EARLIEST MASONIC LODGES IN NORTHWEST LOUISIANA

Masonic lodges were organized in communities in Northwest Louisiana soon after the early settlers began forming these communities.

Phoenix Lodge No. 38 was chartered October 6, 1836 in Natchitoches. The first lodge chartered in Caddo Parish was Jackson Lodge No. 45 at Greenwood with a date of January 28, 1843. Minden Lodge No. 51, Webster Parish, was chartered April 19, 1845, and DeSoto Lodge No. 55 on March 17, 1847 at Mansfield.

The first lodge in Shreveport, Caddo Lodge No. 49, was organized in 1845. Its charter was surrendered in 1853, but restored the same year as Shreveport Lodge No. 124. Joppa Lodge No. 79 was organized in 1850, and seven years later it was dissolved and Caddo Lodge No. 188 formed. Later, March 27, 1853, it was changed to Shreveport Lodge No. 115, and on February 14, 1867, Caddo Lodge No. 179 was authorized.

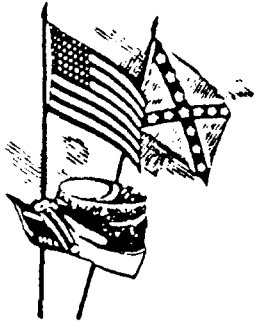

The 5th Louisiana Regiment of Infantry, Confederate States of America, was mustered in 1861, and sent to Virginia to fight under General T. J. JACKSON with the Army of Virginia. The company fought bravely in many of the bloodiest battles of the war, including the Seven Days Battle, Gettysburg, Sharpsburg, Second Manassas and Winchester.

Today the 5th Louisiana is being represented in battle re-enactments by a group of men and boys organized in northwest Louisiana. Equipped and traveling at their own expense, this 5th Louisiana attends six to eight events a year in Louisiana, Texas, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Tennessee and Virginia. They host two battles: Pleasant Hill in April and Harrisonburg in November.

The first weekend in October they will participate in the 125th anniversary observance of the Battle of Corinth, Mississippi. Another 125th anniversary event on their schedule was the re-enactment of the Battle of Manassas in 1986. April 3-5 of this year they were among 6000 troops at their re-enactment of the Battle of Shiloh, though at this event this group portrayed members of the 19th Infantry.

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Attempts to secure rosters of the original 5th Louisiana companies from northwest Louisiana to publish at this time have been unsuccessful. The Louisiana State Archives in Baton Rouge will furnish this desired information as soon as the move into its new facilities is completed. The information will be published when available.

Captain Paul SUMMERLIN, of Shreveport, is in command of the present day re-enactment unit, which represents Company E, 5th Louisiana Regiment of Infantry.

Nat BAGGETT, of Jamestown, is the First Sergeant, Sgt. Mike NEKLUTIN is from Natchitoches, Les ALBERS of Deridder, David ANDERSON and Jason SUMMERLIN of Shreveport, and Mike DUBOIS of Many, are Corporals.

Privates are Dale CRAIN of Kelly, Travis GARAFFA of Bossier City, Bryon BOHANNON of Coushatta, Chris and David MATHERN of Natchitoches, Tom and Jim RYDER of Coushatta, Frank WALSH of Ringgold, Steve WEBB of Blanchard, Shane WILKINS of Columbia, Charles YOUNG of Benton, George THARPE III, Bryan PETERS and Charles ANDERSON of Shreveport.

Pioneers are Allan THARPE and Charles ANDERSON of Shreveport, and Ed BOHANNON of Coushatta. Brant SUMMERLIN of Shreveport is a cadet.

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NEWSPAPER FILES ARE VALUABLE GENEALOGICAL TOOL

Newspaper archives are a valuable source of genealogical information for family history researchers. Since my father was an editor and publisher of a newspaper, I have always been aware of the wealth of information chronicled in old newspapers, but many family history researchers overlook this tool. Obituaries in old newspapers give not only dates and information as to the deceased, but usually give names and residences of surviving relatives. Accompanying information may even give names and residences of family and friends attending the funeral from out of the area.

Neither of my own parents (born in 1882 and 1886) had been entered in a register of births in their respective counties, but in both cases diligent searches turned up items in local newspapers announcing their births. In this era, the announcements were interspersed with other local items and advertising on the front page.

A retirement story appearing on the front page of a community weekly newspaper of 60 years ago, contained the clue as to the village of birth in West Prussia of my husband's grandfather. That one long sought place name from that article was the key to tracing that family back 250 years.

Much help on another family line came from a 1902 St. Louis Dispatch article reporting a 73rd wedding anniversary. Golden and silver wedding anniversaries were also often reported and many had accompanying photographs.

One of my husband's cousins celebrated her 107th birthday last December 7th and has often been featured in area newspapers as she has attained various birth milestones. Don't overlook this possibility in your research, if a member was long-lived. This particular lady is amazingly active and mentally alert and her hometown newspaper recently reported her having gone to an elementary school to talk to students on local history!

City and small town newspapers, alike, report wedding activities. Names of the parents of both the bride and bridegroom are usually included, and members of the wedding party who are relatives are often identified. An 1838 Hanover, Pennsylvania, newspaper unearthed recently in my own research positively identified the parents of the bride and groom, refuted a published family history, but enabled that line to be easily taken back two generations.

A 1908, Cedar Rapids (Iowa) Gazette reported the death of my great grandfather, and included a reprint of a lengthy autobiographical article. A 1911, Des Moines (Iowa) Register and Leader had included a complete page featuring his father and the seven sons, with biographical material and pictures of each. (What a hey-day I have whenever I can get into newspaper archives at the Iowa State Historical Building in Des Moines.) The old newspaper files of originals were bound volumes of newsprint. The brittle

paper deteriorates rapidly, and most early newspapers are now available on microfilm. Check the State Archives, The State Historical Societies, the universities and public libraries in the area of your interest, for the list of newspapers available on microfilm. A source book of "Newspapers on Microfilm", published by the Library of Congress, is on the shelf at the Genealogy Department of Shreve Memorial Library in Shreveport, and is probably available at a major library near you. Information is arranged by states, then by city or town, with a key to the code where microfilm for a particular newspaper of a particular date is located. Check all possible sources in your search for a particular newspaper that might be of help to you. Do not give up easily. I have even climbed ladders in back rooms of small town newspapers, lugged down the old seven and eight column wide original bound files, and have become encrusted with dirt and grime from pages obviously untouched for years. Never have I come up empty-handed!

Even if you should fail to find information you need for your research, you'll have fun reading the old items and front page advertising. One of the choicest items I found reports the sighting of the first airplane flying over the community "with no perceptible movement of the wings".

Following is a listing of some of the newspapers of this area available on microfilm on the first floor of Shreve Memorial Library in Shreveport and at the library of Louisiana State University in Shreveport. An accompanying article, "Shreveport Newspapers at Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana", was contributed by Gloria L. The information given here is from an inventory which I took in 1984 when the cabinets which contained these microfilms were open to the public. Since that time LSU has moved these films to the Special Collections Division of Hill Memorial Library. The cabinets themselves are now in "closed stacks" If you would like to view any of these newspapers, it is advisable to call ahead before attempting a trip to Baton Rouge. This is to insure that the reels you wish to search are available for use. (See the Second Quarter 1987 issue of THE GENIE, page 74, for details on the newspaper project at LSU. Editor's note.)

CADDO GAZETTE

Began printing in 1841 until circa 1869. Film copies available from February 1844 to November 1863. Many of these are single issues for the various years, the largest number are for 1853. Microfilm #415. This same reel of film contains a single issue of the CADDO FREE PRESS for 18 March 1839; two issues dated 1843 of the CADDO GAZETTE and DESOTO INTELLIGENCER; one issue dated April 1874 of the DAILY SOUTHWESTERN TELEGRAM; 18 October 1870 issue of the SHREVEPORT BULLETIN; and one 1884 issue of the SHREVEPORT DAILY DEMOCRAT; three issues of the SHREVEPORT JOURNAL dated 1848.

DAILY CAUCASIAN

Began printing in 1888. Film copies date from October 1889 to December 1927. LSU at Shreveport is said to have originals. Total of 13 reels of film. Microfilm #444. Reels 1 thru 9 are prior to 1900.

DAILY SOUTH-WESTERN

Began printing October 1868. Film copies date from October 1868 thru October 1869. Total of 2 reels. Microfilm #1030. LSU at Shreveport has some original copies.

HERALD

Began printing in circa 1896. No earlier copies available to verify. Film copies date from November 1896 to February 1897. Total of one reel. Microfilm #333.

PROGRESS

Began printing in February 1892 until 1900. Film copies date from February 1892 thru December 1898. Total of 4 reels. Microfilm #442.

SHREVEPORT DAILY STANDARD AND EVENING STANDARD

Began printing May 1878 until 1883. Film copies available from May 1, 1878 thru October 30, 1881. Total of 5 reels. Film #445.

SHREVEPORT JOURNAL

Began printing in 1895. From 1895 to 1897 appeared as EVENING JUDGE; 1897 to 1903 appeared as the SHREVEPORT EVENING JOURNAL. Film copies available from June 1895 thru February 1938. Total of 763 reels. Prior to 1900 are eleven reels. Film #63.

SHREVEPORT TIMES

Began printing in 1871 until present. Film copies available from 1871 to current year. Total of 1,016 reels in 1984 at inventory. There are 32 reels prior to 1900. Daily paper. Film #497.

SHREVEPORT WEEKLY TIMES

Began printing in 1871 thru 1916. No other issues later than 1916 to confirm last date of printing. Film copies available from 1893 until 1908. Total of 5 reels. Prior to 1900 are two reels. Film #1689.

SOUTH-WESTERN

Began printing in 1852 until 1872. Film copies available from August 1854 thru 12 July 1871. Total of 6 reels. Film #837.

SHREVEPORT WEEKLY NEWS/SHREVEPORT SEMI-WEEKLY NEWS SHREVEPORT NEWS/SHREVEPORT DAILY NEWS

Only scattered issues of these papers available. The DAILY NEWS are issues dated between April and November 1861. The NEWS are three issues only, two in 1864 and one in 1865. The SEMI-WEEKLY NEWS are scattered issues dated between 1861 and 1866. The WEEKLY NEWS are issues dated between 1861 and 1863. All of the above named papers are on Microfilm #3372. Probably at least 2 reels. A note in the margin of my inventory indicates that other issues of the SHREVEPORT NEWS can be found on film #415.

COLONIAL, TERRITORIAL AND STATE CENSUS RECORDS

Census records are one of the basic tools of genealogical research. Beginners are sometimes not aware of and "old timers" sometimes overlook the fact that census records are available other than those taken in the United States Federal Census enumerations.

Many colonial, territorial and state enumerations were made in addition to the every ten year enumerations. The contents of these records varies from tally count of the names of the heads of households to listing of every person residing in a household.

When located and used with the Federal Censuses, these records are an invaluable aid in tracing ancestors and may fill in many gaps found when using only the U. S. Censuses.

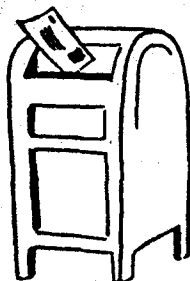

The year of birth is an approximate. The age range of the soldier could be broader, particularly during the Civil War.

Records for the wars listed above may be found in the National Archives with the exception of the wars prior to the American Revolution and for some records of the Civil War. Since there was no United States Government before the Revolutionary War, state, county and city records and archives must be searched for that period.

Many Confederate records are on file in the National Archives, but one should check the State Archives in (1) the state where the ancestor lived, (2) the state where he enlisted, and (3) the state in which he resided after the war. Many men lived in one state, enlisted in another, and after the war, moved to another. Pension applications by Confederate veterans and/or their widows were made to and filed in the state they were living in at the time the application was filed. They will not be found in the National Archives.

EARLY RECORDS OF BOSSIER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The Bossier First United Methodist Church had its beginning in 1908, as a mission charge, when J. W. JAMIESON, a student at Centenary College, arranged for a Sunday School and place to preach in an old store building north of the Illinois Central Railroad tracks. It later moved to an old school building on Broadway Street.

The church was officially organized in 1910. Mr. JAMIESON was appointed the first pastor. It continued as a student appointment until 1917, when J. M. BOYKIN became the first resident minister.

Two lots at the corner of Ogilvie and Arcadia Street were donated by W. B. MC CORMICK and his sister in 1913. The deeds to these two lots are recorded at the Bossier Parish Courthouse at Benton, Louisiana in Volume 47, page 558. Another lot was purchased from him.

The first building, a parsonage, was built here in 1919. This was remodeled in 1939, and in 1943, was moved to 510 McCormick Street. In 1955, a new parsonage was built at 1618 Dudley Lane.

The first sanctuary was built and paid for in 1921. This was added onto through the years until 1949, when a newly constructed sanctuary was opened for worship.

The church remained at this location until July 1973, when it was relocated at 201 John Wesley Boulevard and Old Minden Road, near Interstate 20.

The information which follows is contained in the first register book, which is entitled "The Church Register of the Bossier City, La. Methodist Episcopal Church, South."

More than 125,000 citations to names in over 100 published passenger and naturalization lists are to be found in this work covering passengers who arrived in the United States, Canada or the West Indies from the sixteenth century through the early twentieth century. This is the sixth annual supplemental to the First Edition published by Gale in 1981. Over 1.4 million names are indexed in the three volume base set and its six supplements, but this is still only a fraction of the 20 million immigrants to North America from 1538 to 1900. Citations have been compiled directly from over 100 additional published sources, including complete books as well as articles appearing in periodicals and books in this volume. It contains computer-generated cross references for every accompanying passenger. List of the sources indexed provides full bibliographical information about each source, together with the source code used in the index. xxii and 645 pages.
