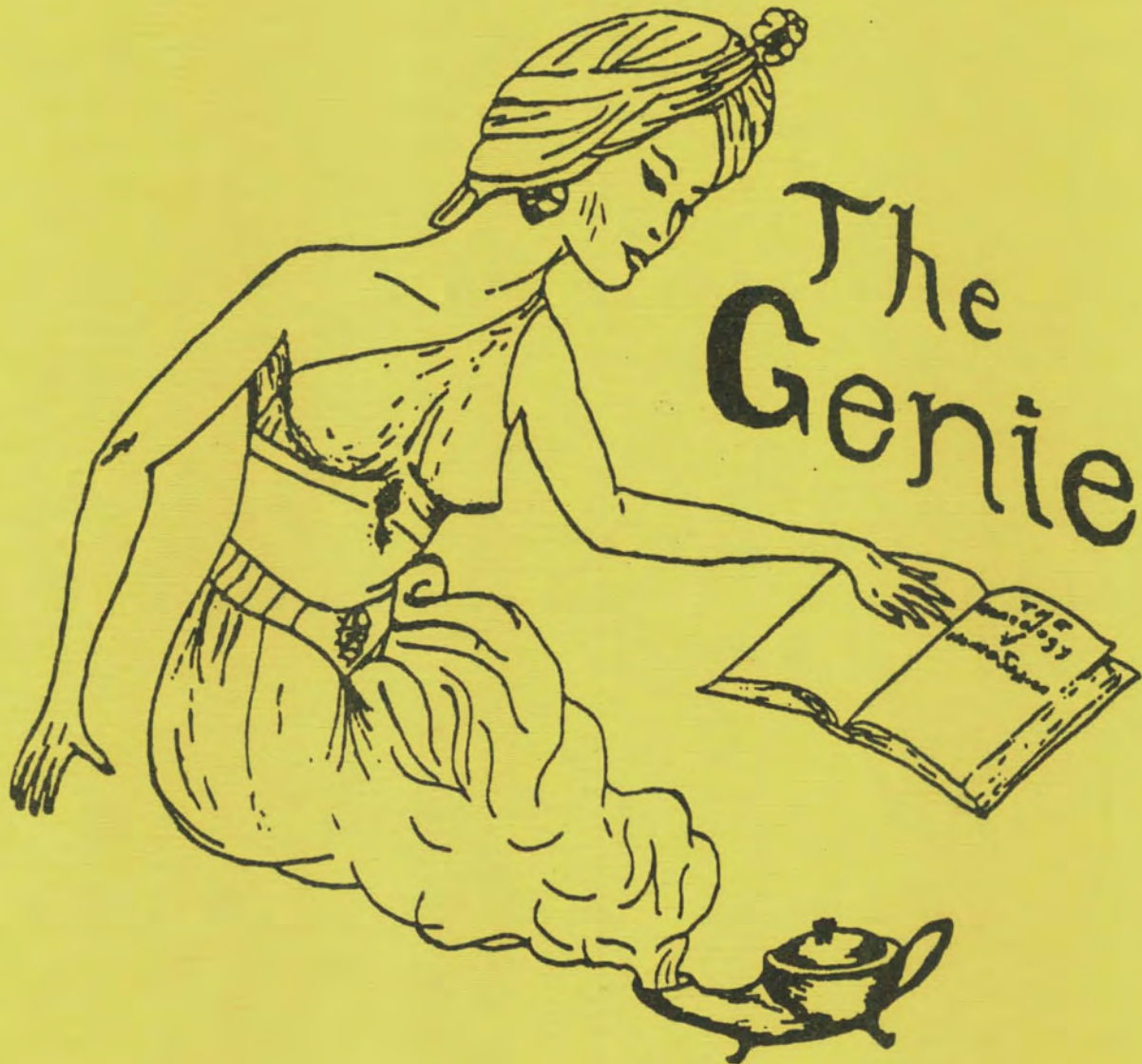

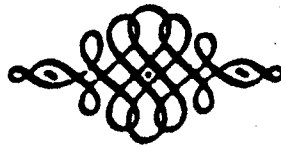

D. R. W. MC IVER'S AND FRIERSON RECORDS FROM SOUTH CAROLINA, ALABAMA, AND KINGSTON, LOUISIANA

D. R. W. McIver, a Baptist minister, having migrated from South Carolina to Alabama, removed to Kingston, DeSoto Parish, Louisiana in February of 1856. Accepting a call to the Mansfield and Evergreen churches, he joined many friends in Louisiana who had originated in Society Hill, South Carolina.

Marriage Records kept by D. R. W. McIver, a letter concerning Dr. McIver written to another minister by his wife, nee' Martha Elizabeth Screven Grant, and a personal journal kept by their daughter, Ida (Mrs. Thomas Clarence Frier-son), have been preserved. They are now in the possession of descendant Charles Moore Hutchinson of Shreveport, Louisiana, to whom The Genie is indebted for having made available this previously unpublished material.

MRS. D. R. W. McIVER'S LETTER CONCERNING DR. McIVER

Rev. W. E. Paxton

Rev and dear Sir

Your Postal requesting I would give you some account of my husbands ministerial life, was received, and answered by Postal. I was absent from home when your communication was received, this with feebleness occasioned by illness has delayed my compliance with your request; and now that I attempt it, I am embarrassed by a feeling of inability to portray in any degree the earnestness and zeal which characterized my husband as a Minister of Christ.

D. R. W. McIver was born in Charleston South Carolina, Decr 8th 1724. His mother, Mrs. Mary Ann McIver was baptized and became a member of the 1st Baptist Church of Charleston in her thirteenth year, and was remarkable for her deep consistant piety: on the death of her husband which occured when the subject of this notice was eighteen months old, she removed to Society Hill So Ca and resided with her Bro, Gen, D. R. Williams, where relieved from domestic cares, she devoted herself to the training and spiritual education of her children, an influence greatly blessed in forming their character for lives of usefulness. Mr. McIver was a graduate of the South Carolina State University of Columbia, after which he became a planter near Society Hill, on the Pee Dee River, and in early life married Miss Caroline Wilds of that place; he was often brought under deep religious impressions, but it was not until his 40th year, that he professed an interest in the atoneing sacrifice of Christ and by Baptism united himself to the Welch Neck Baptist Church of Society Hill, from this time he became an earnest advocate in the cause of the Redeemer, but confined his labors to the colored congregation, which he organized into a Sabbath School; it soon became evident from his exhortations and zeal in the conversation of sinners that his Master was preparing him for a more extended work in His vineyard. The Subject of the ministry was often urged on him by his faithful Pastor Rev James C Furman and the Deacons of the Church, but in return, he urged as a barrier in his way, the want of Theological training. About this time his wife was removed by death to the Home of the Redeemed, she had for years been a consistant member of the Welch Neck B Church and closed her life in the triumphs of Faith leaving six children to his care, this bereavement seemed to increas

his efforts for the Salvation of the spiritual improvement of the colored people, For years he had been anxious to remove to Alabama, in 1838 he was again married to Miss Martha Elizabeth Grant of Georgetown So Ca, and in 1843 removed to Alabama and settled in Carlowville Dallas County and united with the Center Ridge Church, under the care of Rev Jesse Hartwell, by the untiring labors and faithful preaching, Dr Hartwell had established a large working Church, but was soon after Mr. McIvers arrival called to the Presidency of the Howard College of Marion Ala, after which the Church was supplied twice a month by Rev Plat Stout who had recently removed to the neighborhood from Mobile.

Mr. McIver continued his efforts for the benefits of the colored people, aided by the white members of the church; in Sept 1844 the church held a protracted meeting of the great interests after the introductory Sermon by Mr Stout the church met in conference, when D. R. W. McIver was called to ordination without delay, and the following Sabbath appointed for the ordaining service. The Presbytry consisted of Dr Jesse Hartwell, Elders, Plat Stout, Wm Kervin, Devotie, Sessions and Hawthorn. The candidate was examined in the presence of a large congregation; the beginning sermon by Rev. J. Devotie. The charge and presenting the Bible by the Rev Jesse Hartwell, the imposition of hands by the Presbytry, and ordaining prayer by Wm Kervin.

Met in Conference, when the newly ordained candidate was unanimously elected Pastor; he declined the Pastoral Care, but consented to supply the pulpit twice a month in connection with Mr Stout. In Decr 1845 he was again elected Pastor, and he entered upon his duties Jan 1st 1846 and labored with signal success until 1850 when he resigned the care of the church, to arrange for maturing a long cherished wish to remove to La, but when on the eve of leaving he was advised by friends in Mobile to postpone his removal in consequence of the prevalence of cholera in the citys, and on the Rivers he would have to pass over, in the course of the year 1850 he was called to the Pastorate of the Wetumpka, and Pratville Churches near Montgomery Ala, and removed to the former place, here he labored with great zeal and success, these churches in a short time doubled their membership, his Master gave him access to the hearts of the people, not only his own churches, but the Ministers, members, and congregations of other Denominations, and it is probable he would have closed his life in Wetumpka, had it not been for the long cherished wish to reach La, a wish increased by the removal of many friends years before to that State.

In 1856 he resigned the care of the Wetumpka and Pratville Churches and removed to La in Feb of that year; having been before his removal to the State, called to the Pastorate of the Mansfield and Evergreen Churches, he entered upon his duties

had so declined that he was compelled to resign. It was hoped that rest would restore his health, but in vain. After suffering for some time from Acute Rheumatism, he was taken to his reward in the triumph of a living faith. He died, February 10, 1863.

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GENEALOGICAL DATA FROM JOURNAL OF IDA McIVER FRIERSON

Battle of Culloden fought April 16th 1746. The Highlands were in rebellion against George II, espousing the cause of Charles Edward, the pretender, grandson of James II and the last representative of the House of Stuart. Charles had only about 6000 troops and was overwhelmingly defeated by the Duke of Cumberland, Son of the King, George II. The Duke of Cumberland murdered all who fell into his hands as rebels, all who escaped fled the country. The McIvers settled in this vicinity (Darlington So Ca) about 10 years later, about 1756.

Roderick McIver, our Great-Grandfather, came from Scotland in 1756--soon after the battle of Culloden, and settled in Society Hill So Ca. His first wife was Annie Rogerson. Soon after his arrival he married Rachel Edwards, the eldest daughter of Rev. Joshua Edwards. They had 3 children: Evander Roderick, John Edwards and Mary Catherine.

Evander, their son, was born in So Ca May 1734. Married Sarah Kolb, from whom a large and worthy family have descended. I make special mention of Dr. John C. McIver, a son. He was a noble christian gentleman. In his death the Welch Neck Church lost its strongest pillar.

The second son of Roderick McIver, John Edwards (my grandfather) married Mary Ann Williams of Charleston So Ca July 3rd 1788. Their children were: Ann Eliza, born May 3rd 1789, John Evander born Feb 28, 1791, Mary Katherine, born March 5, 1793, David Rogerson Williams (My father) born Dec 8th 1797 in the City of Charleston So Ca., and Thomas Edwards (Alison McIver's grandfather) July 26th 1797 and Alexander Markland, born Feb 21st 1799.

HOW TO OBTAIN HOMESTEAD PAPERS

1. Secure the legal description of the land which includes the township, range, section, and legal subdivision from the recorder of the county in which the land is located.
2. Send this description to the Bureau of Land Management office for the state in question, requesting a copy of the Patent. There is a charge for the copy of the Patent. (See addresses below)
3. To obtain the Homestead papers write the National Archives and Records Service, 8th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20408. Include the name of the person filing the patent, legal description of the land, patent number, date of patent, and the land office of issuance. When the record is found, they will bill you and upon receipt of your payment, they will send the papers. These papers often include a copy of a naturalization record, names of witnesses to the homestead proofs, occupation, address, and other interesting information.

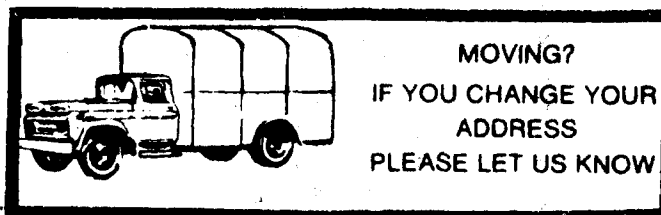

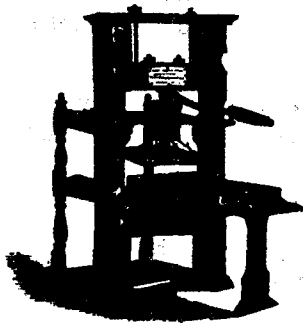

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EARLY NEWSPAPERS OF BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA

Journalism in this parish dates back nearly a quarter of a century ago. The BOSSIER TIMES, Wm. C. Mitchell & Ed. A. Lowry, editors and proprietors, appeared on Saturday, September 17, 1857. It was a four page paper, with six columns on a page; the columns being a fraction narrower than these, the paper was smaller than the present BANNER. The press and material on which the TIMES was printed was brought over from Mansfield in a wagon, being formerly used by the DeSoto Columbian. The type was old and much worn, but the TIMES made a neat appearance. It was issued in the Police Jury room of the present Court house.

On April 24, 1858, W. C. Mitchell disposed of his interest to Robt. J. Looney, Esq., and the paper was issued by Looney & Lowry, until the following August 6th, when Mr. Looney disposed of his interest to Mr. Lowry. In the next month, September 3, 1858, Lowry disposed of the TIMES to his original partner, W. C. Mitchell.

In a few weeks the first addition of material was made by the importation from Shreveport of some "long primer" type, which had been used in the publication of the diminutive CADDO GAZETTE, JR., by the two "devils" in the CADDO GAZETTE office, W. H. and J. M. Scanland.

On June 17, 1859, the TIMES suspended. On Friday, July 1, 1859, from the TIMES material, the first number of THE BOSSIER BANNER was issued, by its present editor, who, then in his "teens" had been a type-setter in the TIMES office since August, 1857. J.A.W. Lowry, the present Prosecuting Attorney for this District, at that time filled the highly important and necessary position of "devil".

In a transfer sale, Messrs. A.A. Abney, T.M. & B.F. Fort, became owners of the TIMES material. The present editor of THE BANNER then not being well up in the world's finances, leased the material, paying for its use half of the net proceeds of THE BOSSIER BANNER, which succeeded the TIMES. In a few months the editor raised the where-with and purchased the establishment, and has been the sole proprietor ever since.

In the first issue of THE BANNER the editor acknowledged the receipt of a bottle of blackberry cordial from a fair lady friend, and announced the arrival of the village Church bell, which still swings in the belfry of that "good old Church" building and calls us to the house of God. A "free fish fry" was announced for the then "ga-lorious" 4th of July, to take place at Inabinett's bluff. The following named gentlemen were announced as candidates: For Sheriff—John G. Allen, Chas. C. Nowell, Philo Alden, Russell Jones, and D. B. Doyle; for Clerk—John N. West and A. A. Abney; For Assessor—R. M. Morris, John I. B. Busby,

J. A. Inabinett, N. R. Blackwell, J. Marion Doyle, Benj. S. Edwards and W. S. Stroud. The successful candidates were, Messrs. Alden, Abney and Doyle. It also contained a numerously signed card requesting G. W. Sentell, Esq., to become a candidate for Representative in the Legislature; but he declined.

On April 2, 1862, T. M. Fort, Esq., was announced as editor, the former editor having departed for the "front", for "Yankees" were abroad in the land in those days.

Owing to the scarcity of printing paper and ink, THE BANNER was suspended on September 27, 1862, until "grim-visaged war" should "smoothe her wrinkled front".

On July 16, 1865, THE BANNER was revived by its present proprietor. On the 3d of the following month, owing to what was considered a "treasonable" article, the office was closed by the unwarranted authority of Col. Foley, of the 61st colored infantry, stationed at Minden. The order was executed by Capt. Riggs, commanding a detachment at this place, and a colored soldier was stationed as sentinel in charge of the office. But the order was soon countermanded, and THE BANNER appeared on its usual publication day, and has so continued to appear ever since—thanks to good fortune and an appreciative public.

On the 9th of September, 1875, THE BANNER began using the ready printed sheets, or "patent outsides", and still uses them.

From the 15th of November, 1875, to the 17th of March, 1876, THE BANNER, containing five columns to the page, was issued twice a week.

Of the original material of the DE SOTO COLUMBIAN and TIMES offices, there only remains in this office the old Washington hand-press, a "font" of defaced job-type, and a few stray advertising "cuts", some of which were used to advertise runaway slaves, representing a darkey with a bundle on the end of a stick extended over over his shoulder and making for the swamp.

In October, 1878, about half of THE BANNER material was taken over to Minden, to be used in the publication of THE WEBSTER TRIBUNE. The type on which the TRIBUNE is now printed is comparatively new; for, in a few weeks the old type was sold to a foundry, and the paper appeared enlarged. The press and marble imposing stone are new, being purchased by the editor of the BANNER in Oct. 1878, of the St. Louis Type Foundry. In a few months, new chases, column rules, news dashes, and other material, was added by the then publisher, so that now the TRIBUNE material is really new. And of the old DE SOTO COLUMBIAN and BOSSIER TIMES only a few remnants remain, including the "Old hand press" on which THE BANNER is still printed.

In order to correct a false impression which prevailed in Minden to the effect that certain gentlemen of that place owned the TRIBUNE, we will state: The entire establishment was owned by the editor of this paper. It was afterward sold to the then editor, who, after a reign of about 15 long months, sold it to its present editor and proprietor, S. M. McCranie, Esq.

There is a dark period in the history of the Old World, styled The Middle Ages, and there is also a dark period in the history of Bossier Journalism. The latter began in November, 1875. B. C. White, of Shreveport, official printer of Caddo, was appointed official printer for this parish, under the infamous Radical government. B. C. White sub-let to Dr. J. B. Walthall the printing for Bossier, and he started the Bossier Sentinel. The legality of the sub appointment was questioned, and the matter came up before the Parish Court, Hon. B. F. Fort, presiding. His Honor decided that White could not sub-let or transfer any portion of his contract, and, consequently, there was then no official journal in Bossier. This bursted the SENTINEL, for a while, and THE BANNER received the

the public printing until the following April, 1876, when the SENTINEL started up again, Dr. Walthall having received the printing contract in his own name. On the 1st of January, 1877, the statute repealing the odious "Printing Law" took effect. The SENTINEL lingered until about December, 1878, when it died a natural and easy death.

The SENTINEL material was brought over from Minden, where it was used in the publication of the NORTH LOUISIANA INDEX, in, 1873, and the MINDEN HERALD, in 1874. The latter was published by Dr. Walthall. So, it will be seen that Minden and Bellevue have exchanged the courtesy of setting up papers for the other in turn.

The press on which the HERALD, INDEX, and SENTINEL, were printed, was, we understand, made at Mr. Chris. Chaffe's blacksmith shop, at Minden. The press and material on which the SENTINEL was printed was taken away by Dr. Walthall, probably to his home in Claiborne.

SEAMAN'S PROTECTION CERTIFICATES ISSUED 1796-1897

If your American ancestor went to sea in the 1800's he may have applied for a Seaman's Protection Certificate to protect him from impressment by Great Britain and other foreign powers. The certificate program lasted from 1796 to 1897. The applicant presented proof of his citizenship and paid a fee of twenty-five cents to obtain a certificate that he then carried with him. The application was preserved at the office of the collector of customs where he applied, but every three months the collector sent a list of the seamen to the Secretary of State in Washington, abstracting each seaman's age, birthplace, height, complexion, and hair color. Workers compiled an index of all of these quarterly abstracts. You may write to the Civil Archives Division, National Archives and Records, Washington, D. C. 20408. You are then on your own to find the original document in a local repository or a Regional Branch of the National Archives.


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JASPER RANDOLPH "OLD AND WORN OUT" AT 105

Several years ago Bill Randolph obtained a certificate of death from the Tennessee Department of Public Health for Jasper Randolph, brother of his great grandfather, Isaac Randolph. Jasper and Isaac were sons of Reuben Randolph and his wife, Sarah Brumbelough, of Whyte and Cumberland County, Virginia.

Jasper Randolph died in Cumberland County, Tennessee, having lived past his 105th birthday. Note that the doctor certifies that he "saw this man once about a month before he died" and gives the principal cause of death as "old and worn out, everything about him worn out; he was more than 100 yrs. old." Jasper died 18 June 1936. Information on this certificate had been provided by his nephew, T. S. Randolph.

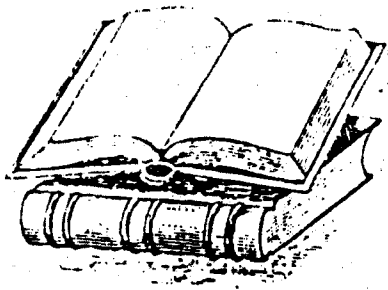

MISSISSIPPI PIONEERS JAMES CALHOUN WILLIAMS AND SHELTON BROTHERS

(The following are two chapters from a book of family history being compiled by an Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association member, Merrill C. Williams, 550 North Fifth Street, La Puente, California 91744. James C. Williams, her grandfather, married Frances F. Fortson at Shreveport, Louisiana, 23 November 1890.)

FROM YALOBUSHA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

James Calhoun Williams was born on the Yalobusha County, Mississippi (present Grenada County) Plantation of his father, J. H. Williams, in 1852. He was his mother's second son. About a year after the Civil War, in which his Dad was murdered by foraging yankee troops who shot him down as he, a wounded veteran, tried to stop them from burning his cotton mill (gin), he was bitter. When the negro sheriff of the county came searching for him because of "trouble" he had caused, James was waiting outside of the house. When the sheriff refused to believe he was not "at home" he pushed Mrs. Williams aside and tried to enter the house. It was then that James stepped out and shot the sheriff. It is claimed by one grandson that he also shot several deputies during this episode.

Forced to leave the county and the state, he rode to Texas and made his way to the frontier. There he became a cowboy, making drives up the Western Trail to the railheads, to send cattle east from Kansas. He also joined the Texas Rangers for a hitch. Before he left Texas, he was carrying eight bullets in his body from wounds he had received. During the 1880's he acquired a ranch in Llano County. Out west of Austin in the "Hill Country" along the Llano River "J. C." established squatter's rights. Despite the "Panic of 1873" that had lowered the price of cattle drastically from \$30 per head price once reached and the invention of Glidden's barbed wire in 1884, it took the winter of 1886-87, it's record cold and loss of cattle throughout the west, to slow the hopes of western ranchers. All this, coupled with the coming of the Texas and Pacific and other Railroads, signaled the end of the Texas Frontier.

James, who had acquired the nickname of "Mule" because of his 6'6" size, his strength and his stubbornness, left his ranch in early 1889. He rode north to the Oklahoma Territory to join the first Oklahoma Land Rush. Although he was the third to arrive at the homestead area, he found the choice property that he had planned to acquire had been claimed by "Sooners". They were the gun toting groups that had driven out the original "Sooners" to get the best homesteads and who had their 160 acres well fortified.

While still in Oklahoma, James received word that his ranch had been allowed to be sold for taxes and bought by his own caretaker. "J. C." then made his way south to Shreveport, Louisiana, where he met a twenty-four year old lady, who was a native of Texas, Frances F. Fortson. On the twenty-third day of November in 1890, they were married. The minister who performed the ceremony was E. R. Fortson. He was probably a member of Fannie's family. We know that this was Fannie's first marriage, but it may have been James' second

wedding. The family has a gold wedding ring inscribed "JCW-HBH". It is believed that the "HBH" stands for Helen B. Hightower. The Williams-Fortson first offspring, Bessie Eola, was born on August 29, 1893. Exactly two years later, their son, Merrill Calhoun, was born.

Another recession hit the United States in 1893. By the time it had run its course, in 1896, James and Fannie had decided to move to Port Gibson, Mississippi. It was some time shortly after Merrill was born that they boarded the Yazoo and Mississippi Valley Railroad Train and took a trip via Vicksburg to their new home. It was in Port Gibson they were listed in the census of 1900.

In Port Gibson, "J. C." went into the livestock business, buying and selling horses, mules and cattle. He, and later, Merrill (known to his father as "Bud") also "broke" horses that were for sale. In the thirties, the family knew Ben Jordan in Pattison, who worked for James. Mr. Williams became a business partner with Henry Marx. Mr. Marx had his Livery Stable burned at Port Gibson in November of 1898. In 1903, Marx and Williams shipped a carload of cattle to Cuba to help feed the occupation troops after the Spanish American War.

In August of 1906, Fannie Williams passed away. She was buried in the church cemetery in the east part of town. Their daughter, Bess, then thirteen, was sent to boarding school. James and "Bud" batched it while working and schooling in Port Gibson.

On May 24, 1909, James married Abigail Mildred Marler of Barland and the Sarepta Community. This lady would be later his grandchildren's Great Aunt Abbie after his son married Willie May Marler. She was then 37 years old. She had stayed with her mother, Mary Ann Marler, at the Old Marler Place until her death at the age of 80 in 1907. It was at the "Old Place" that the new Williams family made their homes. James died in 1925, leaving Abigail quite "well off". He was buried in the Sarepta Cemetery and "Aunt Abbie" had a double tombstone erected so that she could rest beside him. She lost most of her money in the 1929 stock market crash, having "bought cotton" on advice from relatives. During the 1930's she lived at Shaw, Mississippi. She still carried her money with her in a small lard cann at all times. Abigail Williams died in 1951. She was 80 years old.

FROM 18TH CENTURY KENTUCKY

About 1806, in search of good bear hunting grounds, two Shelton brothers, Tom and John came down the Mississippi River from their Kentucky birthplace. In Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana, John met "Belle" from Paris, France. Her full name was Isabella Dominguez Burnell. John decided to stay in the South. He courted "Polly" and in 1807, they were married. They settled down on a plantation that became known as the Old Shelton Place. On Christmas Day in 1808, John Shelton II, their only child, was born. Because of his mother's heritage he was to become known as "The Little Frenchman", the "little" being added because he was a very large man. John Shelton I died when his son was quite young. "Polly" Burnell married Mr. O'Neal, who helped her raise John, along with their children. In the census of 1860 and 1880, John II has his birthstate listed as Mississippi, but he grew up in Louisiana. Some say he was at one time Secretary of State for Louisiana. It is also said that he was a friend of Henry Clay. Perhaps this occurred during his later years in Mississippi, when he became a horse lover and made trips to Kentucky to buy and sell.

Young John married Mary "Polly" Sides in 1829, and a year later they

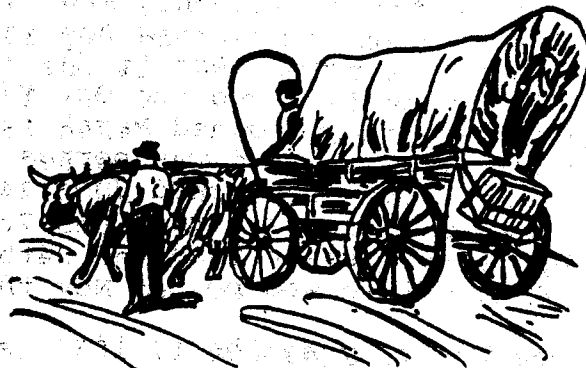
they were blessed with a child, Susan. While Susan was small "Polly" died in a yellow fever outbreak. In 1833, he decided to take his daughter to Kentucky in order to escape the calamity. With his negro slave they went a little east and then north into Mississippi. When they reached Copiah County, they stopped to visit an old acquaintance from Louisiana, Elbert Ferguson. He was then owner of a plantation at Allen, Mississippi, that had a large, two story mansion with slave quarters set behind. Although the mansion burned in later years, it was a landmark on Highway 28 for decades. Elbert, who was a son of Isham Ferguson- another friend of John's, invited him to stay overnight. Soon they struck a bargain and John was hired to oversee the plantation's slaves. In about a year he and Elbert's sister, Rebecca, were married. After their 1834 marriage, John and Rebecca had a beautifully landscaped contemporary home built at Burnell. It had a popular center hall dividing the wings and the traditional veranda. Inasmuch as another Mississippi community had claimed the Shelton name, John chose the maiden name of his mother. That is why you will find the Shelton home and the Shelton Family Cemetery at Burnell, Mississippi. Before she died on October 1, 1844, Rebecca presented John with four heirs, Amanda, Mary Evelyn, Louis and Frances Ann. About 1842, Susan was adopted by grandmother and at the age of twelve went with her to the Sides Farm in Newton County, Mississippi. There she later married Mr. Simmons and they raised a large family- nine children.

About two years after John put his second wife, Rebecca to rest in Ferguson Cemetery, he met Martha Starnes. She was born in Marion County and was under five years of age when her father, Moses, brought the family to Copiah County. She was twenty-one and John was thirty-seven years of age when they were married on June 6, 1846. In the next twenty years, Martha bore him another family of nine children. They were: John Wesley, Nancy G., China, James "Fayette", Virginia Elmer, Moses, Armildia, Julia C., and Burnell I.

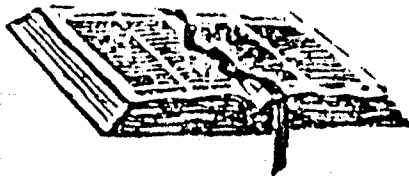
The Shelton family helped organize the Brandywine Methodist Church. The greater family hopes to relocate the church at Burnell in the near future. There was a private school at Burnell. John acquired hundreds of acres of land and was a large slaveholder before the Civil War. Many of his slaves elected to stay on the plantation after they were freed. For many years, there was a Burnell Post Office at the Shelton Home Place.

After the "Seven Cedars" were planted at the dedication of the Shelton Cemetery in the fall of 1880, Maud, John's granddaughter, was the first of the family buried there. Then John Shelton II planted a post on the spot where he wished to be buried. On April 21, 1881, the "Little Frenchman" made his last trip from his Burnell home to Shelton Cemetery. In 1889, his wife, Martha, was laid beside him.

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PICTURES OF CIVIL WAR VETERANS

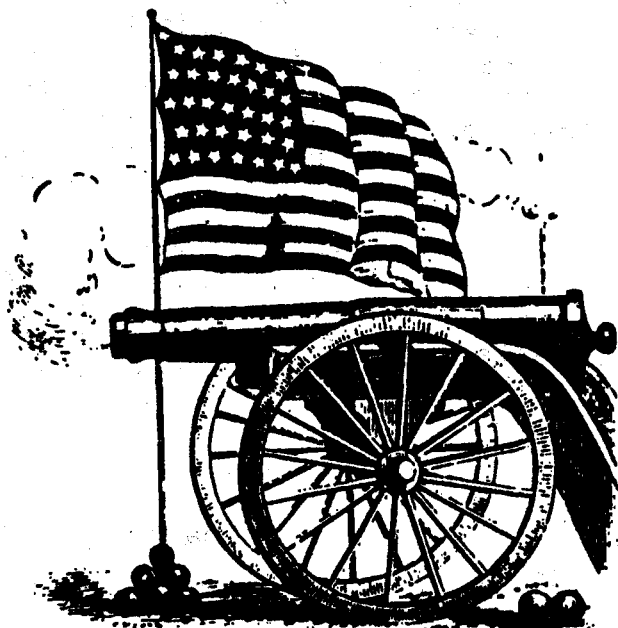

The Bistineau Cemetery at Heflin in Webster Parish, Louisiana is located six miles north of Ringgold. At Louisiana Highway #7 turn right onto Webster Parish Road #192 for one-half mile, then turn left onto Webster Parish #196 for two-tenths of a mile.

Listings begin at the southwest gate outside of the inter half-circle road within the cemetery.

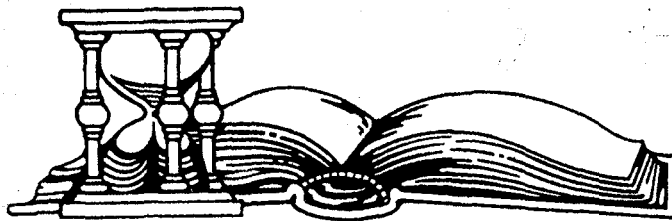

CONFEDERATE CAPT. HILARY HAM'S LETTERS HOME

Contributed by Timothy D. Hudson

The following letters and affidavits were written between 1914 and 1921, pertaining to the Confederate Pension application of Mrs. Samantha Elvyann Ham, widow of Captain Hillory Herbert Ham of Union Parish, Louisiana. They are interesting because they give some insight to the war situation in Union Parish. In spite of the statements of a number of old veterans, she was not allowed the pension, since Captain Ham resigned in mid-1862.

Hillory Herbert Ham (Sr.) was born c1828 in Butler County, Alabama, the son of William and Clarenda Seale Ham. His family lived in Lowndes County between 1830 and 1837, when they moved to the part of northern Ouachita Parish that became Union in 1839. They were a wealthy family, owning a large plantation and many slaves. Hillory married Isabella Ann Robinson on 9 Jan 1851, and after her death on 28 May 1860, he married Samantha Elvyann Scarborough, on 15 Nov 1860. After the war, Hillory lost all of his property he had accumulated in the ten years prior to the war, became an alcoholic, was cruel to his wife, and finally left her and his children in 1874. They were divorced on 18 Mar 1876. He died on 12 Apr 1889, in Union Parish. In spite of their divorce, Hillory's widow continued to use his name, and applied for a pension first on 8 Dec 1909, and later on 30 Aug 1920. Her application was rejected both times due to "Not sufficient service." They said that he quit the service to go home and manage his own affairs, and all such men's applications were rejected. They claimed he took advantage of the Act of the Confederate Congress under the twenty negro law, to quit the Army and go home. Samantha died on 18 Apr 1922, only three months after her application was finally rejected by the Louisiana Pension Board.

Ham, her husband did make up and carry a Company out of Union Parish, La to Camp Moore, La and resigned his Co., which joined the 17 Louisiana Reg. coming home and him & his father having a large pack of negro dogs. His staying at home, made large crops, and quelled the negro's down untill after the war. And he Mr. Ham was ardenant worker for the Confederate Cause untill the surrender of 1865 and our Camp Sid Griffen, No. 379. prays before your honorable body that his widow should be reperesented and get pension from your honorable board.

I was parole prisner went in 3 Parole Camps one at Vienna one at Minden one at Pineville and remained untill the End at Mansfield La.

Ham was Kept Here by the Commander of Post and was a patriotic man and So was all the Hams. on one occasion they Caught one Negro his name was Joe belonged to Carson and Bayless who Robed my Father of some money and there was a white man in it and I could give his name. The Hams S. C. Lee George Kilgore Sen the Father of Judge G. A. Killgore I Suppose in Baton Rouge and others was Quite a help to the Soldiers wives during the War. Mrs. H. H. Ham is one of the old timers that went through the fearful war. She is not of the new Issue and she is old and needy and her boys are poor men.

I hope your Hon Board will consider her claim.

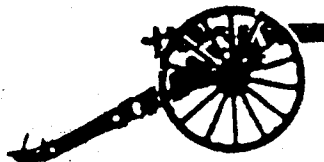

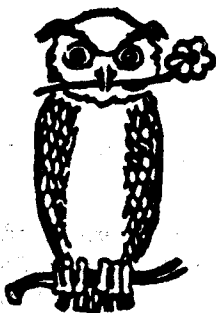

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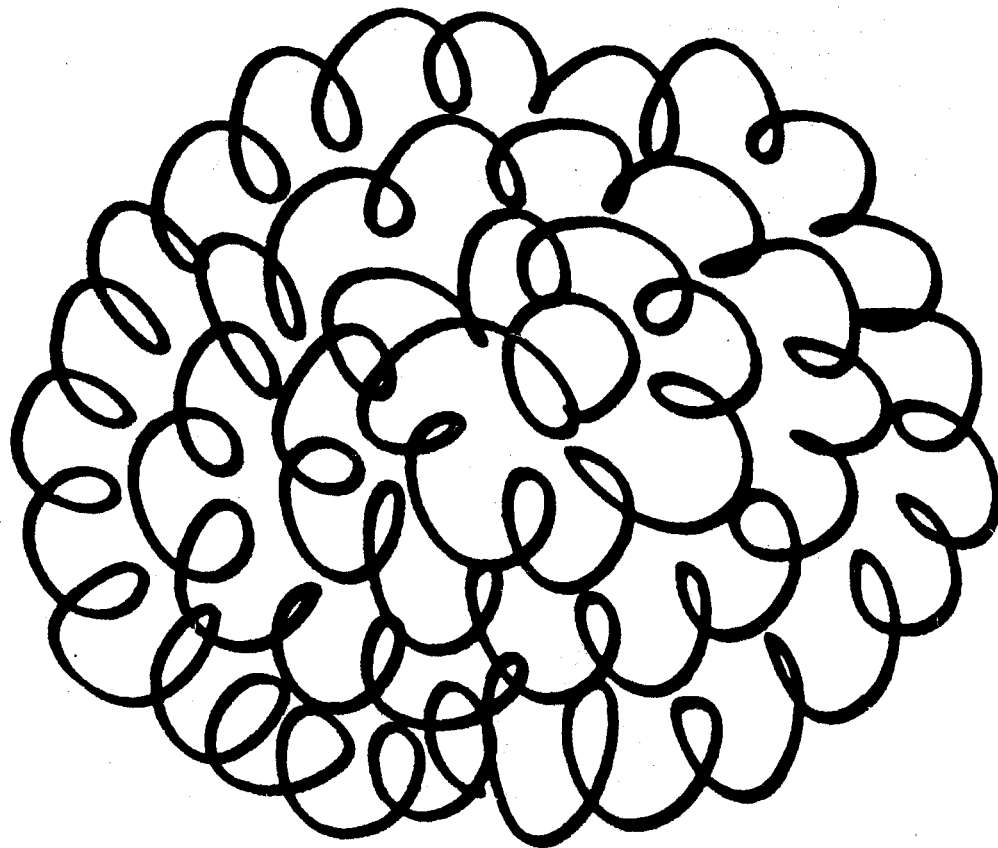
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THE FAMILY TREE



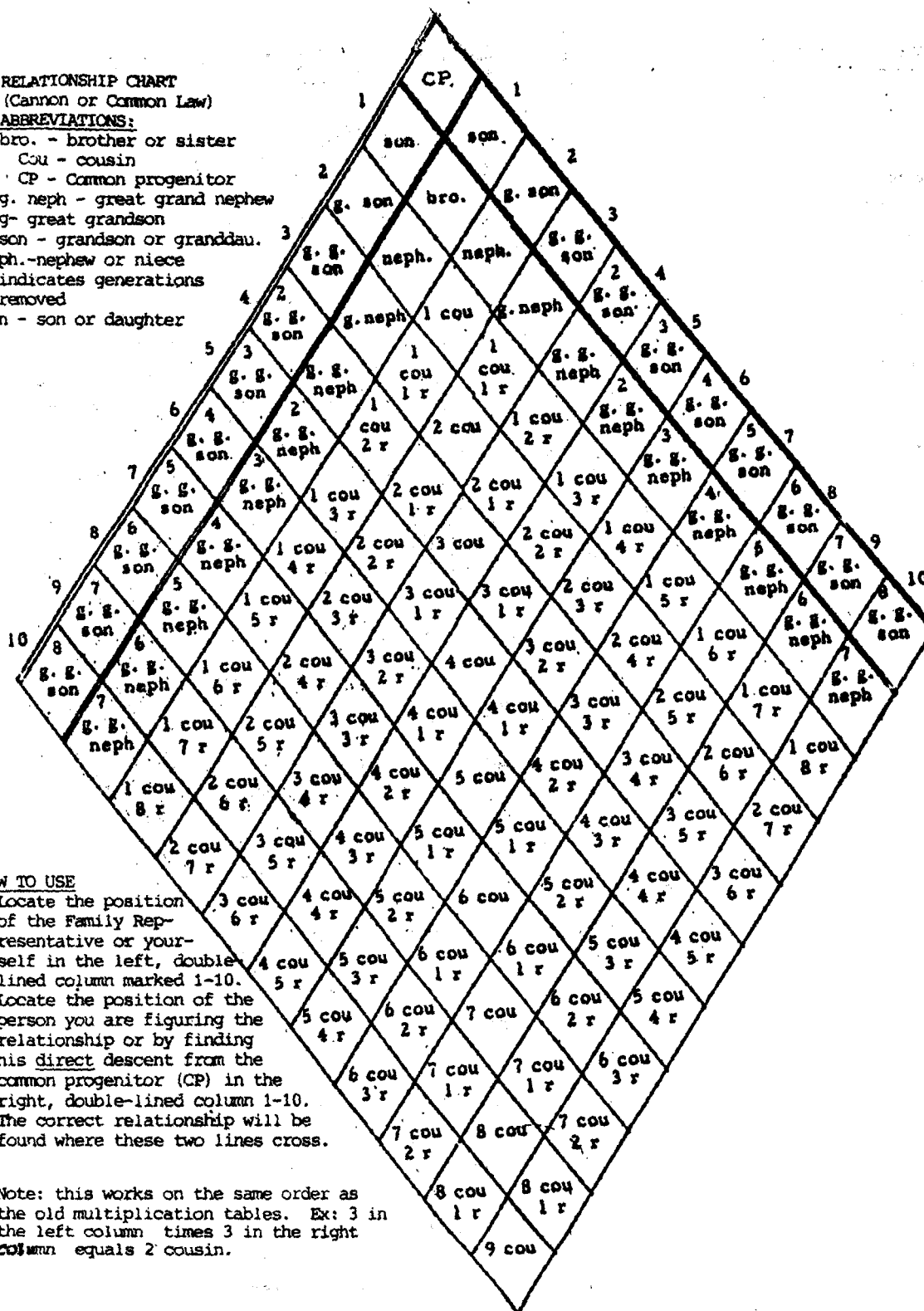
I think that I shall never see,

HOW TO USE

Locate the position of the Family Representative or yourself in the left, double-lined column marked 1-10. Locate the position of the person you are figuring the relationship or by finding his direct descent from the common progenitor (CP) in the right, double-lined column 1-10. The correct relationship will be found where these two lines cross.

Note: this works on the same order as the old multiplication tables. Ex: 3 in the left column times 3 in the right column equals 2 cousin.
