NOTEKEEPING:

Before the genealogist has done much practical searching, he begins to realize that some organized plan for keeping research notes is necessary if he is to correctly analyze and evaluate his work.

Of course, some are assimilated immediately and can be transferred directly to a permanent record; but much of the data gathered must be analyzed and evaluated in connection with other material, often at a later date.

Hence, some system to organize research findings while conducting your research is helpful.

Failure to organize research findings from the beginning can lead to confusion and unnecessary work later. The story has been told of one researcher who spent more than \$2,000 traveling to another state seeking genealogical information on one of his lines. He returned home with more than 25 spiral notebooks, all filled with information.

Each book contained information from various sources and localities without regard to any system at all. As he attempted to construct family group sheets from his notes, it became apparant what he had done. Extracts from land, court, cemetery and family records were written in the notebooks in the order in which he searched and found them.

He had followed no system at all and every question required his thumbing through one or more (or all) notebooks for the answer.

Before he could effectively use the material gathered, he had to spend several hours reorganizing the facts into some logical pattern. His research would have been much more effective had he kept his notes organized according to surname, record source and/or locality.

I realize that all research is not conducted at one time. And, too, few of us are able to spend several weeks filling more than 25 notebooks on a single genealogical problem; but, it is easy to accumulate large amounts of unorganized research material just in our everyday searching.

Since all genealogical research should be considered permanent, so, too, a good notekeeping system should be developed by every researcher from the beginning. An acceptable system should clearly indicate the facts that have been located, and documentations should be detailed enough so that someone else could locate the source of information without any difficulty.

There is more than one way to do a thing and it is particularly true with respect to notekeeping and filing your genealogical research papers. It is not surprising that no one method has been developed that is acceptable to all researchers. There are too many variables to expect this. Every genealogist has his own notekeeping system. No two persons seem to follow exactly the same plan for extracting and filing research information.

Some genealogists identify each source investigated on individual cards or slips of paper while others list details on regular theme paper. Some use spiral notebooks to file their findings while others use looseleaf ring binders or folders.

No "best" system can be outlined because each person's objectives may differ; however, those who have workable systems usually follow similar procedures. Some standardization is desirable, however, and that is what this article and the next two or three is all about.

When a person begins research, little concern is sometimes given towards what to do with the notes and documents that are being collected. Stuffing them in drawers, cupboards and boxes may be an easy way to "file" the data but, what about finding it later when the research is continued?

The problem, then, is two fold: 1) How, and in what form, should research data be acquired? and 2) How should it be filed?

The basic purpose of genealogical research is: 1) Gather the details about possible ancestors from the various sources which came into existence during their lives; 2) Compile those details into meaningful form and 3) Evaluate them to determine connections. You cannot properly do this without keeping a record of your activities.

There is probably no other area where your ability as a genealogist will be judged more critically than in the notes and records you keep during your research and the documentation of your completed records.

When a student writes a library research paper he carefully notes each source checked and what he finds therein. As the paper appears in its final form it is well documented; the information from the various sources is carefully footnoted showing the sources of all information.

Your genealogical research should require no less than this. Data in the records you compile are acceptable only if their origin is known. Undocumented "facts" have no weight or authority,

The purpose of good research is two fold: 1) To keep you constantly and completely in touch with the problem in all its aspects. You must know exactly what has been done, why it was done, when it was done and the results of it. You should also be able to tell readily what still needs to be done and why. 2) To aid those who follow you so that they can check quickly for completeness and accuracy and/or continue research where you left off. No one should ever have to re-do your work because he is not sure that you did it correctly.

Your notes should always indicate the purpose of every search you make. No search should be made without a purpose. Everything possible should be done to prevent needless duplication of effort.

There are many different systems of keeping research notes. We each have our own ideas about what is best. Any system is good, however, if it gets the job done. The system I teach is that which I use myself. You do not have to follow it. You may devise your own; however, whichever way you go, you must remain consistent.

It is said that THOMAS WILLIAMS was born about 1714 in Wales and came to America about 1730. He settled in the area near Fort Cumberland, Va. An enlistment record was found for 1754 in Essex Co., Va.

One son of THOMAS WILLIAMS (64), was JOHN W. WILLIAMS (32); born at Fort Cumberland, Va. in 1735. He enlisted in 1754 in Kent Co., Va. A son of his, JOHN LAFAYETTE WILLIAMS (16), lived near Lynchburg, Va.

My grandfather, THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS (8) was born in South Carolina, date unknown. He married his first wife, EVERLINA (Evalina) YOUNG (9), daughter of BOLING YOUNG (18), on 17 Nov 1825 in Montgomery Co., Ala. (Montgomery Co., Ala MB C, pg 376). THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS (8) died in 1851 at Mansfield, DeSoto, La. Children of THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS and EVERLINA YOUNG were:

4 - THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS JR.; born 4 Apr 1834 in Talladega Co., Ala.; married 31 Jan 1868 in DeSoto Parish, La., to FLORENCE ADELE PARKER (5), daughter of STEPHEN D. PARKER (10) and AMANDA MALVINA CROSBY (11). He died 12 May 1923 at Shreveport, Caddo, La. and is buried at the Old Mansfield Cemetery. FLORENCE ADELE PARKER (5) was born 6 Aug 1847 in Caddo Parish, La. and died 24 Feb 1927 at Shreveport. She is buried in the Old Mansfield Cemetery.

8B - BERNARD YOUNG WILLIAMS; born 183__ in Alabama; married EUGENIA P. _____; died in 1896 in DeSoto Parish, La. He served as a private in Co. D, 11th Louisiana Infantry; enlisting 3 May 1862 at Mansfield, DeSoto, La. He was present on all rolls to October 1862. Furloughed from 5 Nov to 4 Dec 1862, at which time he applied for an extension. Apparently the extension was denied for he was listed as present for duty to April 1863. He also appeared on the rolls of Co. B, Consolidated Cres. Regt. La. Inf.; Pvt., roll of Jan-Feb 1864 (only roll on file). Absent without leave. (Booth, Andrew B., Records of Louisiana Confederate Soldiers of Louisiana Confederate Commands, Vol. III, Bk 2, pg 1090).

8C - DOROTHY JANE WILLIAMS; married in DeSoto Parish, La. to THOMAS B. SPAULDING. They moved to Greenville, Texas.

8D - JOHN ELMORE WILLIAMS; born 31 Dec 1837 in Alabama; married ELIZABETH ANNE GUY; died 25 Feb 1889 in DeSoto Parish, La.; buried in Old Mansfield Cemetery, ELIZABETH ANNE GUY was born 14 Aug 1855; died 23 Dec 1937; buried in Old Mansfield Cemetery.

8E - BOLING WILLIAMS; born 1839 in Alabama; married in Montgomery

WILLIAMS FAMILY (Cont'd)

Co., Ala., to MARGARET FRANCES CHILTON; died 16 Oct 1914 and is buried in Old Mansfield Cemetery. MARGARET FRANCES CHILTON was born in 1844 and died in 1936. He served as a private in Co. D., 2d Louisiana Infantry; present on all rolls to April 1862. He enlisted 11 May 1861 at New Orleans; roll for May and June 1862 shows him absent on detached service as a provost guard; roll for August 1862 to February 1863 and roll for March and April 1863 show him present for duty; rolls for May 1863 to October 1863 show him absent, wounded; roll for November and December 1863 has him absent, on furlough. He was discharged on 6 Feb 1865 (Booth, Vol. III, Bk. 2, pg 1090).

8F - GOODE BRYANT WILLIAMS; born 17 Dec 1842 in Talladega Co., Ala.; married 22 Jul 1875 at Mansfield, DeSoto, La., to MARY JANE (Jennie) WILCOX; died 1896 at Mansfield and is buried in the Old Mansfield Cemetery. MARY JANE WILCOX was born 23 Nov 1856 in DeSoto Parish, La., and died at Mansfield on 20 Feb 1891. He enlisted 2 Mar 1862 as a private in Co. A, 12th Louisiana Infantry, at Coushatta, La.

8G - ALABAMA EUGENIA WILLIAMS; born 26 Sep 1847 in Alabama; married 4 Dec 1869 in DeSoto Parish, La., to JOHN SAMUEL BAILEY; died 25 Mar 1882 in Mansfield and is buried there. JOHN SAMUEL BAILEY was born 7 Feb 1846 and died 21 Feb 1904. He, too, is buried in Mansfield.

8H - DANIEL WILLIAMS; born in Alabama and killed at the Battle of Gettysburg on 2 Jul 1863. He served as a sergeant in Co. A, 1st (Nelligan's) Louisiana Infantry; enlisted 28 Apr 1861 at New Orleans; he was on the roll to 31 Aug 1862 with a notation of being absent on sick furlough by order of the Secretary of War. On the rolls 31 Aug 1862 to February 1863 as being present for duty; promoted to sergeant on 9 Apr 1863; military records show that he was born in Alabama and his occupation was that of a carpenter. He was listed as a resident of Springhill, La.; age 25 when enlisted and was single. (Booth, Vol III, Bk. 2).

THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS (8) married his second wife, MARIE CELELINE LAFITTE ST. VIGNE, probably in 1851. She was born in October 1823 and died 13 Jan 1881 and is buried at Carmel, La. Issue by this second marriage was:

8I - JOSIAH LAFITTE (Pomp) WILLIAMS; born 26 Jun 1852; married 1st) ELLEN CATHERINE CLIFTON and 2d) AMBERZINE DOLL DeSOTO; he died in 1919 and is buried in Carmel, La. His first wife, ELLEN C. CLIFTON, was born 12 Sep 1860 in England and died 15 Jul 1902. She is buried in Carmel, La.

Children of THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS JR. (4) and FLORENCE ADELE PARKER (5) were:

4A - THOMAS JEFFERSON WILLIAMS III; born 9 Dec 1869; died 10 Apr 1871.

4C - ALICE CHRISTINE WILLIAMS; born 25 Jun 1874; died 27 Oct 1954 at Shreveport, La.; buried in Old Mansfield Cemetery.

4D - PARKER CROSBY WILLIAMS; born 12 Jul 1880

EDITOR'S NOTE: Numbers appearing by names correspond to the numbers on a pedigree chart, with Mrs. SARAH WILLIAMS BOSMAN as No. 1.

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Several readers have often asked questions concerning the Regional Branch of the National Archives in Fort Worth. It is one of 11 regional archives branches, established in 1969, to preserve and make available for research use those U.S. Government records of permanent value created and maintained by field offices of Federal agencies that are useful primarily for documenting regional and local activities. In addition to accessioning original records, regional archives branches have begun to acquire and will receive over a period of years copies of many of the NARS microfilm publications.

Research rooms, a basic reference library, microfilm reading equipment and document reproduction facilities are available at all archives branches.

Archival holdings vary from region to region. As a rule, however, each branch accessions records from field offices of Federal agencies located in their area.

It is best to write the branch first to see if they have what you need. Yes, the 1900 census is available in Fort Worth. You can address your inquiries to:

MICHAEL H. ASHTON (1840-1878) married FRANCES TURNER in 1864, the daughter of ROBERT TURNER who was born in Georgia in 1795. Upon the death of FRANCES TURNER ASHTON in 1873 she left young children, one of whom was CARRIE ASHTON (1871-1896) who married ELIJAH HENDERSON DARNELL, son of GENERAL NICHOLAS DARNELL. ELIJAH was born in 1863 and died in 1949.

ELIJAH and CARRIE ASHTON DARNELL had two children, one of whom is ALMA ASHTON DARNELL who was born in 1892 and married JESSE BOYKIN GILL in 1909. ALMA still resides in Marshall, Texas, and it was through her that a photostat of the Ashton Bible was obtained by Mrs. Drummond.

MICHAEL H. ASHTON'S brother, CHARLES W. ASHTON (1832-1862), married NANCY TURNER, a sister of FRANCES TURNER. Two Turner girls married two Ashton boys.

CHARLES W. ASHTON died in 1862 and left small children. NANCY TURNER ASHTON subsequently met and married MARCUS D. BLANKENSHIP and this couple took MICHAEL and FRANCES TURNER ASHTON'S children into their family. CARRIE was one of these children.

SEARCHES IN CFI, TIB and FAMILY GROUP RECORDS in the Genealogical Society, Salt Lake City now require a new form. Effective 1 August 1976 a new form for requesting searches in the CFI, TIB and Main Records Section of the Family Group Records Archive entitled "Temple Ordinance Indexes Request" (PFGS0073 7/76 500M) became available for 1¢ each at the General Church Distribution Center, 1999 West 1700 South, PO Box 11627, Salt Lake City, Utah. Completion of this form is required for Genealogical Society searches in these records. The fee for a search of each file for each name is now 50¢, whether or not the information is found. The search is provided for direct-line ancestral families only and payment must accompany the request form. The old TIB form can no longer be used! If a search of several names is to be made in these records, and particularly the confidential TIB, it may be more efficient and less expensive to employ an accredited researcher. A list of accredited researchers may be obtained by writing to the Genealogical Department, 50 East Temple, Salt Lake City.

NOTE: The year of birth is approximate. Sometimes an under- or over-aged person would slip by and enlist. Only during the War for Southern Independence did the age range from 10-12 year-old boys to 80+ year-old men.

Records for the above mentioned wars may be found in the National Archives with the exception of wars before the American Revolution and some records of the Confederate States of America servicemen.

In the wars before 1775 you will have to search through city, county and/or state records and archives since there was no United States government before that time.

Although many Confederate records are on file in the National Archives, you should also check with the state archives in 1) the state where the ancestor lived, 2) the state where he enlisted, and/or 3) the state he resided in after the war. Many men lived in one state, enlisted in another and, after the war, moved to another. Pension applications by Confederate veterans and/or their widows were made to and filed in the state they were living in at the time they applied for the pension. They will not be found in the National Archives.

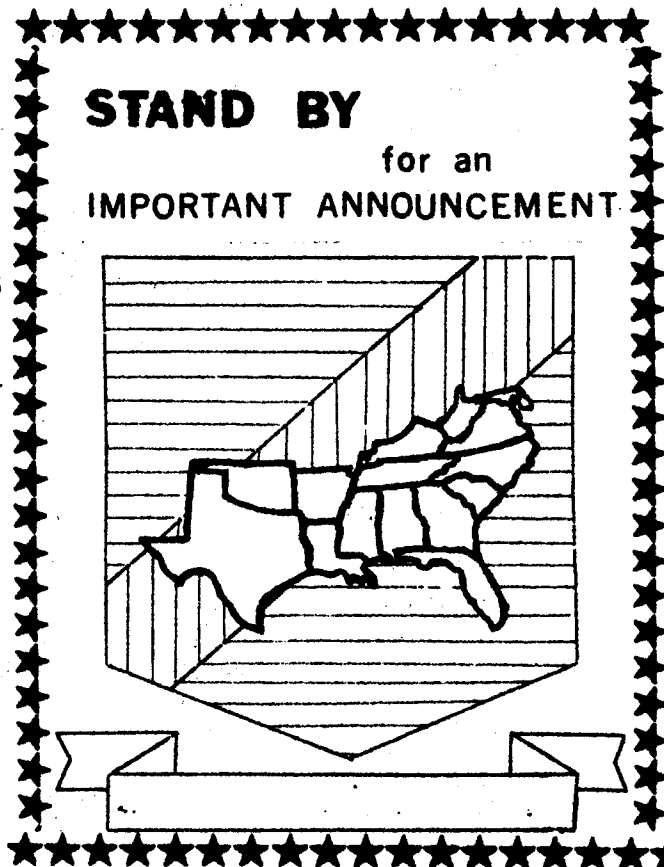

Caddo Gazette: Wednesday, 7 February 1844

CHARLES A. BULLARD and J.C. BEALL former a partnership in a law firm in Shreveport. Others announcing their services included: LAWRENCE P. CRAIN, attorney; ROLAND JONES, attorney; CADWALLADER LEWIS and JNO. N. HOWELL, storage partnership; H.J.G. BATTLE as a notary public (he was also editor of the Gazette); Dr. W.W. GEORGE.



Publication was suspended sometime during 1861 and all copies of Vol. XI, except for one page, appear to have been lost. Publication was resumed with Vol. XII, Issue No. 1, 20 January 1866. Vol. X, No. 40. 3 October 1860:

Major JAMES RAYLEY, of Adams Co., Miss., died 2 Sep 1860 at the residence of his brother, Mr. LOGAN RAYLEY, near Versailles, Woodford Co., Ky. He died at the place of his nativity, being on a visit to his brother and other relatives. Major RAYLEY felt that his health was declining and started on trip to the east with his daughter, Mrs. BOYD. Reaching Baltimore, and finding no improvement in his condition, he turned to Richmond, Va., from thence hastened to Kentucky so that he may be among relatives.

St. Charles, Mo., Sept. 11, 1860

H. H. KAVANAUGH

Rev. J. S. MOORE was born in Mecklenburg Co., N.C., on 22 Jan 1814 and died 27 July 1860 in Selma, Ala. He professed religion 6 July 1832 at Rock-Spring Camp Ground, Lincoln Co., N.C., and joined Bethesda Methodist Episcopal Church, Charlotte Circuit, N.C. On 8 Nov 1837 he professed the blessing of a perfect love at a camp meeting in South Carolina, and still resisting the call to preach, went to Alabama in 1838 where he married in 1839 and gave up the idea of ever preaching. 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BOOK REVIEWS:

Your Editor has been asked on several occasions what book he would recommend for a study of heraldry. There are several books on the subject; however, there is now available in a reprint edition from Gale Research Co., The Manual of Heraldry. It presents a clear, brief survey of the origin and fundamental facts of heraldry and its practice. Amateur and professional practitioners as well as students of heraldry will find this work a convenient reference source and a manual of easy-to-follow instructions. The editor of the manual, Francis J. Grant, was a noted authority on heraldry and Lord Lyon King of Arms.

The Manual of Heraldry contains many features to interest both the beginning and the advanced student of heraldry. Its in-depth treatment of heraldry includes essays on the origin of coats of arms, the right to arms, the heraldic executive, and an explanation of arms of dominion, pretension, concession, community, patronage, family, alliance,

and succession. Detailed information is provided on such heraldic practices as lines used in parting the field, differences, external ornaments of the shield, marshalling charges on escutcheons by the rules of heraldry, and the order of precedency. The main part of the work consists of a dictionary of some 250 heraldic terms. It also contains 350 illustrations, rendered by Graham Johnston, Herald Painter in the Lyon Office.

Now available from the Charles E. Tuttle Co., Inc., PO Drawer F, Rutland, Vt. 05701, is The Stowell Genealogy. Genealogies become more important with each passing year. And in the case of the older, more popular and significant ones, they become scarcer and more difficult to obtain.

This book, then, is the scarce and important Stowell Genealogy which has its roots deep in English history, the founder of the family being the Norman knight Adam who went to England with William the Conqueror in 1066.

On this side of the Atlantic an event of historical importance occurred in 1635 when a large colony from Hingham, England, settled in Hingham, Mass. Among the colonizers was a 10-year old boy named SAMUEL STOWELL. This genealogy, then, is a record of the descendants of SAMUEL STOWELL, of Hingham, Mass.

That SAMUEL had many descendants, most of them very prolific, is attested to by the fact that this mammoth and comprehensive work contains more than 25,000 entries in its 980 pages laden with vital statistics and other tasty fruit of the family tree.

The STOWELLS were represented in almost every trade and profession in America. Many fought and served in America's wars, some distinguishing themselves as officers and leaders.

Cost of the book is \$20 and may be ordered from the publisher. The Tuttle Company has two other books out that may be of interest to readers.

The Mariners of the American Revolution (\$10) is available only through the Charles E. Tuttle Company. The second book is A Catalogue of British Family Histories (\$15). It has been said of this second work, "This work will be of considerable use to genealogists....It appears to be very complete, and its compilation must have entailed considerable difficulties, as many of these family histories were written for private circulation only, and some are not to be found even in the British Museum."

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Several of us probably had ancestors who fought on the wrong side in the Revolutionary War. The wrong side, of course, means for the British. Several have asked about records of these people. After the 1783 peace treaty, both the United States and Great Britain provided means whereby those who suffered losses because of their loyalty to the British Crown could claim compensation from the British government. Records created as a result of the claims have been filed in the Public Record Office, London, as part of records in custody of the Exchequer and Audit Dept. They are titled CLAIMS, AMERICAN LOYALISTS, SERIES I (A.O. 12) and SERIES II (A.O. 13) and consist of 146 volumes and over 140 bundles of records. They have been microfilmed on the behalf of the Public Archives of Canada and the Genealogical Society of Salt Lake City. When searching for your loyalist ancestors, don't overlook these most important records.

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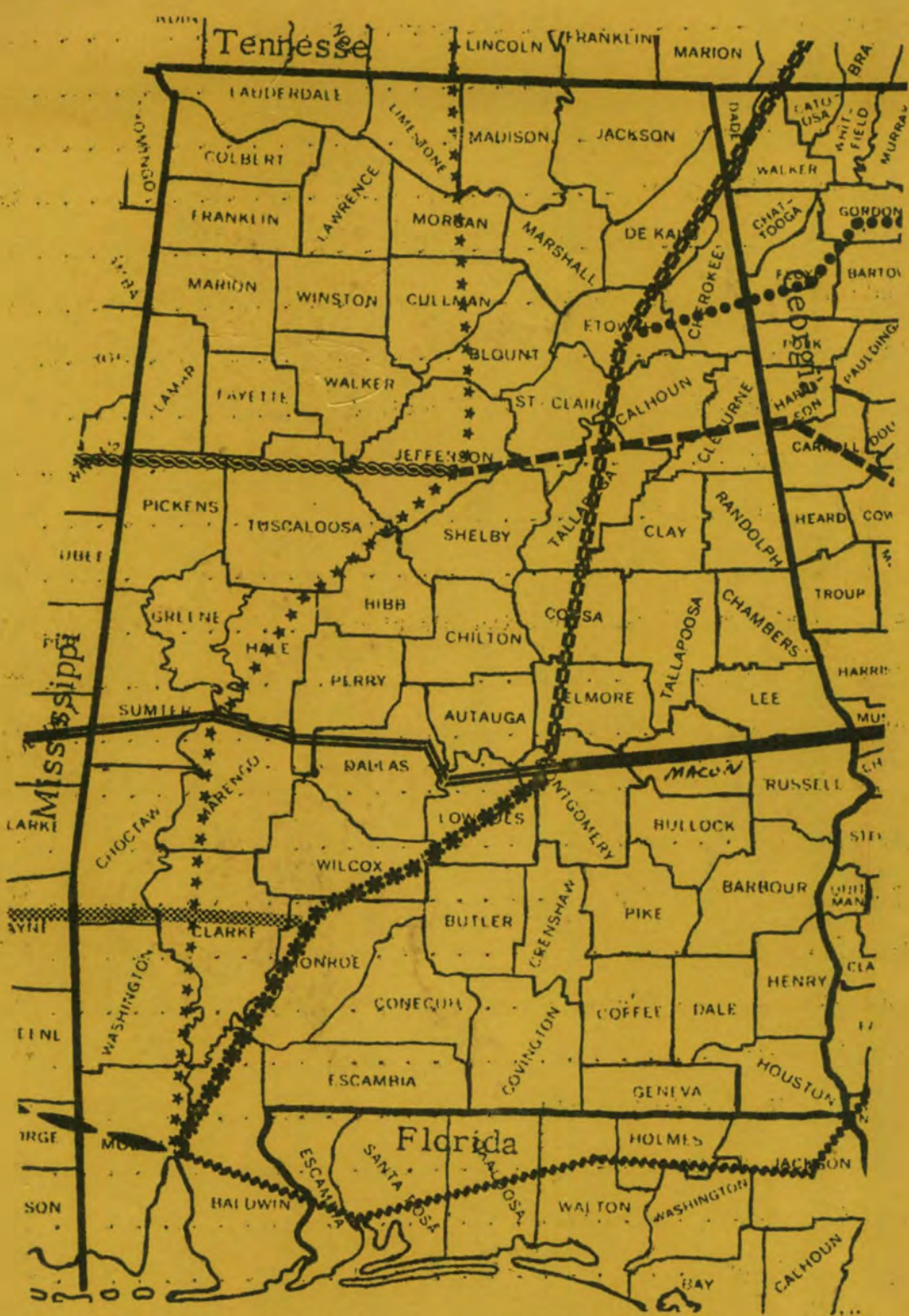
