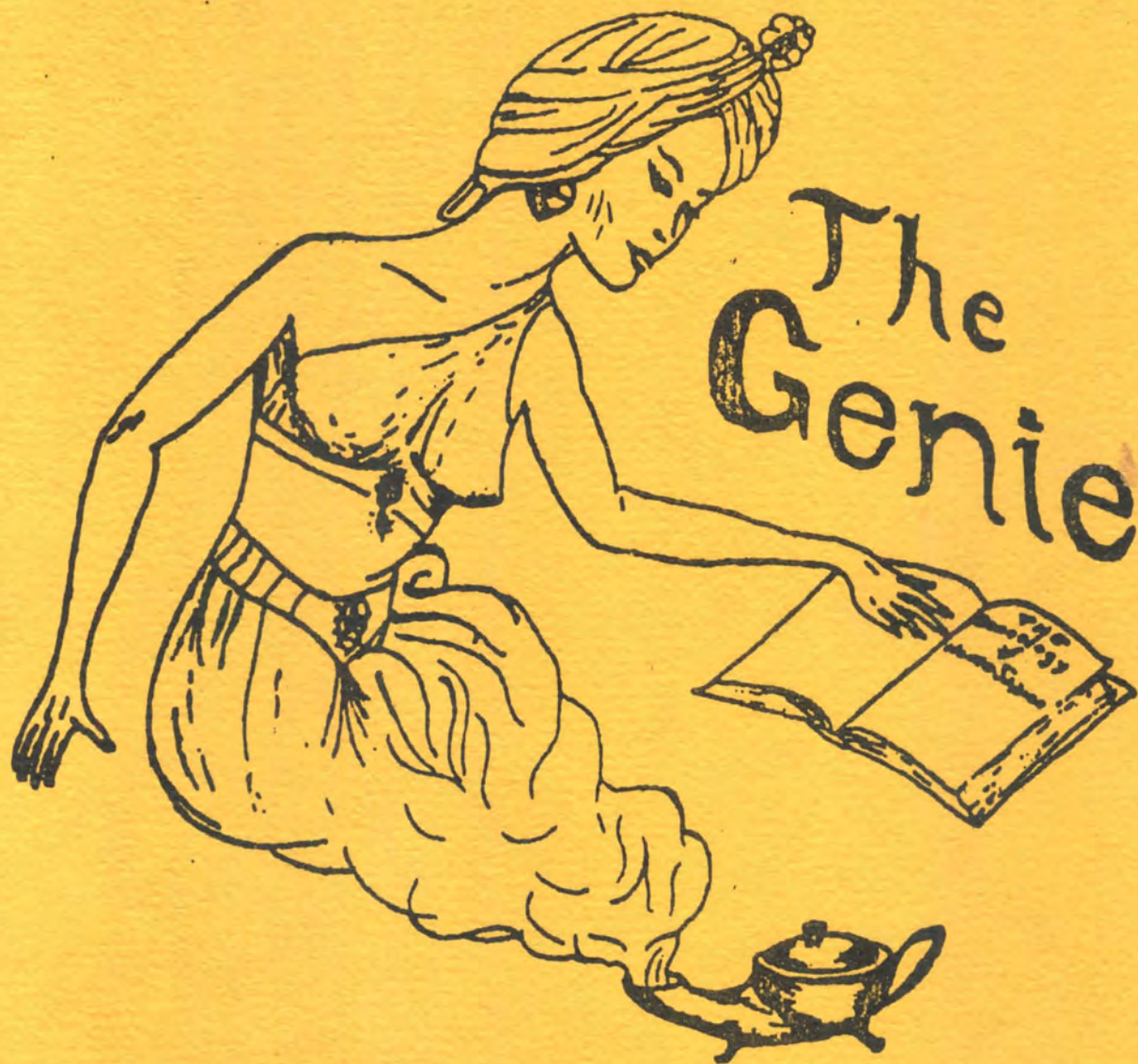

One genealogist states "William NASH and wife Betty had children, two of which were JAMES and JOHN, of Culpepper Co., Va. where WILLIAM died 1754 and BETTY in 1766 leaving large estates. JAMES and JOHN were fathers of the first NASHes in this area". If by "this area" she means all of Miss., this is in error as there were NASHes in Miss. before 1800.

This NASH family, which is related to Thomas, settled in Lowndes Co., Miss. LARKIN, son of JAMES and ANNA (Hess) b. 1766 Culpepper Co., Va. moved into South Carolina and to Tuscaloosa Co., Ala., then into Lowndes Co., Miss. by 1821.

JAMES, son of Wm., b. 6 July 1739, married 9 Dec 1765 to ANN HESS w/o James, born 20 Feb 1737.

JOHN, son of Wm. was born 16 May 1747, married Polly Harrison 15 April 1754

ABNER, son of John and Polly Harrison (Long) was born 21 July 1773 - Abbeville Dist., S.C., d. 23 Nov 1834, married 9 Feb 1795 Betsey Pyle - she was born 10 May 1777 and died 28 Oct 1840. Their children were: Alanson- Deedamia, Gabriel Evans, William Whitfield, Julius Junius, Theodotia, Harvey Riland, Newton Nimrod, Esse, Nancy, John Abner and Polly Ann.

Abner is in 1820 Census Monroe Co., Miss.

Larkin, son of James and Anna Hess Nash, was born 3 Nov 1766 Culpepper Co., Va. - married 5 Nov 1793 Elizabeth Hayne. His estate was not settled until 1856. Their children:

Lucinda, b. 1796, S.C., married Russell Bunnell, b. 1783 in Conn. (1850 Census Pickens Co., Ala.)

James - died before his father.

William V. - b. 1806, S.C., married 30 Oct 1834 Mary Hobbs (lived in Attala Co., Miss.)

Reuben P. - born 9 Mar 1811, S.C., died before 1879

Polly H. married Mr. Reed.

Nancy married #1 Mr. McCamson, #2 Mr. Cohen.

Elizabeth - married Mr. Brewton - children living in Texas 1856.

Ezekiel, son of John and Polly Harrison (Long) Nash and brother of Abner, was b. 11 Feb 1779 Abbeville Dist., S.C., died before 1850, Oktibbeha Co., Miss., married #1 Elizabeth (?), #2 18 April 1843 to Abigail (?) Yates, widow of Thomas P. Yates. The Oktibbeha Co. Courthouse was destroyed by fire about 1900 and many of the records lost. Ezekiel made a will, but it was destroyed in the fire so we have no proof of all of his children. There are probably 2 that can be identified: John Milton G. and Orsamus L. Nash (I wonder if ORSAMUS is Erasmus ? F.A.) Ira N. Nash received property from the estate of Ezekiel in 1848, so he also could have been a child.

I copied some data from an old Bible in the possession of Mr. Laster of Dallas, Texas some years ago, and I'll check it for births, marriages & deaths if you send a SASE.

I have not been as fortunate in Louisiana research as in Miss., but will list some data I have:

John Nesbett Nash, b. 19 Jan 1786, N.C., married 1864 Ga. He was son of John Nash of N.C. His son, Colville Crumbe (Abercrumbe ?) Nash was b. 1823 Lauren Dist. D.C., died 1883 Rapides Parish, La.

There are many entries relative to the NASH Family early in Attahopas District, St. Mary Parish, La., and others, many of which give clues which lead to the knowledge of close relationship of the NASH Family of Lowndes Co., Miss. and those of La. (In fact one genealogist has said (?) that Thomas (of La.) and Abner of S.C. were brothers). This may well be true, and I think that with a little more research it could be proven. For instance, in the Attahopas Dist. in 1859, William Junius Nash is mentioned. In St. Mary Parish in 1830 Abner (which one ?) witnessed a marriage. In 1836 William J. Nash was Justice of the Peace.

In Mortgage Record Book B-A #1767 Peggy L. Nash of Caswell Co. N.C. vs William J. Nash, her son.

1834 - Conveyance Record "B" Wm. Junius Nash to Abner Nash of Caswell Co., N.C., P.O.A. to represent him and his wife Ann C. (Bethel) Nash in settlement of estate of William Bethel of Rockingham Co., N.C.

In Sabine Parish L.J. Nash was quite prominent. He was the son of Valentine and Mary (?) Nash who moved from S.C. to Lowndes Co., Miss. & then to Natchitoches Parish, La. in 1837/8. He later moved to Sabine Parish and settled on Toro (Bayou). He died 1894 at age 98. His children were: John, Abie, Elizabeth, Eveline, Ludlow J., Leonora, America, Columbus C., Isabella, Valentine and Victoria.

Ludlow Jackson (L.J.) first married Caroline E. Sibley and were parents of the following: Francis Marion, John V., Virginia L., Samuel Adrain, Coleman S., Columbus C., Mary Jane and Elizabeth. Married #2 - Leonora Koontz and had 2 children. Ludlow and Mrs. Nash died at the birth of their daughter, Leonora.

This family ran a store and plantation there for 50 years and L.J. served in Civil War as Lt. of the Sabine Rebels.

MINUTES

Of the Twentieth Annual Session of the South Louisiana Primitive Baptist Association, held with Shiloh Church, Vernon Parish, La., October 13th, 14th, and 15th, 1893.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by J. J. Walker, from 1st Timothy, 1st chapter and 15th verse, "This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief."

The Association was organized by W. M. Perkins, Moderator, and I. S. Meadours, temporary Clerk. Thus in order for business, letters were called for. Letters from eight churches received, one without letter.

W. M. Perkins was chosen Moderator, H. F. Henigan assistant Moderator, I. S. Meadours Clerk, and T. M. Cain assistant Clerk. Thus organized the Association proceeded to business.

1st. Visiting brethren were invited to seats.

2nd. Petitionary letters called for. One from Oakland church, Natchitoches parish, La., and the right hand of fellowship given her messenger by the moderator.

3rd. Corresponding letters were called for. One from South East Texas Association, by her messengers, W. J. Newton and Amos Richardson, was received and the Moderator gave them the right hand of fellowship, and the following brethren were appointed to visit them at their next session which will be held with Gravel Hill church, Sabine county, Texas, to commence Friday before the first Sunday in October, A. D. 1894: I. S. Meadours, H. F. Henigan, J. J. Walker, Rees W. Perkins, James Vallery, David Richy, and J. S. Smith. The Brother Clerk was appointed to write a corresponding letter to that Association.

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13th. *Resolved*, That we give to brother H. Cryer, five dollars, out of the funds now on hand.

14th. The Query presented by Hopewell church was taken up and considered. In regard to the first proposition, WE hold the work of the committee to be good. In regard to the second proposition, WE would advise brethren to take the 18th chapter of Matthew and other scriptures bearing on the subject of offences and their settlement in all of their different phases as the man of their council. QUERY. "Dear Brethren, do you hold the work good that was done at the Association held with Little Hope church, A. D., 1890, concerning the hurts between churches? What must be done when a denial of acknowledgements has occurred?"

15th. *Resolved*, That we tender to the brethren, sisters, and friends of this vicinity, our thanks for their kindness toward us during our stay among them.

16th. *Resolved*, By motion and second, that we adjourn to the time and place above mentioned.

CONSTITUTION.

1st. This Association shall be composed of members chosen and sent by the different churches in our union who, on producing a letter from the church to which they belong, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

2nd. The members thus chosen and convened, shall be known by the name of the "SOUTH LOUISIANA PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION," but which shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, or to infringe upon any of the internal rights of the churches in this union, but shall be merely an advisory council in all matters concerning their internal concerns.

3rd. The letters from the different churches shall express their members in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed, excommunicated, and dead, since the last Association.

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4th. The following brethren were appointed a committee to arrange preaching for the session: H. Mathis, John Miers, John Keel, and Rees W. Perkins.

5th. The committee on preaching report as follows: Saturday forenoon, David Richey, W. J. Newton; afternoon, H. F. Henigan; Sunday forenoon, I. S. Meadours, J. J. Walker; afternoon, W. M. Perkins to close.

6th. The following brethren were appointed a committee on finance: C. H. Jones, Jasper Keel, and S. J. Meadours.

7th. The Finance committee report received, and committee discharged. The funds were placed in the hands of I. S. Meadours, who will superintend the printing and distribution of the Minutes, and he shall be allowed \$5 for his services.

8th. *Resolved*, That we have 200 copies of the Minutes printed, and that 20 copies be reserved for corresponding purposes.

By motion and second, we adjourn till to morrow morning 9 o'clock.

SATURDAY.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by H. F. Henigan.

9th. *Resolved*, That our next session be held with Antioch church, Big Woods, Calcasieu parish, La., to commence Friday before the third Sunday in October, A. D., 1894.

10th. *Resolved*, That W. M. Perkins preach the Introductory Sermon; I. S. Meadours, alternate.

11th. *Resolved*, That we have our Abstracts of Faith and Constitution printed in these Minutes.

12th. *Resolved*, That we hold a Union Meeting with Little Hope church, second district, Vernon parish, La., to commence Friday before the fourth Sunday in May, 1894, and one to be held with Oakland church, second district, Natchitoches parish, La., to commence Friday before the second Sunday in September, 1894.

4th. Every church composing this Association shall be entitled to three delegates. Should any church in our union fail to represent herself thus, she shall state the reason at the next Association; and should she fail to represent herself two sessions in succession, it shall be the duty of the Association to inquire into the cause by sending a committee to said church, who shall report at the next session.

5th. We declare non fellowship with all the isms of the day, to wit: Missionary, with all its tributaries, Masonry, Grange, together with everything that is calculated in their nature to cause divisions in the church contrary to gospel order.

6th. Churches of our faith and order may be admitted into this body who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand.

7th. The Association shall appoint a Moderator from among themselves for the time being, whose duty it shall be to see that the Rules of Decorum are observed, and take the opinion of the Association on all questions properly brought before it. Also a Clerk shall be appointed, whose duty it shall be to make proper and correct minutes of their proceedings, etc.

8th. This Association shall have power to exclude any church from this union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles of the gospel.

9th. The Association shall endeavor to furnish churches with minutes of their proceedings.

10th. No query shall be taken up by the Association except those that are included in the church letters, in which case the Association shall take the matter in consideration, and her decision shall be entered on the minutes.

11th. The Association shall have a fund for the support of the same, which shall be supplied by the voluntary contributions of the churches, whose duty it shall be to send it by the hands of their messengers, which money sent shall be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall be appointed for that purpose, and be accountable for all money received, and pay the same out according to the order of the Association.

12th. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if necessary, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk, before the Association adjourns.

13th. There shall be a book provided for the use of the Association, and the fund money liable to pay all expenses that may accrue. All the proceedings of the Association shall be regularly recorded by the Clerk, who shall receive a compensation for his services.

14th. The Association shall, in all cases, be governed by a majority of the members present, except in cases of fellowship, which shall be unanimous.

15th. We agree to print our minutes, and appoint the meetings of our Association from time to time, as the case may be.

ABSTRACTS OF FAITH.

ARTICLE 1. We believe in the only true and living God—the father, the Word and the Holy Ghost. Proof—1 John v. 7: "For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word and the Holy Ghost"—John i. 1.

ART. 2. We believe that the Scriptures, comprising the Old and New Testaments, are the Word of God, and the only rule given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

ART. 3. We believe the doctrine of election, and that God chose his people in Christ before the foundation of the world. Proof.—Eph. i. 4: "According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love." See Rom. viii. 30.

ART. 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin. Proof—Rom. v. 12: "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned." See Psalm li. 5.

ART. 5. We believe in man's incapacity to recover himself from the fallen state which he is in by nature. Proof—John vi. 44: "No man can come to me, except the Father which sent me draw him." See Jer. xiii. 23.

ART. 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God by the imputed righteousness of Christ only. Proof—2 Cor. v. 21: "For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him." See Rom. ix. 6.

ART. 7. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost. Proof—Rom. viii. 30: "Moreover, whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified, and whom he justified, them he also glorified."

ART. 8. We believe that the saints shall be preserved in grace, and never fall finally away. Proof—John x. 28: "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand." See Col. iii. 3, 4.

ART. 9. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers only are subjects of baptism. Proof Acts viii. 37, 38: "And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him."

Proof of Supper Matt. xvi. 26, 27: "Jesus took the bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it."

ART. 10. We believe that our Lord and Master washed his disciples' feet, and we ought also to wash one another's feet. Proof—John xiii. 4, 5: "He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded." See verses 13 15: "Ye call me Master and Lord: and say well; for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you."

ART. 11. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and in the general judgment, and that the felicity of the righteous and the punishment of

the wicked will be eternal. Proof—John v. 28, 29: "Marvel not at this; for the hour is coming, in which all that are in their graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." Matt. xxv. 46. "And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal."

ART. 12. We believe that no minister has any right to administer the ordinances of the gospel but one who is regularly baptized, called and comes under imposition of the presbytery. Proof—Acts xiii. 2, 3 "The Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away." See 1 Tim. iv. 14.

ART. 13. We believe that none but regularly baptized members have a right to commune at the Lord's table. See proof of Supper, and Matt. xxviii. 19, 20: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you."

Old Nacogdoches University Building

The 1954 celebration of one hundred years of public school education in the Lone Star State drew our attention to the old university building at Nacogdoches which stands today a milestone in the progress of education, and a monument to the pioneer sponsors of learning.

The Nacogdoches University was founded under a charter granted by the Republic of Texas on Feb. 3, 1845, in response to a petition from the citizens of Nacogdoches who had held a public meeting at the courthouse for that purpose on Nov. 1, 1844. This is the only non-sectarian university established during the Republic of Texas still in existence.

Private subscriptions ranging from five to three hundred dollars, land, lumber, pork, and labor, supplemented the four league land grant from the government.

The university was originally housed in the "Red House." It was rented for the Sept. 1, 1845 session of the university from Judge Bennett Blake. The "Red House" was built by Colonel Piedras, Mexican officer of the 12th Permanent Battalion, to house the 320 Mexican soldiers sent to Nacogdoches in 1827 to maintain order and control the frontier. Piedras was driven from Nacogdoches in 1832. Thomas J. Rusk later bought this house for his first Texas home. The university occupied this historic old adobe and frame house until 1852, at which time it set up temporary headquarters across the street. In 1855 the university purchased the Temperance Hall on Hospital Street, also a temporary arrangement.

This present two-story building of Modified Grecian architecture, closely resembling the University of Virginia buildings, was erected for a permanent home of the university, in 1859.

It has been in continuous use for school purposes except for two years during and after the Civil War. The building was then used as a hospital and quarters for Confederate soldiers; after the war, it became headquarters for the Federal troops stationed in Nacogdoches. In fact, the war played an important part in the history of the university, for it was the gathering war clouds that brought about its first misfortune. In 1861, two years after the new buildings were completed, the doors were closed. In order to make payments on the buildings and to pay the teachers back salaries, notes were signed. Some of the lands belonging to the university were sold in 1867 to pay off these notes.

In 1870, the Catholic Church took over the management of the university. The school was known as The Convent of the Agony, the Heart of Jesus and teaching was done by the Sisters of Notre Dame.

In 1873, the charter was renewed and the building was leased to the Masonic Lodge and was known as the Nacogdoches Masonic Institute.

In 1887, the property was leased to Keachi College of Keachi, Louisiana in order to meet their increased demand of patronage. The entire faculty of 15 was transferred to Nacogdoches. Scholarships, including board and tuition in all departments, (which included music, art, science, and literature) for both sexes were advertised at \$50.00 for 12 weeks; \$75.00 for 5 months and \$123.00 for ten months, with free passage to all Louisiana pupils from Shreveport and return.

The charter expired and it became apparent that the university could no longer be maintained on that level; no attempt was made to have the charter renewed. A petition was presented requesting the court to appoint a board of trustees to make disposition of the property. Part of the land was sold to improve the remaining property. The buildings and Washington Square on which they stood were divided to Nacogdoches School District in 1904 and the one building which is still standing has been used for school purposes by the public schools since that time.

A movement is now underway to restore and preserve the old building in order that the "mother of education in Texas" may once again and for all time open its doors to all the citizens of our state and our nation.
