NEW PUBLICATION BY BILL P. LINDER - - NOW TO TRACE YOUR FAMILY TREE"

Bill R. Linder, who is the Special Consultant to the upcoming Second Annual Genealogical Heraldric Congress sponsored by the ARK-LA-TEX Genealogical Association, Inc. and being held at the Hyatt Regency in New Orleans, La. this July 26 through July 28, 1979 has recently published a new book.

Linder is the Director of the Central Reference Division of the National Archives in Washington, D.C., and notes that the current national desire to find one's ancestry lies in today's youth and their search for their identity. That search, Linder claims, has its basis with their grandparents and their wisdom and confidence formed by an acknowledgement of reality and their link between offspring and parents.

To find out one's family history is as basic a need as the need to survive because of the precious links with the past that make us what we are. This basic need is answered in his new book and offers sound, easy-to-follow advice on tracing one's ancestry without the help of a professional genealogist. (Hire a professional as a last resort only! They are too expensive and not always accurate!

Linder offers tips on: how to approach the basic genealogical sources in public libraries; how to tape oral interviews with close and distant relatives (and how to handle the interviewing itself); how to use formal documents, basic history texts, church records, and family photographs for the subtleties they can provide; and most importantly, how to summarize the material into manageable, instructive form.

The overall result of Linder's book is an entertaining and informative document which emphasizes the pleasure that both individuals and families can discover in achieving the sense of personal and historical continuity with the world. Few activities can offer this, and Linder has created the definitive guidebook to this skill.

Among genealogical research aids, this is a hard-cover, inexpensive book that deserves a place on any bookshelf or reference desk, and it makes an ideal gift for those persons just beginning to enter the fascinating study of family history. Priced at \$6.95, it is available from Everest House Publishers, 1133 Avenue of the Americas, New York, N.Y. 10036. Ask for it at your local bookstore! It's well worth the price, and with Linder in charge, it has to be a top-notch addition to genealogical source books.

FIRST SETTLERS IN NORTH CAROLINA

The FIRST Permanent Settlers in the Province of North Carolina came to Albermarle in 1660--or possibly as early as 1650.

Emigration moved south to Pamlico. (Col. Records) "1690, a French colony migrated from the James River settlement and took up its abode along the fertile shores of the streams in Pamtico.

In 1681 a large grant of land was made to Gorerner Seth Sothell containing -- twelve thousand acres, -- commonly called -- Pamticoe Town."

Given the 10th day of November 1681. Witness: Seth Sothell, Richard Foster, Arthur Slocum, James Blount

The grant included the present town of Bath ----

Old Indian Town of Pampticoe.

* * * * * * * * *

First "Grand Assembly" ---1664-1665. Prior to this Assembly, settlers were under Virginia rule. April 1697 -- on the death of Earl Craven, John Earl of Bathe became Palatine of Carolina.

The first town to be incorporated was Bath. Commissioners: First 3 - Mr. John Lawson Mr. Joel Martin Mr. Nicholas Daw

Others added: John Porter Thomas Harding Capt. John Drinkwater

The new town was "part of a large tract --- belonging to David Perkins, now belowging to Col. Thomas Cary." "John Lillington's house was burned and papers destroyed by Indians 1714.

Among the most prosperous of the pioneer settlers of Coweta Co., were the Arnold brothers, Park Eddins and James, sons of William Pettis and Elizabeth Eddins Arnold. William P. Arnold was the sone of John and Mary Pettis Arnold.

John Arnold was born in Perquimans, N.C., in 1750 and died in 1812 in Abbeville District, S.C. He helped to establish American independence, serving during the war in Col. Thos. Clark's regiment of N.C. soldiers.

William P. Arnold removed to Oglethorpe Co. Ga., where he and his large family of sons and daughters resided until the wastefulness of slave labor made it necessary for the sons to move westward in order to get fresh lands for their slaves to work as they wished to live in the style to which they had been accustomed. Some settled in Coweta and others in adjoining counties where they purchased large plantations.

On June 24, 1828, James Arnold was married to Matilda Ware, the daughter of Philip Ware, son of Edward Ware of Amherst Co., Va. This union was blessed with six children - one of whom Samuel James (1841-1908) was married in 1867 to Monterey Houston, the daughter of Samuel Houston and Sarah Germaine of Huguenot extration.

John Houston, father of Sam Houston, was born in 1760 in Ireland where his ancestors had fled from Scotland to escape persecution for their loyalty to Prince Charlie. The Houstons belonged to the Scotch-Irish nobility; but, having cast in their lot with the U.S. for which the youthful John had suffered wounds and imprisonment and all hardships incident to the life of a soldier for the whole period of the Revolutionary war, he and his father refused to return to assume the ancestral title.

The descendants of Samuel J. and Monterey H. Arnold, residing in Newnan, Ga., are Mell, Margaret, Sam Houston, Elizabeth, Fred Haskell, Ethel, and Allen Arnold and Mrs. S. L. Cook and her daughters, Frances Margaret and Ethel, and Frances, Mrs. P. A. Boozer and family of Troup.

GRAVEMARKERS FOR CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS AT VICKSBURG

One hundred and thirteen years after the armies stopped firing at each other, more than 1600 graves of Southern soldiers killed during the Battle of Vicksburg will soon be marked for the first time--with headstones provided by the United States Government.

The graves are in a special three-acre plot in the Vicksburg City Cemetery land owned and maintained by the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

In 1906, the United States Congress authorized stones to mark Confederate graves in national cemeteries and Confederate plots, and in 1929 Congress authorized stones for Confederate deceased buried in private cemeteries.

But graves in the Vicksburg plot remained unidentified by headstones or markers since 1863. The gravesites were identified only by locations on a cemetery map.

The sole monument to the fallen Southerners has been a statue of a rebel soldier.

Now, at the request of city, state and UDC officials, the Veterans Administration will provide headstones for all 1604 graves in the Confederate section of the Vicksburg Cemetery.

In 1873, Congress authorized the permanent identification in stone of graves of Union dead buried in national cemeteries, then six years later provided markers for Union soldiers in private cemeteries.

The Confederates were not accorded similar treatment until 33 years later (1960).

The Veterans Administration expected the first 260 gravestones to arrive in the once beleagured Confederate stronghold in late October, 1978. Plans call for a dedication ceremony - probably on April 24, 1979.

That's Confederate Memorial Day !

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JENNIE BELL GIBSON

Until the day she died in her ninety-fifth year, my great-grandmother Gibson's home was a haven for friends and neighbors, strangers and kin. Her very optimistic spirit and unfailing sense of humor inspired her children, her grandchildren, and, finally, her great grandchildren.

Jennie Bell Martin was the daughter of Captain Robert Martin of the United States Army, and Urilda Morgan Martin. She was born in Gallatin, Tennessee, on July 24, 1852.

Captain Martin served with the United States Army in Texas during the Mexican War. When Texas was admitted to the Union in 1845, Mexico refused to honor the boundaries set at the Rio Grande River. When the war ended Captain Martin was given a land grant in return for his services. It was to this tract of land in East Texas, where the town of Rusk now stands, that Captain Martin moved his family. They left Tennessee for Texas when Jennie was two years old.

As a girl Jennie attended "Rusk Academy", a private school for young ladies. She studied piano with a blind musician, Bob McEachern, who was very talented. She loved music and played many compositions from memory, even when she reached ninety and more.

Two great losses struck the Martin family shortly after the Civil War. In 1866, twelve-year-old Laura Bright died. Jennie, then fourteen, missed her sister keenly and never could speak of her without getting upset. Four years later, Mrs. Martin died, leaving eighteen-year old Jennie to manage the household for her father, two brothers, and sister. In addition to all her other household duties during those difficult Reconstruction days, Jennie made all of her brother Percy's clothes by hand. Percy was just five years old and Jennie tried to be a good mother to him.

When she was twenty, she fell in love with a young lawyer from Rusk, James P. Gibson. His family were pioneer settlers of Rusk who got their land from the Mexican Government. His mother's family, the Cooks, traveled to Texas from South Carolina in a sixty-five member wagon train. To protect themselves from the Indians, they built the old Cook fort which stood in Rusk until a few years ago.

In October of 1872, young Jennie, engaged to be married, made a journey to the "city" of Shreveport, one hundred twenty-five miles northeast of Rusk. She visited a young aunt whose husband was a district judge and had to be away from home a good deal. The two young women had a good time gathering Jennie's trouseau. On December 22, 1872, Jennie Martin and James Gibson were married at the aunt's home, Thorn Hill, by the Presbyterian minister.

JENNIE BELL GIBSON - Continued

After a difficult journey by stage, the young couple settled in their home on a hill overlooking Rusk. The house was small when they bought it, but as the family grew, it grew also. Spacious lands surrounded it.

Jennie and James had seven children, two of whom died in infancy. A son, Jesse, died suddenly at the age of twenty, just as he was to leave for Galveston to study medicine. The two remaining sons, Frank and G. W., my grandfather, became successful lawyers. The two girls remained at home, one to teach school, the other, Miss May, to work in the county courthouse.

James not only practiced law for some time, but also was superintendent of the Texas State Prison at Rusk. Jennie became known as an excellent homemaker. When her own children married and had children of their own, Jennie welcomed her grandchildren. Each summer these boy cousins, my father among them, gathered for weeks at a time at their grandmother's house, where there was always much fun and plenty of good food. Jennie used to encourage the children to eat their vegetables by counting the variety served at each meal. She had Tom Hicks, her cook for many years, interested in the "game", too, and often he would prepare eight to ten different vegetables at one meal.

Jennie Gibson lived a long and full life. She remained active in her Presbyterian Church. Gardening was her hobby. All those vegetables her grandchildren relished came from her garden. Her pieced quilts are in the homes of each of her grandchildren, to be handed down to her great grandchildren. She pieced my quilt when she was over ninety.

Jennie announced one November morning in 1947 that she was not going to get up that morning. She was very tired and wanted to rest. A few days later she died in her sleep. Jennie was ninety-five years young.

Cbituary: Mrs. Elizabeth C. Brown was born in Edgefield Dist. S. C. While quite young, she moved first to Indiana, second to Ohio, and then to Giles Co., Tenn. On the 9th of March 1828 she was married to Nathaniel Brown. With her husband she emigrated to the State of Louisiana and settled in Claiborne Parish. In 1837 she joined the Methodist Church, then the only organized Methodist Church in North Louisiana, and departed this life May 18, 1878, having lived nearly 68 years and a member of the church 41 years. Sister Brown was known by the writer the last fifteen years of her life. She was a consistant Christian, a warm-hearted, zealous Methodist, a faithful loving mother, a kind and affectionate wife. She raised a large family of children and lived to see them all grown, and nearly all members of the church of her choice. She was in feeble health for many months previous to her death, but bore her afflictions with great Christian patience and fortitude. Her death was calm and peaceful. Long live her Christian example.

Nathaniel "Nathan" Brown and Elizabeth (Weeks) Brown were my great grand parents. They came to Claiborne Parish, La. from Giles Co., Tenn. traveling overland by covered wagons, crossed the Mississippi River at Memphis, forged the smaller streams and were camping out in Arkansas on the night of November 12, 1833 when the stars fell so abundantly on the Old South. They brought all their possessions with them, including twenty-five slaves. Nathan Brown was a farmer and a woodsman. He would

After the Civil War, the push of white settlers from Texas, Arkansas, Missouri and Kansas caused increased unrest in the territory. This is when the whites have considerable difficulty in locating their people. One must get into court records for the area and the materials the tribes created in trying to control the whites. It is our feeling that Mr. Watson is more knowledgeable on Indian Records than any other person with whom we have had contact. Do not underestimate the records kept on the Indian reservations on all inhabitants as they had between 35,000 and 50,000 whites listed on one of the first census in the Indian Territory.

Indian blood or not, we feel Mr. Watson can help you be successful in your search and can eliminate some of the time-consuming and frustrating areas of your search.

WILLIAM BARNHILL referred to as (d) above, born Bucks County, Pa., 1735 d in S.C. 1810 m Isabel Barr. He purchased 135 acres of Joseph Arthur in New Britain June 30, 1761 and another tract of 150 acres in same township of Thomas Evans Mar. 20, 1762. On June 5, 1767, while proprietor of the Tavern at Warwick Crossroads, now Hartsville, he and his wife Isabelle (or Isabel) conveyed the latter tracts to John Wisler for 750 L. This tract adjoined the farm of his brother Samuel Barnhill, in the records of Deep Run Presbyterian Church, Bedminster Township, Bucks County, Pa., founded in 1732, there is a subscription list for the building of a house for Rev. James Latta, the pastor, in Feb. 1761. Among the subscribers were Samuel Barnhill who gave three shillings and William Barnhill, Sr., who gave one shilling. On Oct. 18th, 1767 (so states Mrs. Emma Dunn Mastin of Owensboro Ky.) William Barnhill and family, in company with Henry Finley and Archibald Finley, Jr. moved to N.C., the Finley brothers stopping in Loudoun County, Va., and William Barnhill and family continuing southward to Mecklenburg N.C. He later moved to York Co. S.C. where he died in 1810.

WILLIAM BARNHILL, SR. served in the Revolutionary War in the North Carolina Militia as a Private; and acted as assessor in Mecklenburg County, N. C. in 1778 when the county was divided into military districts. (Ref. American Monthly Magazine, July 1907, page 8). In 1797 William Barnhill bought 231 acres of land "on the waters of Allison Creek" from Walter McCarter. On Feb. 20, 1798, William Barnhill, Sr. sold to Samual Barnwell 200 acres in York County, S.C. on the south branch of Allison Creek for 400 L. There seems to be no more available records of his land conveyances. The last date found with reference to William Barnhill is May 4, 1810 when he died at the age of 75 years. He is buried in the Beersheeba Church yard in York County, near the town of York, S.C.

- (8) Sarah, who married Francis Armstrong.

Concerning the Revolutionary service of William Barnhill, Sr., he is listed as paid for services in the Adjutant General's office at Raleigh, N. C. (Book 6, page 4, Index Vol. I).

William Barnhill, Jr., referred to as (5) above was born in South Carolina in 1776. In 1796 he married Cynthia Hodge, daughter of Wm. Hodge and Mary Elliott.(?) In the migration westward of this family, we find on Mar. 25, 1814, a land transfer of 287 ½ acres for the sum of \$225, from James Adams and Dorcas, his wife, of Elbert County, Ga., to William Barnwell and "Sentha" (Cynthia) of Franklin Co., Ga., on the north Fork of the Broad River by William Elliott's land.

On Nov. 2, 1818, William Barnwell and "Sentha" (Cynthia) of Franklin co., Ga. sold the above 287 ½ acres for \$1000 to William Bice of the county. Witnesses to the deed were Elizabeth Armstrong (probably a niece of William Barnhill) and William Hodge Barnhill, a son of William and Cynthia. During the family's wanderings they came to live a short time in Barnesville, Lamar County, Ga. where many years later the signature of William Barnhill was found on the ancient register of an old log inn at which the family stopped on their arrival in the village. They moved westward through Alabama to Tennessee and in 1826 settled on Muddy Creek where they were living on Feb. 23, 1831, when William Barnhill of McNairy County, Tenn. appointed his brother, John Barnhill of the District of York, and State of South Carolina, his true and lawful Attorney in Fact, to sell his share of the land of the estate of his father William Barnhill. In October of 1835 we find the older members of the family, at least William and Cynthia, the parents, in the State of

Texas, at which time William applied for "one league and a Labour of Land" in Nacogdoches, Texas. This application was filed for record Oct. 5, 1839.

One source says William Barnhill, Jr. died in Nacogdoches, Texas near Brenham, in 1838, and the family moved back to Tennessee the following year where the widow Cynthia Hodge Barnhill died in 1848. (Another record says that they both (William and Cynthia) returned to Tennessee before William's death in 1838 and that both of them died in Tennessee. (They may have returned to Tennessee but Cynthia was living in 1850 in Travis County Texas with the Houston family. By F. A. author).
