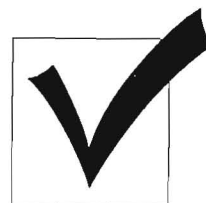

Miss Ima G* Bugg, our own unique, lighthearted research associate, has agreed to try to answer our questions and give us some research clues. If you are confused and in need of help, drop her a line. Dear Miss Bugg: I've been "working on the railroad" searching for information on my grandfather and have reached the end of the line. Please get me back on the right track.

Dear Railroaded: It has been estimated that more than two and a quarter million people, including engineers, brakemen, dispatchers, ticket clerks, and laborers were employed by railroad companies at their peak in the 1920s, which means that zillions of records have been produced. The trick is to find the ones pertaining to your ancestor.

A lot of information has been written about the railroads and the people who ran them. By reading newspapers in the area where your ancestor worked, you will likely find accounts of the various railroad companies operating there and their employees (promotions, transfers, retirements, etc.). Also, a good train wreck was always front-page news! There are many railroad museums and clubs with information about the history of the railroads. A list of railroad archives is found *THE SOURCE*, edited by Eakle & Cerny (Ancestry, Inc.).

Many railroad companies considered themselves responsible for their employees, providing housing and hospitals. Also, most railroad employees were unionized early on. Railroad workers did not receive Social Security; rather, the railroads had their own Railroad Retirement Board. If your ancestor had a social security number beginning 700-729, he probably worked for the railroad between 1937 and 1943. Railroad pension records are available from the Railroad Retirement Board, 844 N. Rust St., Chicago, IL 60611. These records may include information on wages, positions held, and more.



Dear Miss Bugg: I've having problems with the microfilm reader; everything seems so light or dark and out of focus. Now that I'm wearing bifocals, it just seems to get worse!

Dear Four-Eyes: You think bifocals are bad, just wait 'til you get trifocals! Try putting a sheet of yellow paper on the reading surface and adjusting the focus on the particular area which you are trying to decipher. This doesn't always work, but it does help.



Dear Miss Ima G* Bugg: This time of year, we seem to turn our thoughts back to D-Day, June 6, 1944, when Allied forces under General Dwight D. Eisenhower, after crossing the English Channel, landed on the Normandy coast of France. What is the meaning of the term "D-Day?"

Dear Thoughts: D-Day is the date for a planned action. Generally used in a military context, the term enables planners to establish sequential priorities for activities both before and after an operation's starting date, which may be unknown, may be designated but secret, or may be subject to change. For example, when an invasion is contemplated, the date for beginning the action is called D-Day; planning can then schedule an air bombardment for D minus 1, the day before the target date, and commitment of additional troops on D plus 1, the day after. H-hour designates a specific time for a planned action, such as the landing of the first troops. M-day usually means mobilization day, the date for certain planned actions to take place in a specified sequence in the event of possible enemy activities. (Encyclopedia Americana)



Dear Miss Ima G* Bugg: I am interested in African-American research. Where can I find fellow researchers and what type of publications are available on this subject?

Dear Researcher: The Afrigenes Directory, being compiled now by Angela Y. Walton, lists African-American genealogists everywhere and is expected to be published by the end of 1996. Everyone is welcome to submit information about African-American families for the directories at no charge. Dear Miss Ima G*: This old-fashioned terminology has me confused. I have copies of some legal documents for two of my ancestors and in one, my ancestress is referred to as a "consort" and in the other, she is referred to as a "relict." Was the term "wife" not used?

Dear Old Fashioned: You know they did that just to confuse us modern folks. Actually, the terms are very specific and provide additional clues about a married woman in relationship to her husband. If the woman is referred to as the "consort" of the man, he was alive when she died. If she was the "relict" of the man, he predeceased her.



Dear Miss Bugg: My grandfather speaks often of his ancestor "Square James" who was apparently well educated for his time. He could not give me any details about how he got his name. Any ideas?

Dear Name Dropper: First of all, I assume that your "Square James" lived in the South, and as we all know, things don't always sound like what they really are. Your ancestor was most likely referred to as "Squire James" and was a Justice of the Peace.

This office was established as early as 1630 and was one of the first governmental offices created by the American colonists. The Squire was the peer of village officials. Before the Revolutionary War, the Squire was appointed by the Crown. If offenders did not pay the fines imposed on them, this dignitary could place them in the stocks, or order them to be shipped. Persons who lived disorderly "misspending their precious time" could be sent to a workhouse. He could break open doors where liquors were concealed to "defraud His Majesty's excise." And, he could issue "hue and cries" for runaway servants and thieves. A more pleasing function of the office was to marry those who came to him bringing the town clerk's certificate that their "nuptial intentions had been proclaimed at three religious meetings in the parish during the preceding fortnight." Dear Ima G* Bugg: I recall reading an item a few years back about a man who became his own grandfather. It sounded logical at the time, but is it really possible?

Dear Reader: Yes, it really happened, so the story goes: I married a widow who had a daughter. My father visited our house frequently and fell in love with my stepdaughtner and married her. Thus, my father became my son-in-law, and my stepdaughter became my mother, for she was my father's wife. My father and stepdaughter had a son. He was both my brother (my father's son) and my grandchild (my stepdaughter's son). My wife became my grandmother, for she was my mother's mother. I was my wife's husband and grandchild at the same time. Since the husband of a person's grandmother is his grandfather, I was my own grandfather.

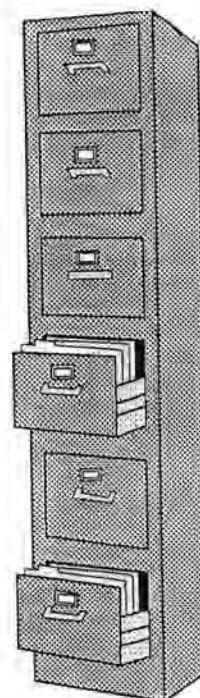

DO YOU HAVE ANCESTORS IN TEXAS?

The Texas State Genealogical Society is offering a commemorative TEXAS FIRST FAMILIES CERTIFICATE to anyone directly or collaterally descended from a Texas resident as of February 19, 1846, or before. LAYING CLAIM TO POCAHONTAS

How to Tell if There is a Princess in Your Past

Thanks to the release of the new Disney movie, Pocahontas has become a hot property, and lots of people now would like to claim that they are her descendants. Not many are likely to be able to do so legitimately, however.

Although the Disney film portrays Pocahontas as a seductive 18 year old maiden fascinated with John SMITH, the truth is that she was an 11 or 12 year old girl when she met the English captain. It was only when she turned 18 that she became involved with a white man, marrying John ROLFE, an Englishman and a Virginia colonist, in April, 1614.

After their marriage, Pocahontas and her new husband traveled to England, where the Powhatan princess was entertained by nobles and royalty. In 1615, she gave birth to a son, Thomas; two years later, she died at Gravesend, England.

The simple fact is that if people cannot trace their ancestry to Thomas ROLFE of Virginia, they are not her descendants.

We know that Thomas ROLFE inherited his father's Virginia holdings and that he fathered only one child himself, a daughter, Jane ROLFE.

In 1675, that daughter married Col. Robert BOLLING, again the marriage produced only one child, this time a son, John BOLLING of Cobbs Plantation. He was a member of the House of Burgesses, Virginia's colonial legislature.

John BOLLING married Mary KENNON and their issue was one son and five daughters. This fourth generation is what genealogists call the "gateway" key to descent from Pocahontas. If you cannot prove your descent from one of these children, you aren't related. The children were:

Major John BOLLING, who married Elizabeth BLAIR, niece of James BLAIR, founder of William and Mary College.

Jane BOLLING, who married Col. Richard RANDOLPH of Curles. One of their descendants was Thomas Mann RANDOLPH of Edge Hill, Governor of Virginia and husband of Thomas JEFFERSON's daughter, Martha.

Elizabeth BOLLING, who married Dr. William GAY.

Martha BOLLING, who married Thomas ELDRIDGE.

Anne BOLLING married James MURRAY of the ancient clan of that name.

Legitimate descendants of Pocahontas include Harry Flood BYRD, a U.S. Senator and Governor of Virginia and his brother, Richard Evelyn BYRD, discoverer of the South Pole.

Mary Ann HARRISON, wife of former New York City Mayor John LINDSAY, is a descendant as is Anne Cary RANDOLPH, who married diplomat and U.S. Senator Gouverneur MORRIS. Robert E. LEE's wife, Mary Ann RANDOLPH CURTIS, also could claim Pocahontas as a forbear.

The only descendant of Pocahontas to occupy the White House was Edith BOLLING GAIT WILSON, the second wife of Woodrow WILSON. She descended from the marriage of John BOLLING, III and Mary JEFFERSON, the sister of President Thomas JEFFERSON.

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Editor's Note: The above article omitted a daughter of John BOLLING and Mary KENNON: Mary BOLLING, who married Col. What happened to our John (Thomas?) HACKETT? We have the following information: He was in the U.S. 2nd Army, Inf., resigned Natchitoches 30 Jan 1809. He may have had a son, Thomas, born 22 Dec 1808 Cincinnati, Hamilton Co, OH. After he disappeared, possibly to Ireland, his (1st?) wife, Jane McCLELLAND HACKETT married Cornelius VAN ARSDOL on 23 Dec 1811 Montgomery Co OH; they moved in Apr 1820 to Delaware Co IN.
