# WOODRUFF CHRONICLES & GENEALOGY, VOLUME II Ema Lee Tipton

Compiled by Ceylon Newton Woodruff and Maurine R. Herod. Published by Arthur H. Clark Co., Box 230, Glendale, Calif. 21909, price \$15.75. A companion to Vol. I, Woodruff Chronicles, it is  $6\frac{1}{8} \times 9\frac{1}{2}$ , hardback, 284 pages, with Coat of Arms, genealogical chart, historical mpa, 5 pages of illustrations and complete index. All Woodruff and related families will be interested to know a limited number of copies of Vol. I are still available at \$23.50 and both Vol. I and Vol. II can be obtained as a set for \$36.00 from the publishers.

No attempt is made to include Woodruff and related families of New Jersey in this review as The Genie is published primarily for readers in the South and Southwest. However, all libraries with genealogical departments in New Jersey, Florida, Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi should obtain copies while they are still available. Its value to libraries in DeSoto and Caddo Parish, La., and Freestone and Brown Co., Texas can not be minimized. Only 24 of the 284 pages will be discussed here.

My personal interest in this book is based on the simple fact that I am either "kin or kin to kin" of all these southern families. Maurine Herod, co-compiler, descends directly from the Woodruff, Magee, Riley and Etheredge families of DeSoto Parish, La. and Freestone Co. Texas, and through them related to the Moore, Horn, Stephenson, Billingsley, Robinson, Ruffin, Nance, and other early families of De Soto, Sabine and Caddo Parish, Louisiana.

Elias Woodruff, 1785-1862, son of Seth and Phoebe (Haines) Woodruff, was born in New Jersey. In 1811 he married Ailcey Collins in Twiggs Co. Ga. and moved to Pike Co. Miss. In 1850 Elias and one sone were in Orange Co. Florida. His wife and most of their other children were in DeSoto Parish, La. Their children were:

Amelia Woodruff, b. 1814, m. Chauncey Collins and lived in Mississippi. Related families are Magee, Carr, Smith, Tate, Morris and Corley.

Eliza Woodruff, b. 1816, m. Moses Williams of DeSoto Parish, La. A son, Weston Lafayette Williams m. Margaret Lee Houston, daughter of General Sam Houston. No other children of Moses and Eliza Williams are listed. Weston died in 1889 and is buried in Brownwood, Texas.

Lucetta Woodruff, b. 1819, m. Rev. W. G. Evans of Harrison Co. Miss., a prominent Methodist Minister of Mississippi.

Phoebe H. Woodruff, b. 1824, m. Burkett Thigpen of DeSoto Parish, La. Related families are Etheredge, Mims, Oliver, Ruffin, Roberson, Smith, Berley, and Pitts.

Sarah Cole Woodruff, b. 1826, m. William Ginn Magee of DeSoto Parish, La. Related families are Fincher, McElroy, Howell, Collins, Robbins, Rascoe, Cole, Sanders, Riley, et al, of DeSoto and Sabine Parishes, and many others in Freestone Co. Texas.

Seth Woodruff, b. 1828, m. Mary Sophie Rich of Mechlenburg Co. N.C. Related families of DeSoto Parish and East Texas are McPhearson, Rachal, Samuels, Smith, Pitchford and Heflin.

William Washington Woodruff, b. 1832, lived with his father in Florida after 1848, m. Nancy Jane Galloway and died in Seminole Co. Florida in 1872. Many descendants still live in Florida.

Martha Ann Woodruff, b. 1833, m. Abram Hill Thigpen of DeSoto Parish, La., brother of Burkett Thigpen who m. Phoebe H. Woodruff. Many descendants in DeSoto and Caddo Parish, La.

This well-documented book, compiled after years of careful research, begins with John Woodruff, 1665-1770, and brings the family down to the present generation. Over 725 surnames and thousands of christian names are indexed. (by quick count).

#### STARR & CRAWFORD FAMILY RECORDS

Compiled from original Bibles of Mary P. Starr Crawford and Margarette Lee Starr Crawford and J. D. Prator Bible, and others; Censuses of Alabama, Georgia, and Union Co., Ark.; marriage records, wills, and cemetery inscriptions; and files of Lillian McGowen, 1504 N. Mosby, ElDorado, Ark. and Nancy Fincher, September 1969.

HENRY STARR (1752-182-) Revolutionary soldier of Maryland, his wife Mary, believed to be from Virginia, and their children settled along banks of the Little River in Wilkes Co., Ga. 1780-85. In 1789, he bought 200 acres of land, in 1792 bought 350 acres described as bounded on all sides by vacant land. In 1798 he sold 200 acres to Thomas Skinner, and in 1814 deeded 250 acres to sons Asa and Samuel Starr, indicating that he was preparing to move to Morgan County where a Henry Starr and one female over 45 are listed on the 1820 census. His will dated 1818 and recorded in 1821 names only his wife Mary and is the last record found on Henry Starr. So far as is known at this time, their children were: Joshua, John Elijah, Samuel, Silas, Asa, Amelia, Caleb, Benjamin and Ann.

In 1799, JOSHUA STARR, believed born in Maryland, married Fenton Melear, daughter of Richard and Martha Melear, also in Wilkes County by 1785 or earlier. Joshua was a minister in Wilkes County and died there in 1822, leaving four sons who also became Methodist Ministers. John Wesley Starr was called on of the builders of Alabama Methodism. James Russell Starr moved to Henry County in 1825, thence to Troup County in 1829, to Chambers County in 1834 where he died. Joshua Starr went to Smith County, Texas ca 1852 and established the town of Starrville. Henry Starr (William Henry) followed later and in 1860 the two families owned all land between Starrville and Tyler, a distance of twelve miles.

Starrville, Texas, in northeast Smith County, located on the Dallas-Shreveport freight route, an overnight stop for freighters, was settled in 1852 and had a post office by 1856. Two schools and two academies were operating by 1858. In 1869, Starrville held what some source claim was the first State Fair in Texas. About the turn of the century, rail and postal service was discontinued, leaving the town to gradually decline in population.

FENTON STARR, her children and perhaps the Crawfords moved to Henry County Ga. ca 1825. The 1827 shows Mary Starr, a widow in Mrogan County, drew land in Gaines County; John W. and Fenton Starr, widow of Henry County, drew land in Lee County. Fenton Starr and family are listed on the 130 census of Henry County Georgia.

ELIHUE and WATSON ATWOOD CRAWFORD, and one brother, name unknown, were sons of Claiborne Crawford whose parents were Ambrose and Martha Crawford from Virginia. Per land deeds, they lived along the Little River, Wilkes County Georgia in 1791. In 1820 Claiborne Crawford is listed on the 1820 census of Morgan County. Nothing further is known of Claiborne and his parents at present.

MARY P. STARR and ELIHUE CRAWFORD were married 1832, and MARGARETTE LEE STARR and WATSON A. CRAWFORD were married 1834, both in Henry County, and were lised on the 1840 census of that county. However, Watson and Margarette Crawford soon moved to Upson County where most of their children were born, and sometime in the 1860's migrated to the Cass County area of East Texas. It has not yet been determined where Elihue and Mary Crawford lived between 1840-1860, at which time they moved to Union County Arkansas.

### GENEALOGICAL QUERIES

### Ema Lee Tipton

The queries you publish and those published by others can be one of your most valuable, most rewarding research tools. Neglecting this phase of research can be a serious handicap, and who need handicaps in searching for genealogical records. The major purpose of publishing genealogical queries or answering queries published by others is to make contacts, exchange data, and coordinate research with others who are interested in your families, or in your surnames.

Always request the source of any information you may receive, obtain photo-copies of the original records whenever possible, or establish proof of their accuracy in some other way. Without proof, use the information only as a clue or lead, but remember, clues and leads are extremely important. Never publish a query unless you plan to follow up all replies.

You can write your own queries better than anyone else because you have more information and know what you need better than anyone else. I suggest you carefully study the queries published in all the good periodicals to learn how they should be written, then follow the examples of those you like best. Some "How To" books give guidelines for writing queries. The following instructions were given for preparing queries for the September 1968 Genealogical Register:

"In preparing this registration blank please, if at all possible use a typewriter equipped with a good ribbon. If registration is handwritten, please print as plain as possible. Double space your lines to make your material easier to read and to enable the editor to make notations between lines for the typesetter. Do NOT abbreviate. Capitalize all letters of surnames and the first letter only of given names or places. (John JONES born Mesa, Colo. married Mary MEEKER born Peoria, Ohio.) Proof (reread and check) your material to be certain it is correct.)"

In the June 1970 Genealogical Helper, the following rules and recommendations were published for queries to be sent in to "The Question Box" section:

- "1. Each query must pertain to one person or one couple. Give all the information you can such as dates of birth, marriage, death, etc. Also give facts or traditions such as place of birth, marriage, death; place and date of children's birth; religion, military service; occupation; places of residence, including city, county, state, etc.
- 2. Each query must be typewritten on a separate sheet never on a sheet with an order or other matter. (Or other query.)
- 3. The name and address of the querist must appear on each and every question submitted to the Question Box.
- 4. Queries of general interest on any genealogical subject will receive top priority. Others will be considered in the order in which they are received.
- 5. Queries must not exceed 100 words. Only one query per person, per issue will be published. If you send more than one query, mark them as to first, second and third, etc. - - - "

Most quarterlies give specific rules for preparing queries sent to them, limit the number of words in each query, have a very strict deadline for each issue and a special Query Editor to edit and set up the material for final copy. So far, The Genie has established no tight rules but you will note my "query" for a Query Editor on the bottom of the last page of "Information Please" in the July issue. Anyone who volunteers will be welcomed with open arms and a stack of material to start on. All you need to qualify is a typewriter, a magnifying glass, a zip code book, a chrystal ball, ability to read illegible handwriting, an excellent imagination, the patience of Job, and the willingness to try. The rest is easy as pie. The job of Query Editor for The Genie is still open. Doesn't anyone want it?

Suggestions for preparing queries for The Genie are given on the next page.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARING QUERIES FOR PUBLICATION:

- 1. To compose a good query, use your head, family group sheets and pedigree charts, and confine each query to one person or one family group as nearly as possible. No explanation is needed for details you are sure of, but for those you have no proof on, specify them as <a href="Irradition">Irradition</a>, <a href="Probable">Probable</a>, or <a href="Estimated">Estimated</a> so the reader will know you need proof on these details.
- 2. Prepare a rough draft of the query, check all dates, names, places to be sure they are correct, then write the final copy. Proof read and keep one copy for your files.
- 3. Never use any abbreviation except standard abbreviation for months and states. NEVER use the new two-letter abbreviations for states of any other two-letter abbreviation for any word. Editors don't have time to refer to code books.
- 4. Never use only numerals for dates such as 7/5/23 for 5 Jul 1923. (Never use only numerals for dates anywhere in your genealogical records.)
- 5. Write each query on a separate sheet of paper, with your full name, address, including your newest zip code, and date of mailing in the upper right corner.
- 6. Use only full size sheets of white paper. Never use index cards, pages from scratch pads, or assorted sizes and colors, or torn scraps of paper.
- 7. For typed queries, use standard 8½x11" white paper, a good typewriter ribbon, clean typewriter keys, and double space between all lines.
- 8. For handwritten queries, write or print as plainly as possible, paying special attention to all names, dates, places or other important details. Use standard 8x10 or  $8\frac{1}{2}x11$  notebook paper with lines and skip a line between each line of writing. Use black ink. (If you have not already started using only permanent water-proof black ink for all your genealogical writing, do so at once.)
- 9. In case of mistakes, if you can not make a clean erasure, simply XXX out the mistake and go on from there. NEVER write over a letter, number, or word. (I use a white correction fluid, called "Liquid Paper" which is sold by most large office supply firms. A bottle of thinner is needed with each bottle of Liquid Paper.)
- 10. When you send in more than one query at a time, be sure your name and address is on every page with date of mailing, and show preference of order in which you want them published.
- 11. ALWAYS mail your queries in time to be received before the deadline date for publication in the next issue of the periodical so they won't have to lay over for three months.

The Genie is published the 1st day of January, April, July and October. All queries should be received no later than the 10th of the month preceding publication date, i.e., 10 Dec., 10 March, 10 June and 10 September, or sooner if possible. It is necessary to type up the queries ahead of time to determine the exact number of pages for each issue. Once the format is established, it is very difficult to add or delete a page, and queries not received on time may have to be carried over.

These are suggestions, not rules. Don't let them discourage you from sending in your queries for publication in The Genie. As Editor, I need your support to publish six or seven pages of queries in each issue. As Searchers, you need the information you may obtain. Send in at least one query for every issue of The Genie. Send more for each issue if you like, but at least one. If you will do this and follow the rules and suggestions on these two pages, your queries could be very successful. Much of the information on your families will be received from unrelated searchers who are gathering data on one of your surnames in the course of their own research, so always respond to all replies whether from relatives or not.
