Note: This is a copy of the old CHILES Bible. The DAVIDSONS are largely buried in the old DAVIDSON Cemetery on the MITCHELL farm west of Springridge. Willis POLLARD'S group is buried at Four Froks in a family cemetery. Some of both are buried at Providence Baptist Church cemetery on Providence Road near Springridge. (Bill Randolph.)

Note: Mr. DAVIDSON told me his grandmother HAGENS was a POLLARD. He remembers his g-grandmother POLLARD since he was a good sized boy before she died. BRR

This Bible is now in the possession of Mr. Elisha M. DAVIDSON, Rt. 2, Keithville, La. The family data pages were torn out many years ago by person or persons unknown while Mr. DAVIDSON and his family were away. Part of the data pages are missing. The older entries are in one handwriting and were obviously copied from an even older Bible. Some of the writing has faded beyond recognition; the surviving pages were copied by B. B. Randolph 14 May 1970.

WHY JOE GARING NEVER WENT TO REUNIONS

During the Civil War a Federal Gun boat was captured on the Yazoo River near Vicksburg by a band of Confederate soldiers. As was customary, the soldiers doing the capturing took what they wanted. Joe Garing of Yazoo City was one of the Confederate soldiers in the party and when he boarded the boat he discovered the Captain had on a fine pair of new boots. Mr. Garing was sure these boots would fit him and he was badly in need of such equipment. So, at the point of a bayonet, he borrowed the Captain's boots but graciously gave the Captain what remained of his dilapidated shoes in return. The Captain was very much upset about the trade but there was nothing he could do but to go through with it. However, the Captain told Garing he would see him again some time. Mr. Garing agreed to trade back, if and when they met after the war provided the Captain had not worn his shoes out. Mr. Garing said after the war he liked the boots so well he did not want to trade back and to avoid a meeting with the Captain and a "Possible Trade" he never attended reunions.

Note: The Cairo was salvaged from the Yazoo River and is on display at the Vicksburg Battlefield Park.

There also 34 unknown graves in the main section of Ramah Baptist Church Cemetary.

The oldest known grave was dated 1878. In 1909, William Tell POU deeded 3.6 acres of land to the Ramah Church, with approximately 3 acres being used for the cemetery. J. E. CHRISTIAN deeded an additional 1/2 acre in 1958. The Christian Broadcasting Company deeded another 2 acres, as directed by William Thomas POU in 1979. This totaled approximately 6 acres in both the old and new sections. In 1990, special improvements to the service road were made from donation by the COXINE-MARTINDALE-WOOD family and Winnie Mae RICH family.

20 WAYS TO AVOID GRIEF IN YOUR GENEALOGICAL RE-SEARCH

The following suggestions and recommendations will be helpful to beginners and hopefully will prevent misfortune when learning how to do genealogical research. Many of these tips are "old hat" to experienced genealogists, but it is always worthwhile to remind ourselves of the basics of sound research.

- ALWAYS note the source of any material you photocopy. If the information is from a library book; note the name, author, date, publisher and also the library where you found the book, or photocopy the title page. Occasionally you will find that you need to refer to the book again, or photocopy more information from it.
- Make photocopies or carbon copies of ALL LETTERS YOU WRITE. This will save you from wondering which of your correspondents questions you answered already, and which of your questions they have or haven't answered.
- 3. Don't procrastinate in responding to letters or messages you receive. If you don't have time to write a detailed reply, send your correspondent a quick reply or postcard to acknowledge receipt and give him/her a rough idea of when a reply will be forthcoming. Then be sure to write back as you promised to.
- 4. When searching for relatives in records, don't pass over the entries that are almost but not quite right. For example, if you are searching for the marriage of John Brown and Mary Jones in 1850, make a note of the marriage of John Brown and Nancy Smith in 1847: this could be a previous marriage in which the wife died shortly after.
- When writing to libraries or genealogical/historical societies and ask if they have any old local histories or family histories pertaining to the area.
- Don't forget to make frequent backups of your computer disks.
- Store backup copies of your computer disks and photocopies of your irreplaceable documents in your deposit box or someone else's home.
- 8. Remember that "if it's in print, it ain't necessarily fact." Information in recently published works. If the older books are incorrect, the erroneous information is sim-

ply repeated and further disseminated.

- 9. The earlier the time period in which you are researching, the less consistent our ancestors were about the spelling of their surnames. Also, many of them were illiterate and could not tell a record keeper how their names should be spelled.
- 10. Family traditions of close connections to famous figures are usually false, but there may be a more obscure relationship involved. Perhaps the famous person spent a night at your ancestor's country estate instead of (as legend goes) marrying into the family.
- 11. Try not to let your research get behind. Establish a filing system for your papers (using file folders or 3-ring binders) and file each page of notes, document, photocopy, etc. as you acquire it. There are few things more disheartening than contemplating a foot-high stack of unfiled papers, wondering if the birth certificate you desperately need to refer to is somewhere in it.
- Double-check all dates to make sure they are possible, for example, a woman born in 1790 could not be a mother in 1800.
- 13. Be on the lookout for nicknames. A request for a birth record for Sadie White may be rejected if the name on file is Sarah White.
- 14. Beware of mail-order promotions offering personalized genealogies of your surname with titles such as "The Amazing Story of the _____Family; or "The ____Family New World Registry." These are usually little more than computer-assembled list of names from telephone directories. Notify the Better business Bureau, postal authorities and consumers advocate agencies if you receive one of these.
- 15. Don't assume modern meaing for terms used to describe relationships. For example, in the 17th century a step-child was often called a "son-in-law" or "daughter-in-law", and "cousin" could refer to almost any relative except a sibling or child.
- 16. Remember that indexes to books rarely include the names of all persons mentioned in the book and, in addition, occasionally contain errors. If it appears that a book is likely to have valuable information, spend some time skimming its contents rather than returning it to the shelf after a quick glance at the index.
- 17. Be precise when making notes and especially when sharing information with others. Write dates using an unambiquous format: Americans interpret 5/6/1881 as 6 May 1881, but in many other countries it would be read as 5 June 1881. Always capitalize or underline surnames, some of which can be mistaken for given names, e. g., HENRY, HOWARD. Note place names in full, including parish or township, country, steate or province, and country.

- 18. You will often encounter conflicting information and you will have to weigh it against other evidence to try to determine which is the most likely to be true. Periodically review and verify the conclusions you have reached concerning each of your ancestors' lives: this will help to prevent you from wasting time following blind alleys.
- 19. Place names and boundaries have changed constantly over the years. Always verify them in historical atlases or genealogical texts pertaining to the area. for example, the boundaries of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania have changed four times since it was first settled.
- 20. Whenever and wherever possible, advertise the surnames you are researching by submitting them to genealogical directories and surname lists published by genealogical societies that you belong to. This will put you in touch with others who are researching the same surnames, possibly for a much longer time. After all, the most rewarding genealogical research is that which no-one else has already done!

TIDBITS FROM THE SHREVEPORT TIMES 1880's and 1890's

4 Oct 1881

The STRANGE CASE OF THOMAS PATTERSON

In 1866, Thomas PATTERSON, brother of John C. PATTERSON, Esquire, of Shreveport, married the daughter of Ed. L. RICE. The couple moved to Delaware where they lived for two years. Thomas PATTERSON developed "dissipated habits," and a dishonesty charge was preferred against him by employers (proved later to be untrue.) But PATTERSON had already disappeared. His wife then left Baltimore and returned to Shreveport.

After two years, relatives in Shreveport got word that PATTERSON had died in western Pennsylvania. John C. PATTERSON went to Pennsylvania and identified the body as that of Thomas PATTERSON. The body was brought to Shreveport where his wife also identified the remains as her husband. Patterson was buried in Shreveport.

A few days ago, PATTERSON's widow received a letter from Grand Rapids, Michigan, written in her deceased husband's handwriting and bearing his signature. He stated that he had throughly reformed and entered into business in Grand Rapids where he had been successful. He further stated that he had a good home and wanted his wife to join him.

The wife feels that the letter was genuine and is preparing to go to Grand Rapids.

Whose body was buried in the PATTERSON burial lot as "Thomas PATTERSON."

Editor's note: There are two PATTERSON lots in Oakland Cemetery, Shreveport, La. according to the 1907 plot map. Lot 21 Contains R. B. PATTERSON, J. G. PATTERSON, and Fannie WEAVER. Lot 20 contains J. T. PATTERSON.

3 June 1881

The Texas and Pacific Railroad is completed one-half way between Dallas and El Paso. At two miles a day, the remaining 660 miles should be completed by the middle of November.

12 Oct 1881

Mrs. Sallie Land ASHTON, widow of Major James H. ASHTON and daughter of Judge Thomas T. LAND, married General Leon JASTREMSKI, mayor of Baton Rouge and editor of the Capitalion.

Nov 1881

Rev. W. C. DUNLAP and others presented a petition for a gas lamp at the corner of Travis and Edwards and the Presbyterian church.

1890

Dr. Angelo MALTA invented a process called "Metalizing a corpse." The process died with him in 1888.

14 May 1890

Louisiana Sons of the American Revolution was organized in New Orleans.

22 May 1890

Three members of the Jesse JAMES gang were arrested in Wisconsin.

7 Aug 1890

A baby daughter was deserted by a well-dressed, attractive woman who appeared to be 21 or 22 years old.

The woman had stayed two nights at the Phoeniz Hotel using the assumed name, "Mrs. Barswell." She told people that she was going to meet her husband in New Orleans.

Later, she was seen boarding the train at the Vicksburg, Shreveport and Pacific railroad station without her baby.

The baby was later found on Caddo street by a black woman. The beautiful little girl was adopted the next day by a Mr. Ketchum who was registered at the Phoeniz Hotel, also. A man of ample means, Mr. Ketchum was a resident of New Jersey.

12 Aug 1890

An article in the Times stated that the child had died and had been buried in the local cemetery.



BATTERY 5 PLAZA



Northwest Corner of Highland and Marshall

The old Highland Hospital was built in 1917 at the site of the defensive fortifications built to protect Shreveport during the Civil War. During the War, Shreveport was the Confederate State Capitol. Originally, the fortifications ran from the Red River (Fort Turnbull or "Humbug") to Arsenal Hill, where the SWEPCO plant stands, just northwest of downtown. The ridge on top of which the North Louisiana Regional Hospital stands was part of this line of fortifications, as was the area nearby to the west. Wall street takes its name from these lines of defense.

In the 1940's, a series of markers were placed at the locations of each of the 18 batteries positioned along the defenses. Most of the markers no longer exist, and none are highly visible, except the newly constructed Battery 5 Plaza. The Battery 5 Plaza serves to represent all the other batteries in commemorating the locations of Shreveport's defenses during the War Between the States—defenses that were never used, but were no less important because they were not. Shreveport remained the only Confederate State seat of government to hold out against the Union onslaught without falling and without seeing battle. Only in June of 1865, two months after Lee's surrender, did the Trans-Mississippi Department of the Confederate Army, and with it the City of Shreveport, peacefully surrender to the Federal Government. Had Union forces not been turned back at Mansfield in April, 1864, these fortifications might well have been the site of the Battle of Shreveport, a battle that was anticipated, but fortunately never occurred.


