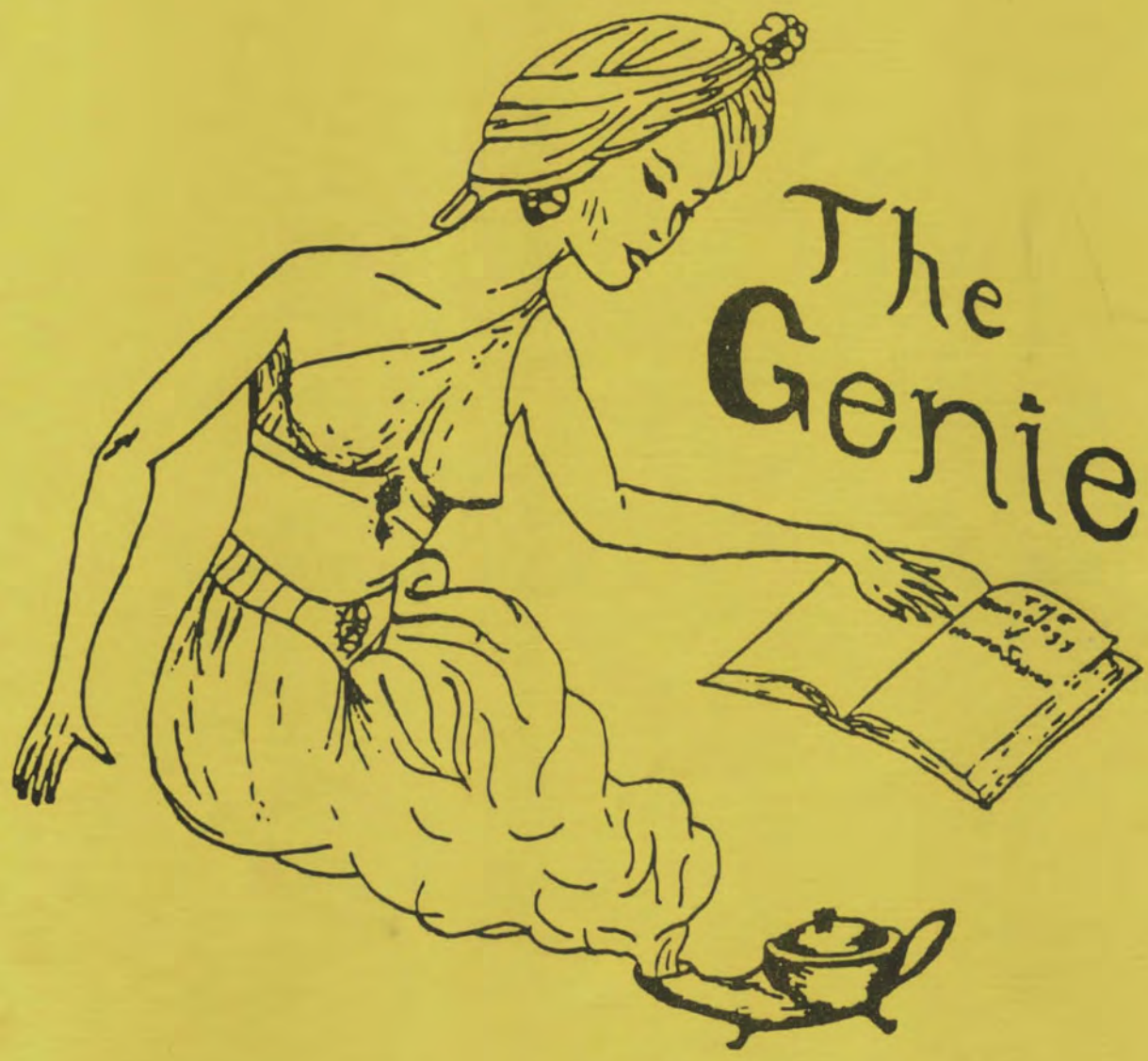

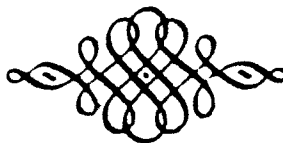

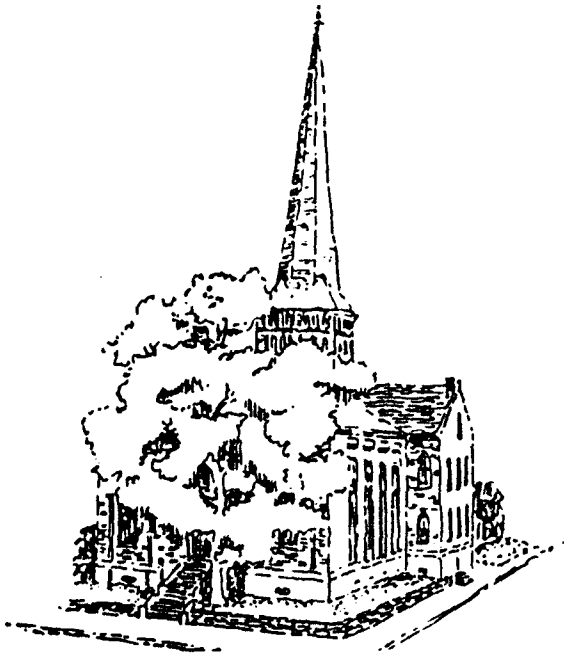

In February 1845, a Presbyterian Church was organized in Shreveport by Rev. James Gallagher, who served as pastor for two years. The succeeding pastor, S. P. Helme, died in 1850.

The first church building was erected under the ministry of Rev. J. Franklin Ford, who served from 1850 to 1856. This was a brick building located on the west side of Market Street, between Milam and Crockett.

Ministers of this period included D. W. Eakin, R. S. McAllister and John W. Mosely, with J. F. Flor, as stated supply minister, serving again from 1866 to 1868.

During the war this first building was used as a hospital for Confederate soldiers, and under reconstruction, it was occupied by Federal troops. Later this building was torn down, the site was sold, and a new building erected on the corner of Travis and Edwards Street in downtown Shreveport. Under the 30 year pastorate of Dr. Jasper K. Smith (1904-1934), the church membership outgrew this facility and the present church was constructed on Jordan Street.

Many of the early minutes of the trustees have been preserved. The earliest membership register surviving the years, however, is that begun by Dr. W. C. Dunlap in 1869. Dr. Dunlap became minister of this congregation in 1868, serving until his death September 21, 1886. Dr. Dunlap also kept a Pastor's Register for 1873-1884 that contains a wealth of information for family history researchers. Included in this volume is a section of Register of Baptisms he began in 1885, a Register of Communicants from 1873-1884, Marriages 1873-1886, with a few entries in a section of Register of Funerals he recorded in 1875 and 1877.

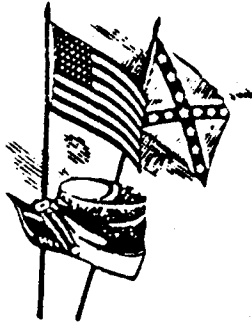

EARLY MEASUREMENTS

By 1750 surveyors in America had most of the basic instruments of modern surveying available to them although often in their crudest form. The surveyor's chain (Gunter's chain, named for the English mathematician and astronomer Edmund Gunter, 1581-1626) was 66 feet long and divided into 100 links. Surveyor's measures were: 80 chains = 1 mile, 625 square links = 1 square pole, 16 square poles = 1 square chain, 10 square chains = 1 acre, 640 acres = 1 square mile or 1 section, and 36 square miles = 1 township. A rod, also called a pole or perch, was 5½ yards or 16½ feet in length.

THE BOSSIER GUARDS

"The last company from this parish was The Bossier Guards, under the captaincy of R. E. Wyche, who left during April 1863," wrote Mabel (Scanland) Jones, a former president of the R. J. Hancock Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, and a daughter of William H. Scanland, editor of the Bossier Banner in an issue of The Banner dated 16 July 1942.

Wyche resigned his captaincy when he became major of the 1st Battalion of State Cavalry in 1864. T. J. Caldwell succeeded Wyche to the captaincy.

The company was made up primarily of home guards, those who had been wounded and were now unable to serve their comrades in arms elsewhere than close to home.

"In the swampy area around Catahoula Lake and Little River a number of jayhawkers were committing depredations on citizens and defying civil and military authorities," wrote John D. Winter in "The Civil War in Louisiana," page 322.

General Taylor directed Major R. E. Wyche of the Louisiana State Troops and Polignac at Harrisonburg "to scour this portion of the country thoroughly," and to shoot "every man with arms in his hands, against whom reasonable suspicion exists or a determination to resist the laws. Such men must be arrested."

A review of the roster of the Bossier Guards, which became the First Battalion State Cavalry, shows that many of its members had been serving in other companies. Also many on the roster could not be found in the Records of Louisiana Confederate Soldiers as compiled by the State of Louisiana. There is evidence that the official roster of the First Battalion of State Cavalry was never filed.

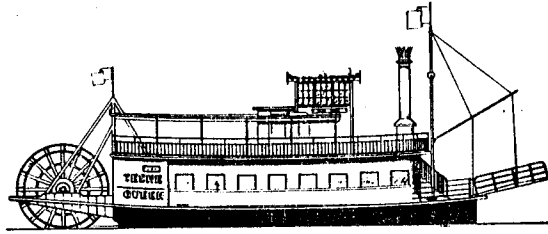

THE AHNENTAFEL -----

The word Ahnentafel is German for "table of ancestors". And that is what it is. It puts all of the facts about one's ancestry in an orderly table. Each person on the chart is given a number exactly the same as it would be on a pedigree chart. To find the father of a person, look for double the number of that person. In turn, the wife of that person may be found by adding one number. Since the father's number is always double that of the child, number 18 is the child of number 36, and the mother of number 8 is 17. The parents of number 17 are 34 and 35. Only basic facts which can be verified should be included and blanks left for unknown unverified facts.

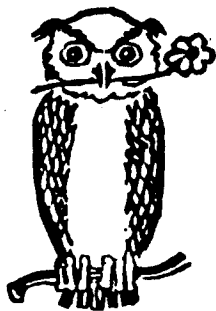

The American Cemetery, which is the oldest Natchitoches burying ground, is at least half a century older than its oldest marked graves. The Church of St. Francis which formerly stood there was built in 1735 by labor and contributions of soldiers and settlers. Around it lay the dead of France's most western post. Louis Juchereau de St. Denis, the commandant who built the fort upon this dominant hill, sleeps in an unmarked grave in this cemetery, in land which was once the floor of the church. The oldest marked grave to be found now in the area is in this cemetery and dates back to one who died in 1797. A cemetery was in the yard of the first Catholic Church in Natchitoches, located on the west bank of the Red River in the heart of the town. The church burned, and was rebuilt at another location. Most of the graves and markers were also moved to the new Catholic Cemetery on Fifth Street. The Jewish Cemetery gives fascinating names from many European countries. At Grand Ecore only a few graves remain. Called the Russell Cemetery, it was at one time known as the DeRussy Cemetery. Some very old handmade iron crosses mark the older graves in the Catholic Cemetery at Campti, LA. All of these cemeteries are included in recordings in this valuable volume.
