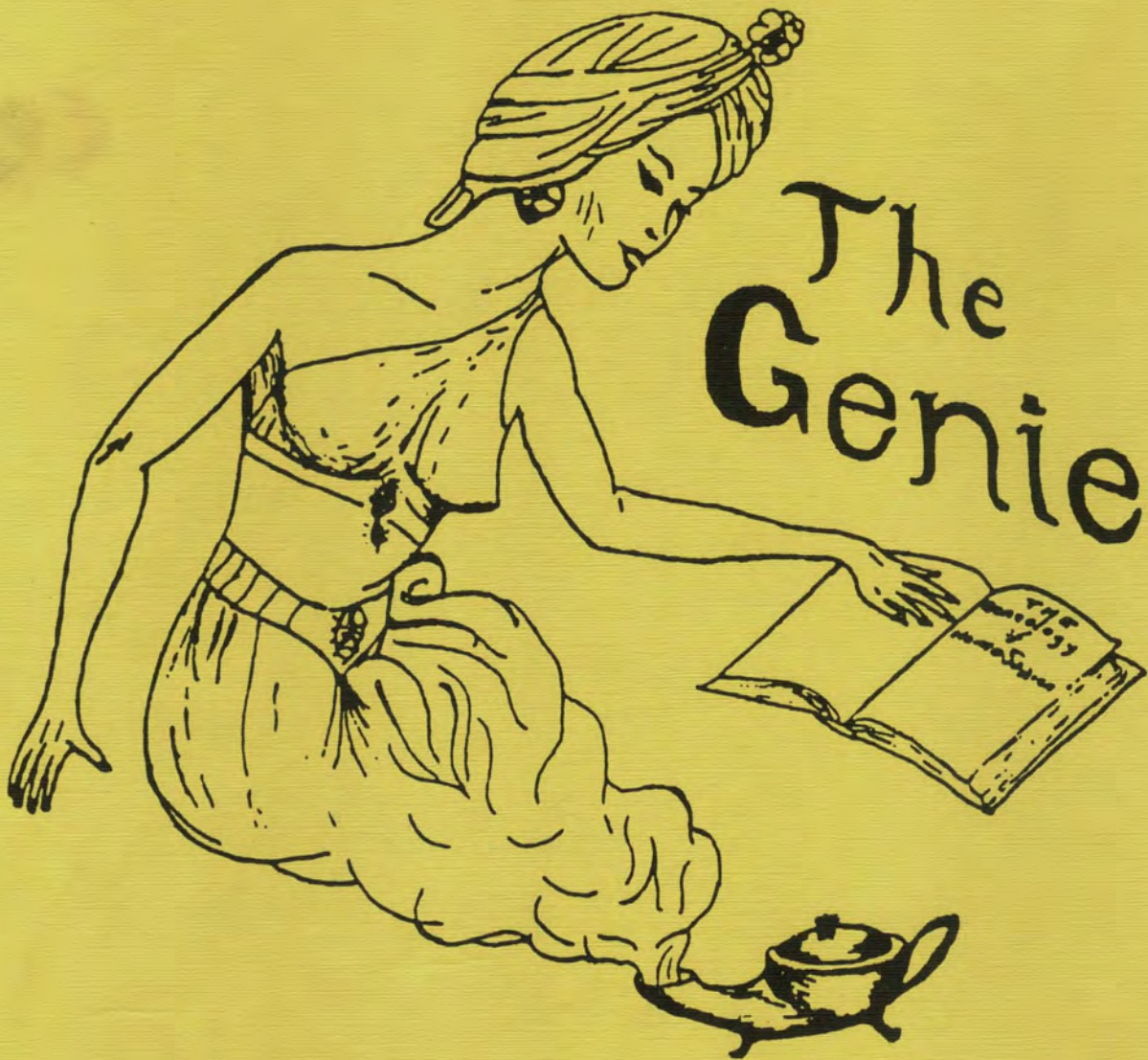

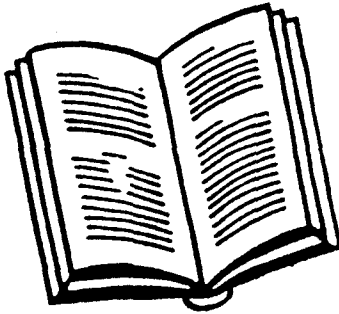
The classes at Shreve Memorial Library have been well attended. We have started a new group of people on the search for their roots.

# BOSSIER PARISH

## MARRIAGES 1867-1875

Bossier Parish was formed 25 February 1843, with Freedonia as the first parish seat, then changed to Society Hill, which adopted the name of Bellevue. In the early 1900's the parish seat was moved to Benton after a long and hotly contested law-suit.

Records appearing in Marriage Book C were recorded during the years 1867 through 1875, when the parish court house was at Bellevue. While the actual recordings of these marriages was not accomplished until this time, some of these marriages actually occurred during the earlier years of the Civil War. These records are now housed in the Office of the Clerk of Court, Bossier Parish Court House, Benton, Louisiana 71006. Wilna Mabry is presently serving as the elected official.

The records which follow were copied in order from the original recorder's handwriting as found at the court house by Paul and Priscilla Reinowski. Bossier Parish Marriage Records consist of Bond, Licenses, Marriage Certificates, Ministers' and Officials' Returns. Dates given are those to be found on the marriage certificates unless as otherwise noted in parentheses. All surnames appearing are indexed alphabetically in the back of this issue.

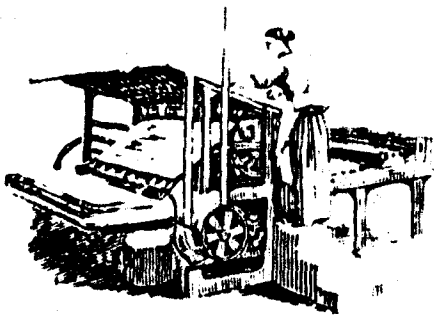

Williamson CLARKE, Recorder &amp; Ex Officio Notary Public in and for the Parish of Bossier State of Louisiana came appeared Derry McCONNELL &amp; Henrietta JOHNSON, both residents of Bossier Parish, who declared that they were privately married in May A. D. 1860, and have since lived as Husband and Wife and that the offspring of said private Marriage are as follows to wit: A Girl named Sarah, aged Seven years, Frank, a boy, aged about Four years &amp; Lucinda, A Girl aged about one year, and that they do by these present acknowledge the above named Children to be their legitimate offspring and bind and obligate themselves to perform all the duties and to assist in all the obligations imposed by existing laws in relation to civil marriages and to abide by the law. In testimony whereof I have caused the parties to sign the same with the said Notary in presence of S. W. BAKER, Percy BAKER on the day and date above written.</p>

The Genie here continues publication begun in its last issue of extracts from The New Orleans Christian Advocate. Marriages and death notices appearing in the pages of that newspaper in 1867, were published in Issues Number 51 and 52 of Volume XII and in subsequent issues of Volume XIII.

### VOLUME XII

No. 51, 5 January 1867 - No deaths or marriages.

No. 52, 12 January 1867 - Page 4, Col. 1

Married - At the residence of Mr. BURBBACHER, 5 Jan. 1867, by the Rev. J. B. A. AHRENS, pastor Dryades Street German Church, Mr. E. HOEHN to Miss Sophia STEFFAN, of Zurich, Switzerland.

Married - At the same place at the same time, by the same minister, Mr. H. SWARZENBACH to Miss Lizzie SWARZENBACH, of Zurich, Switzerland.

### VOLUME XIII

No. 1, 19 January 1867 - Page 5, Col. 5

Died at his residence in Pike County, Miss., Nov. 26th, 1866, Hardy THOMPSON. Born in Georgia, 5 February 1802, he came to Mississippi with his parents in 1818. After attaining the age of majority, he married Miss Nancy McMORRIS, in Amite county, where they first settled. In a few years they moved to Pike County, where he died. Both were members of the M. E. Church. (J. G. JONES, Fayette, Miss., Dec. 26th, 1866.)

Martha F. MYERS, wife of G. W. MYERS, and daughter of Thomas and Sally TOLSON, died 23 November 1866. Born 13 December 1827, in North Carolina, she moved with her parents to Alabama, and from thence to Mississippi, where she died. She joined the Baptist Church at the age of 13. On 29 October 1863, she was united in marriage to G. W. MYERS. (G. D. WADE, Goodman, Miss., Jan. 3rd, 1867.)

No. 2, 26 January 1867, Page 5, Col. 4

Died, on the 11th of December 1866, in Macon, Noxubee County, Miss., Mrs. E. D. MACON, aged about 87 years. Born in city of Columbia, S. C., in the year 1780, she was "born again" in her 18th year. The result of the war left her almost penniless, or most of her possessions consisted of slaves, "whom she treated with the utmost kindness. (J. BANCROFT, Macon, Miss., Jan. 17, 1867.)

No. 3, 2 February 1867, Page 4, Col. 6

Died December 23rd, 1866, in Mobile, after an illness of six days, Mrs. Mary

WHITE DORMAN, wife of Rev. T. W. DORMAN. She was born in Loudon Co., Va., in 1802, was married in 1825, and united with the Methodist Church. In 1836, Bro. DORMAN moved to Montgomery, Ala., and in 1839, entered the Alabama Conference. (J. HAMILTON, Mobile, Jan. 24, 1867.)

No. 3, 2 February 1867, Page 5, Col. 4

Departed this life the 14th of December 1866, in the town of Black Hawk, Carroll County, Miss., Miss Eliza Jane COLE, born in Fayette County, Ala., 7th May 1815. She was married to Wm. R. COLE 3rd January 1839, in the 24th year of her age. (Joseph D. NEWSOM)

Married December 27th, 1866, by J. D. NEWSOM, at the residence of Jas. LUNDEY, Miss Laura NORWOOD to Thomas CARTER, all of Blackhawk, Carroll County, Miss.

Married January 15th, 1867, by the same, at the residence of the bride, Mrs. Martha GLEN to Wm. TURNER, all of Blackhawk, Carroll County, Miss.

Married on Thursday, January 10th, by the Rev. J. B. STRATTON, D. D., A. Freeland DRAKE, of St. Joseph, La., to Miss Lizzie MASON, daughter of Richard MASON, Esq., of Natchez, Miss.

No. 4, 9 February 1867, Page 5, Col. 4

Obituary. Capt. Isaac A. HOMER, was born Oct. 26, 1823, in Boston, Mass., and his parents, A. B. and Phebe HOMER, moved to Mobile, Ala., in 1828, when he was about five years old. He remained here until 1857, when he went to St. Marx, Florida, where he was married to Miss Mattie COLEMAN. Enlisting as a Confederate soldier, he served in the Army of Virginia, three years, and was then detached to go as a pilot in the Navy, where he served until the close of the war. He then engaged to carry some persons to China, was captured on the ocean and placed in prison at Fort Jackson. Transferred to Fort Lafayette, he contracted consumption (tuberculosis), which terminated in his death 13 December 1866, at the home of his father on Eastern Shore, Baldwin Co., Ala. He had lost his wife and child while in the Army. (J. J. GRACE, Eastern Shore, Ala.)

Married, at sunrise February 7th, 1867, by Rev. P. M. GOODWYN, Francis L. MEAD, Esq. to Mrs. Ann Eliza MEAD, all of Terrebonne Parish, La.

No. 6, 23 February 1867, Page 5, Cols. 3 & 4

Obituary - Susan P. GUTHRIE was born 7 September 1840, in the county of Winston, Miss. She graduated in June 1860, from the Masonic Female Institute in Homer. Once a member of the Missionary Baptist Church, she became a member of the M. E. Church, South in 1861. She married W. W. GUTHRIE, of Farmerville, Union Parish, La., in November 1865. (N.D.G., Walnut Hill, Dec. 5th 1866.)

Died, at the residence of her husband near Eutaw on 6 December 1866, Mrs. Minerva E. PATTON, wife of Rev. James E. PATTON, in the 33rd year of her life. (J.W.T., Eutaw, Jan 2nd, 1867.)

Obituary - Mrs. Martha Ann SPENSER, the wife of Dr. George SPENSER, was born in Perry County, Ala., November 18, 1836. (Ed. Note! No date or place of death is given.)

No. 7, 2 March 1867, Page 5, Cols. 4 & 5

Obituary - Robert MORRIS, born in Tennessee 17 March 1817, died in Jefferson City, La., 12 February 1867. (Chas. F. EVENS.)



Died, 4 February 1867, at house of her daughter, Mrs. Dr. THIGPEN, in Many, La., Sister Nancy HAWKINS, of DeSoto Parish, Louisiana, aged 58 years. A native of North Carolina, she came to Alabama, in 1833, and thence to Natchitoches Parish, La., in 1858. She lived there until 1863, when she moved with her son, J. E. HAWKINS, to DeSoto Parish.

Died, 12 February 1867, William Aikin LEAKE, son of Dr. Wm. S. LEAKE. Born in Monroe County, Miss., 28 May 1858, he joined the M. E. Church, South in Washita County, Ark., September 2860. Too young to enter the army, he had remained at home, the protection and support of his family during his father's absence in service of the Confederacy. On the morning of the day of his death, he left home in fine health to convey a load of produce to New Iberia, a distance of five miles. 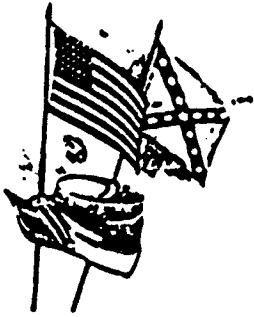

Company "C" of the 18th Louisiana Infantry, Confederate States of America, was known as the Natchitoches Rebels. The muster roll of this unit as of 16 November 1861, is recorded in Notarial Book 63, pages 77 and 78, in Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana.

A paragraph following the listing of the names of the 54 members is signed by J. D. Wood, Captain of the Company, and is addressed to Felix Metoyer. It reads: "Dear Friend. I send a list of all who have been, or are connected with our company, which you will greatly oblige me by having recorded; as it may be of service to some of the members in future - So soon as I have time I will write you a long letter. Until then, believe me as ever sincerely, Your friend. J. D. Wood."

The Medical Department of the above University held its annual commencement exercises, Thursday, in the college building on Common Street.

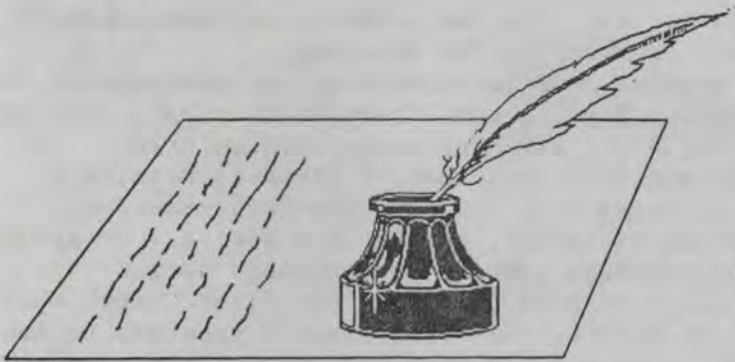

## A LETTER FROM THE REV. A. M. SHAW

A recent edition of The Tree Tracers, quarterly publication of the Southwest Oklahoma Genealogical Society, included a reprint of a letter written in 1911, by Rev. A. M. Shaw, pastor of the Methodist Church in Vinton, Louisiana, to Mrs. Mattie Dickens Avritt, Weatherford, Oklahoma.

The letter contains much information of genealogical value concerning the family of Rev. Shaw, who served as minister of the Belcher Methodist Church in north Caddo Parish, Louisiana during World War II.

His son, Arthur Marvin Shaw, Jr., referred to in the letter, graduated from Hendricks College, Conway, Arkansas, in 1921, and that same year married Edith Wilson, of Yellville, Arkansas. He received his Phd. from Louisiana State University, his doctoral dissertation, a biography of William Preston Johnston, who served as president of both Tulane University, and LSU, being published by The LSU Press in 1953. Shaw died while a member of the faculty of Centenary College, Shreveport, LA., teaching English literature and public speaking.

Edith Wilson Shaw served as hostess at the central Shreveport YWCA on Travis Street, eighteen and one half years, retiring in 1972. She died 25 March 1988, in Shreveport,

Their daughter, Helen, was born in New Madrid, Missouri, while her father was serving as superintendent of schools there. The family later lived in Lake Charles, LA., before moving to Shreveport. Helen received a degree in library science from LSU. She has the distinction of having been the Special Services librarian when the base library was opened in 1943, at Barksdale (LA) Army Air Field. She later served as assistant librarian at C. E. Byrd High School in Shreveport, and opened the library at the Veterans Administration Hospital, when that facility was built in Shreveport. She married lawyer, Vernon W. Woods. They raised three children in Shreveport before moving to Metairie, LA, where he died. Helen Woods now lives in Shreveport.

Dear Friend of Long Ago.

Of the many kind letters that have come to me as the result of the "Mellow Memories", few if any have been so welcome as the one received yesterday from your own hand. Thank you a thousand times for having written it. The memory of your father's kindness to me - boy that I was, treating me with the deference



due to a mature man - your mother's gentleness, the fine man-like friendship between George and myself, and most of all, the very sincere and sure attachment between you and me - all linger as very sacred memories.

Of course, this letter-head answers your question about my continuance in the ministry of Christ. Next October 13, I shall round out my 39th year as a licensed preacher, and next Dec my 37th year as a member of Conference. I have served as pastor at all these places in Arkansas: Arkansas Post; Murfreesboro; Lake Village (twice); Arkansas City (twice); Crossett; Bearden; Warren, Prescott; Dermott; DeWitt and Stuttgart, having held revivals or preached occasional sermons in every considerable town in the southern part of the state. I spent 1905 in Oakland, California as pastor of our First Church there, and 1906 in Bakersville in charge of our Church. From there I returned to Arkansas and remained until after the World War. I have been in Louisiana since November 1919, and have been pastor of Churches at Trout, Oakdale, Mooringsport, Ferriday - and now am in my third year at Vinton. It is a fine little city a few miles from the Gulf Coast, 25 miles West of Lake Charles and 12 miles East of Orange, Texas. Therefore between the Calcasien River at Lake Charles and Sabine river at Orange. We are 36 miles from Port Arthur, 37 from Beumont, 139 from Harrison, all West of us - and New Orleans is 270 miles East of us. Our railroad is the Southern Pacific and we are on the great U. S. "Highway 90", known as the "Old Spanish Trail".

I was, of course, not surprised to hear of your father's and mother's death. I believe my Uncle "Bud Hogue" of Mt. Vernon - who died two years ago - told me when I last saw him in 1924, that your father had finished his course. But the passing of George is more of a shock. Did he live in Little Rock? You referred to your "wonderful family". I think that brings you under obligation to write me at least once more, and tell me all about them. How many children, girls, and boys? Where they are and what they are doing. You see, I really want to know them, even if only at long distance.

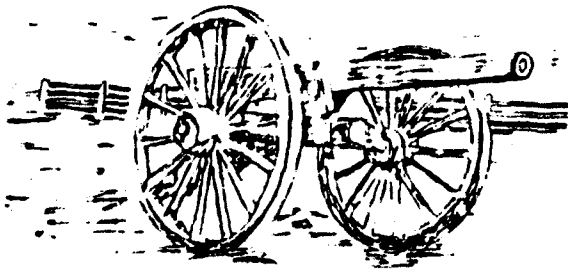
And, since you sent kind regards to my family, I will tell you about them. I married Miss Oregon Collins in Tyro, Lincoln Co., Arkansas, Jan 22, 1896. Marvin, our eldest son, (who is Arthur M. Junior) is 36 years old; married and has a little girl 11 years old. He is associate professor of English in Centenary College, Shreveport, La., where he has served for five years. Edward and Edwin are twins, 33. Edward is an auto mechanic, single and still lives with us. Edwin is married; has a fine little son eight years old, and they live at Kelly, La. Joe, the youngest son, 29, is a preacher in the M.E. Church, and is serving his third year as pastor at DeQuincy, La. He has a wife, two fine little boys and five little girls. DeQuincy is only 30 miles from here.

Eleanor, the only daughter - and youngest child - is 25 and still at home; but she is to be married on June 2, to Royal McGee, Editor of our town paper, the "Southwest Builder". So you know a lot about us now. My children have had a little better deal than I had. Marvin and Joe both are A.B. graduates of Hendrix College at Conway, Ark., and Marvin has his Degree from Peabody College, Nashville, Tenn. Eleanor graduated three years ago from Centenary College, Shreveport. Education failed to "register" with the twins.

God has been good to us - far better than I have deserved. Our children are all living. However, both my wife and I have had many sorrows. My brother died in 1897, my father and stepmother both had died the year before. My wife lost her mother in 1907, and her stepfather this year. Both of us have had many kindred and dear friends cross over within our thirty-seven years of married life. I am sure we begin to look old; but we are still vigorous and young in spirit. She and I expect to visit Arkansas about the middle of June, going to Warren, Gould, Lonoke, Little Rock, and we hope to Mayflower and Conway and Hot Springs. We have made several similar trips since coming to

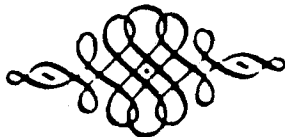

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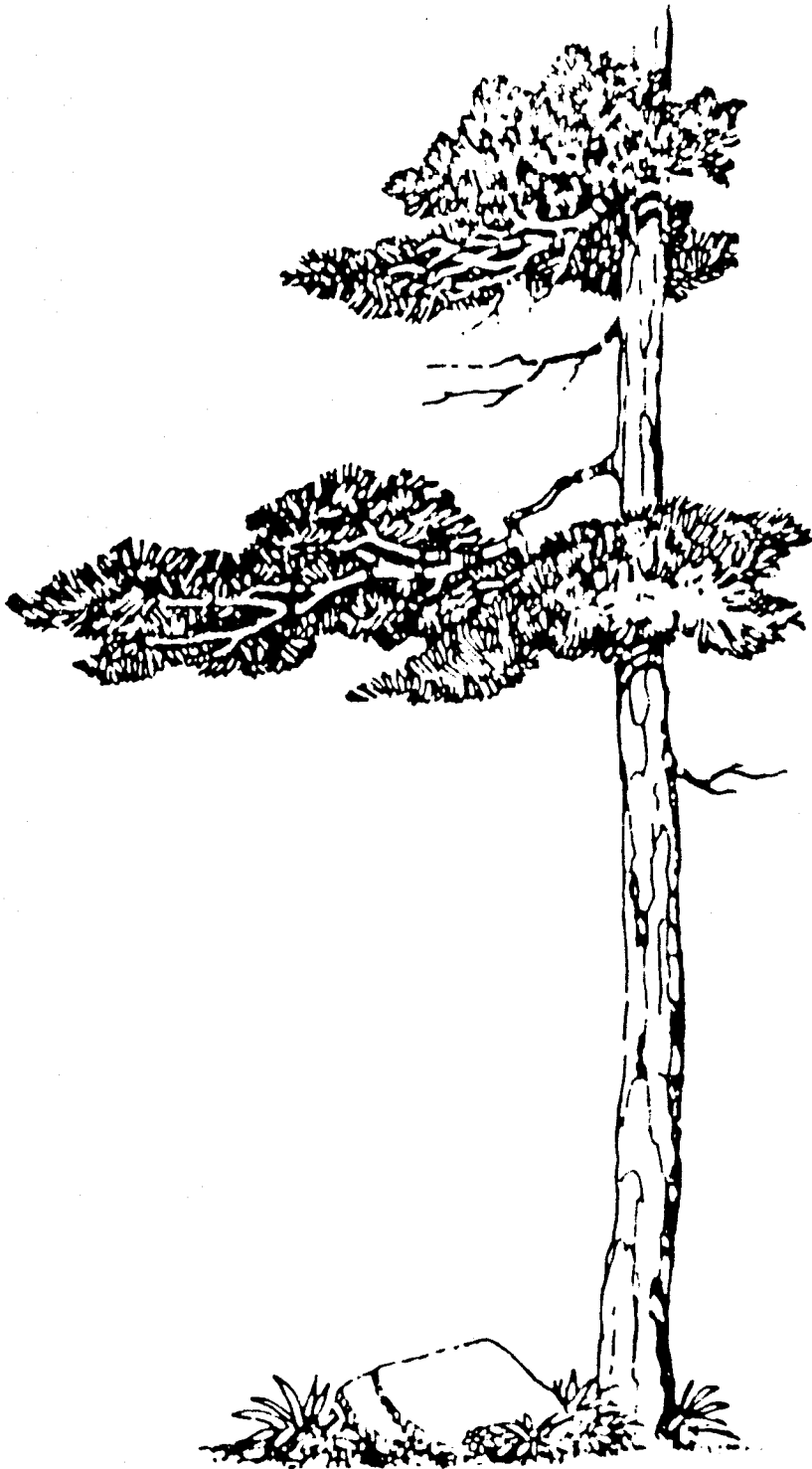
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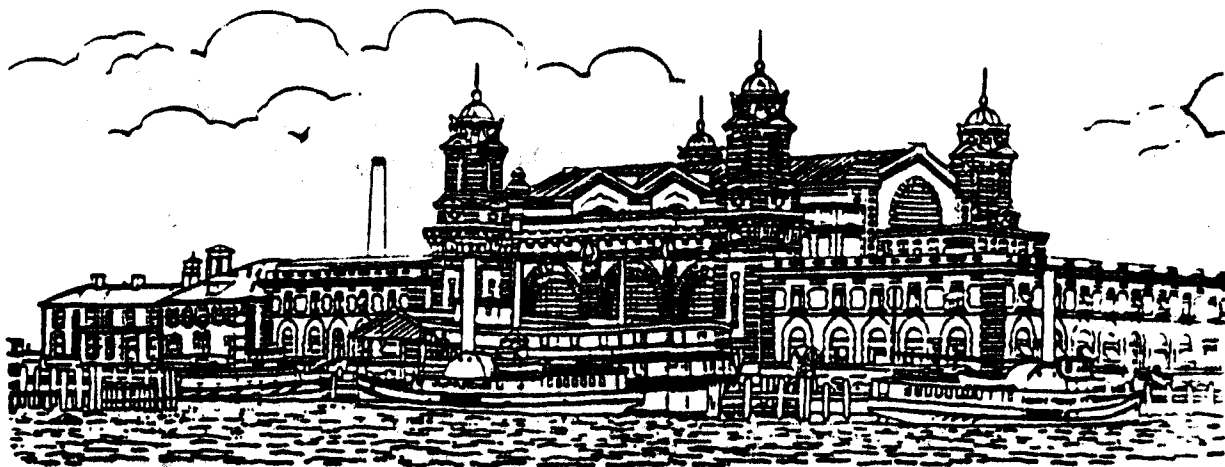
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# FUTURE PLANS FOR ELLIS ISLAND



From 1892 until 1954, most immigrants to America were processed at Ellis Island, New York City. Soon the estimated 100 million Americans whose relatives arrived in the United States at Ellis Island will be able to trace their history instantly at a new computerized genealogical center planned for the restored immigration site.

Genealogists and family searchers want access to the actual arrival records and to that end The Ellis Island Restoration Commission, a private group, has been formed. (Two members of the Commission are Rabbi Malcom H. Stern, a vice president of the Federation of Genealogical Societies, and P. William Philby, compiler of many books on immigration.) It is intended to computerize the passenger lists so that any name will be immediately available. Information differs from list to list, but the full name, age, port of embarkation and arrival are stated, and since the family was treated together, those traveling with parents will be readily seen. A special program being developed will also help visitors whose relatives' names were changed or spelled phonetically by U. S. immigration officials.

It is estimated that \$25 million will be needed for this family history center. It is to be next to the Great Hall in the main building. Materials for it come from the National Archives, the Immigration Research and Naturalization Service and the Temple Balsch Center for Immigration Research at Temple University in Philadelphia. The initial stages of the museum, including the renovated Great Hall, are scheduled to open in the fall of 1989, with the genealogical computer to be ready for use in 1992. Access to these computer records may be made available in other parts of the country.
