JUNE 1970 CELEBRATION AT ROCKY MOUNT, BOSSIER PARISH, LA

THE HOME SITE of the old Jim Hughes home is the focal point of the Rocky Mount Historical Preservation Comm.

In 1970, there was a Bossier Restoration Foundation, dedicated to the preservation of historic Bossier Parish. 1970 was the fifth anniversary of the Foundation and this year they met for a meeting and picnic lunch at a site near the old James HUGHES residence, which was being restored to its antebellum status by the Foundation. The HUGHES home, the oldest in Rocky Mount, had slave quarters, a barn & log corn crib. The Foundation has received a 99 year least on the home and estate from the heirs, for restoration.

Rocky Mount is credited as being the scene of the first secession movement prior to the War Between the States. It was here on 26 Nov 1860, that citizens of Bossier, in mass meeting, "declared war" and organized a company of militia, the Minute Men of Bossier, to "defend our homes". This was nearly a month before South Carolina seceded and months before the guns fired on Fort Sumter.

SCOTIA-SCOT-ALBA From IRELAND TO SCOTLAND

"SCOTIA" and "SCOT", first applied to Ireland and Irishmen, later came to be applied to Ireland's northeastern neighbor, ALBA, and its inhabitants. SCOTIA was said by some ancients to be derived from SCOTA, queen-mother of the Milesians.

Down through the centuries the term SCOTIA was applied to Ireland by Continental writers more often than any other name, and these writers applied the term SCOT to a native of Eirinn.

The modern name of Ireland seems to have originated from the Northmen in about the seventh century, and after that the English called it Ireland, and the natives Irish.

ALBA, the present Scotland, became SCOTIA, and its people SCOT. The SCOTI of Hibernia colonized again and again in ALBA, resulting in a strong kingdom which gave them dominance and soon made the SCOTI kings the kings of the whole country. The last of the Irish royal line became extinct with Alexander the Third, who died without heir in 1287.

0.K.

The expression "O.K." comes from a Choctaw expression "Sia Hoka," meaning "it's acceptable." Chief Pushmataha used it often as he talked with Andrew Jackson when the Choctaws aided Jackson at New Orleans during the War of 1812. Jackson started using the expression, and then his men copied Jackson, phoneticizing it to "O.K." Received from Chris Morgan, American Indian researcher.



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HOW TO READ LAND DESCRIPTIONS

In order to use land records, you must first know if your land description is loacated in a public land state. All lands lying outside the thirteen original states; except Maine, Vermont, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia were formed formed into public lands states.

The public land states were based on the rectangular survey system. Each system begins with an initial point from which a base line runs in an east-west direction and a principal meridian(P.M.) runs in a north-south direction. Secondary east-west lines spaced six miles apart lie north and south of the base line and are known as township lines. Secondary north-south lines spaced six miles apart lie east and west of the principal meridian and are known as range lines. The secondary lines intersect to form blocks of land six miles square that are known as townships. Each township is divided into thirty-six sections of one square mile each. These section are numbered one through thirty-six according to their location in the township, beginning in the uppper right hand corner, then moving left on the first tier, right on the second tier, left on the third, right on the fourth, left on the fifth, and right on the sixth, ending in the lower righthand corner. Each section contains 640 acres. A section may be further divided into smaller rectangular units such as a half section, a quarter section, a half-quarter section or a quarter-quarter section. A complete legal description should also include the name or number of the principal meridian of the survey system within which the land lies. Example: Southwest Quarter of Section 14, Township 2 North, Range 3 east of the Fifth Principal Meridian. The legal land description are often abbreviated, as follows: SW 1/4, S14, T2N, R3E, 5th P.M.

In order to locate a described tract of land on a map, it is necessary to read the legal description from right to left. First find the Fifth Principal Meridian, then find the township described by the township and range numbers, then find the appropriate section within the township.

Range and township line and number can be found on state maps or county maps. townships, section and sectional subdivisiona are depicted in plat books, on original land entry maps, and on some other land ownership maps.

Obtaining Federal Land Records

Federal Land records are located in the Washington D. C. area at the following two offices:

If the land entry papers you are seeking are prior to 1908 and in a state for which there is no index, you must provide identifying information. For states west of the Mississippi (excluding Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota, and Missouri) provide the name of the entryman and the state and either a legal description of the Land or the name of the land office, type of file and final certificate number. For states East of the the Mississippi (and

Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota and Missouri), provide the name of the entryman, the state, the name of the land office, type of file, and the final certificate number. The information for the latter group of states can be obtained from the Eastern States office. Provide that office with the following information: name of the Entryman, county and state in which the land is located, and the full legal description of the land.

When you have obtained the necessary information, forward it to suitland Reference Branch (NNRR), Textual Reference Division, National Archived and Records Administration, Washington, DC 20409. No special form is needed for this purpose. When the file you have requested is located, you will receive a price quotation for copies with instructions for making appropriate payment. do not send any money in advance.

Patent for the thirteen Eastern public-land states and for all states after 1908 are at the Eastern States office. Most patents for the remaining public-land states prior to 1908 can be obtained from the Suitland Reference Branch. In forder to obtain a patent you must furnish the volume and page number given in the land entry file.

PROVING CONNECTIONS THROUGH LAND DESCRIPTIONS

Very often the genealogist will trace a pedigree back to a situation where an ancestor has one or more contemporaries with the same name and it is impossible to distinguish one from the other in existing rescords. The land descriptions can sometimes provide evidence to help solve the problem. Work from the known to the unknown, gathering data from the land records on all persons with the surname. This approach can work only when two specific conditions are present:

- 1. There is a positive identification of your ancestor at the time he disposes of a specific tract or parcel of land.
- 2. There is a direct statement of relationship--preferably a lineal relationship--between your ancestor and someone else in the instrument by which that same ancestor acquired title to that same property.

It all boils down to this: if you find your ancestor, John X selling 100 acres of land of the same description as William X sold to his son John sixteen years earlier, you have a pretty good case.

OTHER TRICKS FOR HARD CASES

- 1. Look for companion documents. When you have identified a land record of interest, look at all of the deeds for a few pages before and after.
- 2 Check for deeds on adjoining properties.
- 3. Locate and plat out the property description of your ancestor's land on a county map. It shows the location of the property in relation to such things as cemeteries and churches.
- 4. Account for both the acquisition and disposition of every tract of your ancestor's land. Make an "in" and "out" table with five columns. Column one contains that land's legal description, two and three tell the date and means of acquisition, and four and five tell the date and means of its disposal. Those who fail to account for both the "ins" and "outs risk missing some important clues and/or genealogical evidence.

- VII. RESACA, GEORGIA-June 1, 1864--SHERMAN-JOHNSTON
 - A. Louisiana Brigade enlisted Men-34 killed, 150 wounded out of total of 889. Officers: 4 killed, 13 wounded of 85.
 - B. Major W. B. SCOTT-19th Louisiana Infantry lost a leg and died
 - C. Captain M.G. PEARSON-killed
 - D. Major SCOTT of the 19th had been a minister, but he laid aside his ministerial robes for the sword.
- VIII. KENNESAW MOUNTAIN, GEORGIA-June 27, 1864
 - Union army 90,000-2,000 casualties; Confederate Army 60,000-270 casualties
 - B. Lieut. W.J. CLARK of the 19th Louisiana Infantry killed.
 - In spite of Confederate success, Jefferson DAVIS replaced general Joseph JOHNSTON with HOOD
 - D. Gibson's Brigade took position, intrenching on the west side of Atlanta and was engaged in continual skirmishing during the remainder of the seige.
 - E. HOOD evacuated Atlanta September 1, 1864. SHERMAN'S victory helped LINCOLN win re-election.
 - F. During the operations near Kennesaw Mountain, the Armies of Mississippi and Tennessee suffered a heavy blow in the death of LT. GEN-ERAL Leonidas POLK. The united armies, facing desperate perils, took

time to mourn the BISHOP OF LOUISIANA. He had ever been a pillar of strenghth to his people in civilian life, and his men in war. Gentle in peace and undaunted in the field, he is remembered as the militant bishop of the confederacy.

THE TENNESSEE CAMPAINGN UNDER HOOD

Major Camp FLOURNOY led the 19th Louisiana in this campaign.

- IX. FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE- November 30, 1864 GENERAL SCHOFIED-GENERAL HOOD
 - A. This campaign was designed by HOOD to draw SHERMAN from Georgian, but if failed.
 - B. Union Casualties-1,000 confederate Casualties-5,000
 - C. 19th Louisiana Infantry almost completely killed and wounded.
 - D. Grig. General SCOTT was paralyzed by an exploding shell nearby.
 - E. Colonel NELSON of the 12 th Louisiana Infantry killed.
 - F. "rains with fallling snow as early as December 5th; ground freezing; soldiers barefooted; feet bleeding," described the march to Nashville, Tennessee.
- X. NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE-DECEMBER 15-16, 1864 General THOMAS-General HOOD
 - A. Union casualties-3,000; -Confederate casualties 3,000
 - B. At the Harpeth river, The Brigade was deserted by the Cavalry and charged on all sides by the enemy. colonel LINDSEY'S 16th Louisiana Infantry was deployed as shirmishers, and Colonel CAMPBELL and Major FLOURNOY, with the 13th, 19th and 20th Louisiana Infantry moved to the rear, fighting as they went. The command fought its was to the river losing 10 men-killed, 25 men -wounded and 5 men captured.
 - C. This Union victory practically ended Southern resistance in the West.
 - D. The retreat from Nashville had brought no dishonor to the Army of Tennessee. It had fought until a division, weakly guarding its line, had unexpectedly given away, involving an order to retire from the position, so long and so gallantly held. When the union army charged, it faced them sternly, and when they pressed upon it, struck back at them fiercely. With hearts steadfast; never flurried, though barefooted, never depressed, though bleeding feet left a tracery of blood upon the path, the Army of Tennessee crossed the Tennessee River and march to Tupelo, its last retreat; with all its bugles blowing, its drums beating, and with all its flags streaming; its strong files as unbroken in that final retreat as when facing its first fight.
- XI. SPANISH FORT Mobile, Alabama-March 23, 1865
 - A. Gibson's Brigade gave this last battle a noble effort of Confederate valor.

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
