Fellow Genealogists:



We are always looking for articles of interest to you to print in the Genie. Family histories, Bible records, cemetery listings, census records, wills, church membership lists, organizational records.







# CONFEDERATE VETERANS BURIED AT SHREVEPORT

During the administration of Mrs. Everett L. Davidson as president of Shreveport Chapter No. 237, United Daughters of the Confederacy, 1969-1971, that organization published an Index To Burial Sites Confederate Veterans at Shreveport, Louisiana, an eleven page pamphlet. Credit for collecting and publishing of these records was given by Mrs. Davidson to the Chapter Historian, Miss Josephine Miller. Other members of the committee were Miss Ada Elizabeth Miller and Mrs. E. Kenneth Nelson.

In January of this year, in a conversation with the editor, Mrs. Davidson granted THE GENIE permission to reprint this information. Copy was furnished by Miss Josephine Miller, one of the early members of the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association. We hope that she would have been pleased with this further publication of her project.

# THE OGDENS AND BLANKS OF UNION COUNTY, ARKANSAS

Recently published by Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association member, Timothy D. Hudson, is a collection of articles chronicling the lives of the Ogden family, one of the earliest families to settle in Union County, Arkansas.

In the introduction to the 83 page booklet, titled "The Ogdens and Blanks of Union County, Arkansas", Mr. Hudson writes the following:

"Rev. Benjamin Ogden moved his family to this area about 1820, long before Arkansas entered the Union as a state and about the time it was made a territory. He and his family were in many ways the typical pioneer American family. They were among the very first white people to clear, farm and settle the southern Arkansas woodlands, although Benjamin was never able to obtain a title to his farmland-he was legally a "squatter", as were all early settlers to regions which had not yet been admitted to the Union. His children and grandchildren participated in fighting in the War of 1812, for Texas' independence from Mexico, and for Southern Independence during the War Between the States. The lives of Benjamin', his son Isaac, his grandson, Isaac Nathaniel, and his great-grandson, William Robert Ogden, extend through 180 years of our country's history: from the general unrest and dissatisfaction of the 1760's, which led to our American Revolution, until the middle of World War II. The last chapter is on the Blanks family that was connected to the Ogdens through marriage of Elizabeth J. Blanks and Isaac Nathaniel Ogden. Besides having numerous descendants in Union County today. this family has many throughout north Louisiana and Texas, besides others scattered all over the country."

A copy of the book has been donated to the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association for review and will be placed in the Genealogy Department of Shreve Memorial Library. 



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### OVER THE EDITOR'S DESK



If you have an ancestor who was born or died at sea on a British vessel between 1864-1920, records may be obtained from: Registrar General, Custom House, Dublin, Ireland. Birth information was recorded if at least one parent was Irish. Another source for births at sea on British vessels, 1586 to present time is St. Dunstan's Parish, London, England.

Under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Act which permits release of data when an individual is deceased, records may be obtained from the Social Security Administration. A copy of the death certificate must accompany the request. Information you will receive will include names of parents, date and exact place of birth, residence, place of employment, and signature of applicant. Another request can be made for a computer printout of all places of employment, showing years. Write Social Security Administration, Box 57, Baltimore, MD 21203.

Bounty Land Warrants were given to all soldiers who served from 1812 through 1856. Nearly all Illinois land was bounty land. Widows were granted 40 acres, privates 80 acres, and on up to as much as 5,000 acres for generals. When ordering bounty land records always ask for the complete record. The National Archives is the main source of that information.

The government hopes to open the Ellis Island Family History Center during the Centennial Celebration of Ellis Island June 1992. The computer will have information on where the immigrants came from, how old they were, who traveled with them, what their destination was, and also what possessions they brought with them.

Identity cards of 130,000 prisoners of the Auschwitz Concentration Camp which once were stored in sealed Soviet Archives have been released and turned over to the Red Cross, the news agency Tass reported. The material was found by Soviet soldiers at the end of the war and shipped to the Soviet Union. Tass said researchers gained access to the volumes about a year and a half ago under President Gorbachev's glasnost policy.

The Western History Collections at the University of Oklahoma is one of our nation's foremost research institutions documenting the history and culture of the North American Indians. The collections have vast holdings in microfilm, books, manuscripts and photographs.

To determine if your ancestor was naturalized, check the 1820, 1830, 1870

and 1900 censuses, whichever applicable, as each has a column dealing with the citizenship status of the individual. Some states also have information available.

For those researching French ancestry, The Services Cultrels Francais, 972 Fifth Avenue, New York, NY 10021, can provide a broshure which includes explanation of French records, suggestions on where to begin one's search in France, a list of three private genealogists in France, names and addresses of six Frenchoriented genealogical societies in the U. S., and the names and addresses of 97 "Archives Departementales" in France. Send a postcard with your name and address.

Because soldiers in state militias did not serve in the Continental Line (federal service) during the Revolutionary War, their records are not held in the National Archives. They can be found, instead, in the archives of the state of enlistment. The Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania, 1300 Locust St., Philadelphia, PA 19107, has many military records for the Mid-Atlantic region, including Maryland. They are for the Revolutionary War and Civil War. Maryland militia records (copies and originals) of the Revolutionary War are held by the Maryland State Archives and the Maryland Historical Society. These are distinct from the Continental Service (Regular Army). The latter are contained in Volume 18 of the published series, <u>Archives of Maryland</u>. The militia records were recently published in Maryland Militia in The Revolutionary War.

You may have heard of people being called "Black Dutch". This terminology was often used to refer to Sephardic Jews who intermarried with Dutch Protestants to escape the inquisition. The Sephardic Jews lived in Spain during the Middle Ages. The "Black" refers to dark or black hair and usually darkened complexions due to their Spanish heritage. These people of Jewish origin moved through Belgium and the Netherlands, eventually becoming Catholic in religion, and then Reformed Dutch. Later some of them migrated to and settled in America.

Looking for a marriage in Virginia? A statewide mandate for registration of marriages by county began in 1853, but ceased in 1896, not to be resumed until 1918.

And speaking of Virginia, a reference to an ancestor as having been born in Virginia between 1781 and 1863, might now mean an entirely different state. That ancestor may have been born in what became today's state of Illinois between 1781-1792; Indiana,1787-1816; Kentucky,1775-1792; Maryland,1775-1792; North Carolina, 1728-1803; Ohio, 1728-1803; Pennsylvania, 1752-1786; Tennessee, 1760-1803; West Virginia, 1769-1863

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
### STOVALL FAMILY REUNION


