"NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS ADMINISTRATION ACT OF 1984"-  
On April 1, 1985, this legislation will go into effect separating the National Archives and Records Administration from the General Services Administration. It will become an independent agency within the Executive Branch and will be headed by the Archivist of the United States who will be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Senate. The purpose of this legislation is "to extend independence to an agency that many believe has suffered as a result of its placement within the General Services Administration."

Agricultural Censuses - were taken in 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880 and list farm and ranch owners in each county of every state. The National Archives has some but not all of these. However, they are not available through inter-library loan as was previously printed.

## THE FIRST SETTLERS

Sibley, first known as Lanesville, had as it's earliest settler, John G. LANE, a builder. He moved here in 1851 from Perry, Georgia, with his family and 75 slaves. Travel was made overland in a two wheeled oxcart and the trip required more than eight months. LANE purchased six sections of land, which included the present site of Sibley, from the government.

In 1856, other settlers who moved from Houston County, Georgia, were G. W. WREN, Jack WHITE and Tom SHERMAN. These were soon followed by others; E. E. KENNON came from Kentucky, the COLBERTS from Tennessee, Jesse LAIRD and Ben BEEN from Arkansas. Major LEARY and Tom BOONE were also early settlers in this section.

A school was organized before the Civil War and was taught by Miss Fannie PRATT. The school was a log cabin with dirt floor and shutter windows. The first school after the war was taught by Miss Betty ROCHESTER, who was born and reared in this community.

The first religious services were held by traveling preachers in homes of settlers. When the school was built, it was used as a church building and for all public meetings.

For many years there were not a store at Lanesville. Supplies were brought by wagon from Shreveport. R.F. LANE, son of John LANE opened the first store, a commissary, in connection with a sawmill. A post office was established in the store.

Mr. LANE gave a right-of-way through his land to the Vicksburg, Shreveport and Pacific Railroad in 1884. For this reason the town and post office were first called Lanesville. There being a station by this name near Monroe, the name was changed to Sibley in honor of General Henry Hopkins SIBLEY.

BEULAH METHODIST CHURCH - Located Hwy 487 between Marthaville and Ajax, LA- Southwest Natchitoches Parish, LA

BEULAH METHODIST CHURCH was organized on July 23, 1860, by the Reverend B. F. ALEXANDER, a circuit rider of the Methodist Church, with the assistance of most of the members listed as having joined in 1860; and it has never been without a pastor since its organization. The doors were open throughout the terrible Civil War & Reconstruction Period, and for the duration of World War I and II. The first preachers, known as circuit riders, travelled long distances on horseback and served several charges.

CIVIL WAR LETTER

This is a letter from Arlo H. AINSWORTH to his wife, Hannah M., written during the Civil War.

Lauderdale Co. Miss.

July 17th 1862

Dear wife I rite you a few lines that I forgot to put in the letter befour I sealed it up and I rite this to day and the other I rote Yesterday. I believe that I feel a little better than I did yesterday but I have medicine but I think I will soon B sound if I have no bad luck. I have sent you some medicine one bottle of expecturant Dr. LAYNIR medicine and a bottle of number six. It is good for all most any misery if you (last line missing from original letter) It will be apt to cure it and the other medicine is verry good for a grea t many things. I will send the directirens and then you will know how to give it to the children and how to take it your self. an adult means a grown person and the rest of the direction you will understand there is no harm in it. I will send you twenty dollars in a Confederate bill and when you get it spend it as you think proper. This (line missing) Mose ABNEY and get you a pair of shoes and if you cannot get them send me word. I cannot buy shoes for less than 7\$ here. I will get some more money soon and then I will send you some more or bring it and tell Papy that I will send him some money soon or bring it. Tell him to have patience. I will attend to him soon. I will bring or send you and Mary & Charity and the baby some calico but I cannot send much for it is scarce. There is a cotton factory in two miles of where I am. Put into asseretion I am going next week if I am able and buy some thread and bring or send to you. I could buy right here by paying five dollars and twenty five cents a bunch but I cannot pay that much. I have sent Allen a

The author has interviewed some 3000 persons from all walks of life, received written notes from native Shelby Countians from 38 states, & 3 foreign countries, visted 27 cemeteries, many churches & researched in numerous libraries. This landmark book provides an illuminating summary of life in Shelby Co. from mid-19th centur to the present. It is not a black history for it has been the Blacks & Caucasians that have worked in building the county. However, it has a treasure-trove of information which emphasizes the Black experience. His observations cover 40 of the mountain counties of eastern Kentucky and historical data goes back to 1730 and the arrival of LaSalle to the region via the Mississippi. With illustrations, this volume presents the manner of living in begone days of those hardy pioneers- when men were land kings and monarchs of all they could survey.
