HISTORY OF THE KENNEDY-CALLEN-ARMSTRONG FAMILIES

continued from Vol. 5 number 3:

On 23 Oct 1896 at Many LA, Hugh Hamilton KENNEDY married Miss Betty Fisher SMITH, the daughter of Senator J. Fisher SMITH. They have no children.

Robert McGough ARMSTRONG, having married into the KENNEDY family, is entitled to special mention. In his own family Bible he wrote, "I am the son of James Harrison ARMSTRONG, born in Nashville Tenn. in 1796, where my grandfather, Capt. William Hamilton ARMSTRONG had gone to help Gov. SEVIER and Gen. Robert Conrad ARMSTRONG, my cousin, fight the Creek Indians. My mother was Mary McGOUGH, born at Ft. Augusta GA in 1795. My paternal grandfather was Capt. William Hamilton ARMSTRONG of the Pennsylvania line in the Revolution, born at Bethlehem, PA 4 Jul 1756. He fought through the Revolution under Gen. Anthony WAYNE, then joined the regular army and was stationed at Ft. Pitt (Pittsburg) at Ft. Washington (Cincinnati) and at Ft. Wayne. My grandmother was Mary Randolph HARRISON, granddaughter of Benjamin HARRISON and Peyton RANDOLPH of VA, born in 1753. My great grandfather was Thomas Alexander ARMSTRONG born in Duahada Parish Ireland, 1726. My great grandmother was Lady Jane HAMILTON, born at the House of HAMILTON in Scotland in 1729. Her father was the Duke of James Michelle HAMILTON, the fourth Duke of the House of HAMILTON and BRANDON."

(editor note: the next page of this family history has always been missing, according to the family - continuing on the next page, somewhere in a paragraph)

Jane Minerva KENNEDY's fourth child was born in AL in 1843, named for her grandmother, Elizabeth Simpson ARMSTRONG. She married B. F. WAGLEY. The fifth child was Agnes Alabama ARMSTRONG, born in AL 22 Feb 1845. She married G. M. BROOKS and died 12 Sep 1869 when 23 years of age. The sixth child was born in AL in 1847. She was named Jane Minerva after her beautiful mother. She married Mr. Polk RAINS, called Doda, of Marthaville. At the time of Robert McGough ARMSTRONG's coming to LA, he was just a little past 31 years of age, yet a husband and father of six children.

They reached LA late in December of 1847 and did not gain legal possession of the lands of Sabine Parish upon which they had settled and built their hewn log houses, until 1851. Robert McGough ARMSTRONG bought a large tract of land and built a commodious house suited to his large family. There four more children were born. The 7th child was called Geneva Harrison and was born in 1849. She married Isaac RAINS, brother to Polk RAINS and was the mother of 8 boys and 1 girl. The eighth child was Richard Laurence who died. The ninth child was Cinthia Loraine. She married James BOZEMAN. One of their daughters, Vivette, called Dump, married her cousin, Hon. T. C. ARMSTRONG of Pleasant Hill, LA. They had Emilie, Mary, and Wilhelmina. The tenth child of Robert McGough ARMSTRONG and wife was Louisiana McGough ARMSTRONG, who married first, Tom JACKSON and at his death married Sini DuBOSE. The 11th child is William Hamilton ARMSTRONG. He married Alice RACHAL of Ft. Jessup, LA. One son,

born to them is Amos Lee ARMSTRONG, a famous artist. Another son is William Hamilton ARMSTRONG 4th, a prosperous businessman in Monroe, LA. A third son is C. E. ARMSTRONG; a fourth son is H. M. ARMSTRONG. Three daughters were: Mrs. J. D. GERMAN of Many, LA; Mrs. L. B. SHADOIN; and Mrs. Daisy BAIRD.

Robert McGough ARMSTRONG and Jane Minerva KENNEDY ARMSTRONG's son Hugh Simpson Kennedy ARMSTRONG, lived and died as "Dick", while the wonderful name of Hamilton became "Hamp".

When some of William Hamilton ARMSTRONG's relatives from Pleasant Hill, LA attended his funeral at Many, LA they took with them his childhood nurse, and aged Negro, locally known as "Hannah I.T." Hannah's mother was a slave of Jane Minerva KENNEDY ARMSTRONG and came with them from AL in 1847. She was called "Long waisted Emeline". She was a faithful servant and devoted to her mistress. She, out of all the covered wagon caravan of 1847, was the only person to go back to Selma, AL and visit old friends and places. When she returned, she brought back chestnuts that grew on the old KENNEDY, CALLEN and ARMSTRONG farms.

Now to make you understand and appreciate the honor of being called Hamilton, I will describe to you the home of Duke of HAMILTON and BRANDON in Scotland: It is situated just east of the River Avon and Clyde and is 10 miles from Glasgow. One historian says "The House of Hamilton was one of the most distinguished places in the world". "It was a magnificent building. The projecting front portice was made like that of the Temple of Jupiter, at Rome. Each of the 12 pillars of the portico is a

simple block of stone and each took 30 horses to draw it from the quarry. Up to the year 1882, this palace contained the finest collection of books and paintings in the world. They were largely collected by the 10th Duke of Hamilton."

When James ARMSTRONG, son of Sir Thomas Alexander ARMSTRONG and the Lady Jane HAMILTON, made himself famous as "James ARMSTRONG, the Lighting Chaplain of Light Horse Harry LEE's Legion", he visited this kinsman of his mother, the 10th Duke of Hamilton at his palace in Scotland. He wished to continue his army service, but the Duke being at peace with the world, did not need a soldier, so he obtained for him a service as a dragon and palace guard at the English court of St. James. This act so incensed Thomas Alexander ARMSTRONG that he never forgave his son for entering English service, so soon after the war, James married into the celebrated LIVINGSTON family and his son was the famous Gen. Robert Conrad ARMSTRONG, celebrated newspaperman and Ambassador to the Court of St. James. Gen. Andrew JACKSON left his sword.

This manor House of Hamilton was very ornate inside and there were 10,000 acres of land surrounding it. The mausoleum that holds the ashes of Duke of Hamilton is in the enclosure.

Lady Jane, who married Thomas ARMSTRONG, and Lady Anne, who married Col. McAFEE, were the daughters of James Michelle, the 5th Duke. His father, the 4th Duke, was killed in a duel. His wife was "Duchess Anne". This James Michelle HAMILTON was born in 1703 and died in 1743. King James of England transferred the House of Hamilton to Ireland.

According to Lady Jane HAMILTON's son, Col. John ARMSTRONG, his father and mother went to Londonderry to be married and there they lived for 4 years. His brother James, the "Fighting Chaplain of the Revolution" and his sister, Nancy who married the celebrated Col. Ephraim McADAMS, were born in Londonderry, then came to York, PA and settled for 5 years on the manor of the Masque. They then moved to Bethlehem where he and his brother, William HAMILTON and his other sister, were born.

The McWHORTER family, previously mentioned, was distinguished. They had a family coat of arms. They originally came from Roskilde, Denmark and settled on the eastern shore of Loch Lomond in Scotland. In this new country they were Highlanders. I pause here to say that my grandmother, Mrs. James Harrison ARMSTRONG, who lived to be almost a hundred, was the granddaughter of Agnes McWHORTER, this same clan. She treasured a red and black checked tartan, which was the property of an ancestor who was a Highland Chief. These were placed in her coffin and mouldered in the dust of Pisgah burying ground. Their coat of arms may be found in any illustrated clan work. In APPLETON's Encyclopedia it says: "The Chief of the McWHORTER clan, Hugh McWHORTER came from Armagh, Ireland to America in 1730. With them were relations, the McGOUGHS". They settled in New Castle, DE. Hugh McWHORTER's wife is known only as Jane. A son, Elbert McWHORTER, was born 6 May 1731 at New Castle. He was the father of Agnes McWHORTER and grandfather of Mrs. James Harrison McWhorter ARMSTRONG. Elbert McWHORTER had a sister whom he named his daughter for. Agnes McWHORTER, this daughter of Elbert's, was very beautiful with wonderful auburn hair. Her

personality was so strong that she handed down that wonderful auburn hair to 1 daughter, to Joe ARMSTRONG, to Milly ARMSTRONG, to Dr. Clifton ARMSTRONG, to Lillian ARMSTRONG, to the 5 sons and daughters of Lillian ARMSTRONG CORNWALL, and to every one of her 9 grandchildren - think of that!

The McWHORTER family shield was in shape of an antique harp with 9 strings. Each string represented a branch of the family. Chief Hugh McWHORTER had a son Rev. Dr. Alexander McWHORTER, who was a highly educated Presbyterian minister. He helped collect funds to rebuild Princeton College which has been burned by the British. He built Charlotte Academy in NC and was the first president. He had a sister, Nancy that married Alexander OSBORN.

I have told you of tracing our line of KENNEDY back to Ayrshire Kennedys, the Earl of Cassillis. They lived in a beautiful place called "Castle Kennedy". It stood on an isthmus between the Black and White Lakes in a ground of 4,000 acres. This castle was erected by King James 4th, for the renowned Earle of Kennedy of Cassilis. It was struck by lightning and burned to the ground and was never rebuilt, but it is still famous because of the very beautiful garden.

I have found 3 coats of arms for the KENNEDY family. There were 7 branches of the ARMSTRONGs. Ours belonged to the coat of arms for Northumberland, English branch to which our first ancestor, Siward, Earl of Northumberland, England, belonged. He was the first man on earth to be called "ARMSTRONG" and it happened this way. He was riding one day with his sister's husband, "Good King Duncan of Scotland", in a dense wood. A large tree fell across the King's path. Earl Siward BEORN dismounted and with his mighty strength lifted up the tree and removed it from the King's path. So the King said, "Never more shalt thou be called BEORNE, but henceforth thou shalt be called by all men "ARMSTRONG".

Nancy KENNEDY, daughter of Hugh Simpson KENNEDY, and Elizabeth SIMPSON KENNEDY, married John K. CALLEN of AL. She was a sister of Hugh Hamilton KENNEDY and Jane Minerva KENNEDY ARMSTRONG. She was the first woman to own a sewing machine in Dallas County AL. She made a trip to Sabine Parish LA in 1867 to visit her sisters and brothers and friends, but no one in the caravan of the covered wagon of 1847 ever went back to visit her.

Obituary from The Eureka Herald in Kansas, 18 Nov 1880

William PRESTON, the helpless cripple who most of our people have noticed on the streets of Eureka for a few years past, died Wednesday night of last week. He was a most distressing cripple; both legs were shattered by a shell during the war and the woulds never entirely healed up. He was in pain most times and required almost constant attention and assistance. He was a Creole, born in New Orleans and became a sailor in early life, but when war broke out he joined the Union Army. He possessed the unfortunate Creole pride that prefers to suffer rather than let its necessities be made known. He had no means of support save a pension of \$18 a month, which in his deplorable condition was an exceeding scanty allowance for himself and family. He had been sick for 4 or 5 days before anyone outside of his family discovered it and then it was too late to give him any relief. He was delirious and very weak when the doctor visited him of Wednesday morning and nothing could stay the rapid advance made by death. His funeral took place Thursday and was attended by a number of the Garfield Guards with fife and drum. Being of the Catholic faith and there being no priest present, the burial service was conducted by Mr. James MURPHY.

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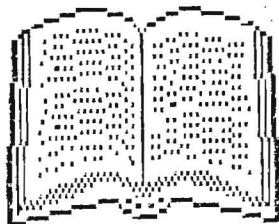

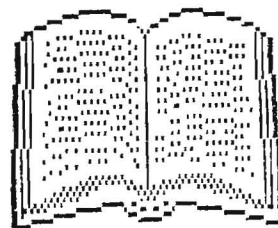

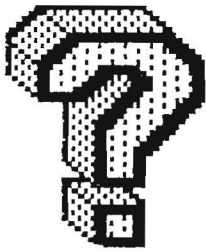

HISTORICAL MISCELLANY

Red River in northern Texas, in the Llano Estacado, or High Plains, flowing east by south in Texas, between Texas and Oklahoma, and to Fulton in southwestern Arkansas. turning southeast, it continues in that general direction through Louisiana, and discharges partly into the Mississippi and partly into the Atchafalaya.

The great Red River Raft, which was formed by trees felled by the river, extended from Loggy Bayou 65 miles below Shreveport to Hurricane Bluffs 27 miles above Shreveport. By 1841 Capt. Henry Miller Shreve had opened a channel in the Red, permitting river traffic to flow.

1. Rose Hill (I.T.), southeast of Huigo, OK. Grounds and burial ground of Col. Robert M. Jones.
2. Pine Bluffs (TX), a village northwest of Clarksville.
3. Pecan Point (I.T.), on the north side of the Red River some miles below the mouth of the Kiamichi River.
4. Port Caddo-1836 Port of entry for the Republic of Texas. Served as custom's office for steamboats operating on Red River, Big Cypress, and Caddo Lake. Only a ca 1850 log house remains which is thought to have been the customs house.
5. Trails and Roads in the vicinity of Fulton Landing (AR): Mill or Washington Road; Long's Trail; Washington-Old Shreveport Road; Southwest Trail.
6. Texas Trail, crossed the Red at Shreveport.
7. Greenwood (LA), once the last outpost on the wagon trail between Shreveport and the Republic of Texas.
8. Bennett's Bluff, located on the "Upper Bluffs" (now Shreveport) on the west bank of the Red. Earliest date mentioned is 1832.
9. Coats (Coates) Bluff, store site of Jim Coats, was located on the "Lower Bluffs." He later moved to the east side of the river.

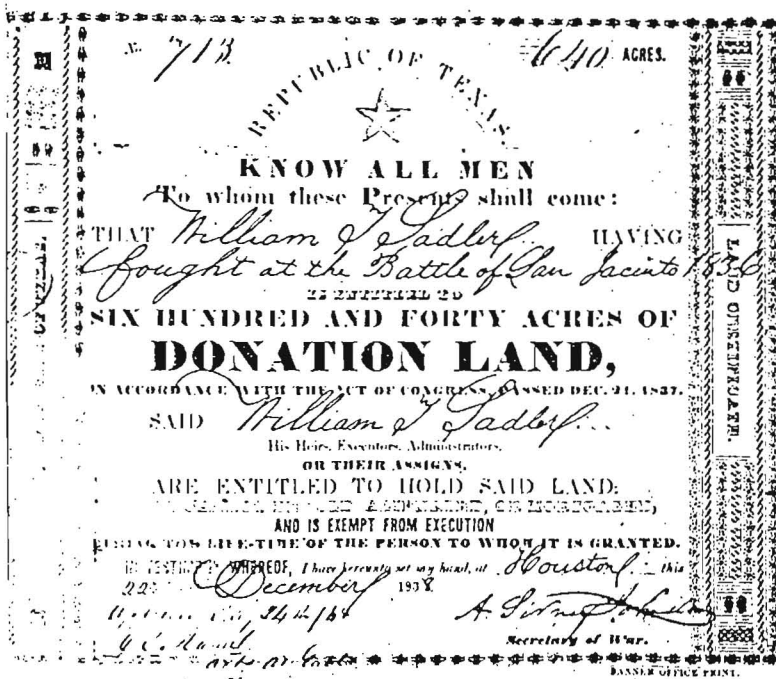

TEXAS HEADRIGHT CERTIFICATES



There were four classes of headright certificates. The first class was defined in the Constitution of 1836. Every person, unless African or Indian, living in Texas on March 2, was entitled to a league and labor if a family head, one-third of a league if a single man 17 years of age or older.

Second class headrights went to heads of families and single men who reached Texas after March 2, 1836, and prior to October 1, 1837, provided they

remained in Texas three years and performed duties of citizenship. Family heads were eligible for 1,280 acres each and single men for half as much.

Third class headrights provided for immigrants after Oct. 1st, 1837, and before Jan. 1st, 1842. Heads of families received 640 acres each and single men 320.

Fourth class certificates were awarded to immigrants who reached Texas after Jan. 1, 1840, and before Jan. 1, 1842. Young residents who became 17 after Jan. 1, 1840, were also eligible for land under this classification. Certificates provided for 640 and 320 acres each according to family status.

Such certificates were issued by the Board of Land Commissioners and were then located in the open domain. Both location and survey were the land claimant's responsibility.

Inspired by witnessing the Convention of the People of Mississippi upon adopting an Ordinance of Secession on Jan. 9, 1861, Harry McCarthy, an Irish-born actor, wrote "The Bonnie Blue Flag" which was destined to become the second most popular patriotic song in the Confederacy. I Publish the Banns of Marriage between M. of ____ and N. of _____. If any of you know cause, or just impediment, why these two persons should not be joined together in holy Matrimony, ye are to declare it. This is the first [second, or third] time of asking.

And if the persons that are to be married dwell in divers Parishes, the Banns must be asked in both Parishes; and the Curate of the one Parish shall not solemnize Matrimony betwixt them, without a Certificate of the Banns being thrice asked, from the Curate of the other Parish.

At the day and time appointed for solemnization of Matrimony, the persons to be married shall come into the body of the Church with their friends and neighbours: and there standing together, the Man on the right hand, and the Woman on the left, the Priest shall say, DEARLY beloved.....

It is convenient that the new-married persons should receive the holy Communion at the time of their Marriage, or at the first opportunity after their Marriage.

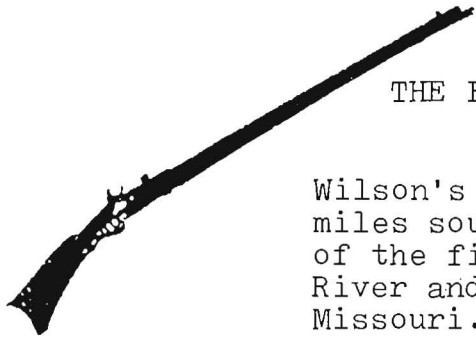

THE BATTLE OF WILSON'S CREEK
August 10, 1861

Wilson's Creek National Battlefield, located 10 miles southwest of Springfield, MO, was the scene of the first major battle west of the Mississippi River and marked the start of the Civil War in Missouri.

The Confederate troops numbering about 10,000 were pitted against 5,400 Federals on that day. When the six-hour battle was over, 1,317 Union soldiers were either dead, wounded or captured. The Rebels, who won the battle, suffered 1,230 troops killed or injured. Nathaniel LYON took a bullet in the heart and became the first Federal general killed in battle.

Commander of the Confederate forces at Wilson's Creek was Gen. Ben McCULLOCH who was killed at the battle of Elkhorn, Pea Ridge, Arkansas on 7 March 1862. (He and his brother Henry Eustace McCulloch removed to Texas from Tennessee in the 1830s, and became Texans of note. Both held the rank of brigadier general in the Confederate forces. - assoc. ed. F.O.G.). If you're a veteran of American military service (or currently on active duty), a new organization called Registry of American Veterans might help you find old buddies you served with. On a database, its purpose is to connect former military friends. Vets may write for a form to get themselves registered to: Registry of American Veterans, PO Box 51148, Riverside CA 92517.

When submitting forms to the Federal Archives for military records, always include the wording: "Send Complete Medical File." The reason being that medical records are not filed with the military records and if your veteran was injured, hospitalized or received a medical discharge, there could be helpful info in the medical file, but you must ask for it.

The modern Woodmen of America (Woodmen of the World - WOW) is a fraternal benefit society founded in 1883. The office has a historian who answers letters from researchers. The name and date of death are needed for a search. Records before 1912 are more detailed than later ones. Send SASE to Modern Woodmen of America, Mr. G.A. Need to locate an old cemetery in Wisconsin? Try writing: Wisconsin Old Cemetery Society, 3500 92nd Street, Milwaukee WI 53228.

If your ancestor was a Texas Mason, you may be able to get info from the Masonic Grand Lodge, PO Box 446, Waco TX 76703.

The Collin County Texas Genealogical Society welcomes queries pertaining to their county. Write them at PO Box 865052, Plano, Texas 75086-5052.

Did your American ancestor go to sea in the 1800's? If so, perhaps he applied for the "Seaman's Protection Certificate", which was designed to stop the British from impressing Americans into the British Navy on the high seas. These certificates were issued from 1796 to 1897 and were especially popular from 1796 to 1820. For info write: Archives Division, National Archives, Washington, D.C. 20408.

From prison to genealogy center, that's the tale of the old

From prison to genealogy center, that's the tale of the old Panola County Texas jail, built in 1891. Replaced in 1953 for a new jail, the building stood empty and neglected until folks in Carthage decided two stories could become one. The old jail needed to be saved and the historical society needed a place to house their research materials. The result is a quaint place to research and very friendly folks to help.

An announcement from the Virginia State Library and Archives states that all out-of-state research requests must include a fee of \$10.00 to begin. The fee covers 30 minutes of staff research and 3 copies if the info is found. If microfilm or more copies are required, a bill will be sent.

Have you ever found the letters H/F following a person's name in a marriage or birth record? It stands for the term HANDFAST and is basically a sign of the confirmation of a form of uncannonical private or even a probationary form of marriage. Handfasting was a form of announcing a union between a man and woman who wished to live together as husband and wife before receiving the blessing of the church. The couple would stand before a group of their peers, hold their clasped hands above their heads, and state their intentions. The agreement was good for a year and a day, or until the preacher came to perform the rituals of the church. If, at the end of the specified time, each wished to go his own way, they could do so with no ties. No matter what happened, any children born of a Handfast were considered legitimate, and would inherit.

The Bureau of Land Management's Eastern States Office in Springfield, VA holds more than 5 million land documents for homesteads, cash sales and military warrants dating from the late 1700's for the 13 public land sales states. The Bureau has recently announced the General Land Office (GLO) Automated Retrieval System, the enormous task of recording the historic info using a specially designed computer system. Now, you can request land title info through any one of 6 categories: land description, patentee name, patent authority, land office, certificate number, or county (you used to have to know the complete legal description of the land). Only 6 states are ready now: AR, FL, LA, MI, MN, & WI. Next to be released: MS, OH, & AL. You may open an account with BLM using a major credit card and your own password.
