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To collect, preserve and make available genealogical materials, documents, and records. To encourage an interest in Genealogy and to sponsor educational programs for its development.

To promote and publicize the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, as a major Genealogical Research Center for genealogists and historians interested in records of the entire State of Louisiana and the Ark-La-Tex area. To cooperate with and assist all other genealogical, historical and patriotic societies and libraries in the furtherance of these purposes for the mutual benefit of all.

To compile and publish a regular Genealogical Magazine, THE GENIE, quarterly, and to publish large collections of specific data of the Ark-La-Tex and other areas when available.

A WAGON TRAIN

by Mrs. Woodrow Wilburn

These notes and excerpts are taken from the diary of Mahala McDaniel, wife of Henry McDaniel. They were the great-great-grandparents of Homer C. Elliott of Crows Landing, California, who copied this directly from the diary and sent it to Mrs. Wilburn, Rt. 3, Box 239-A, Texarkana, Texas 75501, for this article.

This is a copy of a log kept of a wagon train trip in 1812 April 8 from Bell Buckle, Tennessee to Texas. Their destination was what later became Washington-on-the-Brazos. It took 299 days on this, the first, trip. (There were three trips in all: one in 1812; one in 1814; and one in 1816). It took 199 days to reach Red River, at the big bend of the river which is now in Bowie County, Tex. In 1812, this was a territory, and the point of entry in Texas was made at this bend because of quicksand to the east and west. It is about 10 miles north of present day Hooks, Tex. Today all that is left to identify this spot where settlers crossed is one lonely white marble tombstone, standing amidst several sunken graves, with the inscription "Jane, wife of S. Cooper, 1846-1887".

This old forgotten cemetery was known as Red River Cemetery. People coming to Texas from Kentucky and Tennessee crossed the river at this spot, and camped here before moving on. There is thought to have been a small community, or settlement, here for awhile as graves were dug here very early. Six graves are definitely known to be here and had stones in 1922. One grave was the grandmother of Jane Cooper (do not know which one of her grandmother). Jane's maiden name was Bolander. Jane's husband was Sam C. Cooper, Jr. He is thought to be buried here; he died in 1914. Also, his parents, Sam Cooper, Sr. and wife (her name not known) are buried here. (As late as 1930 a Bowie County man, my husband, Woodrow Wilburn, saw these stones, but not being interested in history then, he did not copy any data from them.) It is fairly certain the stones have been pushed over and sunk into the ground by grazing cattle. Also a bulldozer has been used in clearing this land in late years. The marker for Jane Cooper's grave was purchased in Clarksville, Tennessee, and was shipped to Fort Smith, Arkansas, and then taken to her grave sometime in 1888. (Ed. Note: For further information regarding Sam C. Jr. and Jane Bolander Cooper refer to THE GENIE, July 1974, page 9.)

This wagon train came south from Fort Smith, Arkansas, to the Red River, east of Spanish Peak. The Captain of the train was Captain Baker, father of the notorious Cullen Baker, Texas outlaw. Captain Baker made three such trips as pilot of these trains, and on the last trip he and his family settled at Spanish Peak. The Indians were so bad that he moved his family across the Sulphur Fork, and somewhat to the east about 40 to 50 miles, in 1838.

There were 39 men, including the doctor and the preacher; 19 women and 42 children. Ninety started on the train from Tennessee, but they picked up two wagons on 20 April. They had 28 wagons, 116 draft horses and mules, and 30 saddle horses. One Hundred Dollars was paid by each family and there were 19 or 20 families on the train. They made a list of all on the wagon train to aid friends and relatives in tracing them, if necessary.

Rules of the Wagon Train

- Allow 5 days for each one hundred miles. Bad days, what you can make, or stay in camp if agreed on by all. Real good days, and ground, makes it easy pulling 25 to 30 miles per day, if camp sites come right.
- 2. Take plenty of guns and ammunition.
- 3. Recommended -- shave your head -- Indians have no interest in Bald Heads.
- 4. Do not drink whiskey or alcohol in freezing weather, or you are liable to freeze to death.
- 5. Do not fire rifles, only when absolutely necessary.
- 6. Do not stay up late -- get your sleep. Guards are on duty all night.
- 7. Do not smoke strong pipes and cigars in close places where women and children are.
- 8. Keep your politics and preaching to yourself. Let the preacher do the preaching.
- 9. In case of a runaway of teams to wagons, get down and try to ride it out. If you jump, you are liable to get killed, or hurt badly. The horse men will pick the team up, maybe not too far off.
- 10. All people -- young, married, or not, stay inside the circle of wagons in Indian country, or you are liable to loose your scalps.

A WAGON TRAIN - continued

- 11. The wagon master will try to pick spots so men and women and children can bathe, clean up, and wash clothes, when possible.
- 12. Be courteous and help others.
- 13. Do not be noisy, even with your musical instruments; only when it is safe.
- 14. When (we) can, we will have recreation and dances.
- 15. Do your part by all means. Church services will be held when it is considered safe from Indians, and other hazardous conditions.

Addenda

In 1974, Jim Kates of Roswell, N. M., wrote this extra bit of data about some of the people on these wagon trains. The following is about his great-great-grand-parents.

John Kates and wife, Cindy Kates, were on the second wagon train piloted by Capt. Baker in 1314. They had two children, a boy and a girl. Cindy died 11 June 1814, and was buried in the Red River Cemetery. The little girl was just a baby. John Kates is also buried in this same cemetery, although his death date is not known.

The daughter (name not known by writer) married Paul Newman in 1834 when she was about 20 years old. He died in the Texas Revolution. In 1843 she married, 2nd, Reno Bolander. They had a daughter, Jane, born 1846. This is the Jane who is also buried in Red River Cemetery. She married Sam Cooper, Jr. She died 6 August 1887.

Jim Kates says that John Kates and the two small children stayed at the Hooks Ranch, in what is Hooks, Bowie County, Texas, today. How long they stayed we are not told. He also said that <u>after</u> the fall of the Alamo the graves were moved <u>back</u> away from the river banks. He stated that many of the relatives of the people buried in this cemetery were brought back to the cemetery for burial, and at one time there were 20 to 25 stones in Red River Cemetery. Many of these people went to Bell County, Texas, and to Llana River; also Collin County as well as along the Sabine River. Most of them came from Tennessee and Kentucky.

In this data Jim Kates states that Capt. Baker made his <u>last</u> trip in 1837 and brought his family with him. In 1838 he had to move his family from Spanish Peak where he first settled because the Indians were so bad. (Note in paragraph 1 of this article, it was stated Capt. Baker made three trips. He made 4 or 5 in all, according to Jim Kates.) There are several diaries and logs of these trips that have been kept over the years by the family of Homer C. Elliott of Crows Landing, California. Mr. Elliott sent all this information to use in this article.

They resided about two miles from the Patuxent River in Prince George County, in the vicinity of "Black Swamp", later moving to Washington. Among her friends there were many early and devoted Methodists: Messrs Lyell, Ryland, Bezzel and other pioneers. After her father's death, she and her mother went to live with her only surviving brother, Nathaniel Magruder, near Rockville, Montgomery County. After her mother's death she resided for some years with the family of Col W. D. Beall, then with their adopted dau, Mrs E. H. Hansen, at Fredericksburg, Va.; from 1832 until 1838 lived with her sister, the widow of Capt J. T. Magruder; after that lady's death she went to live in the home of Rev B. M. Drake in Jefferson County where she died 17 Aug 1859 and was laid to rest beside her sister. 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Genealogically Speaking

Recently a lady came to me and said that she had traced one of her lines to an Indian and did not know where to go for additional information. Her problem is common to many in the South and West.

The National Archives has many records available on Indians. These include removals; annuity pay rolls; annual census rolls; special rolls relating to the Eastern Cherokees; claims relating to the Eastern Cherokees; estate files; and Carlisle Indian School files.

The removal records mostly show the names of the heads of families and concern the migration of Cherokees, Chickasaws, Choctaws, Creeks and Seminoles, before and after their removal to western lands. Dates covered are 1815-1852.

Tribal enrollment records name tribal officers from 1827 to date. Also included is the head of each family, names of parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, brothers, sisters and children with the vital statistics of each. They also give tribal and/or band affiliation, land allotments.

Annuity rolls resulted from treaties or acts of Congress providing that the Federal Government make annual payments to tribal members for a stated period of time. These records cover the period 1841-1959 and may be found in the National Archives and/or Federal Records Centers. The rolls contain the English and/or Indian names of each person, their age, sex, and their signature or mark.

Land allotment records cover the period 1856-1935 and are on file in the National Archives, the Superintendent's Office of each Bureau of Indian Affairs, and in the Federal Records Centers. The records contain names of allottee et al. with some vital statistics.

The annual census rolls are dated 1855-1950 and contain much vital information. There are no annual census rolls for the Five Civilized Tribes of Oklahoma or for the Eastern Cherokees before 1898. These records are in the National Archives and Federal Records Centers.

QUESTION: "How can I find the birth record of my 3rd great grandfather who was born in England about 1806?" Mrs. JG

ANSWER: From the information submitted, your next step is to search the appropriate parish registers or bishops transcripts, Nonconformist and Quaker registers for the period. If this fails to help, then you must search all parishes within a 5-mile radius, Nonconformists within 10 miles and Quaker records for the entire county. I also suggest a review of "Genealogical Research in England and Wales by Gardner and Smith, Vol. III, Chapter 10.

GENEALOGICALLY SPEAKING - continued

QUESTION: 'Where in Sabine Parish did people go to get married in the 1840s? How can I locate lost people in DeSoto Parish?" Mrs. FET

ANSWER: First, in reference to finding some trace of "the younger children near Mansfield," you say that you have searched the DeSoto census three
times and find no trace. You also stated that a house was built and indicated
that there were slaves. This is ownership of property and, as property owners,
they had to pay taxes. These were paid yearly. Check the tax roll for the
years you are interested in.

In 1845 young people did not travel far to get married. What is the basis of your statement that they married about 1845. Are you searching in the right year?

You should widen the period of search to 1) an earlier date and 2) to a later date, including the period when and after children were born. Always be aware that marriages of parents sometimes took place after the birth of some or all of their children.

If the marriage took place before 1843, near Many, then check with the Clerk of Court in Natchitoches Parish. If after 1843, check with the Parish Clerk of Sabine Parish.

Since you're not certain the marriage took place in 1845 and/or in Sabine Parish, you should check the surrounding parishes and across the river in Texas. I noted there was a reference to CWE being born in Texas. Also, con't rule out the possibility that they could have been married in the Catholic Church in Many. I would certainly check their records.

BOOK REVIEWS

THE HUNTER FAMILY OF BEDFORD COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Judge Walter M. Hunter; prepared for publication by Dorothy Ford Wulfeck. Publisher, Polyanthos, Inc., New Orleans, Louisiana. Cloth binding, 296 pages, table of contents and name index. \$15.00 from Hunter Book Fund, 546 Academy Road, Fairfield, Conn. 06430

Divided into eight chapters, the book begins with Alexander Hunter and the original Hunter family in America in the early eighteenth century. He then gives details of each generation to the present day. Special interest is given to James Hunter, the Regulator leader of Revolutionary North Carolina, and his son, Samuel Hunter, a distinguished soldier during the War of 1812 and an early figure in Texas history. Pleasant Hunter established the family in Central Louisiana during the early 19th century. In 1955 the family reunion was held at Eden Plantation in Louisiana. Allied families are Kitchen, Daniel, Ford, Prince and Barry.

EARLY JOHNSONS IN CARROLL COUNTY, TENNESSEE, THEIR ANCESTRY AND DESCENDANTS

(1970) by Vice Admiral Marion E. Murphy, U. S. Navy, Retired, 3510 Emerson St.,

This book is a genealogical history of a Johnson family which had roots in the Greenville District of South Carolina in the late 18th century. According to family tradition they were of English origin, with an admixture of Scotch-Irish, and lived in North Carolina before moving to South Carolina. The family included three brothers, William born 1788; Stephen born 1790; and Rowland born 1805. Stephen Johnson moved to Carroll County, Tennessee, in 1826 or 1827, followed by his two brothers. They had more than 2500 descendants whose line of descent are shown in this book. Living descendants are located all over the United States, with heaviest concentrations in Tennessee, Texas, Arkansas, Mississippi, and Oklahoma. Allied family names are: Barnhart, Berry, Blake, Brown, Clark, Eubanks, Harrison, Leslie, McKinney, Morgan, Murphy, Page, Reed, Smith, Thompson, Walsh, Williams, and Williamson. About 700 other surnames are listed in the Family Index.

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
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
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
