THE VANCES OF BOSSIER PARISH

(This is a continuation of the Vance family history from Vol. 28, Fourth Quarter, No. 4, 1994 edition of THE GENIE)

During the course of time, at least 12 Vances would leave the Palmetto State to make a new home in Northwest Louisiana. Those who came before the Civil War were Washington, Whitfield, Tom, and J. P. Those who came after the conflict were Calvin, John, Mary, Nina, Rosborough, William W, Norwood, and Frank.

The identity of William Calvin Vance has eluded Vance family chroniclers and descendants. Calvin or "Cal" is referred to as a cousin in relationship to some members of Nathaniel Vance's family line, but his parentage is a mystery.

An obituary profile of Calvin states that he was born in Spartanburg, South Carolina. His date of birth is known only to the extent that he was born in 1840. The same obituary tells us that he attended school first in Columbia, South Carolina, and later finished his education at the Citadel. Nineteen-year-old W. C. Vance is placed at the Citadel in Charleston, S.C. by the 1860 census, the first census report in which he can be found.

Information furnished by the Citadel confirms that sixteen-year-old W. C. Vance was admitted to "Arsenal" January 1, 1857 and transferred to the Citadel January 1, 1858 (Arsenal Academy was located in Columbia, S.C.). Also furnished was the information that Calvin graduated April 9, 1861, three days before South Carolina forces fired on Fort Sumter in Charleston Harbor. Calvin's address was given as Abbeville District (County).

Charleston was the center of turbulent historic events during the ominous days of late 1860 and early 1861. South Carolina became the first southern state to secede from the Union on December 20, 1860.

Washington and South Carolina were in a stand-down state of negotiations over Federal occupation of Charleston's harbor defenses. Union commander, Major Anderson, aggravated an already tense situation by moving his troops under cover of darkness from the land-based Fort Moultrie, to the uncompleted but more defensible Fort Sumter at the entrance to Charleston Harbor.

Governor Pickens then learned that the merchant steamer "Star of the West" was under steam for Charleston with 200 troops and supplies for reinforcement of Fort Sumter. He ordered Citadel superintendent, Major P. F. Stevens, with a detachment of cadets to Cummings Point on Morris Island to man a battery of heavy guns. William Calvin Vance is said to have been one of those cadets. The steamer in its approach up the ship channel would come under the cadets' 24-pounders before coming into range of other South Carolina batteries at Forts Moultrie and Pinkney.

On January 9, 1861, the Citadel cadets fired what could arguably be considered the first shot fired in the Civil War as they volleyed at and scored one hit on the "Star of the West". Other batteries at Fort Moultrie opened up with several rounds with no effect. The captain of the steamer receiving no support from Fort Sumter turned back with only light damage.

Cool heads on both sides delayed the bombardment of Fort Sumter until April 12th.

The lineage of John Chappell Vance has already been illustrated. He was born near Cross Hill, Laurens County, South Carolina, August 25, 1843, later moving with his family to Greenwood, Abbeville County. He entered the freshman class of South Carolina College (University of South Carolina) in 1860. During the patriotic fervor which prevailed following secession, John joined the "College Cadet Company." They traveled to Charleston where they presented themselves for duty in the defense of Charleston, and were present at Fort Moultrie upon the opening bombardment of Fort Sumter.

The 2d (Palmetto) Regiment, South Carolina Infantry (Vol) was called into State service about April 9, 1861, for a period of twelve months. Greenwood supplied one of its companies, the Secession Guards, which was designated Company F. Allen Vance is said to have financed the Guards.

William Calvin Vance enlisted as a corporal in Company F on April 14, 1861. Calvin was in Charleston when the company was being formed and officers chosen back home in Greenwood. John Chappell Vance, Allen's son and a cousin to Calvin, would wait until after his eighteenth birthday to enlist. Another cousin of John's, W. W. Perryman, was elected captain of the company. One of Calvin Vance's obituaries reads in part; "When the late war broke out he was in the Senior Class of the Citadel, Charleston, S. C., was stationed with Cadets on Morris Island, before and during the bombardment of Fort Sumter. Receiving his diploma immediately after this, he joined Capt. Perryman's Company from Greenwood, S.C., and went to Virginia without even coming home." Calvin apparently joined and secured the rank of corporal in his company on its way through the Port of Charleston enroute to Richmond. General Milledge L. Bonham was appointed by Governor Pickens as commander of South Carolina's army. Bonham led a small brigade consisting of the 1st and 2d South Carolina Regiments to Richmond, reaching there May 11. They were immediately dispatched by General Lee by rail to Manassas Junction to join a small force of Virginia troops beginning a build-up in the strategic Manassas Gap area. Upon his arrival at Manassas, General Bonham became the ranking officer and took command of all forces on May 21. He was later ranked by and relinquished command to General P.G.T. Beauregard, the hero of Charleston. The 2d Regiment, commanded by Colonel Joseph B. Kershaw, was mustered into Confederate States service on May 22, 1861. They would be one of six South Carolina regiments to participate in the Battle of First Manassas (Bull Run).

Calvin's regiment was assigned with three other South Carolina regiments to a brigade which was posted to Mitchell's Ford. Mitchell's Ford was one of the crossings on Bull Run Creek between the key railway junction of Manassas and the Federal approach from Washington. The regiment was tasked to go forward and engage the advance pickets of the advancing Union forces.

The troops were not told so, but their purpose was to cause the deployment of opposing forces into battle formation to observe enemy strength and disposition. Once this was accomplished, the troops were ordered to withdraw back to Mitchell's Ford.

The main thrust of the enemy attack came in another sector of the Confederate line; the 2d South Carolina thus missed the protracted, heavy fighting of the battle. However, when the outcome hung in the balance at the battle's focal point on Henry Hill, the 2d and 8th S.C. Regiments were rushed there from Mitchell's Ford. Their insertion into the battle, joined shortly thereafter by General Kirby Smith's brigade just arriving from the Shenandoah Valley and Colonel Early's brigade, combined to force the withdrawal, then retreat, of the Federals.

The troops of the 2d South Carolina Regiment, as part of the Confederate pursuit, were contributory witnesses to the historic route of the Northern forces at Bull Run. It was the 2d Regiment's General Kershaw who allowed the firing of Kemper's battery on the Cub Run suspension bridge being used by the retreating Federals. The first round struck the middle of the bridge upsetting a wagon and team thus blocking traffic. Route turned to bedlam as artillery and wagons were abandoned and enemy troops, many throwing down their weapons, splashed across the stream in disorderly flight.

The long lull in activity in the Virginia theater following the Manassas battle allowed for reorganization of forces on both sides. The 2d South Carolina Regiment became part of General Kershaw's Brigade, General McLaws' Division, Army of Northern Virginia. John Vance enlisted into Company F and joined his cousin Cal near Manassas.

The long delayed invasion of Virginia came in the Spring of 1862 with Gen. McClellan's Peninsula Campaign. Gen. McLaws' Division was part of the Confederate forces defending Richmond against the Army of the Potomac's movement up the York and James Rivers peninsula. The 2d South Carolina saw action at Williamsburg on the peninsula and took part in the series of battles collectively called the Seven Days' Battles outside of Richmond. The Federal army was repulsed after a total of thirty thousand casualties on both sides. Gen. Lee had taken command of the Army with the wounding of Gen. Joseph Johnston and afterward reorganized the Army into a more manageable two-corps army. McLaws' Division would be in Gen. Longstreet's 1st Corps; the 2d Corps being that of Gen. Jackson.

Calvin and John missed the Battle of Second Manassas as their division remained to protect Richmond until the Federals completed their evacuation from Harrison's Landing on the James River. Flush from victory at Second Manassas, Lee embarked on his invasion of Maryland. McLaws' Division hastened north to take a key part in Stonewall Jackson's capture of Harpers Ferry in West Virginia as part of Lee's Maryland strategy.

General Lee chose his ground along Antietam Creek near Sharpsburg, Maryland, on which to face the numerically superior forces of General McClellan. The Battle of Sharpsburg or Antietam on September 17, 1862, was probably the bloodiest and most hotly contested single day of the war. Lee's position was tenuous at several junctures of the battle. At one point, the

Confederate line was penetrated and the Union forces were disastrously close to rolling up Lee's right flank. At this critical juncture, McLaws' Division arrived from Harpers Ferry and with another division shifted from the center, drove back the Federal attackers. Lee was forced to withdraw his army back to Virginia spelling the failure of his Maryland campaign. Nearly one-third of the rebels who marched into Maryland became casualties. One of those wounded at Sharpsburg was Calvin Vance who would soon be commissioned 2d Lieutenant.

The next test of strength between North and South in Virginia came at Fredericksburg in December 1862. General Burnside advanced his forces through the town and threw successive waves of brigades, fourteen in all, at the deceptively strong entrenchments of McLaws' Division on Marye's Heights. Most of the 13,000 Union casualties were suffered on this narrow front. The terrible carnage prompted Lee to remark to Longstreet as they looked on, "It is well that war is so terrible--we should grow too fond of it."

In January or February, 1863, General Longstreet required a courier. He wrote General Kershaw to send him, "one who would enter Hell if sent." John was selected. He would perform his new duties on a fine Arabian mare provided by his father. As a gallant courier for General James Longstreet whose counsel and ability Lee relied on more than any other, John would witness and participate in events which greatly impacted history. That Spring, John accompanied Longstreet with two of his divisions to lay siege to Suffolk while much needed supplies were foraged from the area. Calvin's regiment as part of McLaws' Division remained with Lee's Army and took part in the Battle of Chancellorsville. The route of General Hooker in this battle encouraged Lee to undertake another invasion of the North.

The battle site for the clash between the Army of Northern Virginia and the Army of the Potomac in Pennsylvania was not the choosing of either side. The armies of Lee and Meade collided near the little town of Gettysburg on July 1, 1863. Ordered by Lee and directed by Longstreet, McLaws' Division spearheaded the offensive of the second day which smashed through formation after formation of the Federal Army. The drive finally spent itself against determined resistance and good tactical use of reserves by Meade. Northern forces remained in control of key heights critical to resumption of the battle.

General Lee chose to renew the offensive on the following day. His choice for the assault against the Union center on Cemetery Ridge were the veteran 1st Corps divisions of Hood and McLaws. He was informed by Longstreet that these divisions had been decimated in that day's fighting. Gen. Longstreet gave him Gen. Pickett's all-Virginia division to be augmented by 3d Corps brigades and supported by Hood and McLaws. The charge fell short with perhaps half the attacking force killed, wounded or captured on that long slope. Lee withdrew his army back across the Potomac. Calvin Vance was promoted to Captain on July 3, the last day of the battle. Tom Vance was left at Gettysburg to tend the wounded and was captured the following day, the Fourth of July. The war continued.

Following Gettysburg, Gen. Longstreet persuaded Lee to allow him to take two divisions, McLaws' and Hood's, west to bolster Gen. Bragg in Tennessee.

Before his arrival, Bragg had been forced out of Knoxville and Chattanooga. Longstreet arrived in time to join Bragg in the Battle of Chickamauga in northern Georgia where he was instrumental in driving the Federals back to Chattanooga. However, Longstreet was forced to retire eastward after his failed campaign against Knoxville and Bragg's defeat at Chattanooga. He committed elements to include Kershaw's Brigade to a rear guard action at Bean Station in east Tennessee. There were less than 500 total casualties in the Battle of Bean Station on December 14, 1863. It was described by Major Osmon Latrobe of Longstreet's staff as "the briskest little fight of the war." Here Captain Vance received a wound of serious enough nature to warrant a furlough home.

Calvin was once again present for duty for the March/April company muster roll. He was with his unit in the Battle of the Wilderness fought near Chancellorsville, Virginia in May 1864, where he was again wounded.

Captain Vance's Confederate military records are typically incomplete and virtually nonexistent after the muster roll of May/June 1864. Calvin signed for a special requisition of two pairs of shoes for his company near Winchester, Virginia, on August 31, 1864. Also surviving is a special requisition document for 4 pairs of shoes, 8 shirts, 3 pairs of pants, 8 pairs of drawers, and 1 jacket which he received and signed for "on the march" on September 30, 1864.

John Vance rejoined Calvin's Company F of Kershaw's old brigade of South Carolinians, now commanded by General Kennedy. They were transferred back to their home state at the request of South Carolina's governor in the face of Sherman's invasion of the deep South. The brigade was consolidated into the army of General Johnston attempting to counter Sherman's swing up through the Carolinas from Savannah. He saw his opportunity near Bentonville, North Carolina, to concentrate his 17,000 man force against a like-sized divided wing of Sherman's army. The Battle of Bentonville on March 19-21, 1865, was the last major battle of the war. When Sherman consolidated his forces, Johnston broke contact under cover of darkness on the night of the 21st and made his escape. The battle was inconclusive, but John was severely wounded in the thigh, left on the field, and reported mortally wounded.

John was laid out with other wounded in a ruined church serving as a makeshift hospital. The wounded were then loaded on freight cars for transport to the nearest town. Loose cotton put down on John's car floor as comfort for the wounded caught fire from engine sparks. Many of the wounded died from the fire or from crashing to the ground as they rolled out of the car. It was not John's time to die as he rolled out of that flaming car and down a steep embankment. As soon as he recovered sufficiently, he cut a sapling from which he made a crude crutch and hobbled and crawled to the nearest house. From there, he hobbled and caught short rides between burned bridges on his way back to Greenwood. On one of these rides, he said he was lifted into a boxcar by General John C. Breckenridge, who had in there all the archives and records of the Confederacy. (Breckenridge was a Kentucky Senator and Buchanan's Vice President before the war. He is now the undaunted last Secretary of War, CSA) John was given a seat on a keg containing silver coin which he said was afterward divided among the Davis bodyguard at Abbeville, S.C., fourteen miles beyond Greenwood.

Allen Vance, upon hearing of his son's death and not being able to travel himself, sent an old servant with a wagon and coffin to bring back the body. When John finally hobbled in, even his mother didn't recognize him until he yelled "Get back from me, Maw. I'm full of body lice!"

Captain Calvin Vance surrendered with General Johnston at Goldsboro, North Carolina, on April 26, under the same terms agreed upon between Lee and Grant on April 9th. He was paroled at Greensboro, N.C., on May 2, 1865. After more than four years at war in eight states and being five times wounded, according to a later statement by his widow, the war was over for Cal.

Allen Vance died sometime in 1865, after John's return home. He was buried next to his son "Allie" in the lower southeast corner of the family residence lot at 158 East Cambridge Avenue in Greenwood. Later when the house was sold to Dr. J. C. Maxwell, Mrs. Vance's nephew, John had his father and brother's bodies disinterred and reburied in Magnolia Cemetery in Greenwood. John and his uncle, Dr. J. W. Vance, were named by Allen as co-executors of his will. Allen's estate located in South Carolina and Louisiana was left to his widow and three children. John moved to Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in 1865 as evidenced by the Parish Tax Assessment Roll. He is listed as a resident without property.

Captain Vance apparently left his native state of South Carolina to reside in Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in 1867. Like many other young men at war's end he would have to make the transition to a civilian profession. The choice was probably not difficult for two other ex-Confederate captains returning to Bossier Parish. Nathan W. Sentell was raised in a family of merchants who had early stores near Benton and in Collinsburg dating to 1850. John H. Nattin clerked at the Collinsburg store for G. W. Sentell and Brothers and for W. M. Sentell and Company before the war. W. M. Sentell died an officer in the war as did his brother, J. M. Sentell. After the conflict Nathan took over the Collinsburg store. As proprietor of N. W. Sentell and Company he took on two partners, John H. Nattin and W. Calvin Vance. There is reason to believe Calvin had some help getting started in the mercantile business from an old friend of the Sentells, Dr. J. W. Vance. Calvin was also able to purchase in partnership with Nathan 480 acres near Cottage Grove in April 1867.

William Calvin Vance first appeared on the Bossier Parish tax assessment roll in 1867. The tax roll does not indicate that he paid the taxes on the land purchased jointly with Nathan Sentell that year--only that Calvin was assessed a tax of \$1.25 on an "amount of money loaned on interest - \$500.00." John Vance is listed as a resident each year since 1865, and as agent for the Allen Vance estate.

Dr. J. W. Vance and his nephew, Dr. S. W. Vance, applied for pardons under the Amnesty Proclamation on July 18, 1865. Both claimed not to have been in the civil or military service of the Confederate Government. Wash Vance confirmed in his statement that he came to Bossier Parish in 1840. Whitfield Vance divulged that he had been a resident of Bossier Parish since 1852. Neither claimed credit for sponsorship of the Vance Guards Company. Pardons for both were routinely granted on August 26, 1865.

Upon the death of Dr. Wash Vance in October 1868, his nephew Dr. S. W. Vance petitioned the Parish Judge for the opening, probating and execution of the will. He stated that he had reason to believe that he was the sole, or one of the executors appointed in the will. He asserted that John C. Vance, W. C. Vance, R. W. Vance and he were the only presumptive heirs residing in Bossier Parish. Judge L. W. Baker in ordering the opening of the will saw fit to include Joseph and Thomas Vance for notification as presumptive heirs.

The reading of the will no doubt produced some surprises as it read in part:

"Item 2d. To William Calvin Vance, now of the Parish of Bossier and State of Louisiana and at this time a member of the commercial firm of N. W. Sentell & Co., doing business at Collinsburg, in said Parish and State, I will and bequeath, in addition to means and money, I have heretofore furnished and advanced him, the sum of twenty thousand dollars in gold to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3d. To Harriet R. Montgomery, commonly called Hattie Montgomery of Laurens District in the State of South Carolina, I will and bequeath the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars in gold to her and her heirs forever." (It would be interesting to learn who Hattie Montgomery was.)

Dr. Vance willed the remainder of his property equally among his legal heirs and representatives. He appointed as executors of his will William Calvin Vance and George Washington Sentell.

Not much is known about Rosborough Washington Vance, older brother of Samuel Whitfield Vance. He appears as a 28-year-old physician in the household of his parents in the census of 1850. He is missing from the census reports of both South Carolina and Louisiana for 1860 and does not seem to have been in the war. He purchased 320 acres of land in north Bossier Parish on November 22, 1865. The joint signers as security on Dr. Rosborough's promissory note were Dr. Whitfield and Dr. Washington Vance. R. W. bought many other parcels of land until his accumulated acreage reached 1,280 acres by 1883.

Rosborough died a bachelor in March 1888 at Gilmer on Red River west of Plain Dealing. He requested in his will that a wall of granite or marble be put around his grave with a marble slab on top with his name and age, and that an iron railing be put around his grave. Dr. Vance further requested that his property not be sold but be kept rented for a period of twenty years, then sold and the proceeds be divided between his brother Whitfield's three children by his second marriage. He appointed Calvin Vance and his nephew, Samuel Whitfield Vance, Jr., as co-executors to discharge the duty of executors agreeable to his request. Judge Drew noted in probating the will that Calvin refused and declined to accept and serve, leaving Dr. Vance's nephew as sole executor.

Dr. Rosborough Vance is buried in the Gilmer-Vance section of the Plain Dealing Cemetery. A railing, if ever installed around the grave, has since been removed. The large marble slab laid atop a low stone perimeter wall

has broken across the center. Inexplicably, the inscribed date of his death is given as March 18, 1887, rather than the correct date of March 6, 1888.

Calvin Vance, in the legal settlement of Dr. Washington's estate, bought at Sheriff's sale the 1,382 acre Riverside Plantation for the sum of \$29,160 on December 10, 1869. Whitfield Vance purchased the remaining 786 acres of his Uncle Wash's estate. On February 24, 1870, Calvin married the young member of a pioneer north Bossier Parish family, Miss Lou M. Doles. Lou's sister Mary had married Nathan Sentell. By now W. C. Vance is a planter. Living in the household of 30-year-old W. C. Vance during the 1870 census are his wife Lou M., age 21, as well as Mary Vance, age 50, and "Nannie" Vance, age 10. Both of the latter were born in South Carolina. Their relationship to the head of the household was not required on that decade's census report and were not given. One child was born to the Vances. Lou M. Vance died shortly after the birth of Allen Washington Vance in January 1871. Lou is buried in the Cottage Grove Cemetery located between Benton and Plain Dealing. Allen, a youth said to have had many fine qualities and great promise, fell ill and died at age 15 on November 15, 1885.

John C. Vance, also a planter, had living with him during the 1870 census M. M. Vance, age 55, and "Ninnie" Vance, age 17. Nina would make the statement in her latter years that she moved to Louisiana in 1870. It is assumed that she and her mother both joined John in Bossier Parish that year. John became the sole executor of his father's estate upon the death of his Uncle Wash in 1868. As executor, he filed and posted legal notices of annual succession accounts; paid the property taxes; and managed the business of the plantation pending settlement of the succession. John named the plantation Palmetto for his native "Palmetto State".

It was also John's legal obligation, and obligation to the heirs, to collect on all debts to the estate. He brought civil suit against Martha E. Gilmer to collect a balance of payments for slaves sold to her by Allen Vance in 1859 and 1860. Martha had paid \$8,000 on the purchase price of \$9,600 and went to litigation rather than pay the balance. It was Martha's contention that she had been warranted title and was divested of title to these slaves by reason of the Proclamation of Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863. She further alledged that they were sold in fraud of the revenue laws of the State of Louisiana. That Allen Vance, being a slave trader and speculator, brought them there for sale and did sell them within the State, and went to Arkansas to make title in order to evade the revenue laws. She also contended that she paid greatly more than the slaves were worth from the date of sale to the date of their emancipation. It is unfortunate that Dr. Wash Vance, with his rapport with the Gilmers, couldn't have settled this amicably while still co-executor, before his death.

James Veazey had married Elizabeth Johnson, a widow, nee Hollingsworth, a direct descendant of Valentine Hollingsworth, on 30 August 1750. Valentine Hollingsworth had joined William Penn in the Delaware-Pennsylvania area.

- +7G John Veazey (Abt 1747-Abt 1707) is said to have built Cherry Grove in 1670, in Cecil County, Maryland. It is still being used as a residence today. A descendant of John, through his son Edward, Thomas Ward Veazey, was Governor of Maryland 1836- to 1839. The Governor had been an occupant of Cherry Grove. Edward Veazey had built a home called "Essex Lodge" and it has been thought that Essex Lodge had been named in remembrance of Essex County, England where "Veseys of Wickes" had resided since 1561.

Cecil County is in the very northeast corner of Maryland and borders Delaware and Pennsylvania, with the southern border on the Chesapeake Bay. Maryland was in that land King Charles I granted to Lord Baltimore (George Calvert), but he died before the charter was signed. The King then transferred the grant to his son, Cecilius Calvert, the second Lord Baltimore, hence the name Cecil County.

A deed was recorded 1 April 1687, for land to John Veazey, known as Veazey's Neck in the southern part of Cecil County, on the eastern side of the Elk River and the south side of the Bohemia River. This is the location of Cherry Grove. In 1698, John was Church Warden of the Parish of North Sassafras, or St. Stephens, founded in 1692. In 1697, his family consisted of wife Martha and five sons: William, George, Edward, James (Sr), and Robert.

- +7G Henry Hollingsworth, the son of Valentine, came to the area of Delaware-Pennsylvania on the ship, "Lyon of Liverpool," in 1683, as a redemptioner, the year after his parents came. He had met and fell in love with Lydia Atkinson in Ireland who was waiting for him, so before his indenture service was up he returned to Ireland to marry Lydia. He and Lydia were married 22 August 1688, in the home of her sister and brother-in-law, Sarah Atkinson and John Robson. Henry may have been instrumental in his father selling his place in Ireland, for the sale was in 1688. Upon Henry's return with his bride to America, he commenced a livelihood that was to extend into Chester County, Pennsylvania and New Castle County, Delaware, and eventually Cecil County, Maryland. He assisted Thomas Holmes in laying out the City of Philadelphia. He became deputy surveyor of Chester County, Pennsylvania and deputy surveyor of the Town and County of New Castle. He was sheriff, coroner and Clerk of the Court of Chester County. He surveyed 30,000 acres of land for William and Letitia, children of William Penn. In 1711, he bought "The Landing" near the junction of the Big Elk and the Little Elk Rivers. In 1712, Lord Baltimore appointed him surveyor of Cecil County, Maryland. He had represented New Castle County (now Delaware), in their Provincial Assembly. He died in Elkton, Maryland, in early 1721. Some of Henry's descendants still live there.

+8G Valentine Hollingsworth, a devout Quaker, from Ballyvickcrannel, Parish of Seago, County of Armagh, of northern Ireland, came on the good ship "Antelope," landed in the Delaware River, 10 December 1582, New Castle, Pennsylvania (now Delaware). He is the only known child of Henry and Katheran Hollingsworth, born in the Sixth Month (August, by Gregorian Calendar) of 1632, there in Ireland. There is a claim his family had moved to Ireland from Cheshire, England. He married twice before leaving Ireland: First, to Ann Ree 7 June 1655, and by her four children were born: Mary, Henry, Thomas and Katheran. Second, to Ann Calvert, daughter of Thomas and Jane Calvert, on 12 June 1672, of Drumgor, also Parish of Seago. Their children were: Samuel, Enoch who died at age 12, Valentine, Jr., Ann, John born in Castle County (now Delaware), Joseph, and another Enoch. The marriages were recorded in the Lurgan Quaker Meeting records, there in Ireland.

Note that Cecil County, Maryland was named for the second Lord Baltimore, Cecilius Calvert. It makes me wonder what relation that Ann Calvert and her parents were to the Lords Baltimore of Maryland.

Valentine Hollingsworth had joined William Penn in the area of Pennsylvania and Delaware. An Address by Edward W. Cooch, given 23 May 1936, at the unveiling of the Hollingsworth Memorial at Mewark burial ground, Brandywine Hundred, Delaware, published under the title: VALENTINE HOLLINGSWORTH, in DAR Magazine, Volume 70, Number 9, is a great article about my Eighth Great Grandfather Valentine Hollingsworth, his life, and his two wives and children. It tells something of the persecution of the Quakers by taxation in Ireland, a reason for coming to the new world, his help in establishing the Quaker cause in his new land; it shows a picture of the monument that marks the land he donated as a burying place, and shows a picture of the Newark Union Meeting House, chartered by the Delaware Legislature as a free Public Meeting, erected in 1845 on the site of Hollingsworth's Newark Monthly Meeting, 138 years after the latter was removed.

Valentine Hollingsworth served as Colonial Delaware Assemblyman for New Castle County: 1683, 1687, 1688, 1689, 1695 and 1700. His son, Henry Hollingsworth, also served in the same Assembly in 1695.

+1G Henry Norrell (Jr) married Mary Frances Veazey in Chambers County, Alabama on 8 November 1849. Her parents, John Lee Veazey and Permelia Veazey were married 8 November 1825, in Greene County, Georgia. Henry Jr. and Mary Frances had soon moved to Coosa County, Alabama, and lived at Travelers Rest, near Rockford. Henry and his brother Alfred had a Shop in Rockford making shoes and saddles during the Civil War. After the War was over their barrels of Confederate money were rolled out the back door of the shop and burned. Henry and Mary Frances were the parents of five children: James Henry (mine), William Cornelius, Mary A., C. W. (Columbus Washington), and John L. . John L. died as a young man. Henry became a merchant in Rockford and both he and Mary Frances are buried in the Rockford Cemetery.

NORRELL REVOLUTIONARY WAR CLAIMS AND OTHER DATA:

From South Carolina:

Isaac Norrel No. 5557) Pvt - Under Col Hammond (son of James and Mary)
James Norrel Jr No. 5558 Pvt and Sgt in Militia - Under Col Anderson.
Mary Norrel No. 5559) Wife of James) For provisions and forage.

Richard Norrel No. 5560 Pvt in Militia - Under Col Anderson.

Samuel Norrel No. 5561 Pvt in Militia - Service at the Ridge -
Under Captain Sinquefield.

James Norrell Sr left a will presented in Halifax County, Virginia Court 18 April 1771, naming: Wife - Jean, sons: James, Thomas, Samuel, Richard and William, and daughters: Sarah and Elizabeth. Bk 0, p 306.

James Norrell, Sr. and Richard Norrell came into court and made oath that they were imported into this Colony from the part of Great Britain called Ireland and that this was the first time of proving their importation which is ordered certified. Plea Book 5, part 2, p 404-5, Halifax County, Virginia. Date February 1767. A copy Teste: Signed J. C. SIZEMORE, Clerk.

James Norrell, Jr. had married Mary Spraggins 25 May 1756, in Halifax County, Virginia. Also, land records indicate that James Norrell and wife Jean, and their children had been in Virginia, many years before James Sr. and Richard went into court and had their coming to Virginia certified.

By 5 August 1766, James Norrell, Jr. received a plat of 126 acres in Colleton County (96th District) in South Carolina.

Thomas Norrell and James Norrell (Jr) were on the Jury Duty List for 1778-1779 below Old Ninety-Six Courthouse of Edgefield District, South Carolina. Thomas Norrell had bought 61 acres on Halfway Swamp Creek in District Ninety-Six, Province of South Carolina, on 2 January 1776, from Cornelius Gardner and his wife Anna Carradesan Edelmansin. (Deed Bk 10, pp 101-104.)

All of the above Norrells I firmly believe are the family of James Norrell Sr. and his wife, Jean. I believe that daughters Sarah and Elizabeth Norrell are in South Carolina too, but my proof is not firm enough. The son William Norrell I have not found. He may have stayed in Virginia.

I am not positive on the proof of the Elizabeth Norrel No. 5556 who furnished provisions and forage. She could have been the daughter of James Sr. and his wife Jean. However, I do not know the name of Samuel's wife, nor of Thomas' wife. James Norrell Jr and Mary Spraggins had a daughter Elizabeth born 10 February 1766. By 1780, she would not have been but 14 years of age.

This last mentioned Elizabeth Norrell married on 10 May 1783 to Thomas Spraggen/Spraggin, evidently a relative from Pittsylvania County, Virginia. He had Revolutionary Service as a minuteman under Captain Thomas Dilyard. He served two years, ending in March 1778, as a Private in Captain Peter Dunn's and Captain Thomas Hutchins' Companies in Colonel Buckner's Virginia Regiment, and was in

the battles of Trenton, Brandywine, Germantown, Red Bank and Fort Mifflin. He again enlisted in September 1781 and served until June 1782, as a Private in Captain Churchill Jones' Company of Colonel George Baylor's Third Continental Dragoons and was in the battle of Yorktown. He drew a pension in Blount County, Tennessee from his application executed 1 July 1818. He died 21 June 1835, in Roane County, Tennessee. (Claim W. 1095)

Elizabeth Norrell Spraggen was allowed a pension on her application executed 11 March 1839, at which time she was a resident of Roan County, Tennessee. Elizabeth died 21 Oct 1846. The pension claim file shows children of Thomas Spraggen and Elizabeth:

Mary living in Roane County, TN in 1853, stated she was the only surviving child.

In 1822, Thomas Spraggen Sr referred to his daughter Sarah, age 23 years.

Grandchildren named in the pension claim of Thomas Spraggen and Elizabeth Norrell:

James Cane Sr in his will in Granville County, South Carolina, dated 21 August 1777, named a daughter Frances Norrell (Box 21, Pkg 486). Richard Norrell had received 150 acres grant in Granville County, South Carolina in January 1773. So, I suspect he had married Frances Cane. He was found on Wilson Creek, Long Cane Road, near Logan's Mill, in a road work order dated 20 December 1785, quoted in Margaret Watson's book, "Greenwood County Sketches." That source also expressed that Nancy McKellar, widow of John McKellar, Jr, the former Cambridge Postmaster, was Richard Norrell's daughter Nancy. It is my belief that Joseph Norrell born in 1791 and Henry Norrell born in 1792, were sons of Richard Norrell. These two made several Civil Court appearances for such as guardian bonds, etc., some of which were made together, in Abbeville, South Carolina.

About 1842, Henry Norrell removed to Tallapoosa-Chambers Counties area of Alabama. In a gift deed dated 24 April 1847, Henry named his children:

Henry (Jr), Jane, Alfred, Thomas, Franklin and William Jackson Norrell.

I believe he had a daughter Elizabeth married to a Walden, by that time, living in Tallapoosa County, Alabama. A Delila Norrell was in the home. (1850)

Anyone who can trace their Norrell ancestry back to South Carolina is almost certain to belong to descendants of my James Norrell Sr. who came from that part of Great Britain called Ireland around 1750 to Halifax County, Virginia. A few remained in South Carolina. Many began to scatter from South Carolina to Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Texas and Oklahoma. The time frame 1770 to 1850 is a difficult period to assemble them into their immediate families.

Mr. Rochell Robinson is one of several persons who maintain the cemetery and accompanied Isabelle Woods on December 17, 1994, as she toured the cemetery to record this cemetery's data.

A question mark (?) indicates the information was illegible or not available. Some of the headstones were buried too deeply or too heavy to turnover to obtain the information. Unless otherwise noted, all dates shown without a symbol were obtained from the headstone.

Both Afro-American and Caucasian decedents are buried in the Mound Chapel Cemetery. It is reached by driving north on Wilmot Highway 165 North and turning left onto the Hopkins Hill Highway 834. The Mound Chapel Cemetery is one-tenth of a mile from the Mound Chapel Independent Church at 14352 Hopkins Hill Highway 834 in Jones, Louisiana

REV. SOLOMAN PERKINS

Soloman Perkins, the son of Henry Perkins, Jr. and Ann Ferebee, was born in Halifax County, North Carolina on September 11, 1775. He was the grandson of Henry and Abigail Perkins. While still young, Soloman moved with his family to Phillip's Mill, Wilkes County, Georgia where he was baptized by Rev. Jesse Mercer. About 1820, Soloman along with his wife and some of their children moved from Crawfordsville, Taliaferro County, Georgia to Marengo County, Alabama. In May 1821 He organized Bethel Church, now McKinley Baptist Church. he was ordained by Bethel Church and became pastor of the Bethel flock, a position he held until his death October 27, 1845. Soloman soon became a full-time evangelist and , with Truhart Tucker, Jonathon Anderson, and other ministers, organized several Baptist Churches in Marengo, Clarke, and Wilcox Counties. These churches included Bethlehem, Friendship, and Shiloh. Bethel Baptist Association was named for the Bethel Church in honor of Soloman Perkins.

After living in Marengo County for two years the Soloman Perkins family moved to Wilcox County where Soloman signed his will on May 6, 1839, It was proved November 27, 1845, The will names his wife Delila (Daniels), eight children and a granddaughter, Emily Francis Delila Perkins, who was the daughter of Dr. Joseph and Winifred Perkins. Joseph was not named in his father's will and is believed to have been deceased at the time. Emily Francis Delila Perkins married Joseph B. Haden son of Alexander and Rebecca Frost Haden on October 6. 1853, in Carthage, Panola County, Texas. Joseph B. Haden owned considerable land in DeSoto Parish, Louisiana and was a prominent Planter in this area before the civil war.

Patsy Haden Oliphant of Bossier City, Louisiana is a descendant of this line through Joseph and Emily Francis Haden's son Burgess Morgan Haden and Burgess's son Joseph Daniel Haden (Patsy's father).

Am doing historical research on Civil War battle of Milliken's Bend, LA, which occurred 7 Jun 1863 during the Vicksburg Campaign. My interest centers on Capt. Corydon HEATH, the white captain of Co B, 9th LA Inf African Descent (later renamed 5th US Colored Heavy Artillery). HEATH was originally a member of Battery G, 2nd IL Light Artillery, enlisting in late 8161 in DeKalb Co., IL. He married Celestia VAN deBERGH (BERG, BURGH, BURG) in DeKalb Co., in 1858; they had two children, Jefferson and Ada b between 1858 and 1860. Corydon and Celestia divorced in 1860, with Celestia's father Abram VAN deBERGH, acting as guardian of the HEATH children. Celestia reverted to her maiden name, and later married and went to NE., apparently. It is unknown what became of the HEATH children, although Jefferson was living in DeKalb Co., IL as late as 1880. Corydon's whereabouts in 1860 is unknown, although he returned in 1861 to enlist for the war.

HEATH enters the LA scene in 1863, when reports show that Capt. HEATH, a white sergeant, and a number of black enlisted men may have been executed near Richmond or Monroe shortly after the battle of Milliken's Bend. Another officer, 2nd Lt. George CONN of the 11th LA Inf African Descent (later 49th US Colored Inf) may have shared the same fate. Thomas CORMAL, a Confederate deserter - possibly from HARRISON's 15th LA Cav Battalion - reported being present at the execution of some white officers from black Federal units. Some sources indicate that prisoners may have been taken to Shreveport or Camp Ford in Tyler, TX. The Confederates involved in this battle were TX troops (the 16th, 17th and 19th Inf and the 16th TX Cav) of Gen. Ben McCULLOCH's brigade from WALKER's TX division.

BOOK REVIEWS

TITLE: THE DESCENDANTS OF THE DYESS BROTHERS OF BARNWELL, SOUTH CAROLINA
by Pamela Karen Veuleman Trammell.

In the preface the author gives an excellent explanation of the numbering system she has used for those not familiar with the "Henry System". She also explains that she has not included documentation and photos in order to keep costs down, but she has them and they can be obtained upon request. She does, however, in her acknowledgements give the names and addresses of family members who contributed information and which brother each is associated with. She also gives a reference list of source material used. There is a section titled "The Dyess Brothers from South Carolina" in which the author presents the premise that these six men are brothers and proceeds to give in detail the circumstantial evidence and her reasoning for her belief. She also presents their possible parents. Then each of the men, Henry, John, William, Thomas, Christopher and George are given a chapter in which their descendants are brought down generation by generation. The author is descended from Christopher, and this line is brought to date. The lines of the other brothers are brought well into the 20th century, some to the 1970's and 1980's.

All of these men went to Georgia. Henry and John's descendants moved on into Florida, while the descendants of William, Thomas, Christopher and George spread through Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Texas. In GA, the families lived in Tatnall, Liberty, Wilkerson, Jones, Appling, Monroe, Bibb, Ware, Crawford, Stewart, Talbot and Sumter Counties. In AL, they were in Mobile and Baldwin Counties. In MS, the counties were Copiah, Clark, Covington, Wayne, Lawrence, Jones, Rankin, Jasper, Lauderdale, North Carroll and Jefferson Davis. In LA, the families were in Natchitoches, Sabine, Winn, Bienville, Rapides, Vernon, Caddo and others. A few of the surnames of interest in LA are Britt, Cobb, Irby, Veuleman, Rambin, Crocker, Terrell, Gates, Cross, Sapp and Marler. This is an excellent genealogy, but documentation in the book would have been more valuable. Size 9 x 6½. Hard Bound. 395 pages. Counties and parishes are included in the every-name index.

This genealogy begins with a listing of the Pennsylvania German Pioneers and the passenger list of the Phoenix in 1749. The author then discusses the Feazel name and its German origins. Following is the account of Michael

Feazel, the emigrant, and his wife, Elizabeth of Shenandoah County, VA and short sketches of his six sons. Michael, Jr. married Christiana Hank, John G., married Eve Bower, Martin married Mary Tressler/Trexler, Henry married Susannah Huser, Jacob married Susannah Hite and George married Margaret Pehr. The author picks up the ancestors of Margaret Pehr, daughter of Margaret Lockmiller and Phillip Pehr, giving the ancestry of both parents. The author descends from George through two of his sons, John and Michael.

Following this are the descendants of Margaret Pehr and George Feazel, who married 13 Jan 1790 in VA. They were in Tennessee in 1792, when their first child, Rachel, was born and Hawkins Co., TN by 1794. Son, Phillip, was born 7 Jun 1795, Mary Mae between 1799 and 1801, John O., born 1800, George L., 3 Mar 1803, Michael 7 Jun 1805, Sarah Elizabeth 1 Nov 1797 and Solomon born about 1807/08. The fourth son, John O., married Christiana Ferguson 17 Jun 1824 in Quachita Parish, LA. They had ten children and were in Union Parish when John died in 1877. Sketches are given of their children and a large portion of the book is given to the Bagwell family, who entered the family when Bayless F. Bagwell married Catherine Feazel, sixth child of John O.

The author states in the introduction that she hopes this book can be used by some future family historians as a starting point for future research. There is a great deal of work represented here, but it is poorly presented. Excellent facsimilies of original records are given, but before the records of the person creating them, and the reader has no idea what or to whom they refer. There is no table of contents to guide you, the pages are not numbered and there is no index. I found the different styles of type distracting, however, the material presented was excellent, and I enjoyed the narrative style used. Size 8½ x 11. This Gresham line begins in Norfolk, England about the beginning of the 14th Century with one Edward Gresham, who left a son named John. The line follows through three Johns, and William to Thomas, whose sons Edward and John emigrated to America. Edward settled in New County, VA about 1650. He and his wife, Elizabeth, had ten children. The line of son George is brought down generation by generation in narrative form through Georgia, Alabama into the present in northern Louisiana. The author gives as much information as is available on all the children of each generation in America. A well-done lineage and of great value to the Gresham family researchers. Brought together under one cover alphabetically by groom's name are all the estant marriage bonds 1776-1850 on file in the County Clerk's office in Accomack Co., and in the Virginia State Library, bonds for the years 1831-1841 and 1847-1850, which were abstracted by earlier genealogists from records which have since disappeared, marriages recorded only in the Ministers' Returns for 1805-1853, and the eighteen surviving marriages from the Accomack Co., colonial period. Sources and their location are given for each set of records. The introduction gives a brief explanation of Virginia marriage laws and describes banns, bonds, and licenses. Also discussed are ministers' returns, Maryland marriages for Virginians, alternate spelling of names, the importance of marriage records and explains African-American marriages.

Arranged alphabetically by groom, the bride and the date are given, also whether widow or widower, the name of the parent or guardian, if either is under age and the name of the security if the record is from a bond. Altogether nearly 6,000 marriages are given including 145 African-American. This book is a real treasure for Accomack County researchers.
