Wheeler. Due was born 19 May 1875 in Carthage, MS where he received his education, and located in Edgewood, TX in 1895. He married in 1901 Miss Della STARNES. They have a son Lloyd.

W. T. MORRIS

Born in Van Zandt Co., the son of Rev. Newton MORRIS who came to the county in 1857. W. T. was educated in the schools here, and is engaged in the mercantile business in Denman.

HON. W. J. GREER

A lawyer, and district attorney who resides with his family in Wills Point. He is of the Christian faith.

ELDER C. C. CARR

He was a teacher of vocal music and literature for many years when he felt a call to the ministry. He resides in Myrtle Springs.

WILLIAM FRANKLIN STANHISER

Born 1 Jan 1867 in Smith Co. TX, the son of Lawrence STANHISER. His parents died when he was a child, leaving him an orphan to be raised by strangers. He is self-educated, and operates a general store in Roddy.

J. V. HARRIS

The Harris family came from Louisiana. William, the father, married in 1856 to a Miss BRADSHAW, and came to TX in 1866. Their son J.V. was born 2 Feb 1862 in Columbia Co AR, and was educated in the common schools of TX. In May, 1883, he married Miss Millie COOPER, and came to Ben Wheeler from Rusk Co. A mechanic, he works in wood and iron, and makes an excellent quality of chair.

HON. WENTWORTH MANNING

His great-grandfather Manning was born and reared about Boston, MA, served in the revolutionary army, and after the war was sheriff in Connecticut. His 2 children were Elisha and William. William lived to age 96. His grandfather was born during the revolutionary war in North Parish, New London, Conn. He married an INGERSOLL and moved to western NY 2 Dec. 1805 in Pennsylvania (sic). The grandfather served in the war of 1812. He raised 7 children of whom only 1 is living, Martin M. MANNING, of Assaria, KA, who was 80 years old 29 Oct 1903. The maternal grandfather was a wheel-right or ship carpenter, and was in the war of 1812. Subject's father was born in PA near NY, a cooper who came to TX in Apr of 1857. He married 20 Jan 1828 to Miss Martha HARVEY who was born and reared in Montpelier, VT. They had 11 children. He died 20 May 1874; she, 16 Mar 1882 near Canton, TX. Wentworth was born Pendleton Co. KY on 25 Mar 1847 and came to TX with his father from KY to Red River Co TX in 1857; thence to Van Zandt in 1858. He is unmarried, a banker, and owns 1,000 acres of land.

VAN ZANDT COUNTY TEXAS "FIRSTS"

Taken from the paper The Southland, printed ca 1892

Van Zandt county was named in honor of Isaac Van Zandt, minister to the United States during the Republic of Texas, and father of General K.M. Van Zandt of Fort Worth, Texas.

The first white child born in Van Zandt county was Joseph HUFFER, a son of Sam HUFFER, a prominent surveyor in early days, and a grandson of Neal MARTIN, a pioneer who settled and died in Van Zandt Co. about 3 miles north of Wills Point. Mr. MARTIN was on the island of Galveston on the day that Jackson fought the battle of New Orleans.

The first printer to settle in Van Zandt Co was George A. HILL, who settled on the north bank of the Sabine river about 10 miles northeast of Wills Point. His home is now in Rains Co.

The first newspaper published in Van Zandt Co was by Sid S. JOHNSON. He was editor and proprietor of the Canton Weekly Times, 1860-61.

The first minister of the gospel to settle in Van Zandt Co was Jesse J. GAGE.

The first couple to enter into a marriage contract in Van Zandt Co was Thomas CUNNINGHAM and Mahala BROWN.

The first district court held in Van Zandt was on Christmas day, 1848. Judge Bennett H. MARTIN presided and Andrew J. FOWLER was district attorney. This court was held about 2 miles a little east of south of the present town of Grand Saline. Gilbert YARBOROUGH, then chief justice of the county, was foreman of the grand jury.

The first estray taken up in the county was by Leonard Brown in 1848. The first cotton gin built was by Burrell HANBRICK, near the southeast corner, and the first cotton ginned on this gin was marketed at old Magnolia, a steamboat landing near Palestine.

The first salt manufactured was by John JORDAN and Allen T. McGEE at Grand Saline.

The first water mill built in the county was by Sila S. ROAHER. Mr. ROAHER married the widow HUFFER, the mother of the first white child born in the county.

The first election held was on Monday, in August, 1848. There were 87 votes polled.

The first brick kiln burnt in the county was by Frederick EZELL in 1857.

The first tanyard was established in 1848 near Grand Saline by Leland H. BAUGHENAN. The tanyard is gone and the spring is gone and no sign can be found of it anywhere.

Leland H. BAUGHENAN was the first Justice of the peace in the county.

David T. BUNDY whose father Jas. BUNDY, was county commissioner at the time when the town of Canton was located, and who, while acting as county commissioner, contracted to build the first court house in Canton, the said David T. got out most of the timbers for the building now lives in Lindale in Smith Co.

John NORMAN built the first jail in Canton, M.M. NORMAN, stone point, Aanan KNUDSON contracted under Norman to get out the timbers and build the first jail. He is living in the Wise P.O. area.

Ambrose FITZGERALD was first county clerk, and died a few years since near Emery where members of his family now live.

Peter S. BENTON was first sheriff of the county and died in Johnson co. and has a son, William S., who now lives at or near Alvarado.

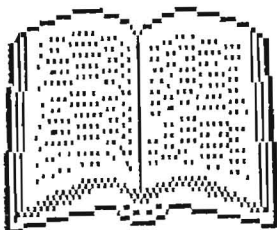
The first school ever taught in Van Zandt was in 1849 and 1850, and conducted by Jas. J. KUYKENDALL. It was taught in a log house on Saline Creek about 5 miles S of the present town, Grand Saline.

The first reunion of the old settlers held in Van Zandt Co. was in the southeastern portion of the county on Battle Creek, where Chief BOWLES was killed, on the 17th day of July, 1857, and was addressed by Everett E. LOTT, George W. CHILTON and R.B. HUBBARD. John WALLING, Sr. was present and pointed out the spot where Chief BOWLES fell after receiving his death wound, which place was marked with a drawing knife in shaving off the bark of a red oak tree. The tree is now living.

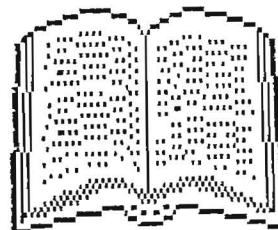
Alf. MOORE, Thos. WHITE, William GIBBERT, the BRITTONS, the LANGFORDS, the BURNETTS, the JONESES, the SPEARS, the FULLERS, the ELLIOTTS, the TEALS, the WILLS are remembered by Elijah SULLIVAN as among the first settlers of Van Zandt.

The McGEE mill, the first built in the county, was erected in 1846. It was an old fashioned tread mill, grinding for a wide territory.

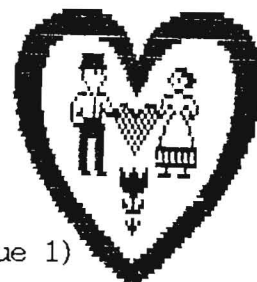

The Riley-Hickingbotham Library, Ouachita Baptist University, Arkadelphia, AR houses info on Baptist ministers, or other info regarding the Baptists in the US with special emphasis on AR. Many old church records on microfilm plus the Clark County Historical Assn printed & microfilmed materials. Henderson University (with Methodist background) is also located in Arkadelphia.

If you find "D.S.P." or "orbin sine prole" on your ancestors tombstone, you have a real problem. It is Latin meaning "died without issue."

Many children were shipped west by a Catholic Foundling Home in New York City to parish families on trains. According to Sister Marian Healy, supervisor of record information, their files contain the records of children who were under the care of this agency. In order for them to initiate a search for a former ward, the birth name must be given along with the exact date of birth. The request must also be accompanied by one form of identification for yourself along with one form of identification for the person on whom you are requesting info, as proof of your relationship to that person. (Ex: xerox'd copy of social security card, birth or baptismal or marriage certificate, driver's license). Contact Sister Marian Healy, 18 West 18th Street, New York, NY 10011.

Member Barbara Estess shares a New Orleans, LA newspaper article telling of a 1974 law under which New Orleans tombs in need of renovation can be confiscated & the remains moved to unmarked mausoleums elsewhere in the same cemetery. Called "The Cities of the Dead", the 31 cemeteries mirror the city in miniature & in marble. Some tombs are maintained through preservation funds,

but the majority are the responsibility of the family. As a result, the cemeteries have been ravaged by years of neglect. The New Orleans Archdiocese, which owns 6 of the old cemeteries, has upgraded the tombs & plots. Most of the tombs were built 60 to 200 years ago above ground. Under the law, officials must try for a year to trace heirs, then wait 3 more years before repossessing the tombs. Many lately located descendants, many of whom didn't know about their family tomb, are beginning restorations. If a restored tomb is resold, the remains inside will be put in another crypt & records kept to show where they are. Do you have ancestors buried in these old cemeteries???

"DIT" Names

From the American-Canadian Genealogical Society and shared by member Mary Frances Bridges, comes this explanation of a "dit" or "second name." "Dit" is translated into English as "say" or "also known as". There is no negative connotation implied which is sometimes the case the English "alias". Since surnames came into being for identification, the "dit" name came into being for the purpose of further identification of a person or family.

Some general sources for these changes are:

Occupation/Guild	Heroic deed/accomplishments
Place of origin	Description of some object
Physical description	Easily pronounced names
Character description	Seignorial identification
Maternal identification	Military

The 2 surnames used can be interchanged at any time. Since one form of the name, or both forms together, may appear at birth, baptism, marriage, census or at death, each individual document must be checked. Example: a man might have been born as Jean Labonte dit Clement, baptized as Jean Clement, married as Jean Clement dit Labonte, reported in census as Jean Labonte, & died as Jean Labonte dit Clement. The wise researcher will record all "dit" names in his personal records. Even misspellings should be kept since they stand in the records as a certain family flavor. These variations add spice to our research & assist us in the knowledge of our origins. Don't be surprised to learn that one branch of a family carried on the original family name while a brother of the same parentage elected to hang on to the "dit" name for his descendants.
