CESSION OF LAND BY GEORGIA TO THE UNITED STATES - 1802

In pursuance of the act entitled "An act supplemental to the act, entitled An act for an amicable settlement of the limits with the State of Georgia, and authorizing the establishment of a Government in the Mississippi territory," James Madison, Secretary of State, Albert Gallatin, Secretary of the Treasury, and Levi Lincoln, Attorney General of the United States, were appointed commissioners to settle, by compromise, with the commissioners appointed by the State of Georgia, the claims and cession to which the said act has relation.

Articles of agreement and cession have accordingly been entered into, and signed by the said commissioners of the United States and Georgia; which, as they leave a right to Congress to act upon them legislatively at any time within six months after their date, I have thought it my duty immediately to communicate to the Legislature.

Sir: We have the honor to enclose a copy of an agreement entered into between the commissioners of the United States and those of Georgia, in pursuance of the act entitled "An act supplemental to the act, entitled An act for an amicable settlement of limits with the State of Georgia, and authorizing the establishment of a Government in the Mississippi territory."

The nature and importance of the transaction have induced the insertion of a clause which renders it necessary that the subject should be communicated to Congress during their present session.

We have the honor to be, very respectfully, sir your obedient servants.

JAMES MADISON ALBERT GALLATIN LEVI LINCOLN

ARTICLE I. The State of Georgia cedes to the United States all the right, title, and claim, which the said State has to the jurisdiction and soil of the lands situated within the boundaries of the United States, south of the State of Tennessee, and west of a line, beginning on the western bank of the Chattahoochee river, where the same crosses the boundary line between the United States and Spain; running thence up the said River Chattahoochee, and long the western bank thereof, to the great bend thereof, next above the place where a certain creek or river, called "Uchee," (being the first considerable stream on the western side, above the Cussetas and Coweta towns,) empties into the said Chattahoochee river; thence, in a direct line, to Nickajack, on the Tennessee river; then crossing the said last mentioned river; and thence, running up the said Tennessee river, and along the western bank thereof, to the southern boundary line of the State of Tennessee; upon the following express conditions, and subject thereto; that is to say:

First, That out of the first net proceeds of the sales of the lands thus ceded, which net proceeds shall be estimated by deducting from the

gross amount of sales, the expenses incurred in surveying, and incident to the sale, the United States shall pay, at their Treasury, one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars to the State of Georgia, as a consideration for the expenses incurred by the said State, in relation to the said territory; and that, for the better securing as prompt a payment of the said sum as is practicable, a land office, for the disposition of the vacant lands thus ceded, to which the Indian title has been, or may hereafter be extinguished, shall be opened within a twelvemonth after the assent of the Sate of Georgia to this agreement, as hereafter stated, shall have been declared.

Secondly, That all persons who, on the twenty-seventh day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, were actual settlers within the territory thus ceded, shall be confirmed in all the grants legally and fully executed prior to that day, by the former British Government of West Florida, or by the Government of Spain, and in the claims which may be derived from any actual survey or settlement made under the act of the State of Georgia, entitled "An act for laying out a district of land, situate on the River Mississippi, and within the bounds of this State, into a county, to be called Bourbon," passed the seventh day of February, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five.

Thirdly, That all the lands ceded by this agreement to the United States shall, after satisfying the above-mentioned payment of one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars to the State of Georgia, and the grants recognized by the preceding condition, be considered as a common fund, for the use and benefit of the United States, Georgia included, and shall be faithfully disposed of for that purpose, and for no other use or purpose whatever: provided, however, that the United States, for the period, and until the end of one year after the assent of Georgia to the boundary established by this agreement shall have been declared, may, in such manner as not to interfere with the above mentioned payment to the State of Georgia, nor with the grants hereinbefore recognized, dispose of or appropriate a proportion of the said lands, not exceeding five millions of acres, or the proceeds of the said five million of acres, or of any part thereof, for the purpose of satisfying, quieting, or compansating, for any claims other than those hereinbefore recognized, which may be made to the said lands, or to any part thereof. It being fully understood, that if an act of Congress making such disposition or appropriation shall not be passed into a law within the above mentioned period of one year, the United States shall not be at liberty thereafter to cede any part of the said lands on account of claims which may be laid to the same, other than those recognized by the preceding condition, nor to compensate for the same; and in case of any such cession or compensation, the present cession of Georgia to the right of soil over the lands thus ceded or compensated for shall be considered as null and void, and the lands thus ceded or compensated for shall revert to the State of Georgia.

Fourthly, That the United States, shall, at their own expense, extinguish, for the use of Georgia, as early as the same can be peaceably obtained, on reasonable terms, the Indian title to the country of Talassee, to the lands left out by the line drawn with the Creeks, in

the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, which had been previously granted by the State of Georgia, both which tracts had formally been yielded by the Indians; and to the lands within the forks of the Oconse and Ocmulgee rivers; for which several objects the President of the United States has directed that a treaty should be immediately held with the Creeks; and that the United States shall, in the same manner, also extinguish the Indian title to all the other lands within the State of Georgia.

Fifthly, That the territory thus ceded shall form a State, and be admitted as such into the Union, as soon as it shall contain sixty thousand free inhabitants, or at an earlier period, if Congress shall think it erpedient, on the same conditions and restrictions, with the same privileges, and in the same manner, as is provided in the ordinance of Congress of the thirteenth day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, for the government of the Western Territory of the United States; which ordinance shall, in all its parts, extend to the territory contained in the present act of cession, that article only excepted which forbids slavery.

ART. II. The United States accept the cession above mentioned, and on the conditions therein expressed; and they cede to the State of Georgia whatever claim, right, or title, they may have to the jurisdiction or soil of any lands lying within the United States, and out of the proper boundaries of any other State, and situated south of the southern boundaries of the States of Tennessee, North Carolina, and South Carolina, and east of the boundary line hereinabove described, as the eastern boundary of the territory ceded by Georgia to the United States.

ART. III. The present act of cession and agreement shall be in full force as soon as the Legislature of Georgia shall have given its assent to the boundaries of this cession; provided, that the said assent shall be given within six months after the date of these presents; and provided that Congress shall not, durin, the same period of six months, repeal so much of any former law as authorizes this agreement, and renders it binding and conclusive on the United States: but if either the assent of Georgia shall not be thus given, or if the law of the United States shall be thus repealed, whin the said period of six months, then, and in either case, these presents shall become null and void.

In faith whereof the respective commissioners have signed these presents, and affixed hereunto their seals. Done at the city of Washington, in the District of Columbia, this twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and two.

This is the first of a series of articles relating to land acquired by the United States after the Revolutionary War. Some of the colonies claimed much larger areas than had been colonized or that was included in their original grant, borders were disputed and the boundaries were often quite vague. Many had bought land from the Indians, sometimes illegally, and the problems were numerous. To solve the problem different colonies ceded to the United States the area/s in dispute. Some of them reserved certain areas for their veterans of the wars with some reserving the right to allocate that land themselves, and others assigning the right to the United States. ant.

There are many records dealing with this process housed in the National Archives as well as various State Land Offices. Many sources will be used, and we hope they will prove helpful as well as interesting.

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COPY OF LETTER WRITTEN BY THOMAS B. FLOYD TO: NEPHEW JOHN W. FLOYD AND MOTHER

GEORGIA, Troup County June 15, 1855

Dear Nephew and sister, for such I shall call you. Sister Sarah received a letter from North Carolina bearing some intelligence of our deceased Brother Dolphin FLOYD. How they got the information of you and your whereabouts I cannot tell unless through the politeness of Mr. Davis BUNTING. If it be the Bunting I knew in North Carolina he is a man of 40 or 45 years of age. If it be the man I think he is he is well acquainted with me and the rest of the family. I have written two letters since 1830 to my Brother. One addressed to Orleans that was before the annexation of Texas to the States. Some time in '35 I wrote one and addressed it of Nachadoces but never received no answer and give up all hope of ever hearing from him again but always inquiring. I have given the name of my Brother to many travelers but never could I get any information. I saw in some gazet of the United States but do not recollect what one, the names of those massacred in Texas, and my brother was one. The dates of the secdure that contained the names of the slayn I do not recollect. I very well recollect the name of my Brother and David CROCKET. My Mother received one letter after he went to Texas, stating that he married a Widow JONES. He also wrote that he used to tell us while joking and talking about marrying that he intended marrying some old rich widow that she might die directly and then he would be independent. Though he married as he always had said a widow and that she was not very old nor very rich. So we have never heard anything about him until now. Therefore I take this privilege of writing to you both, requesting you to write to me as soon as these lines of my best love and respect reaches you and particular on the THE GENIE, JANUARY 1984 22

account of my poor old Mother, for since she has heard about him since, she is very desirous to hear more. She is 86 and lives within 1/4 mile of me, with my Brother and Sister Sarah, both single. So far as Respects the comforts of this life in fact, we that are here in Georgia are all getting along well. Brother John is very rich. I have plenty myself and for my children to do well on. Now there is one or two things I do wish to know, First I wish to know how you are situated and what your condition is relative to living and making out in life. Secondly, what it was when you married my Brother. Thirdly, what was his condition was when he married you. forthly What was his reputation whether good or bad. I wish to know whether he stood fair in the world as respects truth and veracity and what was his general deportment? You may think I am too scrupous and wish to know too much my dear nephew and sister. This is a great request too much you may think to be revealed but nothing less than the revelation will satisfy me. Now my reasons to know them is this to see if a person once pure as vain Mortal can become adulterated by leaving his country and family circle. When he left North Carolina November 22, 1825 and took the last shake of the hand from his poor old Mother and his Brothers and Sisters with the exception of the Sin Stain was not to be found on him. He indulged in no bad practices save that of the folly of youth. He drank no ardent Spirits, chewed no tobacco, nor used signs when he left us. He made no pretensions to religion of any sort. He was always lively and very fond of company and had all the good will of all who knew and was muched beliked. He was very industrous though subject to waist as we all thought. Now I wish to know more things. I want to know whether he was a good husband and kind Father, a good Master and Neighbor, whether he was charitable,

Benevolent so far as in power. Now, I wish to know something relative to your Birth, Where you were born and of what nation. We understand you have married since my Brother got killed to a Mr. CLARK. We do not blame you for that as it is reasonable to suppose that everybody tries to do the best they can. I want to know how John is getting along. It would do me good to hear he was doing well. We understand you had a daughter by my Brother and she married and since died, and her name was Elizabeth. We have two samples of hair said to be John's and Elizabeth's.

Now, Dear Sister and Nephew these requests you may think to be exaggerations and speculative. But they are the pure desires of my heart and no speculation design in them no further than to know the truth. Now it you want to know my brother's age, he was born in 1804, March 6th A.D.. The times in Georgia are hard money. Provisions of all kind are scarce. Corn, \$5.00 pr., Bacon 121/2¢ per 1b., Wheat has been \$2.00 per Bush. Wheat crops are good. Other growing crops look promising.

I am older than Dolphin. I was born Feb. 27th, 1802. When he left North Carolina we were both one weight say 125 lbs. Though at this time I way 190 pounds. I am corpulent and clumsey and feel my age much. The rest of our family is all well. Small Brother Penuel will weigh not more than 120 and is about 45 years of age. I have 6 living children, 4 sons and two daughters. One is dead, my oldest son. There names as follows:

Their Mother's name was Martha Daniel HUNTER. She died Oct. 14th 1840. Born Dec. 16th 1807. I married my present wife Feb. 11th 1841. Her name was Ann SHARP, never had but one child stilled born.

(This letter transcribed above is in the possession of Rufus L. Floyd, Jourdanton, Texas, or Gonzales, Texas.)

The above letter was written to the widow of DOLPHIN FLOYD who was killed at the Alamo. He was the son of PENUEL FLOYD and SARAH BECKWITH who lived in Nash County, North Carolina. PENUEL FLOYD died in 1815 in Nash County and in 1830's most of the family moved to Georgia. Some of the family moved into Upshur County, Texas and reared families there. DOLPHIN was the first to leave North Carolina for Georgia, but left for Texas soon afterward, and lost his life at the ALAMO.

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SOME ALBRITTON FAMILY NOTES Submitted by Joyce Shannon Bridges Rt. 2 Box 50-X, Keithville, LA 71047

Records show that prior to 1667, the name was spelled Albrighton. Francis Albrighton, believed to be Scotch, married an Irish girl and emigrated with his family to Virginia about 1650. He purchased land in York county, Va in January, 1651. (Ref: York Co. Record Book 1, page 33) He bought adjoining land in 1655 (Ref: same book, page 98). He made his will in York County, April 9, 1667, naming seven childred, namely: Richard, Francis, Elizabeth, George, John, Anne, and Margaret. Each of their names was spelled Albrighton (Ref: York Co. Record Book 4, page 132-156). (Page 132 is record on file in State Archives in Richmon, VA and page 156 is origional.)

Francis Albrighton's eldest son, Richard, made his will April 23, 1683, the name still being spelled Albrighton (Ref: York Co, VA, book 6, page 5553). After the Richard Albrighton will, the name was not spelled Albrighton any more in family records.

- Francis Albrighton emigrated to America in 1650 Children: Richard, Francis, Elizabeth, George, John, Anne, and Margaret.
- George Albrighton-born in 1630, 4th child of Francis the emigrant.
- 3. Ralph Albrighton-born in 1655 or 1656, son or George, grandson of Francis I (York Co. book 8, page 385). Ralph sttended court in York County in January 1689 and told the court he was 33 years old.
- 4. Thomas Albritton-born 1682, son of Ralph Albrighton.
- 5. James Albritton-born 1705, son of Thomas. James and one of his brothers settled in Pitt County, North Carolina. James was the father of 6 sons: Matthew, Richard, John, James, Thomas, and George.
- 6. Richard Albritton-born 1752 in Pitt Co., North Carolina, second son of James. Richard was a member of the North Carolina State Militia in 1771 (Ref: N.C. State Record, Vol. XXII, page 415). Also in 1775, he was a member of the Army Patroll (Ref: N.C. Colonial Record, Vol. X, page 62-63). In 1776, Richard married Mary Lanier (she was born 25 Dec 1759, daughter of Benjamin Lanier). After their marriage, Richard and Mary moved to Georgia and settled on land grants in Effingham County (Land

F.A.) married (1) Perry TUNNELL, Methodist Minister in Greene Co., Tenn. in 1807, married (2) Robert LITTLE in Jefferson Co., Ala. 1839. In Smith Co., Texas 1850 living with her son James TUNNELL. She is said to have been the granddaughter of John GUNTER of Sunter's Landing, North Alabama."

From another source who give the Ancestral Line of Lulu SELF descended from John H. SELF and Leona PULCHER who was descended from George PUSLEY a full blood Choctaw Indian who is referred to as Captain PUSLEY. He was the official blacksmith for MOSHULETUBBEE in the Indiam Territory at Mountain Station. Before the removal of the Indians from Alabama and Miss., three very important men were often mentioned in the U.S. Territorial Papers as leaders of the Choctaws; PUSHMATAHA, MOSHULETUBBEE and Peter PITCHLYNN.

Polly FILLEYCUTCHEY (PHILLECUTCHEY/FILECUTCHER/FILLE-COO-CHEE) is said to be the sister of PUSHMATAHA but it is hard to prove this. She was the mother of Margaret FILLECUTCHEY (called Peggy sometimes) and is listed in the 19th article or Supplementary Agreement of Dancing Rabbit Creek Treaty which ended the Creek Indian War.

George PUSLEY owned a stand on the Natchez Trace and moved to Indian territory in the late 1830's. His daughter,

Phoebe, married a German named PULCHER.

This is a very interesting historical item in relation to the SELF Family, and the statement about PUSLEY being a full blooded Choctaw with Catherine SELF being the granddaughter of John GUNTER of Gunter's Landing on the Tenn. River in northern Ala. John GUNTER married Aky (Katie), daughter of a chieftain of the Cherokee Indians and he signed many of the treaties with the Indians as recorded in the U.S. Territorial Papers and other documents found in the Dept. of Interior in Washington, D.C.

There is a will written by William SELF in 1844, Pike County, Miss. but filed in St. Helena Parish, Louisiana: "I. William SELF, considering the uncertainty of this mortel life and through law (though low) and enfeabled in the body, being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say, First I give to my wife Elizabeth Ann SELF one nigro of light completion named Charlotte about 24 years old, one hundred dollars in cash, in consideration of certain cattle which she owned at the time of our marriage, one grey mare, one sorrell horse with a bull face, in the place of the mare and colt which she owned at the time of our marriage, also two beds and bedding being the same which she owned at the time of our marriage. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my youngest child, Thomas Jefferson SELF, being the only child of my said wife, Elizabeth Ann SELF, one negro girl of light complection named Mary, about seven years old. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my other six sons, to wit; Elijah SELF, Eli SELF, Elias SELF, William Jackson SELF, David Washington SELF and Franklin Dawson SELF and their heirs forever all the rest, residence and reminder (sic) of my real and personal estate, effects, money, goods and chattels of what kind and nature so ever to be equally divided between and among them. Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my oldest son, Elijah SELF my sole executor of this my last will and testament here by revoking all former wills by me made. In witness hereof I have here unto set my hand and seal the seventh day of May, 1844.

William SELF (seal)

Signed, sealed, published and declared by the last will and testament of William SELF above named William SELF to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who have here unto subscribed our names as witness. Brother HUGHES, Lewis VARNADO and Samuel Mark VARNADO.

William SELF died 21 Mar 1846 in St. Helena Parish, La.
