
Remember that Friends of Genealogy needs your support. Each of us is important to our organization - each of us needs to support and work for FOG.

PILGRIMAGE for the MOTHERS and WIDOWS  
of Louisiana Soldiers, Sailors, & Marines of the American Forces  
Now Interred in the Cemeteries of Europe  
As Provided by The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929

This record was located in the Prescott Memorial Library, Louisiana Tech University, Ruston, Louisiana in the Government Documents Department. The records are on microfiche - House Document No. 140 of the 71st Congress, 2nd Session, published in 1930 by the United States Government Printing Office.

The letter of transmittal from the War Department to the Speaker of the House of Representatives in Washington, December 6, 1929, reads in part: "...An act to enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors, and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries, an investigation was made for the purpose of determining (1) the total number of mothers and widows entitled to make the pilgrimages (2) the number of such mothers and widows who desire to make the pilgrimages (3) the number who desire to make the pilgrimages during the calendar year 1930 and (4) the probable cost of the pilgrimages to be made. ....Letters were written to the relative or person who authorized the burial in the cemeteries of Europe of each deceased soldier, sailor, and marine now interred in Europe, requesting information as to the name and address of the mother or widow if there be such. ....On November 15, 1929, the investigation showed the following:

11,440 mothers & widows were entitled to make the pilgrimage  
6,730 mothers & widows desired to make the pilgrimage  
5,323 mothers & widows desired to make the pilgrimage in the  
calendar year 1930  
probable cost of the pilgrimage would be \$5,653,200  
estimated cost per person - \$840

Information arranged by state, then county and lists the name and address of the mother or widow, relationship, name of deceased & his rank, organization, name of cemetery, whether the mother or widow desired to make the pilgrimage, and whether in 1930 or at a later time.

I extracted the names from Louisiana, Arkansas, and Mississippi and will include these in the issues for 1994.

## CLAIBORNE LINEAGE



The first mention in history of Col. Wm. Claiborne, the founder of the family of that name in Virginia, is on his coming thither in the party of Sir Francis WYATT, when he was appointed by King James I. surveyor of the new country in 1621. The name has been variously rendered: CLEYBORN, CLIBORN, CLEBURN, CLAIBORN, CLAIBORNE, etc., the last being the form used by Col. Wm. Claiborne, and which has obtained in the United States.

The branches of the family in Yorkshire and Westmoreland, England, and in Ireland, use a different orthography-but are of common lineage. Col. Wm. was the son of Edmund and Grace (BELLINGHAM) CLIBORNE, of Westmoreland, and came to Virginia in early manhood. Appointed member of Colonial Council August 26, 1624, and Secretary of State March 24, 1625. During 1625-9 CLAIBORNE made extended explorations in the territory of the Colony under charter from Charles I., and founded a settlement and trading establishment with the Indians upon Kent Island. His claim to which was resisted by Lord BALTIMORE, and hence the quarrel between Virginia and Maryland and the contest between Lord BALTIMORE and Col. CLAIBORNE, in prosecuting which the latter acquired the historical distinction of "rebel," which had no warrant save in the fickle temper of a bigoted king, who pledged and retracted, and who gave, revoked, and gave again, as his passion swayed him, or as he deemed his interests indicated. The dispute resulted in the imprisonment of CLAIBORNE, and in his being deprived of his just landed rights, together with a loss of £ 5,000, expended by him in furtherance of the settlement on Kent Island.

In 1650 Col. Wm. CLAIBORNE was appointed by Parliament, then in power, one of the Commissioners to reduce Virginia to the authority of the Commonwealth. Col. CLAIBORNE was holding the office of Treasurer of Virginia, from which he was deposed in favor of Col. NORWOOD, a royalist, by whose assistance Gov. BERKELEY endeavored to keep Virginia loyal to the King.

Grants of land to the extent of more than 24,000 acres are of record in Virginia Land Office in the name of Col. CLAIBORNE. His family seat was "Romancock," situated in King William county, fourteen miles below the Court House and five miles above West Point. Here is the tomb of Lt. Col. Thomas CLAIBORNE, and at "Sweet Hall," another seat, a few miles above, are those of Capt. Thomas, Jr. and his son, Thomas CLAIBORNE, and of Mrs. Martha, wife of Leonard CLAIBORNE.

The name of the wife of Col. CLAIBORNE is not positively known, but according to tradition he married in England, in 1638, a Miss BULLER. He died sometime between 1673 and 1680. His grave cannot be pointed out.

His character has been thus gracefully summoned by a gifted biographer - the late Rev. S. F. STREETER, of Baltimore, Md.: "The hand of prejudice, prompted by personal subservience, traced on the tablet of history an inscription as unjust to the character and actions of the deceased, as unbecoming the the dignity of the historic muse. It has been reserved for an humble enquirer and a lover of the truth to erase the undeserved censure, and to erect a new cenotaph which displays the name of CLAIBORNE as worthy of honor and respect, and which ranks him who planted it in this country as a man of whom his descendants have reason to be proud,-one of the earliest pioneers of civilization; the first actual settler of the territory of Maryland, and among the most active and prominent citizens in the early colonial days of Virginia; and one of most remarkable men of his time."

- i. Wm.<sup>2</sup>, Lt. Col. distinguished himself in the Indian wars of Bacon's Rebellion.
- ii. Thos.<sup>2</sup>, Lt. Col., b. Aug. 17, 1647; m. DANDRIDGE; killed by Indians, Oct. 7, 1683. Among other issue was a son Thomas<sup>3</sup>, Capt., b. Dec. 16, 1680; d. Aug. 16, 1732, m. three times and had issue 27 children.

Of the 27, Nathaniel<sup>4</sup>, m. \_\_\_\_\_, and had issue:

Wm.<sup>5</sup>, who was the father of Wm. Chas. Cole, Gov. of La.; Gen'l Ferdinand L., Gov. of Miss.; Mary Leigh, who m. Bathurst CLAIBORNE<sup>5</sup>, and Franklin HERBERT, of Franklin county, Va., author of "Notes on the South."

p 5n: VOLTAIRE: "Heraldic knowledge is the science of fools with long memories."

p 6n: In the tenth century, the Christian names of the fathers were adopted by the sons as surnames.

GREENWOOD CEMETERY JEWISH SECTION (HEBREW REST  
CEMETERY NUMBER THREE)

SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA

Background:

Hebrew Rest Cemetery Number Three, commonly known as the Jewish Section of Greenwood Cemetery, is the fourth and newest Jewish cemetery in the city of Shreveport and the third established by the Reform Jewish Community of Shreveport, represented by Temple B'nai Zion.

This cemetery was established with the purchase of the southeast quadrant (two and one-quarter acres) of Greenwood Cemetery Number Two (namely, the east half of Greenwood Cemetery, which was annexed to the original cemetery grounds about 1930) from the City of Shreveport on January 9, 1933 for the total sum of \$6,750.00. This property transfer and its specifics can be found recorded in Record Book 316, page 427, Office of the Clerk of Court of Caddo Parish, Louisiana. An official map of the property can be found in Book 300, page 84.

Details regarding cemetery fees, policies, and plot availability are available from the Board or Cemetery Committee of Temple B'nai Zion, Shreveport, Louisiana, which owns and maintains the cemetery.

All three Hebrew Rest Cemeteries have received some manner of historic site designation. Hebrew Rest Number One (the Jewish Section of Oakland Cemetery) was listed on the National Register of Historic Places along with adjacent Oakland Cemetery in 1977, Hebrew Rest Number Two (Hebrew Rest) and Hebrew Rest Number Three (the Jewish Section of Greenwood Cemetery) were both nominated as charter entries to Shreveport's own local registry of Historic Sites, established in 1993. Hebrew Rest (No. 2) was so designated on its own merit; Hebrew Rest Number Three was so designated as part of Greenwood Cemetery which was so designated in its entirety.

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**LIBRARY SURVEY**

One of the assignments of American Genealogy-A Basic Course was to perform a survey of genealogical materials at the local library. Since Shreve Memorial Library has a fine genealogical department, I wanted to share some of the findings of the survey.

The Genealogical department is located on the third floor of the main library. The first row of shelves were the indexed for Census Records. Then the next row was dedicated to reference works in the Dewey Classification of 000. the following rows were arranged as family histories, military histories, DAR lineage Books. The rows were arranged in groupings by state.

The library has Kaminkow's Genealogies in the Library of Congress. and American Genealogical Index. Also of value was the Periodicals Source Index. The Shreveport Times from 1871 to 1970 and the New Your Times at about 1900 are available on microfilm, located on the first floor.

There was also the Louisiana Room which housed historical information regarding Shreveport and Caddo Parish. The Larkin Edwards Room which housed old and rare books. These was also a collection of Sanborne Maps in this room.

The third floor Genealogy Department has microfilm of census records mainly of the south and southeast. There are Mississippi Marriage Records, Revolutionary War records, tax records and parish court records for the state of Louisiana. Other microfilm may be ordered for use in the library through American Lending Library.

Four hundred sixty-five different periodicals were located in the Genealogy department. Friends of Genealogy exchange program has donated some of these periocials.

The Genealogy department will not loan out any of the genealogical material on interlibrary loan. However, the library does participate in interlibrary loan for other departments.

## HEREDITY AS AN AID TO GENEALOGY

The habit of genealogy is one not hazardous to your health if you do not fall off the ladder at the library, drop marriage Book A on your foot at the courthouse, or fall into a ditch looking for tombstones at the cemetery.

When we are looking for information to plug into those blank spaces on the pedigree chart, perhaps it is easy to ignore the past that heredity plays in determining what we are all like, and how this can, at times, aid us in the search for forbears of any family.

There is a medical fact which each serious genealogist should keep in the back of his or her mind when researching families. It is called Galot's Law.

"Each parent contributes, on an average, one-fourth, or (0.5) squared, of an individual's heritage, each grandparent one-sixteenth, or (0.5) to the fourth power and so on, the occupier of each ancestral place in the nth degree contributing (0.5) square to the nth power of the heritage."

Stated more simply, each parent contributes 1/4 of the inherited genes, grandparents each contribute 1/16, great grandparents 1/64, great great grandparents 1/256, and so on. This law would indicate that there is an infinitesimal part of Adam and Eve in all of us.

The inherited characteristics or qualities transmitted by parents may be described in several distinct ways.

- ° Criss-Cross - inheritance by offspring of characteristics from the parent of the opposite sex.
- ° Holandric - inheritance by all male children but not by female children.
- ° Maternal - the transmission of characteristics that are dependent on peculiarities of the egg cytoplasm produced by nuclear genes.
- ° Monofactorial - the acquisition of a characteristic or quality whose transmission depends upon a single gene.
- ° Multifactorial - characteristics whose manifestations are subject to modification by a number of genes.

Why would an article like this be found in a publication dedicated to genealogical subjects? Is there some connection which is of interest to those of us who inhabit musty places in search of our heritage or that of others? The obvious answer is that there is, indeed, a correlation between this information and what we do as researchers. Family traits and characteristics often play a part in determining which of two or more possibilities indicate the direction our research must take.

Although many of the details of human heredity are not known, it can be said in general that the child receives one-half of his or her genes from the natural father and mother. Along with the fractional parts contributed by grandparents, etc., these genes develop into characteristics which reflect those of the ancestors.

Before birth, these inherited traits are influenced by conditions within the mother's body. After birth, they are shaped in various ways by environmental influences such as diet, training and education.

In formation of the human embryo, the male and female seed each contribute 23 chromosomes, for a total of 46. The ovum and sperm are formed by a special process in which each one receives only one part of a chromosomes pair. Otherwise, the mathematical progression of cell division would increase the number of chromosomes in the same way that Galot's Law works. This guarantees that the amount of hereditary material in body cells remains constant from generation to generation.

Each time a cell divides, one-half of each chromosome is provided by the male and female portions. It is a matter of chance which member of each pair of chromosomes is found in the ovum and sperm. Incredible as it seems, there are about 70 trillion possible combinations of chromosomes that a child can inherit.

Some aspects of heredity are pretty well understood by most people. The inheritance of eye color, for example. It has been established by researchers that one gene may be more powerful in its influence than that of the other half of the pair that act on the same trait. The more powerful gene is then said to be dominant, and the other is said to be recessive. A gene that produces blue eyes, for example, is recessive to one that produces brown eyes.

Myopia is thought to be inherited. Just recently, I read that persons with nearsightedness were apt to be more intelligent than persons with better sight. If you carry that just a step further, does it mean that severely myopic persons are more intelligent than those with less of a problem? I have heard that this trait is usually inherited from the mother, although I have no scientific basis for it.

The question of sex is determined solely by the male. In females, both of a pair of chromosomes are called X chromosomes. In the male, one may be X or it may be Y. If an ovum is fertilized by a sperm containing a Y chromosome, the child will be male and vice-versa.

Certain traits are known as sex-linked and are always carried by the X chromosome. Color blindness is one example. This condition is very rare in females, but appears in about eight percent of the male population. Another characteristic associated with sex is baldness. The gene for baldness is dominant in males and recessive in females.

Of more importance to genealogists, however, are the hereditary diseases. These should be distinguished from congenital defects: those which arise from conditions of conception or pregnancy. Among them are cleft lip, some birthmarks, and actual injuries incident to birth.

Hereditary diseases are passed from generation to generation by the genes. Several diseases such as cystic fibrosis and hemophilia are two examples. Although certain diseases are not inherited directly, the tendency to contract them may be inherited. Epilepsy, for example, occurs more frequently in some families than others. The tendency to develop allergies, asthma and bronchitis also seems to run in families. Certain mental disorders are known to be hereditary. An abnormality in the chromosomes, for instance, causes Down's Syndrome.

Finally, if all this is not enough, there are cases of spontaneous change in chromosomes over generations which are known as mutations. Normally chromosomes duplicate themselves exactly during cell division. Once in a while, the new cells contain an altered chromosome. When this occurs, the new trait represented by this change will be expressed in the offspring. A mutation which would be harmful in a living human usually expires in the womb. Favorable mutations not only live, they tend to spread through the population.





## BRISTOL PARISH BAPTISMAL REGISTERS

Church registers of the olden time, when nearly every one was baptised and married by the Colonial clergy, are not only documents of curious interest to those whose names are recorded in them, but they have an intrinsic value, involving, as they often do, titles to property, and furnishing names, dates and other missing links in historical chains, of general interest. Time, war, flood and fire have destroyed many of them and mutilated more. Very few registers are now entire; but the smallest fragments of them are precious in the eyes of the historian and of the antiquary, who sometimes deduce valuable inferences from them, as the naturalist infers an entire antique animal from a single bone. In the first General Assembly of Virginia (which was the first legislature ever convened in America) it was provided that all ministers in the Colony shall, once a year, bring or send to "the Secretary of Estate" a true account of all christenings, marriages and burials; and where there is no minister, "the Commanders of the place do supply the same duty."

In 1631-2 this order was reaffirmed (1 Hening 158). This was ten years before the establishment of Bristol Parish. In 1662 another act to the same end was passed, for the reason that "many differences had arisen about ages and inquiries had been made which could not be answered without a register" (2 Hening 54). It is worthy of note, some of the old registers, as that of Middlesex, begin at this date, a strong circumstance to show that the act was the motive for the resumption of a neglected duty. The House of Burgesses returned to the subject in 1713, and said: "Whereas the Act of 1662 has fallen into disuse," and the method prescribed had not answered its purpose, parents and ministers are again ordered, on pain of heavier penalties, to "report the christenings, births and burials in every parish to the minister or clerk thereof, who should keep a fair and exact register, and return a true copy thereof to the Secretary of this Dominion in April and October" (4 Hening 42). This last act was just before the beginning of the exact register of Bristol Parish (1720), a few entries for previous years having been inserted in blank spaces without regard to the order of time. Our ancestors were perhaps scarce of paper, as they seem to have had more regard to the economy of space than to the order of time.


