errors contained in the contributed material.

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
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Rapides Parish Meeting of Police Jury, August 21, 1871 -

J. N. Rohrer, President

On motion of J. W. Bass: that there not be any more toll collected on a plank road running into Alexandria, by S. R. Boissat, after 23rd inst.

Ferries discussed; that there will not be any more toll collected on a plank road, known as Bayou Robert plank road, after September 14, 1871.

Motion of Mr. Clements: that the public road leading from Cotile down the bank of Red River to Alexandria be changed so as to intersect the Bayou Rapides road near the upper line of G. W. Compton's plantation and that G. W. Compton, H. L. Lockett and James Cruikshank be appointed commissioners to lay off same.

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From 1871 until 1875 -- confusion of getting organized -- the stage line and mail route from Red River Landing causing trouble as to letting out contracts, mostly for mail.

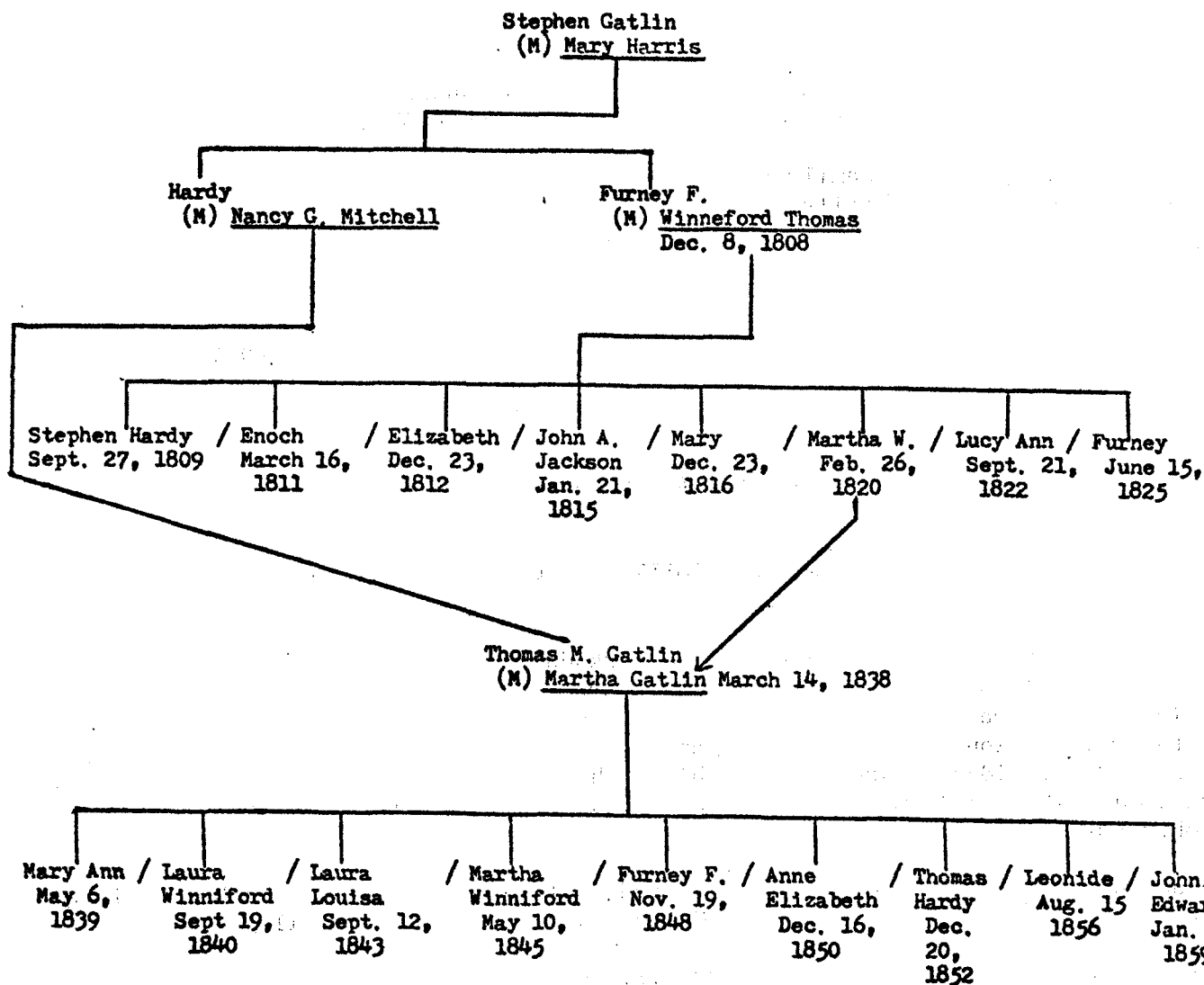

Thomas Hardy Gatlin was the father of Franklin Courtney Gatlin, and the son of Thomas Mitchell Gatlin of Fairview Plantation, DeSoto Parish, La. (See THE GENIE, Jan. 1971). Thomas Hardy and his wife, Annie, are buried in Keatchie town cemetery.

These copies were made in Oct 1973, during a visit with Dr. F. C. Gatlin at his home in Keatchie. Dr. Gatlin, a retired dentist, died in Jan 1974. His wife continues to live in Keatchie.

Found inside the Bible was a loose leaf, blue lined sheet of paper which contained additional information. The original sheet was returned to and is still in the Bible. According to the 1973 interview with Dr. F. C. Gatlin, this sheet was prepared by his Aunt Leonide Gatlin who died in March 1902. She was a sister of Thomas Hardy Gatlin, and is buried at Fairview Plantation cemetery.

Stephen Gatlin and Mary Harris were first cousins - (See "The Gatlin Family in America", Shreve Memorial Library, pg 37) - and were married April 4, 1786 - ("The Gatlin Family", pg 47).

Thomas Mitchell Gatlin and his wife, Martha Winifred Gatlin, were also first cousins - he was the son of Hardy Gatlin and she the daughter of Furney Gatlin, Hardy's brother. Martha was a Gatlin before she married Thomas M.

The reference "See Family Bible" under the Furney Gatlin column on the blue lined sheet refers to a Family Bible other than the Thomas Hardy Gatlin Bible given here. The existence of the referenced Bible is unknown.

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Genealogically Speaking

"Wish to inform you of an important development related to your Clement family name", began the URGENTGRAM MEMO from Canton, Ohio.

"Did you know that Clements have held important military, political and business positions which have greatly contributed to our American heritage? And, did you know that Clements have fought with honor in nearly every war to defend our great country?"

Such news is not much revelation to me; however, I wonder if they are talking about my 43rd great-grandfather, Childeric I, or could it be my 32nd great-grandfather, Charlemagne? No, they are probably talking about my 23rd great-grandfather, Clement de Peake, who went to England from France in 1066 with his cousin, William of Normandy.

"This information comes from our recent genealogical trace of your name. This study shows that your name is significant in American history."

By this time I assume that they are speaking of my eighth great-grandfather, Jeremiah Clement, who came to this country on the ship "George" in 1611 with his mother, Elizabeth, the widow of Geoffry Clement of Oxford, England. Geoffry Clement had chartered the Virginia-London Company at Jamestown, Va., but died before he could sail for the colony. Elizabeth brought three of her servants and her four children to Virginia and settled at Jamestown.

Yes, I knew that the Clement family had contributed to American history. I didn't need one of the growing numbers of companies that are trying to cash in on the Bicentennial or mail-order heraldry to tell me our place in history. So, why the letter?

"The . . . has produced a Clement Bicentennial Commemorative Flag."

"You should see your Clement flag. It measures 16 inches by 24 inches . . . On it is original Bicentennial art work of the American Eagle with the American Shield and flanked by '1776' and '1976'. Across the top in artistic lettering is 'The United States of America'. Under the eagle in large bold letters the proud name of Clement stands out for all the world to see, followed by the proclamation 'An American Bicentennial Family'. The colors of your flag are radiant red, white and blue."

Now we have it! A sales pitch. If the company really wanted to sell me a Clement flag (I already have one) then it would have been one with my own arms, to wit: a blue shield with two red wavy bands. On the chief of the shield which is red are four caltrops in silver. The only thing the company had right were the colors. The four caltrops represent my ancestors that fought in the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, the War for Southern Independence, and myself in the Korean

and Vietnam Wars.

"I have had a number of these flags made up only for selected Clement families such as yourself who are respected and prominent citizens."

This statement is made just in case you haven't fallen for the sales pitch yet. The key words of flattery here are "selected", "respected" and "prominent". Don't kid yourself. This form letter went to thousands, perhaps millions, of people across our great nation. I received two of the letters, one at my post office box and the other at my office.

A few more words and another attempt at flattery when the letter states:

"I can tell you that your neighbors and friends there in Shreveport will be surprised and impressed when they see your flag flying . . ."

Now, do you really want to feel important? Read on.

"I could only reserve one flag for you because of the severe shortage in flag production . . ."

Hogwash! This letter, or one similar, was sent to many people of other surnames all over the country. All that is required of these mass produced flags is the sewing on of the surname. Wouldn't you be "surprised" if you raised "your" special flag at the same time your neighbor was raising his own, to discover the only difference was the surname?

Of course there was a P.S. to the letter. Excuse me, I mean "URGENTGRAM MEMO".

"P.S. . . . The results of the research study on your name throughout American history may be documented into a single publication called, 'The Clement Story in America'. This report will tell where the family originated, when the first families came to America, what political and military positions were held, . . . where they settled, and where they now live, plus much more".

Unless they have access to the several volumes I have already compiled they can tell me nothing.

That paragraph is a flag - a warning flag! Unless you are prepared to pay dearly, you will never know if the "family" history they send you is yours or not. What they are selling is instant ego. It's a search for the buck.

If you want their flag with your name on it, then by all means, get it; but, remember, the only difference in yours and someone else's is the surname that is sewn on the bottom.

If you want to know your own genealogy, then contact the local genealogical society or library. They will put you on the right track. If you want a flag that is truly your own, then design your own. The same is true for coats-of-arms. You can design your own and not have to borrow one that belongs to someone else.

A similar surname does not entitle a person to claim a coat-of-arms or flag. You are misleading yourself in purchasing coats-of-arms or flags by mail or in the local department store.

The U.S. Postal Service is also concerned with this problem under the post office's false representation law. People should know that what they are getting for their money is in all probability the result of an artist's imagination, and has nothing to do with their true family tree.
