

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#### THE EDITOR'S PAGE

More and more people are becoming interested in the study of Genealogy, and it is refreshing to see what some of the States are doing to make it easier for its citizens to find out about the pioneers who have contributed to making our country what it is today.

The Arkansas State Historical Commission has for many years been housed in cramped quarters in the Old State House on Markham Street in Little Rock. Plans are now being made for more adequate quarters, we are informed.

On top of that, so much interest has been manifest over the State that Arkansas is now trying something new among the other states. It's director, Hon. John Ferguson, envisions a new concept for the history commission. It is to establish regional archives in the four corners of the State.

For the present, two such regional archives have been established. One is in Powhatan, in lawrence county, and the nearest to our area is at Old Washington in Hempstead County. For the present, these archives have beem established by historical and genealogical societes in those areas, but it is hoped that in time they will be funded by the State and Federal Governments.

Dr. Ferguson stressed the purpose of these of these archives will be "to collect, preserve and make available under controlled conditions information for research".

Family histories, written or oral, and any published materials will be acceptable for inclusion in the archives, and "anything that sheds light on the history of the people, such as manuscripts, business records, organization and church records, photographs and maps are being sought.

It is hoped that in time Louisiana will see its way clear to build a better 'warehouse" in which to house its precious remains of its glorious past.

#### HEMPHILL-STAR CEMETERY

This Cemetery is quite large and was one which Mrs. ANNIE PARKER( a contributor of THE GENIE) wanted copied for many years. She even advertised money to have someone copy the Cemetery, but in vain. Since ANNIE PARKER was such a great help to me and a Christian inspiration by helping others with genealogy problems "free", I would like to submit this Cemetery listing in her name. "Copied by "one of Annie's many Friends" in her memory.

Located in Rapides Parish, Louisiana. Take La. Hwy. 121 off Alexandria Boyce Highway, approximately two miles north of Boyce, drive about seven miles on 121 through Hot Wells to Farm Road 1200, about two miles, cross Chicot Lake Dam. Cemetery is at fork in the road, well marked.

#### FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH IN GEORGIA

Kiokee Church, the first Baptist Church to be constituted in Georgia, was organized in the Spring of 1772, by the Rev. Daniel Marshall, one of the founders of the Baptist denomination in Georgia. A meeting house was built, and the Rev. Daniel Marshall became the first pastor, ministering from his headquarters at Kiokee to an ever increasing number of Baptist in the area.

In October, 1784, the preliminary meeting for the organization of a Georgia Baptist Association was held at Kiokee Church. The Rev. Daniel Marshall died November 2, 1784, and some time later the church was moved to Appling and a new brick edifice erected.

Kiokee Baptist Church was incorporated December 23, 1789, as "The Anabaptist Church on Kiokee," with Abram Marshall, William Willingham, Edmund Cartledge, John Landers, James Simms, Joseph Ray and Lewis Gardener as Trustees.

JERUSALEM CHURCH, AT RINCON, BEARS SCARS OF BRITISH SHOT

Jerusalem Church, standing in the dust of the long-dead town of Ebenizer, is not only the oldest Lutheran Church in Georgia but is the oldest colonial building in the state.

In terms of modern geography, 190-year old Jerusalem is at Rincon, near Springfield, in Effingham County.

No building in Savannah, Georgia's oldest city, is quite as venerable as his church, says its pastor, the Reb. Charles J. Shealy, nor will one find many structures along the Atlantic Seaboard that antedate it.

Jerusalem was built by the Salzburgers, a group of devout Lutheran families from Salzburg, Austria, who accepted the invitation of Georgia's first governor, James Oglethorpe, to find religious freedom in the New World.

The Salzburgers settled in 1734, and their town, Ebenezer, was for many years one of the largest and most important centers in Georgia.

Contstruction of Jerusalem Church began in1767 and was completed two years later.

Services have been held regularly all these years, except for a time during the Revolutionary War.

"The British captured the town in 1779. and mind you, they used the church as a stable," says the Rev. Mr. Shealy. "They nearly ruined it." The British razed Ebenezer, too and the town was never restored.

There are about 275 members in the Jerusalem congregation today, many of them descendants of the builders.

Inside the church, Pastor Shealy will show you - in the balcony - the hand-made pews that were installed when the church was built.

"The pews downstairs are new; they were built in 1851, and the new pulpit - graceful, isn't it? - was set up that same year. But the brick floor has been here since the Salzburgers put it down in 1769."

The Rev. Mr. Shealy bids you listen to the mellow tones of the two bells in the tower. The smaller bell, he explains, was the gift of George Whitefield, the eminent English evangelist, who came to Georgia in 1738.

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#### PILGRIMS HOME BAPTIST CHURCH

There are no minutes which record the date of the founding of this church; however the church records of New Bethel Baptist Church at Rocky Mount list the following people that withdrew their letter from New Bethel on January 16, 1892 to organize a church at Ivan, La. in Bossier Parish. Mollie I. Bounds, W.R. Bounds, Catherine Bounds, Malissa Bundy, Mollie Bundy, J.E. Bundy, Anna Bundy, Neoma M. Bundy, Willie Burks, Mrs. Willie Burks, Mrs. E.A. Coker, Mattie Coker, Miss Alice Coker, John Coker, Mrs. Ida Coker, Mrs. Campbell, Mrs. Jones, Mrs. M.A. Keith, Mrs. M. Jane Keith, W.T. Keith, Mrs. Georgia Keith, Matilda McGuigan, Miss Lula McGuigan, J. Littleton Oliver, Mrs. Missouri Oliver, J.E. Rabb, Mrs. Joe Rabb, Robert Smith, Tom Smith, J.B. Whittington, Mrs. Anna Whittington, Miss Eva Whittington, J.D. Young, N.A. Young, Wm. B. Young, Johnnie Young, John Young and Mrs. John Young. Brother Hollis who was pastor at New Bethel at that time helped organize Pilgrims Home and was their first pastor. The first minutes available are dated September 18, 1899, at which time J.F. Adair was church clerk, and Rev. C.E. Burgess, pastor. We have a land deed stating James L. Keith donated one acre to this church October 22, 1895, where we are presently located.

The first church was organized around 1892, however we have no record of where they met at that time or exactly when the first building was built, but it is believed to have been a few years later. The building was a one room frame structure, with a seating capacity of approximately 150 persons. Due to the fact the

old record book was lostk there are no records of the pastors or action taken by this early church prior to the year 1899.

The church has a record of three deacons in 1899 these being, W.R. Bounds, W.T. Keith, Sr. and F.J. Burks. In June 1917 two other deacons were ordained, E.H. Wilson and Robert Burks, this ordination service was preached by Rev. W.S. Young. The records then show in August 1932 there were two other deacons ordained C.C. Young and Sam Burks, this bringing the total at that time to five with J.E. Young, E.H. Wilson and W.W. Rhodes as the other three. In May 1941 N.D. Sheppard and Lee Coker were ordained deacons and January 1950 D.D. Roden and Roy Johnston; later in June 1958 J.C. Deen and Earnest Coile were made deacons. Our present deacons are C.C. Young, N.D. Sheppard, Roy D. Johnston, J.C. Deen, Earnest Coile, J.G. Smith and Allen Mears.

#### LETTER

Contributed by: Geraldine S. Hitchcock

This letter was in the possession of my maternal grandmother Agnes Hale Hawkins. It is from my great-great grandmother, Prudence Carter to her daughter (my grandmother Elizabeth Carter Golihan (Hale). It was addressed to Mrs. William Golihan in Arkansas. It is so faded that the best we can decipher is Polk Co. Ark. Haven't researched yet. My great grandmother married my g-grandfather George Washington Hale in 1857. The original letter is in the Centenary College Library (Cline room) under the Hale-Hawkins-Hitchcock collection.

Bayou Beouf, La. Dec. 23, 1853

My Beloved Daughter,

I received your letter written in July saying you and your family were going to move to Texas, and as I have not heard from you since I do not know whether you have moved or not. I will try and tell you of how I have passed some of my time. I was staying at Wm. in the spring and I thought I would come to see Solomon, so I got on a steamboat and came as far as McGeorges on Red River that 1st day of June about six miles from Solomon's and (?) from where Emily lives. It was about four o'clock in the evening and I thought I could get there easy, but some how or other I missed the road and rambled about all that night and all next day till sundown without a mouth full to eat and only puddle hole water to drink out of my shoe and nothing but a mouthful. God kept me from rambling about until I died. I found my way to a gentleman by the name of Little (who poor man since died with the yellow fever) where I was kindly treated and sent to Emily's. I have never been well since. I went over to Solomon's. My leg broke out from my feet getting wet by the dew and I had fever off and on for three weeks. I cannot get up and down without help. I thought my leg would mortify but there came an old gentleman told (?) to get buckeye and boil it and bathe my leg with it and I did so and it cured me in no time. I am now at Wm. Martins. I got a letter from Vincent the 1st of September saying he would come after me to live with him. Solomon sometimes before that got a letter from (?) asking where I was and that he was going to Arkansas to see me and I would live with him as he thought Texas was a better place to live in and he advised Solomon to come out as it was better for a man that had to live by his own work so Solomon hastened on a letter telling him I was with him, not to go to Arkansas. And put in the letter that I would go with him, so that is the letter I mentioned up above but I have not heard from him since but am still in hopes he will come through sometimes. I think he has fallen with the yellow fever. He stated in the letter that he had written (?) letters to William and had not got an answer. He said he thought it was a better place than he was to make a living. It has been four weeks since I left Solomons. They were well and doing pretty well. Emily desired if I wrote to you to remember her and her husband to you. My dear child I scarcely know what to say to you but that all my crave is if I could only live the balance of my life with you. I never expect to have the same loveing treatment from anyone as I have had from you my yongest and best loved child. Give my love to William and kiss all the children and don't let them forget their old Grandmother who may never see them again. The last I I heard from your brother Daniel he had gone to Texas to live. I have not heard from Charles since the yellow fever broke out but trust he has escaped.

Letter Cont'd.

I will write to (?) tonight and ask him about Charles. Direct your letter to Solomon. He may get them as I may not be here at the time they arrive as I have seen all of the Wm. Martins family but (?) Florida they are all nearly grown. They asked me a heap of questions about you. Farewell my child, May God bless you and your dear little children and accept all the love that I have. Kiss the little baby for me. (more that cannot read)

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# ANNALS OF NEWBERRY

A scene between Peter Carnes, a well-known lawyer of that day, and Judge Mayson in Court, is worth recording. It was at June or July term, Carnes made his appearance, in his shirt sleeves. Judge Mayson, who was a Schotchman, said to him, "Mr. Carnes, the court don't know you!" "Humph," said Carnes, "don't know me, ha!" Turning upon his heel, and walking out of court, he purchased a blanket, and cutting a hole in it, he thrust his head through, and drawing it around him, walked into the court room, and presenting himself to their worships, he demanded "Does the court know me now!" The effect may be imagined-an universal laugh excused the contempt. Carnes' argument was, that although the rule of court required a lawyer to wear a gown, it had not prescribed the color, and therefore his blanket was sufficient gown!

### ANNALS OF NEWBERRY

One of Judge Mayson's judgments is remembered. It was characteristic of the man and of the court. The case was assault and battery. Timothy Goodman vs. John Tune. Goodman was celebrated for card playing and Tune, as a bully. Goodman, it appeared, cheated Tune at cards, and he whipped him. Mayson, for himself and his brethren, said "as Mr. Goodman was a carder, and Mr. Tune a fighter, the judgment of the court was, that each party should pay his own costs, and go without day."

In '87 or '88, or thereabouts, a cake baker, known better by the nickname of Billy Behold, than his real name, William English, was engaged in an affray, in front of Coate's house, where the court was in session, the Sheriff and his posse of constables were sent out to suppress it. They seized Billy Behold, and dragged him in. Unable to get him through the crowd, thronging around the temporary bar, they lifted him up over the heads of the people, and threw him down among lawyers. He was ordered to gaol. Next morning he made his peace by telling their worships, "behold, behold," he said, "may it please your worships, I was a little teddivated." A strange word, but perhaps a pretty good one to describe drunkenness.

Another instance of the familiarity, and of the want of respect with which the court was treated, may be given, Paddy Bradley, mentioned in the second paragraph above, on a court day, had taken "a wee drap too much," and had mounted himself up on one end of the long bench occupied by their worships, who were engaged in an earnest discussion about the ways and means to pay for building a bridge. It was urged, one would think, very conclusively, that they had not the money, and therefore could not build it. But Paddy's drink and Irish propensity to blunder, made him think otherwise, and induced him to intrude his advice, "Egad," he said, "gie them trust for pay!" Whether they took his sage advice or not, I am not informed, but it is more than possible they did.

#### SEMINOLE WAR

West Raulerson, Soldier in Indian War. Widow's Application for Pension.

Mrs. ELIZABETH RAULERSON in Baker County, Fla., made her Declaration to obtain a Pension as a Disabled Soldier's Widow, on Dec. 14, 1889, before Mott Howard, County Judge E der County; and deposed that was 64 years old; that she was married at Raulerson's Ferry, Fla., Jan. 5, 1842, to West Raulerson, being married by Joseph Howell J.P. Columbia (now Baker) Co., Fla. and that they lived together as husband and wife until his death Feb. 13, 1887, and that he died at Johnsville, Baker Co., Fla. That her maiden name before marriage was Elizabeth Canada (Canid ay); that her said husband volunteered on June 16, 1837, and served as a private in Capt. Brown's company, 2nd Regt. Florida Volunteers in the Seminole War; that he incurred a double hernia while in the line of duty, from which he died Feb. 13, 1887. Said the children of her and her said husband were all over 21 at his death. support of her application she furnished the affidavit of Abel Cowart, dated March 22, 1890, before Mott Howard, County Judge Baker Co., Fla., and the said Cowart testified he was 90 years of age and a resident of Charleton Co., Ga., and had been all his life; that he was present at the marriage of West Raulerson and Elizabeth Canida in the year 1842 at Raulerson's Ferry on the St. Marys River in what was then Columbia but now Baker Co., Fla., and that he saw them duly married by Joseph Howell, J.P.

Apparently, no action was ever taken on the above application. In 1892 Congress passed an Act to allow pensions to soldiers of the various Indian Wars and their widows; and under this Act she submitted another Declaration dated March 17, 1893, made in Baker Co., Fla., before Jos. D.Chalker, Clerk Circuit Court; and testified that she is the widow of W. Raulerson and was 67 years old; that her husband at time of enlisting in the service in 1837 was 19 years old, 5'2" high, black hair and eyes, dark complexion, and was a farmer; and that he was born in Ware Co., Ga.; that they were married Jan. 5, 1842 and neither had ever before been married, and her maiden name was Elizabeth Canada; that he died Fe. 13, 1886. In support of same, Urban C. Herndon age 63 years, and Henry F. Sweat, age 58 years, both of Baker Co., Fla., testified that they had known Elizabeth Raulerson, the applicant, for 40 and 50 years, respectively, and also her deceased husband, and they were reputed and accepted as man and wife and lived together as such until his death.

On this application, the Record & Pension Office, War Dept. reported to the Commissioner of Pensions, Dec. 19, 1893, that West Raulerson, pvt. in Capt. Brown's company, 2nd Regt. Fla., mounted militia, enrolled June 16, 1837, and was mustered in Sept. 25, 1837 at Fort White, Fla., and was mustered out Dec. 18,1837, at Fort Dilliland, Fla. Also that he, West Raulerson, enlisted Sept. 17, 1840, in Capt. Aaron Jernigan's company, Georgia Mounted Militia, and was mustered out November 5, 1840 at Traders Hill, Ga., and served a second enlistment under the same captain from Nov. 6, 1840, to May 31, 1841, being mustered out at Fort Moniac Ga., Also that he served a third term in the same Capt. Jernigan's company, from Nov. 15, 1841, to Nov. 30, 1841.

The widow's application was granted, and she drew the pension until her death.
