CORPORATE BYLAWS OF THE ARK-LA-TEX GENEALOGICAL ASSOCIATION, INC.

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the Association shall be the ARK-LA-TEX GENEALOGICAL ASSOCIATION, INC (hereinafter called the Association).

ARTICLE II - SEAL AND INSIGNIA

- Section 1. The Seal of the Association shall be as specified in the Articles of Incorporation. The design of the Seal shall be as proposed by the Board of Directors, and approved by the membership. The Seal shall reflect the Founding Date of December 10, 1955, and the Charter Date of January 11, 1971. The Seal shall be shown on all official correspondence and publications of the Association.
- Section 2. The Insignia of the Association shall be the device specified in the Articles of Incorporation. The design and use of the Insignia shall be as proposed by the Board of Directors, and as approved by the membership.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

- Section 1. The Association shall be operated as a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Louisiana. Expenditure of Association funds shall in no way monitarily benefit any member of the Association.
- Section 2. The purpose and objectives of this Association are as follows:
- a. To collect and make available for use of its members, and others, genealogical and historical materials.
 - b. To inculcate and promote an interest in research of family histories.
- c. To assist Association members in their efforts at research of family histories.
- d. To locate public and private records, and endeavor to preserve and/or copy them so they may be available for research.
- e. To conduct educational programs which will benefit members of the Association, and of others who may be interested in genealogy.
- f. To solicit donations of publications and documents which will then be given to the Genealogy Department of the Shreve Memorial Library.
- g. To budget funds on a recurring basis for the purchase of materials intended to enhance the resources of the Genealogy Department of the Shreve Memorial Library.
 - h. To publish genealogical material on a regular basis.
- i. To accept and properly use property and monies donated to the Association.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Any individual or institution having a sincere interest in promoting the objectives of this Association is eligible for membership, subject to such limitations as the Board of Directors may propose and the membership may impose.
- Section 2. The following classifications of membership are established:
- a. Single. A Single Member is an individual whose dues are currently paid and who complies with the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws.
- 1. A Single Member shall be eligible to vote on all regular business of the Association, and in the election of officers.
- 2. A Single Member must be present at a meeting of the Association to cast his/her ballot. There shall be no Proxy votes or votes by mail.
- 3. A Single Member shall hold only one membership, and it shall not be sold or traded.
 - 4. A Single Member may resign from membership in the Association.
- b. Joint. A Joint Membership may be held by a married couple residing at the same mail address upon payment of annual dues as specified by the Board of Directors. Only one copy of Association publications will be mailed to a Joint Membership. Each member of a Joint Membership shall have the same privileges or limitations as a Single Member.
- c. Institutional. An Institutional Member is an organization whose dues are currently paid and who complies with the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws. This category of membership does not have the privilege of voting on Association business or officers.
- c. Sponsoring. A Sponsoring Member is an individual or institution who desires to further the objectives of the Association by contributing monies for that purpose. This category of membership does not have the privilege of voting on Association business or officers.
- d. Life. A Single Member may become a Life Member by payment of the amount designated in Article V. Payment of this amount shall exempt the Life Member from further payment of dues. A Life Member continues to have all the privileges of a Single Member.
- e. Honorary. An Honorary Membership may be granted to an individual who has contributed something significantly beneficial to genealogy in general or to the Association in particular. An Honorary Membership may be conferred with or without full membership privileges, and shall be conferred without payment of dues or fees. Granting of an Honorary Membership shall require the 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors followed by a 2/3 approving vote of the membership.
- Section 3. Any conduct by a member which is deemed detrimental to the Association shall be referred to the Board of Directors for investigation.

Should the investigation by the Board of Directors sustain the allegation, the accused member shall be notified of the allegation and invited to appear before the Board of Directors in a hearing. Following such a hearing, or if the accused should refuse to attend such a hearing, the Board of Directors may by 2/3 vote, by secret ballot, recommend suspension or expulsion of the individual. Such recommendation shall be submitted to the membership at the next regular meeting of the Association. The membership by 2/3 vote, by secret ballot, may approve the recommended action. Should suspension or expulsion be approved, it shall become effective immediately and the person notified in writing of the action.

ARTICLE V - DUES AND FEES

- Section 1. Annual dues are payable in advance for the calendar year January 1 through December 31.
- a. Single Members shall pay annual dues as set by the Board of Directors.
 - b. Joint Members shall pay annual dues as set by the Board of Directors.
- c. Institutional Members shall pay annual dues as set by the Board of Directors.
- d. Sponsoring Members shall pay annual dues as set by the Board of Directors.
 - d. Life Memberships shall be as follows:
 - 1. Age 45 and below---12 X the rate for a Single Membership.
 - 2. Age 46 to 55---10 X the rate for a Single Membership.
 - 3. Age 56 to 60---8 X the rate for a Single Membership.
 - 4. Age 61 and up 6 X the rate for a Single Membership.
- Section 2. Dues shall be due and payable to the Treasurer by January 1 of each year. Dues not received by March 1 shall result in forfeiture of membership.
- Section 3. Special assessments shall not be levied.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

- Section 1. Qualifications for Office
- a. A Single, Joint or Life member in good standing for at least six months, who regularly attends meetings, and who resides within commuting distance of the meeting place is eligible for elective office. Under the same rules an Honorary Member who has full privileges conferred may hold elective office.
- Section 2. Elective officers shall be: President; First Vice-president;

Second Vice-president; Treasurer, Recording Secretary; Corresponding Secretary; and Editor.

Section 3. There shall be four Trustees. Two Trustees shall be elected at the Annual Meeting held in odd numbered years, and two shall be elected at the Annual Meeting held in even numbered years.

Section 4. Term of Office

- a. Officers and Trustees shall be elected for a two-year term. They may be reelected to a second two-year term, but may not serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office. After two years shall have elapsed, a person may be reelected to the same office. The two term limit does not apply to the Editor.
- b. An elected officer or Trustee having served one-half or more of a term is deemed to have served a full term of office.
- c. An elected officer or Trustee may serve in more than one office, but shall have only one vote as a member of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Vacancy in office

a. A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the First Vice-president. A vacancy occurring in any other office, including that of Trustee, shall be filled by a majority vote of the Board of Directors until the next Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Section 1. The President shall be the chief executive officer and the official representative of the Association.
- a. The President may appoint other officers deemed necessary in addition to those specified herein. Such appointments shall be approved by the Board of Directors and shall be for a term not exceeding that of the appointing administration. They shall have no vote on the Board of Directors.
- b. The President shall appoint all committee chairmen with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- c. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.
- d. The President shall conduct such other business as may be directed by the Board of Directors.
 - e. The President shall sign all checks for approved expenditures.
- Section 2. Vice Presidents, in numerical order, shall preside as President in the temporary absence of the president. The First Vice President is authorized to countersign checks in the absence of the President. Vice Presidents shall perform such other duties as may be specified by the President and/or Board of Directors.

- Section 3. The Treasurer shall be custodian of all funds of the Association.
- a. Funds shall be deposited in the name of the Association. The choice of a bank shall be approved by the Board of Directors. Funds invested outside of a regular checking account shall be invested only upon the approval of the Board of Directors.
- b. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements.
- c. All checks issued must be signed by both the President and the Treasurer. In the temporary absence of the President, the First Vice-President is authorized to countersign the check with the Treasurer.
- d. The Treasurer shall submit a monthly financial report to the Board of Directors at their monthly meeting, and to the membership at the regular monthly meeting.
 - e. The Treasurer shall maintain a current membership list.
- f. The fiscal year of the Association shall be from November 1 to October 31. The Treasurer shall close the books at the end of the fiscal year and submit them for audit. Also, the books may be examined whenever the Board of Directors deems it appropriate. The audited Annual Report shall be submitted to the Board of Directors at their monthly meeting held prior to the Annual Meeting in December, and to the membership at the Annual Meeting in December.
- g. The Treasurer may be bonded at the discretion of the Board of Directors. The cost of such bond shall be borne by the Association.
- h. The Treasurer shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Finance Committee.
- i. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties as requested by the President and/or the Board of Directors.
- Section 4. The Recording Secretary shall be custodian of all records of the Association.
- a. The Recording Secretary shall record all minutes of the Association and of the Board of Directors.
- b. The Recording Secretary shall perform such other duties as requested by the President and/or the Board of Directors.
- Section 5. The Corresponding Secretary shall prepare the general correspondence of the Association as requested by the President and/or the Board of Directors.
- Section 6. The Editor shall be chairman of the Publications Committee and have supervisory responsibility for all functions relative to the preparation and production of the Association's publications.

Section 7. Trustees shall serve on the Board of Directors and have one vote each in the business affairs of the Board. They shall perform such other functions as requested by the President and/or the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII - PUBLICATIONS

- Section 1. The quarterly publication of the Association shall be known as THE GENIE. Other publications of the Association shall be as approved by the Board of Directors.
- a. The Editor shall review overall plans for THE GENIE with the Board of Directors on an annual basis, or as requested by the Board of Directors.
- b. THE GENIE shall be sent to all categories of members of the Association. Also, THE GENIE may be sent to other historical associations or societies on an exchange basis with the approval of the Board of Directors. Certain libraries or individuals may be sent THE GENIE gratis with the approval of the Board of Directors. THE GENIE may be purchased by non-members provided sufficient copies are available.

ARTICLE IX - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

- Section 1. A committee for the purpose of nominating officers and trustees of the Association shall be appointed by the President and approved by the Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members. This committee shall be formed not less than 60 days prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association.
- Section 2. Duties of the Nominating Committee.
- a. Members of the Nominating Committee shall elect a Chairman from among their membership. The Chairman shall designate a recorder.
 - b. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman.
 - c. A majority vote shall govern the proceedings of the Committee.
- d. The Committee shall consider the full qualifications of each candidate and his/her willingness to serve. A candidate shall be a member who has attended Association meetings on a regular basis. The candidate should have been active in the Association for a minimum of six- months.
- e. The Nominating Committee shall submit a slate consisting of one name for each office to be filled as an item of new business at the regular meeting prior to the Annual Meeting.
- Section 3. As the last item of new business at the Annual Meeting of the Association the President shall review with the membership the slate of nominees submitted at the previous meeting.
- a. Nominations may be made from the floor provided the proposed candidate meets the qualifications for office specified herein and has consented to serve if elected.

- b. If more than one candidate is to be voted on per office, an ad hoc Tellers Committee shall be appointed by the President prior to a vote. This committee shall consist of three members not nominated for office. The sole function of this committee is to count the ballots.
- c. A single candidate for office may be voted on by voice vote. If two or more candidates are nominated for an office, the election for that office shall be by secret written ballot. A majority vote shall elect to office.
- Section 4. Elected officers shall assume the duties of their new office at the close of the Annual Meeting and following installation.
- Section 5. Retiring officers, except the Treasurer, shall deliver to their successors all materials pertaining to that office, and all Association property in their custody, within seven days following the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer shall deliver all materials and records pertaining to that office following a successful audit by the Audit Committee, but not later than 30 days following the Annual Meeting. Retiring officers are responsible for briefing their successors on the duties of their office.

ARTICLE X - MEETINGS

- Section 1. The Association shall meet on the second Saturday of each month at a time and place designated by the Board of Directors.
- a. In the event the regular meeting date falls on a holiday weekend, the Board of Directors may elect to change the meeting to another date. Proper advance notification of the change shall be given to all members.
- b. The regular meeting in December of each year shall be known as the Annual Meeting and shall be held within the environs of Shreveport/Bossier City, La. Confirmation of the meeting time and place shall be announced at the November regular meeting. Notification of the meeting shall be published in Shreveport area daily newspapers.
- c. A purpose of the Annual Meeting is for election of officers and trustees, and for their installation. Also, it is to receive reports of officers and standing committees, and such other business as requires the attention of the full membership.
- d. Special Meetings may be held at the call of the President, with approval of the Board of Directors. No less than five members of the Board of Directors may, by written request, call a Special Meeting. An individual member with a reason for a Special Meeting should state his reason for such a meeting in writing to the Board of Directors. Should the Board of Directors judge the request to be valid, the rule for a Board of Directors called Special Meeting will then apply. All such meetings shall be for a stated purpose. The Recording Secretary shall give proper notification of the meeting to the membership not less than seven days prior to the Special Meeting.

ARTICLE XI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the elected officers, four Trustees, and the Immediate Past President as long as he/she is an active member in good standing.
- Section 2. Duties of the Board of Directors.
- a. The Board of Directors is the governing body of the Association. It shall make decisions concerning the Association in matters not requiring membership approval. On matters arising between regular meetings which require prompt decision and which normally require membership approval, the Board of Directors may act and report its actions to the membership at the next regular meeting.
- b. Within 30 days after the start of each administration the Board of Directors shall inventory all property owned by the Association. The location of all property shall be listed on the inventory. This inventory shall be filed with the Recording Secretary.
- c. The Board of Directors shall select the bank to be used by the Association and make decisions concerning the investment of monies outside normal checking accounts.
- d. The Board of Directors shall fill vacancies in all elected positions occuring between elections, except for President.
- e. The Board of Directors shall perform such other duties as the membership may request and approve.

ARTICLE XII COMMITTEES

- Section 1. The President shall appoint, with approval of the Board of Directors, the following standing committees. Committee chairmen shall be responsible for preparing the annual budget input for their respective committees. Committee chairmen are responsible to the Board of Directors for their committee's activities.
- a. Education Committee. This Committee shall consist of a chairman and not less than two other members. Its function is to develop course outlines and other materials to be used in training classes.
- b. Finance Committee. This Committee shall consist of a chairman and not less than four other members. Included in this membership shall be the Treasurer and the immediate past President (if available). It shall have general supervision of the finances of the Association. It shall prepare the Annual Budget. The budget shall be presented to the Board of Directors at their regular January meeting, and to the membership at the regular meeting in February.
- c. Library Committee. This committee shall consist of a chairman and not less than two other members. It shall have general supervision of all books, magazines and other printed material belonging to the Association, including resale items. It shall serve as the conduit for books received, reviewed and passed—on to Shreve Memorial Library.

- d. Programs Committee. This committee shall consist of a chairman and no less than two other members. It shall be responsible for developing programs for regular meetings, and such other events as may be approved by the Board of Directors.
- e. Publications Committee. This Committee shall consist of a chairman, normally the Editor, and no less than two other members. It shall be responsible for all functions relative to the production of Association publications. It shall supervise the publications exchange program with other organizations.
- f. Publicity Committee. This Committee shall consist of a chairman and no less than two other members. The Committee shall see that the Association receives adequate publicity in the local media, and elsewhere.
- Section 2. Other Committees. The President may appoint, with Board of Directors approval, such other committees as may be required.

ARTICLE XIII - QUORUM

- Section 1. A quorum for the transaction of routine business by the Board of Directors shall be five members. In an urgent situation, the President may poll a quorum of board members by telephone.
- Section 2. A quorum for the transaction of routine business by the membership in any regular meeting shall be 11 members.
- Section 3. A quorum for the transaction of routine business in the Annual Meeting shall be 15 members.
- Section 4. A quorum for the transaction of business for all committees shall be a majority of the members of the committee.

ARTICLE XIV - DISSOLUTION

- Section 1. The Association may be dissolved by the following procedure:
- a. A Resolution for Dissolution signed by five members may be submitted to the Board of Directors.
- b. The Board of Directors may by 2/3 vote in the affirmative submit the resolution to the membership at the next Regular Meeting. A resolution failing the required 2/3 affirmative vote by the Board of Directors shall be returned to the originators.
- c. The membership may by 3/4 vote approve the acceptance of the resolution for consideration. A resolution failing this 3/4 vote is rejected.
- d. Following the acceptance of the resolution, written notice shall be sent by mail to all members of the Association who have voting privileges advising them that action will be taken on the Resolution for Dissolution at the next Regular Meeting. The notice shall include all pertinent facts and any information deemed useful to making a decision regarding the resolution. Members should receive the written notice at least seven days prior to the

stated Regular Meeting.

f. At the stated Regular Meeting the Association by a 4/5 vote of the members present may adopt the Resolution of Dissolution. Should the resolution be adopted, the membership by a 2/3 vote shall adopt a method for the disposition of all equipment, materials and supplies owned by the Association.

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g. After any indebtedness has been satisfied, any monies remaining shall be distributed as provided for in Article VII, Section b, of the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE XV - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The Modern Edition of Robert's Rules of Order (ie: Patnode revision) shall govern the proceedings of the Association in all matters not provided for in these Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE XVI - AMENDMENTS

- Section 1. An amendment to these Bylaws may be proposed by either of two methods.
- a. An amendment to these Bylaws may originate with the Board of Directors and be submitted to the Association membership for consideration by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the Board membership.
- b. An amendment to these Bylaws may originate from within the Association membership. No less than five members may petition the Board of Directors in writing for an amendment to these Bylaws. After due consideration, the Board of Directors shall submit the proposed amendment, along with their recommendations, to the Association membership.
- Section 2. After the proposed amendment is presented to the Association membership at a regular meeting, it shall lay-over until the next Regular Meeting for discussion and final action. A 2/3 affirmative vote of the Association members present shall be required for passage.
- Section 3. No amendment shall be acted upon which is in conflict with the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE XVII - LIMITATIONS

Should these Bylaws conflict with the Articles of Incorporation in any manner, the Articles of Incorporation shall take precedence. These herein contained Bylaws are effective upon passage by the Association membership. All previous Bylaws become null and void with the passage of these Bylaws.

(Found in Natchitoches Parish Court House)

After the thirteen colonies relinquished claims for lands from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River (and even farther West) by 1785 the United States had a become a vast land owner. A system was devised, whereby this land would be distributed. The rectangular system was used and as land became available it was either sold, granted to soldiers, etc.

The "Original Entry" books are records of those transfers from the United States to individuals, schools, railroads, states, etc., etc.



The stones are recorded in place allowing the researcher to put families together. There is a map of the Village of Summerville showing the perimeters within which persons must live in order to be eligible for burial in this private cemetery. There are plot maps of the cemetery sections making it easy to locate any grave. Additional research has been done in newspapers to identify people in unmarked graves. There are special indexes for blacks, veterans, slave owners, by occupations, by immigration from and emigration to the counties. This delightful book is the story of a New England family's migration westward through four generations of letters beginning in New Hampshire in the 1830's and ending in Arkansas in 1909. The letters for the most part were transcribed just as written. There are letters from parents to children, children to parents, to sisters and brothers, nieces and nephews and soldiers letters home. there are love letters and a honeymoon diary detailing the trip to Niagara Falls. All of these letters give and request information on various family members. In some instances you are given both sides of the correspondence as the young soldier in charge of the family farm, who had to leave it in the care of his sisters, gives them directions on running the farm and their answers request instructions on handling hired help among other things. All these letters give us a close look at the life style of these interwoven families. In between each series of letters, the author has filled in the family and put the times in context. A series of genealogical appendexes gives the descendants of each family: William and Mary Hale (Mann) Darby, the Heard line, the Mann (Man) line, the Ichabod Smith line, and the Tillotson (Tilletson) line. There is a hibliography plus six pages of notes giving full documentation. Besides being good reading this is an excellent well done family genealogy. Size 6 by 8½. 162 pages. Hard cover. Deals with 15 generations of the Cary family in England before picking up the American line. There are 9 generations of the Brett family in England and other families traced in varying degrees are Pool, Sturdevant, Abbott, Chandler, Bickford, Fuller, Durkee and Moulton. 3. COMPUTING BIRTH DATES

Given the Date of Death and the Age of the Individual in Years, Months, Days at the Time of Death

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Find the DAY of death in the left column. Treating this as day 0, the day before as 1, the day before that as 2, etc., count up the column the number of days of life given. If you reach the top of the column before you have finished counting, continue at the bottom of the column. If the month preceding that of death has less than 31 days, be sure to skip the unneeded days in the column. You now have the day of birth.
- Find the MONTH of death in the lower month column at the right. If you went
 past the 1st while counting days, go back one month. Just like with days,
 count this month as 0 and count the number of months of life. This gives you
 the month of birth.
- 3. Take the YEAR of death. If you went past January when counting months, subtract 1 from the year of death. Now subtract the number of years of life from the year you have to get the year of birth.
- 4. LEAP YEARS: Any years evenly divisible by 4, except the century years, unless they are divisible by 400 (1600 was a leap year; 2000 will be the next one.). Remember that when you count back the days, you skip only 31 and 30, instead of 31, 30, and 29, to correct the number of days in the month. The rule to remember: Thirty days hath September, April, June, and November.

Note: To check the birth date you have arrived at, start with that date and count forward to the date of death.

EXAMPLE I: Subject died 31 May 1966, aged 94y llm 7d.

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- 1. Starting with 31, treat this as day 0 and count back 7 days. This bring us to $\underline{24}$.
- 2. We did not go past the 1st, so starting with May in the month column, count up 11 months. This takes us to <u>June</u>.
- 3. We did go past January, so 1966 becomes 1965. Subtracting 94 from 65 gives 1871. THE DATE OF BIRTH: 24 June 1871.

EXAMPLE II: Subject died 1 March 1896, aged 35y 7m 2d.

- 1. Starting with 1, treat this day as 0 and count back 2. The month preceding March is February and 1896 was a Leap Year so we skip only 30 and 31. The before March 1 was February 29. Treat the 29th as 1, etc. This lands us on 29.
- 2. We did go past the 1st; so starting with February in the month column, count up 7 months. This takes us to <u>July</u>.
- 3. We did go past January; so 1896 becomes 1895. Subtracting 35 from 1895 gives us 1860. THE DATE OF BIRTH: 28 July 1860.
