PROTECT YOUR VALUABLE RECORDS

COMPUTER RECORDS - - - Over the past 30 years, many records have been collected and stored on computer tape. In the mad dash to produce even faster machines with fantastically expanded storage, one factor seems to have been forgotten: Many tapes made years ago cannot be run on present computers!

Census data from the 1960 census is stored on thousands of reels of old tape. The old film would probably disintegrate if run on the old machines on which it was created. The Census Bureau has changed computers and tape drives five times since taking that 1960 census. Parts of the 1970 and 1980 census face the same problems.

Lesson: Be sure to transfer your records to newer software programs when you upgrade programs, system, or computer.

GLAD BAGS - - - We have noticed that several genealogical publications have suggested using Glad Bags to store genealogical documents, pictures, etc. Glad Bags are NOT mylar and therefore are not archival; if that's your goal, then Glad Bags are not for you.

EUBANK, Caleb, succn. d. Aug 7, 1849. Will is here & names "my illegitimate son Rufus," my sister Elizabeth RAMSEY & her children incl. John & Richard DOGGET, & my bro. John & his children (named).

#313 Sep 10, 1849

JONES, Sanford. d. in Jun 1849. Wid. Susan J. JONES was adm but died before 1859. Sanford JONES left children & at least one bro, Churchill JONES.

#314 Oct 27, 1849

BEAUVOIS, Jean. Mentions heirs in France. Evidenced by sale of his inventory, BEAUVOIS apparently had a toy shop here. Victor LeGRAND, curator.

#316 Sep 29, 1849

GOOD, Mary L. Ptn of Robert A. GOOD, her son, for adm.

#318 Oct 26, 1849

MOOHN (MHOON), William M. succn. His sister Mary Ann MOOHN (MHOON), dec'd, wife of James SKILES of Bertie Co NC. Other heirs named.

#320 Nov 17, 1849

ALLEN, W.W. succn. Mary S. ALLEN, his wid, applies for tutorship of child'n She was nee' TRANTHAM (?)

#320 Aug 29, 1854

Tutorship of minor heirs of Susan (Mary Susan?) ALLEN in Burleson Co TX.

#324 Dec 29, 1849

NOEL, James D. succn. Mary Ann MOORING, wid with their children James, Mary Elizabeth & Mary Margaret NOEL.

#325 Jan 7, 1859

HESTER, David, succn. d. Dec 20, 1849, had bro Charles J. HESTER in Adams Co MS. David HESTER's wife was Laura A. GRAVES, mentions land held by late David HESTER & heirs of Ann RAYFORD SCOTT (Laura A. GRAVES was dau of Charles GRAVES-see #304).

#326 Dec 24, 1849

GREEN, William M., physician. Heirs live in Hillsborough NC & Natchez MS. His father was William M. GREEN of Hinds Co MS in 1850.

#328 Mar 8, 1850

WILLS, James. Names nieces (incl. one md. John J. JENNINGS & one md. John PERRY), and nephews of Edgefield Dist SC. All child'n of James WILLS dec'd bro Matthew WILLS.

#329 Jan 23, 1850

WHITE, William B. Elizabeth H. WHITE, wid.

#330 Jun 14, 1850

MILLER, Henry, succn. Mentions indebtedness to William N. THOMPSON of Autauga Co AL.

#331 Feb 8, 1851

PATTERSON, John T. succn. Clementina H. BARBEE PATTERSON, wid.

#332 Feb 18, 1850

LITTLEJOHN, William, succn. Jane McALPINE wid. & 5 child'n. Caddo Marriages. Wm LITTLEJOHN & Jane J. PATRICK md Dec 22, 1838. Wit Wm. LITTLEJOHN & H.C. Mc NEIL.

From "THE SHREVEPORT INTELLIGENCER & CADDO BEACON" issue Jan 14, 1841. One William LITTLEJOHN was secretary of the Greenwood Academy at Greenwood.

#333 Feb 25, 1850

MARTIN, John, succn. "Late of Talledego (sic) Co AL." Also owned property in Caddo.

#334 Feb 6, 1850

MORTON, William. Ptn natural tutor of Joel MORTON. Application to sell all land. Fam meeting shows Elisha ATTAWAY, Murry ATTAWAY & David McGEE are only relatives (of said child) in Caddo Par.

#335 Mar 15, 1850

Succn Reuben R. HARRISON, Mary A. SPROTT HARRISON, wid. & children. She later md. A. J. HITCHCOCK & moved to Lowndes Co AL. Reuben had a bro John R R (sic) HARRISON. Rel. in Caddo incl James HARROLD & William D. SPRATT. (abstr's note): Reuben R. HARRISON was a son of Reuben Henry HARRISON, b ca 1760, Rev Sold, d. May 18, 1835, & his wife Sara BURGESS, b 1765, d. Apr 15, 1831. Reuben R's bros & sis were Wm Henry (md Ann PERRY), Eli (b Apr 4, 1782), Mary (md Charles MOORE), Nancy (md (1) a WHITAKER; (2) a ROSEBOROUGH), Richard, Willoughby B. (b 1793 SC, md Elizabeth R. RIVES), James, John, David, Frances & Kirkland HARRISON.

#337 Mar 23, 1850

Succn G. THOMPSON, "recently moved to Caddo Par" where he died. Most property was in Iberville Par LA.

#340 Apr 18, 1850

CADDO PARISH SCHOOL BOARD

The present Caddo Parish School Board was organized 7 Jun 1877, with members elected in accordance with the new constitutional provisions and acts of the Legislature. Continuous minutes have been kept since that time that indicate the position of parish superintendent began to develop somewhere around 1900. material is located at the Prescott Library, Louisiana Tech University, Archives Collection A43 - Box 1 - folder #19.

The School Board of the Parish of Caddo met on Thursday, June 7th in the Crockett Street Schoolhouse. Present: Messrs: T. N. MORRIS, B. JACOBS, Abner HALL, E. HICKMAN, J. J. HORAN, & Wm. A. SEAY. Absent: Messrs: J. S. WISE, J. D. CAWTHON, & Peter The oath of office was taken before Justice DODEZ. motion of Mr. MORRIS, Wm. A. SEAY, Esq. was unanimously elected President, & John J. HORAN, Esq., Secretary. On motion of Mr. JACOBS: Resolved that the following by-laws be adopted for the guidance of the Board:

BY-LAWS & RULES OF REGULATION FOR THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS FOR THE PARISH OF CADDO

Article 1

The following shall be the order of business at regular or special meetings of this Board:

1st - Reading of the minutes

2nd - Roports of committees, etc.
3rd - Unfinished business

4th - Reading communications, etc., to the Board

5th - New business

6th - Reading & correcting minutes just before adjouring This order of business may be changed for a single occasion by the President.

Article 2

The President & Secretary shall be chosen by ballot & shall serve for one year from the 1st Saturday in July next.

Article 3

In the absence of the Secretary, the President shall appoint one pro-tem. And if the President be absent, the Board may select one of their own members as President, pro-tem to serve during the meeting or absence of the regular President.

Article 4

The President shall decide all questions of order.

Article 5

All subjects legitimately arising or coming before this body, shall be open to discussion to members of the Board; porvided that no one engaging in any discussion shall speak longer than ten minutes on any one subject, unless by consent of the Board.

Article 6

A member, or person wishing to speak shall rise from his seat and address the President in a respectful manner.

Article 7

The President shall appoint all committees unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

Article 8

No motion shall be considered until it has been seconded.

Article 9

The presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote in case of a tie.

Article 10

In discussions, etc, this Board will take as a guide for its action and government, the Rules of Parliamentary Law.

Article 11

All amendments or repeals of these By-Laws shall be proposed in writing, when the same way be acted upon and adopted by a two thirds vote of members present.

Article 12

These By-Laws shall not be suspended or sidpensed with for a single occasion (except as provided for in Article 1st, in regards to the order of business) unless by a two thirds vote of members present.

Article 13

As soon as these By-Laws are adopted, it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Board to record them in the minute book (provided him by the Board) to which he shall add the date of their adoption, over his attest, & all amendments to them shall be recorded in the same book, in the same manner, & numbered in the order in which they are adopted.

Article 14

The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Board neatly transcribed in the minute book.

On motion of Mr. HALL: Resolved that the salary of the Secretary be fixed at \$100.00 per annum.

On motion of Mr. HORAN: That a committee of 3 members be appointed by the President, who together with the Treasurer & Attorney of the Board, shall examine the accounts, vouchers, etc., of Mr. A. WALSH, the Treasurer of the late board & also the books & records of the late School Board, & shall demand from them all pages, books, etc. belonging to the Board.

On motion of Mr. HICKMAN: Resolved, that the bond of W. C. BLANCHARD, Parish Treasurer, as treasurer of the School Board, be accepted & that the President be authorized to certify to this approval.

On motion of Mr. JACOBS: Resolved, that the Police Jury be required in accordance with Section 28, of the act relating to public education, to levy and order collected, a tax of 2 mills, on the dollar in currency on the taxable property of Caddo Parish for public school purposes, & that a committee of 3 be appointed to wait on the Police Jury & present to them this resolution.

On motion of Mr. MORRIS: Resolved, that the Secretary be authorized to purchase a minute book & stationary for the use of the Board & that the President draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the payment of the same.

The President appointed as a committee on the examination of teachers, Messrs. T. H. MORRIS, B. JACOBS, & J. S. WISE.

On motion of Mr. MORRIS: Resolved that the President of the Board be chairman of the committee. On the committee to examine the records of the late board & the accounts of the Treasurer: Messrs HORAN, JACOBS, & HALL. On the committee to wait on the Police Jury: Messrs MORRIS, HORAN, & HICKMAN.

On motion the Board then adjourned to the regular quarterly

meeting the first Saturday in July next. Signed: John J. HORAN, Secretary

Professor C. E. BYRD was nominated for the office of Parish Supertindent & was unamimously elected.

The salary of the parish superintendent was fixed at \$1,200 dollars per annum, payable monthly.

THIGPEN, both board members, served until Oct 1900. Judge J. C. MONCURE, served as secretary from Oct 1900 until Jan 1908. It seems that in 1907, the Legislature passed an act which prohibited a member of a parish school board from holding the office of secretary of the board and parish superintendent]

DENSON SPRINGS CEMETERY Anderson County, Texas

Located south of Palestine, a Texas Historical Marker has been placed in the cemetery & provides the following information:

Early settlers in the area, known as Ioni after a nearby Indian village, began arriving in the early 1830's. The land on which this cemetery is located was granted to James BRADSHAW in 1835. When he died in 1844, the property was inherited by his brother William, who moved to the area with his family from Nacogdoches in 1849. One of William BRADSHAW's daughters, Diana, married Kindred WATKINS in 1850. When their first child was born & died on 15 Aug 1851, he was buried near their home. The child's burial was the first in what would become the Denson Springs Cemetery.

Over the years, this one-acre plot became a family burial ground. Later, other settlers of the area were also buried here. In 1878, the community became known as Denson Springs, and the cemetery as the Denson Springs Cemetery. During the 1870's, many of the settlers were from Alabama & Mississippi. (additional notations are enclosed in brackets []).

Some thoughts, by Joyce Shannon Bridges, considering changes.....

We were born before television, penicillin, polio shots, frozen foods, Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, frisbees, and the Pill. We were born before radar, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams, ball-point pens, and pantyhose. Also before dishwashers, clothes dryers, electric blankets, air conditioners, permanent pressed clothes, and before man walked on the moon.

We got married first, and then lived together. How quaint can you be? In our time, closets were for clothes, not for "coming out of". Bunnies were small rabbits, and rabbits were not Volkswagens. Designer jeans were scheming girls named Jean, and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along well with our cousins at family reunions.

We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent, and outer space was the the back of the Strand Theatre. We were born before house-husbands, gay rights, computer dating/marriages, dual careers, and "surfing the net". We were born before day care centers, group therapy, and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radio, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt, and guys wearing earrings. For us, time-sharing meant togetherness; not computers or condominiums. A chip meant a piece of wood. Hardware meant hardware, and software wasn't even a word!

In 1940, "made in Japan" meant junk, and the term "making out" referred as to how you did on your exam. Pizzas, McDonald's, and instant coffee were unheard of. We hit the scene when there were five and dime stores, where you bought things for five and ten cents. The corner drug store had a soda fountain to buy ice cream cones for a nickel (or dime for a double scoop). For a nickel you could ride the trolley all the way downtown to Texas Avenue, or make a phone call, or buy a root beer, or enough stamps to mail one letter and two postcards. You could buy a new Chevy coupe for \$600, but who could afford one - a pity too, because when I got my drivers license, I could buy three gallons of gas for a dollar and ride around for hours.

In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was what you mowed, coke was a popular soft drink, and pot was what you cooked the Sunday roast in. Rock music was Grandma's lullaby to the newest grandbaby, and aid's were helpers in the school office.

We were certainly not before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely born before the sex change (we made do with what we were born with); and we were the last generation that was so dumb as to think that you needed a husband to have a baby. It's no wonder that we folks over the age of 55 are confused and there is such a generation gap today.
