ATTACKS on the Colors

Confederate Records Crumble Away From The Confederate Gazette, John Perry, Editor



Southern culture has been besieged on many fronts in recent years, but the biggest loser may well be the records of the Confederate government. The records, which include payrolls, hospital records, prison records, governmental correspondence, bills passed by the Confederate Congress, and the all important Confederate Army muster rolls, are simply being allowed to decay. Over 5,730 cubic feet of Confederate records are held hostage in the National Archives destined to eventually fade completely away.

After the Confederate government fell, the official Confederate Government records, that had been well maintained by Inspector Adjutant General Samuel COOPER, passed into the hands of Federal forces. Initially, each document was stamped, "Rebel Archives," and they were held in the War Department in Washington, D.C. Today the records are kept in the National Archives' central facility on Pennsylvania Avenue in Washington.

The records are badly deteriorating according to various Archives' personnell. Archivist Dr. Michael MEIR stated, "They're going to seed quickly." The records are being kept in stacks of ordinary cardboard boxes with no precautions being taken to preserve them. There are two main reasons why the records are in such a state.

Part of the problem is the documents themselves. The Confederacy suffered through many shortages and one major shortage was paper. Toward the end of the war, paper was virtually not available. Southern newspapers had to resorst to printing issues on the backs of wallpaper.

The Confederate government used captured Union paper or made its own lesser grade paper. Ink was also very scarce. Many different generals had their own recipe for making ink to do their required paper work. Ink was often made from ingredients such as vinegar and pine bark.

The other problem is a political one. The National Archives is the official depository of all documents relating to American history, from 1776, to the recent Gulf War.

Federal agencies, from the Department of Agriculture to the Veterans Administration and commissions of all kinds, annually deposit approximately 4 billion documents. With limited air conditioned and climate control space, each agency and commission lobbies for its documents to be preserved.

Unfortunately, there is no acative Confederate Government to lobby for proper care of its documents. As put by archivist Bill LIND, "There's nobody to speak for the dead....My ancestors were Yankees, but I think it's a crime that those records (Confederate) are sitting there with nobody to defend them, " LIND said

Perhaps of all the records that are decaying, the greatest loss will be muster rolls of the Confederate Army. There are literally hundreds of thousands of muster rolls wher Confederate commanders kept tabs on companies and regiments. The rolls were

drawn up every two months and recorded were the names of those active, those that were sick, absent or injured, the condition of the company's supplies, arms, and discipline and even battles, skirmishes, and marches.

(muster rolls) are an absolute irreplaceable "They resource," according to Robert KRICK, chief historian at the Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park. Without these records, serious research cannot be done. "They are an

invaluable piece of our historical heritage, " KRICK said.

Unfortunately, the Archives does not have any plans to even microfilm the documents. Pointing out budgetary constraints, the Archives claims it does not have the funds to either film or preserve the documents. Last year, however, the Archives did find the funds to preserve the muster rolls of the 54th Massachusetts, the black regiment fictionalized in the movie "Glory."

In the sterile atmosphere of the Archives preservation lab the 54th's records were painstakingly restored, microfilmed and then encapsulated in plastic film to last forever. Unfortunately, the Confederate records are today not "politically correct" and continue to rot away to nothing in ordinary cardboard boxes in the Archives basement.

A new state of the art Archives II building, with all the correct climate controls, has been constructed in College Park, Maryland. Again, without political clout, Confederate records will not be moved. What will be moved? Among other records, the valuable memoirs of the now defunct Federal Supply Service, which handled important janitorial matters for the Federal government.

What can be done? It will probably require Congressional action to appropriate the necessary funds to preserve our heritage. Write your Congressional representatives before it is too late!!

THE SANBORN MAPS An Excellent Reference by Reuben Feuge

A map can become an important tool whether modeling the prototype, or researching the past. The Sanborn maps were started by D.A. SANBORN, a civil engineer, when asked to conduct a survey for the Aetna Insurance Company. Mr. SANBORN was so impressed that, in 1876, he founded the Sanborn Map and Publishing Co., LTD. In 1902, it was incorporated into its present form, the Sanborn Map Co., Inc.

These maps have become important reference material for various government agencies, private companies, and the public utilities. Since they were originally prepared for the insurance rating services, they contain information such as water lines, hydrant locations, and other information needed for the insurance rating. In addition, structures, streets, and rail lines are shown. Most of the mapping was started in the early 1890s and the company claims that any town with over 1,000 inhabitants has been mapped.

Locating the Sanborn maps is not difficult as many major libraries carry them. Sanborn's covering the New Orleans area are at the main branch. In addition, the university libraries have copies on file; sets showing most other cities in Louisiana are also on file. Both libraries have bound volumes from various times, as well as complete sets on microfilm.

The Library of Congress carries a complete set of all the Sanborn maps covering all cities in the United States. They are arranged by city and state, and located in the map reading room. There is also a book available to assist you in your research: Fire Insurance Maps in the Library of Congress: Plans of North American Cities and Towns produced by the Sanborn Map Company, 1980, pg 773 (S/N 030-004-00018-1) \$29.00. This would be especially useful if you are studying various cities across the United States. Sanborn can provide you with any of their maps: Sanborn Map Company, 629 Fifth Street, Pelham, New York, 10803. These are black and white prints on 17"x22" paper. Scale accuracy is very good.

If using a bound volume, you will have the advantage of having the structures color-coded. Unfortunately, the newer maps and microfilm are not color-coded. The different colors represented the material used in the construction of the building and I have provided a chart to assist you if you are using the older bound volumes:







Small stores were listed with an "S"; this usually pertained to smaller business establishments.

CAROLINA NOBILITY

Lord ASHLEY, with the aid of his secretary John LOCKE, drafted a curious document called "The Fundamental Constitutions of Carolina." This was the longest, most fantastic and reactionary of all colonial frames of government, and created a Carolina nobility:

BARON, and Lord of the Manor: Any one who purchased 30,000 acres.

CASSIQUE: Anyone who owned 1,200 acres.

LANDGRAVE - a German title: Anyone who owned 20,000 acres.

The common people could elect members of a house of commons but no bill could become law unless consented to by a majority of the barons, cassiques, landgraves, and the proprietors (large extent of land with all governing powers given by a king to an individual).

CONFEDERATE TRAINING CAMP IS OPEN AGAIN AFTER 7 YEARS

Camp Moore was closed in 1986 during budget crunch.

The Confederacy's largest training camp--a place where troops from three states brawled until they were sent to the front--is once more open to the public.

Camp Moore is the one spot where the Confederate Army tried to create a federal-style Army. Other states had several local camps each, historian Sam HYDE said.

"They found it beneficial to keep the Louisiana, Mississippi and Arkansas boys separate because they tended to fight so much among themselves," he added. Tangipahoa

The historic Camp Moore, the largest Confederate training camp, has reopened.

Between 70,000 and 80,000 raw recruits were drilled into soldiers at the camp outside the town of Tangipahoa, north of Hammond near the Mississippi border.

"Gen. Edward D. TRACY said he needed to move the troops out of Camp Moore quickly so they could fight the Yankees before killing themselves," Said HYDE, an assistant professor at the University of Southwestern Louisiana.

It may also have been the only camp where ranger were taught to bushwhack Union Soldiers, HYDE said.

The camp was among 22 historical sites closed in September 1986 because of state budget problems. Some reopened. But it took the dedication of two men whose fathers opened the camp and its museum to get Camp Moore back open. It reopened to the public June 1, 1993.

Camp Moore was founded six weeks after Louisiana's secession from the Union in January 1861. It flew the flag of the Independent Republic of Louisiana- a dozen or so horizontal strips of red, yellow and white- until the Confederacy was formed.

Units which trained there included parts of the Louisiana Tigers, the Washington Artillery, the 4th Louisiana Regiment, which started with nearly 1,000 men and lost 95 of them during the war, and were merged with the 11th Louisiana Regiment after a disastrous battle in Franklin, Teen.

The 11th was shipped off to Tennessee in a rush in 1862, after it led a whiskey riot that took three days to quell, HYDE said.

A train loaded with whiskey had stopped near the cap. When the troops learned its cargo, they broke in and started passing the liquor around.




