REVIEW

- April 10, 1971: Mrs. Mary Agnes Slimer presided in absence of the president. Preceding the business, Fern Ainsworth gave a very informative and interesting talk on migration trails into the south, with handout material to illustrate details of her lecture. A dedicated genealogist, with a charming personality and fine clear voice, Fern always presents a carefully prepared program. She has been seriously ill since mid-April, in the hospital over a month, and is now convelescing at home, 3430 Milton St., Shreveport, La. 71109. Cards and notes will be most welcome.
- May 8, 1971: A short business session was followed by a lecture on Microfilm records by Tom Elkins who has read enough microfilm to be considered an expert on this subject. Tom, an experienced talented speaker, is in great demand by all the many organizations he belongs to and always does a fine job wherever needed, whether presiding at a big state-wide meeting or on K.P. for a pot-luck supper.
- June 12, 1971: An important business session was followed by a talk by Billy R. Randolph on the rare and unusual records sometimes found tucked away in cabinets, corners and shelves of courthouses, and on special types of courthouse records not often used in research. Billy has done research in many states, the Library of Congress and National Archives, and is "THE EXPERT" of this area on East Texas genealogy records. He is Chairman of our Cemetery Committee and 17 pages of this issue of The Genie are records he has copied for publication, with more to come in October. We are deeply indebted to him for his support and assistance.

PREVIEW

July 10, 1971: OUR FIRST MEETING AT 3240 CRESWELL STREET, with no stairs to climb, a large room with fine acoustics, comfortably air-conditioned, and refreshment facilities (maybe coffee). This will be another important business meeting and members will vote to ammend the By-Laws as announced on page 3 by the president. A talk on "Queries and How to Use Them" by Ema Lee Tipton will follow the business. REPORT FROM GENEALOGY ROOM OF SHREVE MEMORIAL LIBRARY Margery Wright

Response to my pleas for help in the Genealogy Room has been generous, but more is still needed. Please refer to the April GENIE for details and help us maintain our claim that we have the "Best Genealogy Department in the State."

It will be impossible to list everyone who has donated material and time to the Genealogy Room in the past three months and will mention only a few, but we are most grateful to all of them for their interest and generousity.

Miss Mattie Bell Hart has donated, among other things, several years of back issues of The Highlander Magazine, an excellent aid for those interested in Scotch ancestry. We need a current subscription to this magazine.

Mrs. Robert Chandler read the article on our Vertical Files in the January GENIE and has been collecting pedigrees and manuscript material on early Shreveport families and others, so that our Vertical Files have grown considerably due to her efforts. She is performing a valuable service for genealogists throughout this area. (Letters to the Editor indicate Mrs. Chandler is also giving the library some very favorable publicity through correspondence with searchers elsewhere, and the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Assoc. wants to take this opportunity to thank her.)

The Colonial Dames of America has been most generous again this year and we will soon have the complete set of Egle's genealogy books on Pennsylvania, a very valuable and expensive set of books, much needed.

Chapter No. 237, United Daughters of the Confederacy, had some CSA Veterans' records microfilmed for us and included an index which they compiled on the four volumes. This will will be most helpful to everyone interested in Confederate records.

Our friends in East Texas have always been generous in their support. A very special thanks to "Annonymous" of East Texas for the complete set of the <u>Virginia County Records</u> by William Cozier. Our old set was incomplete and in bad repair.

Bobby Neal Smith, youngest member of the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Assoc., offered to give up a summer of fun in the sun to work in the Genealogy Room on a volunteer basis and was doing a find job helping get the back log of work done when he was offered a much needed "paying" summer job in library-related work. We regret losing him, but when this job is over he plans to continue work here until he starts to Northwestern University in September, with plans to major in Library Science.

Our Civil War Collection is in such poor condition it is now housed on the third floor and cannot be moved back to the Genealogy Room until it is restored. If you belong to an organization that needs a project, this would make a good one.

Now that you have learned where all the books in the Genealogy Room are located, we are going to move them about again, as we are running out of shelf space. Four sets of "island" shelves, four section each, six shelves high, will replace the nine four-shelf sections running from the fireplace to the front wall where the Maryland-Virginia books are now located. As soon as completed, a new diagram will be published in The Genie, to replace the one on Page 9 of the April issue.

TYLER'S QUARTERLY has been added to our collection. This almost completes the reference material listed in Swem's Index and is extremely important for research in Virginia.

THE SHREVEPORT-BOSSIER CITY CONVENTION-TOURIST BUREAU

The Shreveport-Bossier City Convention Tourist Bureau is a group of successful, serious minded buisness men working for the economic betterment of this area, which will benefit all its citizens. Groups of this type receive little praise for what they do, but get large doses of often undeserved criticism regularly.

They have announced a Drive to Lure Tourists to This Area, concluding with this statement: "If the Commission can convince one couple to spend the night in the metropolitan area they would be expected to spend about \$35 on the average for lodging, meals, gasoline, shopping and sight seeing. If one couple per day stops this would mean an income of \$12,775 per year. One hundred couples per day would mean \$1,277,500 per year, which would create 127 new jobs and add about \$500,000 to the economy." They plan to feature Norton Galleries in a national ad and we appreciate their help on this. We've been publicizing the R. W. Norton Galleries and Library for a very long time, however, the Bureau makes no mention of their fine Library.

Their new yellow brochure has a map of the Shreveport-Bossier City area on one side. On the other, pictures of the handsome mayors of the two cities with their joint welcome to tourists, a History of Shreveport, and lists 16 tourist attractions. R. W. Norton Gallery is listed with a picture of the building, but again, no mention of its Library and genealogical research facilities. The map gives the location of many public buildings, hospitals, schools, etc., but carefully omits Shreve Memorial Library, with not a word about it anywhere in the brochure.

The Bureau ignores completely one of the largest, most mobile, most consistant, fastest growing tourist elements in America, The Genealogists. The Genie protests!

First, how did they arrive at the average of \$35 per day per couple? The couple I belong to spends at least \$50 per day for the items they list, camera supplies, tape, zerox copies, books and other bare necessities on every research trip, and we are about as average as any genealogists could be. For research, most genealogists spend money as if it were going out of style, no matter where they are travelling or at home.

Genealogists are not some crackpot minority group following a seasonal fad such as rock festivals, hoola hoop contests, participating in protest marches, or trying to tell everyone what is wrong with the world and how to destroy it so we can make it over. We are a steadily increasing numerous people, of all ages and backgrounds, quietly going about our work of collecting, publishing and preserving genealogical-historical data, making them available to all others interested in them for generations to come. Our research knows no season, continues the year around, on week ends, holidays, vacations and every day in the week.

There are many active dedicated genealogsits in the Shreveport-Bossier City area. The Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association has over 200 members, representing only a very small percentage of the total number here. The Genie, edited and published locally, is distributed in almost every state in the Union - to members, Societies, Libraries and Archives. Our well attended monthly meetings and fine Workshops bring in many overnight guests. For years we have been publicizing Shreveport as a Major Genealogical Research Center of the South-Southwest by telling genealogists everywhere about the fabulous research facilities available here. If the Bureau had any idea how many out of towners come here almost every day to do research at Shreve Memorial Library, how far they travel for that purpose alone, how long they stay, how often they return and how much money they spend here, the entire Bureau would just flip! In unison!

Our regular meetings and Workshops don't bring in several thousand boisterous revelers in search of a day's fun once each year, but the steady quiet flow of dayafter-day, week-after-week, month-after-month, year-after-year researchers who do

come here adds up to a very impressive number, and is increasing rapidly - all due to the fine Genealogy Department of Shreve Memorial Library and information about it and other libraries here, which is published in every issue of The Genie.

We respectfully suggest that the Shreveport-Bossier City Convention-Tourist Bureau take a long careful look at what we are doing and what has so quietly happened here in the past few years, then recognize Shreveport as a Major Genealogical Research Center of the South-Southwest, well known throughout the mid-south and west to the Pacific Coast, with genealogists coming from as far away as California and other distant areas to do research in Shreve Memorial Library's Genealogy Room. The Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association, through it work and publications, has been luring tourists to the Shreveport-Bossier City area for several years.

"Reynold's knowledge of Mobile and its founders, settlers, and inhabitants was quite comprehensive. He learned much of the city's early history from the pages of the old Mobile Gazette, the first English language newpaper in Mobile, which appeared irregularly from 1812 until it was absorbed by the Mobile Register in 1823. From the middle of the 1830's, Reynolds possessed the advantage of personal acquaint-anceship with the personalities and events of Mobile which he chronicles. Among his friends were the leaders of Mobile's legal, social, and political life, as well as numerous persons of standing in the community in his day who left no lasting mark on Mobile's or Alabama's history."

Six pages of notes, added to the reprint, by Benjamin B. Williams, an Alabama historian, give much details on individuals and events and biographical-genealogical data on many early men of Mobile. THE GENIE, JULY 1951

"The Genealogist's Code was developed by a Committee of the Board of Certification of Genealogists chaired by Dr. Kenn Stryker-Rodda. Its purpose is similar to codes of ethics of the archival, medical, and legal professions, namely, to assure the highest standards of research and to render the greatest possible assistance to the public as well as to the client. The Code was approved by the American Society of Genealogists and the National Genealogical Society, and is being sent now to other organizations with a request for publication and comment." - - -

This statment in a letter to the editor from Mr. Milton Rubincam who presented to us a copy for publication in The Genie and explained it at our May Workshop.

THE GENEALOGIST'S CODE

"The profession of genealogy calls for accurate research, personal and scholarly integrity, and creative analysis. A genealogist must realize that he has moral obligations to society as well as to his client, beyond the requirements of law and business practice. His honesty of purpose must be above suspicion, his findings from the best available evidence, and his analysis sound."

Realizing my moral obligations as a genealogist, I make the following commitments:

I have obligations to the public. Whether engaged in independent research or acting as consultant, adviser, or assistant on a mutually acceptable basis of fee, I will strictly maintain my professional integrity. I will not indulge in exaggerated, misleading, or false advertisement or publicity. I will not publish or publicize as fact anything I know to be false or unproven; nor will I be a party, either directly orindirectly, to such actions by others.

I have obligations to my client. To avoid unnecessary duplication of effort I will, before undertaking research, request from the client such information as he has assembled, with its documentation; and on the basis of that information I will give a candid opinion of the possible or probable results of the projected research. I will make my communications to the client definite and clear. If unable to resolve his problem, I will explain why, and, if possible suggest other avenues of research.

I will inform my client that my conclusions must be based on the preponderance of evidence, and that absolute proof of ancestral relations is usually impossible.

I will not knowingly misquote any document nor cite as authoritative any questionable source. I will not assert as a fact that which I have not substantiated by adequate documentation, nor conceal or withhold data which would break down the chain of evidence necessary for the client's purpose.

I will consider work done for a client as confidential, and will not divulge any information concerning the client or his interests without prior consent. Nor will I publish under my own name and in his lifetime, without authorization, the results of research for which the client has paid.

I will have no personal or financial interests which might tend to compromize my obligations to the client.

I have obligations to the profession. I will not act in a manner detrimental to the best interests of the profession.

I will not knowingly injure or attempt to injure, without demonstrable justification, the professional reputation, prospects, or practice of another genealogist. I will, however, participate in exposing genealogical charlatans.

I will not attempt to supplant another genealogist already employed by a client; nor will I substitute for another unless and until a written form of substitution has been signed by all concerned.

I will not present as my own, the work of another.

RECORDS COMPILED BY OIL COMPANY LEASE DEPARTMENTS

Oil wells are almost as commonplace as pine trees in the Ark-La-Tex area, frequently outnumber houses and people in rural sections, and everyone has heard of oil leases. However, few genealogists seem to know how much research oil companies do on land they lease or what happens to the records when the lease expires. If you already know this, forgive my eager chatter. What I don't know would fill several oversize box cars and when I learn something that may help others, I just can't wait to tell about it.

In 1940 a "lease hound" called to locate my father to obtain his signature on a lease for land that had been in our family over 100 years. He then needed about 400 signatures so I wished him luck and forgot about it. When I began research on the Carlton line I found a list of all the living heirs prepared by the oil co. in 1940. It was actually a pedigree chart of all C. B. Carlton's descendants and I stupidly assumed this was all the data the company had compiled. In 1969 another "lease hound" called. I told him my father was dead but all his children would sign the lease if he would give me an up-to-date list of all the Carlton heirs. He agreed to this. After six months, not hearing from him, I called and was told there were now over 2,000 heirs so the project was abandoned. I never did get the up-to-date list, but wouldn't the names and addresses of over 2,000 living descendants of any great-great-grandfather be wonderful to have?

In April, Willie Farley offered to loan me records on an oil lease to examine. I expected to see a list similar to the one above, plus perhaps a few pages of other data. Instead I received a bound volume of 305 pages! I had never seen a complete abstract on any tract of land before. There must be others who are unfamiliar with such documents. Their availability through oil companies is of special importance in this area. For those who have never seen a complete abstract and who, like me, may not have considered them important, a description of the Farley document may be helpful.

On the cover is listed every parcel of land and its exact location in the entire 260 acres. Page 1 to 4 is an index of all grantors and grantees, page and book numbers of original records, notes whether the transaction was a land grant, sale, succession, mortgage, power of attorney, etc. Page 5 gives the same data as the cover. Page 6, The Surveyor's Report, is a graph of the township divided into 40-acre plots. Page 7 is the abstractor's explanation of where various records were located and that some were lost in a courthouse fire in 1878. Four northwest Louisiana Parish Courthouses are listed as sources of the data, with dates when each was formed and from what other parishes.

The first deed on Page 8, dated 27 April 1850, is for 159.12 acres, a patent based on a military warrant, giving certificate number and land description. Page 9 states that failure to find any record of sale or transfer of this land was due to records being lost in the courthouse fire. Pages 10 through 305 are copies of all other deeds and transactions related to the 260 acres beginning 23 November 1872 through 8 June 1937, when the abstract was completed for the oil company.

Just try to imagine 297 pages of land transactions of your very own family, with names, dates and many other details on all those involved in any way. All land abstracts may not be this extensive but some are much large and almost all of them will contain much valuable genealogical data. You could go from courthouse to courthouse and perhaps collect most of these records for yourself, but I suggest you try the oil company lease departments and abstract companies first.

I contacted lease departments of several oil companies and learned it is a common practice to give the abstract to some member of the family when the lease expires, although some companies charge a modest price for them. Since abstracts cost the company from \$100 to \$500 or more, they usually have only one copy

and no duplicates will be available from them. Circumstances vary and often the title search goes back only 10 to 20 years. Laws governing oil leases vary from state to state, with more information needed on some leases than on others.

If an oil company ever leased land belonging to your family, or which ever belonged to them, you should contact their lease department to learn if they have a complete abstract on the land and if they will permit you to examine it. They can tell you if they ever had an abstract prepared, if they still have it, if disposed of who received it, and the name of the abstract company who compiled it. Don't forget to ask if they have a list of all the living heirs on any property that has been in your family for several generations. Response to all my questions was most cordial, so you should have no reluctance in calling for this type of information. If you are lucky, you could really "bring in a gusher" of data.

If you don't know the name of the oil company that leased the land, just start through the telephone book and call every oil lease department until you locate the one you want. In oil lease areas, oil companies are the first places to check. However, abstracts are prepared for many other land transactions. Banks and loan companies usually require a complete abstract before granting a mortage on land; Abstracts are used in many estate settlements; wise buyers always demand a full abstract on any land they purchase; and many other transactions involving land employ these documents.

I don't know how many deeds, leases, mortgages and other land documents I have signed, but I certainly never bothered to read all that fine print and until I began research on my families and started checking land records, I wouldn't have understood it anyway. Shocked by my ignorance, I did some checking on Abstract Companies.

Abstract companies seem to be the outgrowth of early land disputes, long before 1800. They copied all public records affecting land, such as deeds, estate settlements, probate records, tax lists, mortgages, land grants, marriage contracts, divorces, dowers, wills, and all other data affecting the title to the land, assembled and posted them to tract books in geographical order, so that all matters pertaining to any land would be gathered together for easy reference. The main objective was to keep the title to the land clear, but the records contained a great deal of genealogical data. Where courthouses have burned, the abstract company in that county or parish may have the only existing records on many details of your family history. See Know Your Ancestors by Ethel Williams, Chapter 8, "Land Records as Research Tools" for more data on Abstract office records.

After calling several abstract companies I learned that some of them retain a copy of every abstract they compile for their permanent files. Some companies maintain only a summary indexed by location: township, range, section, etc. In this case, unless you know the exact location of the land, they may be unable to help you. The records of an abstract company are not public records. They belong to the company which compiled them. Policies and procedures are not the same for all companies and you must contact each firm individually to learn what records they may have and to secure permission to examine them. All those I contacted stated that they would be glad to supply information available in their office. Since the business of these firms is supplying information, I assume there will be some charge for the data obtained from them. I did not inquire as to this, since each case differs and must be considered separately.

On your vacation, please try to write down the name and address of all Abstract Companies in every county or parish you visit, for our September "Show and Tell" program and so that a master list can be placed in the Vertical Files of the Genealogy Room of Shreve Memorial Library. This information is badly needed.

- 8. I appoint my long tried friend, John Armfield of Sumner Co., Tenn. and John M. Bass of Nashville, Tenn., my Executors with full power to convey except for my Deer Creek Estates and the property in New Orleans mentiond in Item 6. I also appoint my Exrs. to compromise debts due me and pay exchanges in interest according to commercial usages, at the expense of my estate. I want every cash balance to be paid promptly. If convenient, I want my remains to be placed by my wife and children. Signed/ H. R. W. Hill 29 July 1853.

(TO) John M. Bass, John Armfield:

My friends - if you have to execute the enclosed will, and nothing in the character of either of the men should change your views, I recommend Robt. W. Estlin and Thomas B. Lee should succeed to my commercial house and with them under your direction, my old commercial business. It will be a fortune to them and I wish them to have it. I would be glad for James A. McAlister to be -----, but he has always objected to New Orleans. I know them to be faithful, capable and honest.

My charities will all be done in my lifetime, and justice to all while living; so I leave no obligations, only gratitude and friendship.

Charge full commissions on my estate. It is worth this day over 15 hundred thousand dollars.

I believe in the Christian Religion, though an unworthy believer.

I want my negroes to be well treated. But for abolitionism, I should have been able to do more for them.

NOTES ON BOSSIER PARISH LOUISIANA MARRIAGE RECORDS, MINISTERS & JUSTICES OF PEACE LISTED IN MARRIAGE BOOKS A & B, 1843-1867. By Mrs. Sam J. Nation

When Bossier Parish was created in 1843 the Parish Judge was invested with authority to issue marriage licenses, required to demand bond from applicant according to his means, and to post notice of intended marriage at the door of the church or courthouse. Applicant's bond was a guarantee no legal impediment to the marriage existed, and was binding for two years. After 15 days, there being no objection, license was issued. The Parish Judge and any Priest, Minister or Justice licensed by the Judge had authority to celebrate marriages. In 1845 for the first time, it became the duty of the minister or magistrate who celebrated marriage to make duplicate acts of the fact and return one copy to the Parish Judge within 30 days, he being required to record and file such acts in his office. After 1846 the office of Parish Judge was abolished and authority to grant marriage licenses and special licenses to ministers, et al, to celebrate marriages, and the duty of recording and filing the acts of marriage devolved upon the Clerk of Court.
