Denmark Baptist Church declared themselves a church until 28 Jan 1847.

Some Arkansas Baptist history from the Baptist Commoner, Little Rock, AR, 1 Aug 1928, J L BROWN; Elder W M OWEN; Elder Ben M BOGARD. Has fallen into my hands an old leather bound book. This book was first the property of Jamestown Baptist Church (Cedar Grove) but fell into the hands of the Denmark Baptist Church (Independent). The book does not tell us how it came to change hands as the change took place about 81 years ago.

Also recorded in Independence County Court House in Book "1-2" page 454 states 2 acres was reserved where the Baptist Church and grave yard was and again in Book "A-3" page 372 land along the Baptist graveyard to the Mt. View and Jacksonport road, again in book "H-2" page 205 land reserved where the Baptist Church and graveyard was.

The above submitted by member Jimmie Jean PATE BOWMAN, who is the great-great granddaughter of Bird PATE. Some of her notes:

The original church location which was near the intersection of the Desha-Jamestown/McHue-Locust Grove intersection was in later years removed to higher ground on the Jamestown-Desha Road. According to Mrs. Olevia (BARNES) BAKER, the original church was constructed of logs. Jamestown Cemetery is "kept up" and holds many of the pioneers of that area. Cemeteries in current use are: Alderbrook Cemetery, Desha, AR and Locust Grove Cemetery, Locust Grove, AR. Both are well maintained.

The church history was furnished to me by Mrs. Bertha Mae RICHARDSON of Desha, AR, who was church clerk for many years. She did not give the source of her information. The old church records are protected in a bank deposit box in Batesville, AR. The history had to be written prior to Phebe DUMAS' death which occurred 18 Jan 1932. J L BROWN mentioned in the history was the church pastor for many years; pastorate was not consecutive.

CADDO INDIAN AGENCY HOUSE

Seven miles south of Shreveport, near Forbing, on the bluff where the Forbing-Lucas road crosses the bed of Bayou Pierre, is the historic site of the Caddo Indian Agency House. Here on July 1, 1835, in the presence of a detachment of troops from Fort Jessup,

was formed the only treaty with the Indians in Louisiana, the Treaty of Cession, by which the Caddos yielded their claims to all land in Louisiana and agreed to go to Oklahoma. In this treaty, a section of land was reserved for their half-breed friend and interpreter, Larkin Edwards. He located this section on the site of the present city of Shreveport, selling it to the Shreve Town Company. Source: Louisiana Tourist Guide "Know Louisiana", O.K. Allen, Gov.

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CALENDAR

Prior to 1582 the Julian Calendar was used by the Christian world. This divided the year into 365 days with an extra day added every 4th year (with exceptions). The Gregorian Calendar began 1582 which changed the beginning of the new year from March 25th to January 1st. It was adopted by all Catholic countries, and later by the Protestant nations.

England continued use of the Julian Calendar until 1752 at which time Great Britain and her colonies began using January 1st as the start of the new year. At the same time 11 days were dropped from the calendar between September 2nd and 14th, further complicating calculation of a correct birth date. Use of a double year date, i.e. 1686/7, meant the year was officially 1686 but was really thought to be 1687.

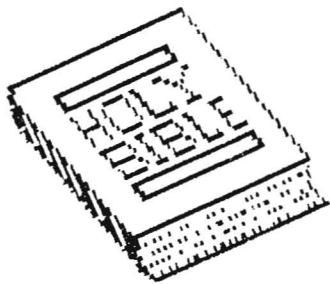

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HOTEL EXCELSIOR REGISTER
 4 Apr 1880 to 18 Oct 1881
 Jefferson, Marion County, Texas

The register is that of the forgotten Hotel Excelsior of Jefferson, historic port city of east Texas, site of the only federal court at that time in all the territory, and gathering point for learned members of the bar, "drummers," from the major cities of the north, and early settlers of the northeast part of the state.

The proprietress was Mrs. K. WOOD. The book, which covers the dates from 4 Apr 1880 to 18 Oct 1881, echos the famous AL ROTHSCCHILD murder trial, and the fate of "Diamond Bessie," mysterious Jefferson, TX visitor.

For hotel men the register is interesting in its revelation of accounting and registration methods of that age. Individual columns are provided for the "number of ladies" "number of gentlemen" "number of servants" "number of children" "number of apartment" "time of arrival" and "time of departure." The columns weren't always used, but the system was there.

The "Diamond Bessie" case is an epic in itself, with a cast of living characters that include Al ROTHSCCHILD, the defendant, still believed to have been the scion of a wealthy New York family in view of the money that was made available for his defense; W T ARMISTEAD, a famous lawyer, partner of Dave COLBERSON, who finally cleared ROTHSCCHILD; and other lawyers and court attendants of more local renown. The trial in question extended over the middle week or two of December 1880 and drew spectators from all over this section of the country.

On March 3, 1881, the McINTYRE and HEATH Great Southern Minstrels took Jefferson by storm and a whole page of the hotel record. This troupe was the leading show of its kind in the country before Al G FIELDS. Signatures of its members include James McINTYRE and Thomas HEATH themselves, and J C DEAGAN, who became a Chicago manufacturer of xylophones. "Call service" was required by the troupe members for everything from breakfast to parade, show time to train time.

C A CULBERSON, governor and United States senator, recorded his name somewhere in the book; Judge B T ESTES of the Bowie County districk court, father of the late Federal Judge Lee ESTES, was a frequent guest; and Districk Judge P A TURNER had his name inscribed a number of times.

There is John W HOOPER, Pittsburgh attorney of note; M L CRAWFORD, a leading Dallas lawyer; S HEILBRON, father of Louis HEILBRON; E MARX, father of Mrs. B H KUHL, Mrs. Ray EBERSON and Joe MARX, of New York; Scott NOBLE, Texas & Pacific superintendent, son of the president of the road; L S SCHLEUTER, Jefferson attorney; Paul JONES of Texarkana; D H ABERNATHY, another Pittsburgh attorney; H O MATHEWS, an early Texarkana lumberman who had a mill at Eylau; Ben WHITAKER, another pioneer lumberman; R D HARRELL, Texarkana attorney, of whom Sam RAGLAND is a relative by marriage; William T HUDGINS, attorney; Mrs J KOSMINSKY, mother of Dr L J KOSMINSKY; John F MOREFIELD, well known in Texarkana's early sporting life; H M BEIDLER, first mayor of Texarkana, AR; and Tom H BALL, Galveston.

Juries of both the districk and federal courts were ensconced in style at the Excelsior. Lists of the jurors, drawn for federal panels from the length and breadth of east Texas, include such names as Major BENEFIELD of Texarkana, builder of the BENEFIELD Hotel, and W J FERGUSON, father of Mrs N P SANDERSON, who registered with fellow jurors respectively on April 4th and May 11, 1880.

John SABINE, of Texarkana, was a deputy sheriff on attendance on one of the state juries. Charles S TODD, Texarkana attorney, was registered. So was Charles E BEARD, father of Mrs A C STUART; and George R RUFFIN, father of Mrs Helen RUFFIN MARSHALL.

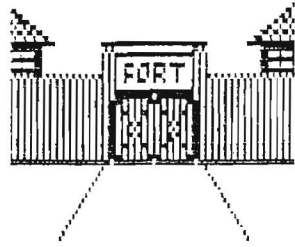
Other guests at one time or another included Ed G MOWER, Texarkana, A Texas & Pacific conductor; J P WADLEIGH, freight representative for the Cotton Belt; Charles H ROWELL, Jefferson attorney; F M HENRY, father of the late Congressman Bob HENRY and Miss Jo HENRY of Texarkana; W H BUSH, a Texarkana justice of the peace; Charles EAKIN, route agent for the Pacific Express company; E C PHILLIPS; Ed PURCEL, Texarkana merchant; R "Tony" HERZ, deputy US marshal; S D LARY, Texarkana TX mayor & county judge; H C ALFORD, Texarkana merchant; A S ZACHARY, another member of the Pittsburg bar; and many other Texarkanians.

NACOGDOCHES, TEXAS



Before the beginning of recorded history, Nacogdoches was a town. When its history began to be written, it was a busy Indian Settlement. Later it became the site of one of the first Spanish missions in Texas, was probably the first incorporated city in

Texas, served as one of the salient cradles of Texas liberty, and formed a force in the government of Texas as a Republic.

Legend has it that in the days of long ago an old Caddo chief lived on the bank of the Sabine River. He had twin sons who were NATCHITOCHEs, swarthy of features with straight black hair and flashing eyes, and NACOGDOCHES, fair of complexion with blue eyes and yellow hair. As the old chief neared his journey to the happy hunting ground, he called his sons to him.

Giving the young men his final blessing, the chief commanded that immediately after his death NATCHITOCHEs should gather his wives and children, turn his face toward the rising sun, and after three days' march build his home and rear his tribe. NACOGDOCHES was instructed to do likewise, but travel toward the setting sun.

Thus the twin tribes of NACOGDOCHES and NATCHITOCHEs were founded one hundred miles apart, and NACOGDOCHES became the father of the Tejas, the white Indians of East Texas. Sites of these Indian villages later became the cities of Nacogdoches, Texas, and Natchitoches, Louisiana.

When the Frenchman Robert Cavalier, la sieur de LaSalle, came to Texas, he was searching for the mouth of the Mississippi River which had been claimed at its head waters by the French. However, the Spaniards in Mexico believed Texas belonged to them, and in each strengthening their claims, for the next eighty years Texas was beset with invasions from both peoples.

It is possible to suppose that in 1685 LaSalle spent several months in the Indian town of Nacogdoches. He was desperately ill that winter and received hospitable care from the Indians.

Alonzo de Leon, appointed governor of Coahuila and Texas, by the Spaniards in 1689, visited among the Tejas Indians, taking several of the young members of the tribe back to the College of Zacatecas in Mexico to educate them. Among these were two children of the chief of the Hainai Indians who then lived on the Angelina about eighteen miles southwest of Nacogdoches. The young man, who afterwards became chief of the Hasinai Confederation, was called Bernadino. The Spaniards named the

young woman Angelina, and later the river was named for her. She served as an interpreter between the Indians and the Spanish explorers.

Countering de Leon's work, the French in 1714 sent Huchereau St. Denis through Texas to the Rio Grande, by way of Nacogdoches. However, after being seized and imprisoned in Mexico, St. Denis married the daughter of a Mexican commandante and in 1715 led Captain Don Domingo Ramon, Spaniard, and his forces into Texas to establish posts and missions. It was in June, 1716, that a member of Don Ramon's party, Fray Antonio Margil de Jesus, founded the Mission Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe de Nacogdoches - the Mission of Our Lady of Guadalupe of Nacogdoches.

Captain Gil Y'Barbo was the first commandante of Nacogdoches. His house, now referred to as the Old Stone Fort, had walls almost a yard in thickness.

One feature of the Magee-Gutierrez Expedition into Texas in 1812-13 was the publication of the first newspaper in Texas, "The Texas Gazette", datelined Nacogdoches, May, 1813. A photostat of this paper may be seen in the Old Stone Fort.

The Empresario Period began after 1821 which saw Stephen F. Austin emerge as the most widely-known leader. Haden Edwards received his empresario grant in 1825, and after the Mexican government decided in favor of the Mexican people in Nacogdoches in their conflict with Edwards' colonists, Edwards declared Texas an independent republic in 1826 in a movement known as the Fredonia Rebellion.

The battle of Nacogdoches, said to be the "opening gun" in the Texas Revolution, was primarily caused from a Mexican decree in 1830 in which colonists from the United States were barred from Texas.

A portentous event of late 1832 was the coming to Texas of Sam Houston. Houston came by way of Nacogdoches, went on to San Felipe and San Antonio, then back to Nacogdoches to make his home.

It is said that Nacogdoches financed the Texas Revolution. Such men as Colonel Frost Thorne, Haden Edwards, Adolphus Sterne, Charles S. Taylor, John S. Roberts, William G. Logan, Henry Raguet, Dr. James H. Starr, John Forbes, Kelsey H. Douglass, William B. Ochiltree, and others combined their efforts in feeding and arming men coming to the defense of the new Republic.

It was a place of glorious deeds and glorious sacrifices - the Nacogdoches that was an Indian town when the first explorers arrived and has since seen nine flags wave in its

skies: The lilies of France with La Salle in 1685, the flag of Castile and Aragon of Spain in 1716, the green flag of the Magee-Gutierrez Expedition of 1813, Long's flag of the First Republic of Fredonia in 1826, the flag of the Mexican Republic in 1821-36, the Lone Star Flag of the Republic of Texas, the Stars and Bars of the Confederacy in 1861-65, and finally, with the Lone Star Flag, the Stars and Stripes.

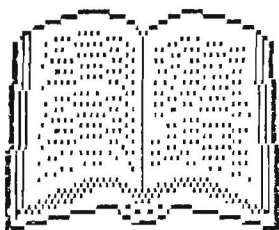

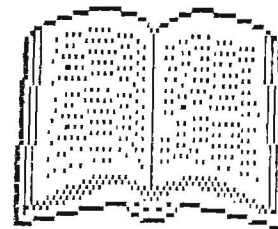

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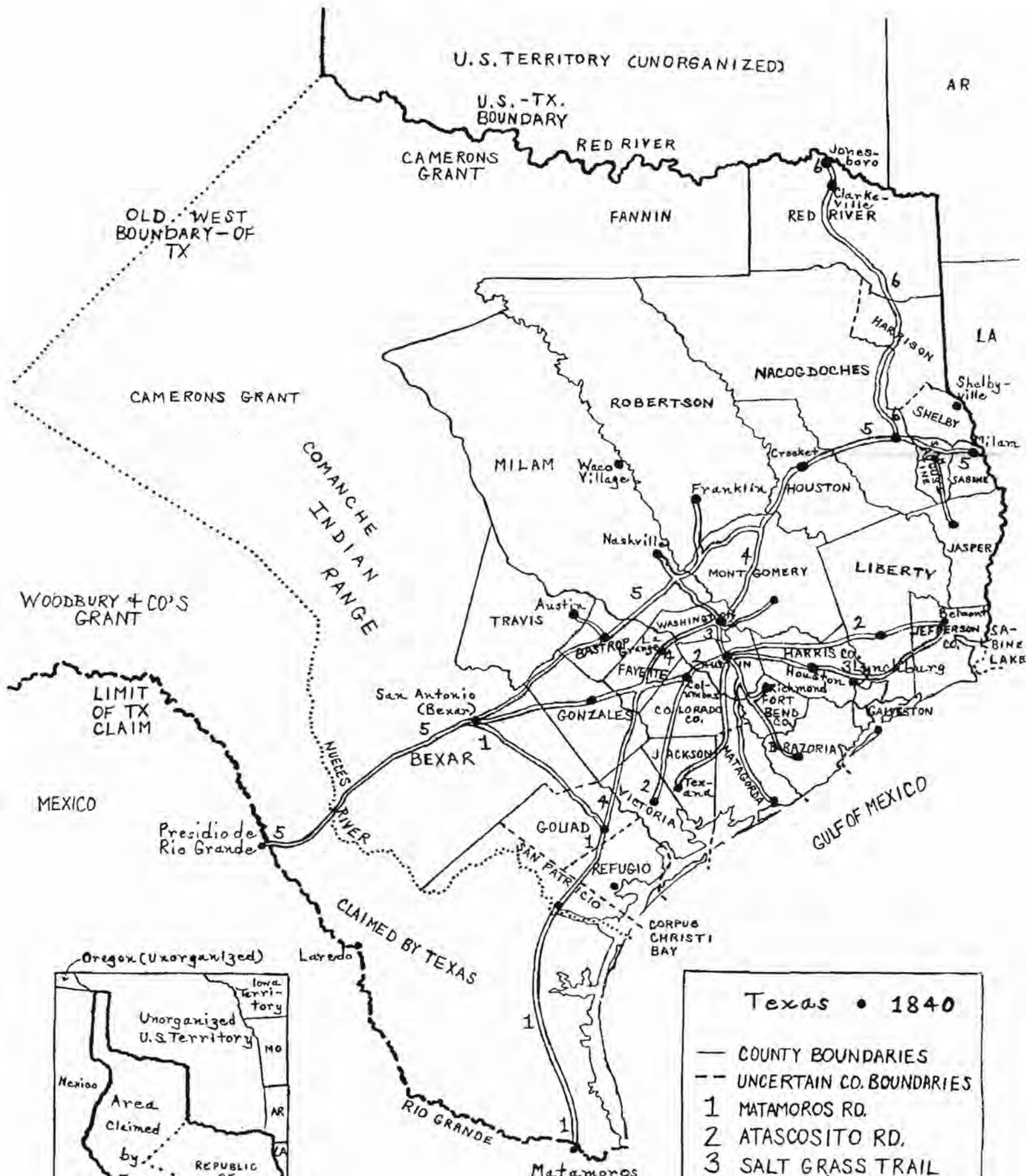
