THE VANCES OF BOSSIER PARISH

(This is the third segment of the family history of a local Vance descendent)

An interesting sequence of events occurred in late 1871 and early 1872. On October 24, 1871, Mary M. Vance made a legal renunciation of her rights to the Louisiana property of her late husband, Allen. In consideration of the provisions in Allen's will for her maintenance and support, she relinquished her interest in the property to John, Mollie, and Nina. Mary and John Vance were appointed natural tutor, and under tutor, to John's minor sister, Nina, the following month. The next month, on December 12, William Calvin Vance purchased the Allen Vance estate at Sheriff's succession sale. He paid \$12,590 cash for the 1,595 acre Palmetto Plantation and over \$6,000 for the livestock and movable property in settlement of the succession. John Vance was then married to Helen Pratt one day prior to the marriage of Calvin Vance to his cousin, Nina, on February 1, 1872.

Palmetto was to be John's plantation and was publicly known, and referred to, as such. John paid the taxes on the full 1,595 acres each year until Palmetto left Vance ownership in 1890. He lived on, worked the land, and raised his family there; the plantation home being located on the present site of the Palmetto Country Club on Palmetto Road. Calvin continued the operation of his adjacent Riverside Plantation. John bought 900 acres of the Palmetto Plantation from Calvin by cash deed on December 31, 1878. Calvin purchased the 900 acres back from John on January 10, 1886. John C. Vance was a public man. He was first elected to the House of Representatives of the Louisiana State Legislature in 1878.

John was married to Helen Ophelia Pratt of Minden, Louisiana, on January 31, 1872. She was a gifted, cultured college graduate who taught piano in Minden before their marriage. Helen was a direct descendent of John Alden and Priscilla Mullens of Mayflower legend. To the Vances was born a large family which included three sets of twins. The first child, Nina, was born November 21, 1872, followed by John Cal on September 18, 1874. The first set of twins, Clarence (Clare) and her brother who did not survive, were born September 5, 1877. Mary Fish was born December 12, 1879, and the next set of twins, Theodosia (Theo) and Edward Alden, were born June 21, 1882. Little Eddie died in February 1884. Camille and Norwood Kincaid were born June 3, 1884, and lived to reach maturity.

John Chappell Vance was elected in January 1878, to fill an unexpired term as Louisiana State Representative and was re-elected in the regular election in November. John took a strong stand against a state lottery while in the legislature and was an advocate for a new state constitution. He was selected as a delegate to the State Constitutional Convention of 1879. In the general election held to adopt the new constitution John ran for the state senate seat from his district. He won the senate seat and was re-elected as state senator upon expiration of his first term.

John Vance was active in the establishment of the Louisiana State Fair and Shreveport Exposition in 1883, serving as a vice president of the sponsoring organization, the North Louisiana Agricultural and Mechanical Association. During President Cleveland's first administration, J. C. Vance was made Surveyor (Chief Customs Officer) of the Port of New Orleans, a position previously held by his old commander, James Longstreet. During the governorship of Murphy J. Foster, John served as State Coal Gauger.

Helen Vance died suddenly in New Orleans May 10, 1886. She was buried in the family section of the Minden Cemetery. The remorseful John never remarried but rose to the challenge of seeing that his children were well raised to take their creditable places in society.

John Vance returned to Northwest Louisiana upon retirement from public life, living in Webster Parish and Shreveport. He died at the Shreveport home of his sister Nina Vance, after an illness of several months, on February 13, 1913. He died intestate, leaving an estate which consisted primarily of land valued at \$30,000 in Rapides Parish and land of lesser value in Webster Parish. John was reunited with Helen in the wrought iron-fenced family plot in the Minden Cemetery. Also buried there are John Cal, Eddie, Theo, Norwood and Camille.

In an adjoining fenced family plot are buried Thomas J. Vance, his wife Laura Belle Pratt Vance, and children; Lynn Watkins, Webster Pratt (Web) and Robert Farrow (Bobbie). Tom and John, who were second cousins, had married Pratt sisters. Dr. Tom Vance practiced medicine in Minden where he and Belle raised their family. Other children of the Vances were Birdie Belle, Thomas Jefferson, Jr. and Kathryn Aubrey (Kate). Tom sold the eighty acres he owned at Vanceville in January, 1914. When he filed for his Confederate pension in July, he claimed that all the property he owned was his Minden home and a small office. Dr. Vance stated that old age and disability prevented his further practice. He drew his pension until his death February 3, 1917. His widow Belle then made application and was granted a Confederate widow's pension of \$19.35 quarterly.

Those who knew Belle Vance before her death on August 26, 1933, after a short illness, say that everyone loved "Aunt Belle." She was buried next to her husband on a Sunday. She was laid to rest at sunrise while the dew was still on the ground and the birds sang sweetly, as she had requested.

Vanceville was located at the present junction of Louisiana Highway 3 (Benton Road) and the Vanceville Road, north of Bossier City. Vanceville had its genesis in the Shady Grove or "Grove Place" Plantation. Dr. Samuel Whitfield Vance bought the 733 acre plantation from Walsh and Boisseau in 1869. His purchase contained most of the 640 acres that is Section 29, Township 19, Range 13 West. This was the square mile tract bought by George O. Gilmer from R. P. Bowie in 1839. Besides the land in Section 29 and a small portion of Section 30, Vance's Shady Grove purchase also contained about 100 acres in Section 32. This tract was between the Vanceville Road, which divides Section 29 from Section 32, and Benoist's Bayou on the south. Dr. Tom Vance soon acquired eighty of this one hundred acres from his Vance cousin, Whitfield. In 1869 a loop of the Red River touched the plantation at the Vanceville site. That site is not now within a mile of the river where it cut through a neck of land to straighten its course.

The community of Shady Grove, as the plantation and community came to be called, originated with and revolved around the plantation store, as did Collinsburg and other Bossier Parish towns. Doctor S. W. Vance employed as store bookkeeper during the mid-1870's a young man recently from Cokesbury, South Carolina, Mr. Samuel J. Zeigler. With her father's concurrence, Sallie Vance petitioned for and was granted her emancipation on January 25, 1877. One of those certifying that they believed her to be the age of eighteen and capable of managing her own affairs was Samuel Zeigler. In February 1877, Dr. S. W. Vance made a land trade with his daughter Sallie. The land relinquished by Dr. Vance was that part of "Shady Grove Place" encompassing the 633 acres in Sections 29 and 30, as well as part of the Southside Plantation and other land in Caddo Parish--968 acres in all. Sallie traded to her father the 975 acre Buck Hall Plantation, the major part of which lay on the Bossier side of the river above Shady Grove. Sallie Vance was married to Samuel Zeigler on February 13, 1877. Dr. Vance was to live only a few months after the marriage.

Mr. Zeigler set about making a going enterprise of the Shady Grove store. He guaranteed in the Bossier Banner that through volume buying from St. Louis and New Orleans he could sell his groceries as low as any house in Shreveport--thus saving the people of Bossier seven miles hauling over bad road. He advertised his line of liquor to be complete from the cheapest "bust head" to the finest Kentucky whiskey, brandy, wine, rum, gin and Champagne. He also advertised that he was able to accommodate travelers with meals and lodging to a limited extent.

Shady Grove never attained much size or stature, but was in the running for the site of the Parish seat when an alternate location to Bellevue was being sought in the early 1880's. Shady Grove would have been a good location as pointed out in the Bossier Banner by its proponents. It had a central location; was on the Shreveport public road between Cain's (Bossier City) and Benton, and points north; and had a splendid steamboat landing. Sallie's husband, Mr. Zeigler, was a progressive man and one of the foremost businessmen in Northwest Louisiana. Sallie and Samuel offered the parish 40 acres as an incentive to relocate the courthouse there. Part of the acreage could be sold for development and to defray relocation costs. Vanceville, as Shady Grove was soon to be called, missed its chance for a secure existence.

The first telephone in Bossier Parish was in Vanceville. The first area telephone exchange was established in Shreveport about 1882, but the company refused to carry its lines beyond the city limits. Mr. Zeigler wanted and needed a telephone so he built and maintained his own line to Shreveport seven miles away, crossing the river from the tops of two tall cottonwood trees. This was the first, and for many years, the only telephone out of the city limits of Shreveport.

Samuel J. Zeigler became first vice president of the Shreveport and Arkansas Railway Company when that company was formed as a branch line of the St. Louis Southwestern. The line, popularly called the "Cotton Belt," was established between Louisville, Arkansas and Shreveport. When the track was completed through Shady Grove Plantation in early 1888, Mr. Zeigler sold a depot site to the railroad for one dollar. Vanceville became a whistle-stop station on the Cotton Belt line. Vanceville received a post office in 1887 and had ten post masters between then and 1907 when mail service was moved to Bossier City.

A profile on Bossier Parish towns in the year 1900, refeatured in a 1956 issue of the Bossier Banner, offered a sketch of Vanceville of that day. The article says of Vanceville, "We cannot boast of being a large place, but can assert that several good men get their mail there. It has one store, a doctor's office, a church and a post office. The time was when Vanceville was noted for the big balls and entertainment given there, but--well, young people are not as plentiful now." As alluded, those residing in the surrounding area were considered as living at Vanceville.

The Gilmer-Vance division of property as affected by Samuel W. Vance's marriage into the Gilmer family is interesting to follow. George Oglethorpe Gilmer made the major division of his plantations and other property among his three younger children before his death in 1849. Among the plantations which he gave to his daughter, Mary E. Gilmer, were Shady Grove and

Southside. He gave to his daughter Sarah, among other properties, the Cash Point Plantation, later to have a Vance connection. One of the several tracts given his son George was that part of the Plain Dealing Plantation containing the family home, and on which the town of Plain Dealing would be located.

The first of George and Martha's children to die was James Blair Gilmer. Divorce proceedings between James and his wife Paulina had been exasperating. Pending settlement they had both legally agreed to settle the respective rights of each by referring the same to their mutual friends, Leonidas B. Spyker (James's brother-in-law), Dr. James W. Vance and Francis W. Armor. J. B. Gilmer's property holdings after the divorce were still extensive, but he had debts--probably resulting from a combination of the divorce settlement, credit investments and bad cash flow. His smallest debt was a note for \$1,750 to his son-in-law, Dr. S. W. Vance. Among other notes which he acknowledged were for \$8,116 held by his brother George and \$6,209 by his mother.

James wanted to make a new start after finalization of the divorce settlement by the state legislature in February 1856. In May, he executed a donation deed in which he donated one-fourth interest in his various plantations to each of his three daughters, Mary Gilmer Vance, Martha Gilmer and Eliza Gilmer. He had previously expressed his aversion to the Louisiana forced heirship laws to his son-in-law, Whitfield. He also donated to his daughters his debts. He proceeded to get his affairs in order by writing his will, naming his good friend Wash Vance executor, and giving Whitfield a power of attorney to handle all his local affairs. He then departed for Cuba in June of that year to establish new plantations on the island.

The girls' grandmother freed them of a portion of their donated debt by donating to James his note "for love and affection." The note was for the amount of \$9,200.15. Whitfield, James' "attorney and agent," accepted the donated note and it was destroyed. At this point Mary and her sisters legally accepted their father's donations.

On June 22, James wrote his son-in-law a letter from Havana expressing his enthusiasm and anticipation. In picturesque language he extolled at length the beauty and agricultural merits of the island of Cuba. He was leaving very soon for Trinidad on the south side of the island to look at a stock and tobacco farm of 12,000 acres, with 1,500 head of cattle, 500 horses and 14 Negroes, all offered for \$36,000. Word soon followed that James had contracted yellow fever and died suddenly on August 8, 1856. It was James Gilmer's desire not to return to Louisiana. His body was transported back to Alabama to be buried beside his first wife Eliza in Montgomery.

Court appointed experts made appraisal and partition of J. B. Gilmer's principal plantations, Egypt, Kingston and Buck Hall, along with an apportionment of the slaves. These three lots were divided between his three daughters in January 1858. The two older sisters agreed to allow the younger Eliza the first choice of parcels. She chose the Egypt Plantation positioned on both sides of the Red River. Martha then consented that Mary make the second choice and she chose Buck Hall, also on both sides of the river. Martha took Kingston Plantation, all in Bossier Parish. The sisters agreed to hold in common between themselves all other property in the hands of the executor and accountable by him until final settlement.

Mary Gilmer Vance died in 1859 prior to final settlement of the estate. Dr. S. W. Vance was appointed tutor for his minor children, James B. G. Vance and Sarah E. Vance. The remaining land, slaves, mules and other property were again divided into three lots and divided between James Gilmer's two surviving daughters and Mary's estate represented by the tutor, Dr. Whitfield Vance. Dr. Vance's second marriage on April 4, 1861, was to the widowed Sallie James Gayle, who had a four-year-old son, James Gayle. Sallie was born Sarah Eliza James and was a Gilmer relative from Athens, Georgia. Sallie's mother, Sally (Gilmer) James, was a sister of Eliza Lewis Gilmer whose daughter, Mary Boutwell Gilmer, was Dr. S. W. Vance's first wife. Thus, Dr. Vance married, in turn, first cousins. To further entangle the family lines, Mary Boutwell Vance named her daughter Sallie Eliza and Sallie Eliza Vance named her daughter Mary Boutwell Gilmer Vance.

When Martha Gilmer, widow of George O. Gilmer, made her will she bequeathed her moneys and notes to her daughters, Mary and Sarah, except \$1,000 each to her granddaughters, Mary Gilmer Vance and Martha and Eliza Gilmer. She wrote, "I further declare that it is my will that my son George E. Gilmer has received his portion of my estate in the purchase of property from me. It is further my wish that Dr. James W. Vance shall have control of my property and the settling of my estate as he has done so much that I know that he will grant me this last favor." When his mother died on August 11, 1857, George had to execute a series of promissory notes to his sisters totaling \$43,520.

George Edwin Gilmer made his will in Shreveport on April 17, 1861, before leaving for the war. He willed certain slaves to his cousin, Peachy R. Gilmer. All other property he willed to his two surviving nieces and the heirs of the deceased Mary; the nieces being the daughters of his brother James. George fell on the battlefield of Sharpsburg on September 17, 1862. He had appointed Dr. Wash Vance executor of his will.

James Blair Gilmer Vance, son of S. W. and Mary Vance, died June 12, 1864, at the age of seven, leaving an inherited

estate. His property was divided--with S. W. Vance receiving one-fourth; Sallie, his full sister, receiving one-half; and Mary B. G. and Samuel W. Vance, Jr. receiving one-eighth each. Samuel Jr. had been born that year, but James Washington would not be born until 1869.

Samuel W. Vance died at Buck Hall May 18, 1877, naming as executors his widow, Sallie E. Vance, Samuel J. Zeigler and William Calvin Vance. Dr. Vance had made several requests. He desired that he be buried in the old Gilmer burying ground at the south side of his first wife Mary. He wanted his oldest daughter Sallie who had considerable property of her own to receive from his estate only that proportion required by law. He desired that his son, James, should receive a special bequest of \$5,000 in compensation for not having any money of his own. He stipulated that should his widow remarry, her brother, Matthew Gilmer James, not have any control of the property to be managed in the interest of his children. Dr. Whitfield wanted his property left unsold and maintained until his youngest son turned twenty-one. Calvin Vance and Samuel Zeigler each refused the duties of executor whereupon Whitfield's widow accepted the sole responsibility.

Sallie and her husband, S. J. Zeigler, filed suit in parish court for the settlement of the account of her late tutor (and father) S. W. Vance regarding her property. Sallie had inherited from the estates of her mother, her brother James, her grand uncle, George E. Gilmer, and her great grandfather, Peachy R. Gilmer of Alabama, as well as having property of her own under the tutorship. She claimed \$125,000 for the rent of lands and hire of slaves prior to their emancipation; for the value of the personal effects that came into possession of her late tutor; with interest on the different accounts. The suit hinged in part on a legal ruling on applicability of an 1869 law on "tacit mortgages." The court ruled in favor of Sallie Vance Zeigler and against Samuel Vance's executrix (Samuel's widow and Sallie's step-mother) in the amount of \$100,838.14.

The lands of Sallie Vance, wife of Samuel J. Zeigler, amounted to some four thousand acres. Included in the acreage were Shady Grove, 735 acres of Buck Hall, and 2,240 acres of the Plain Dealing Plantation acquired from her grand uncle, George E. Gilmer. Upon the death of Sallie on April 8, 1885, the properties went to Samuel and the Zeigler heirs. Sallie had been preceded in death by an infant son, Samuel Vance Zeigler in 1881. Daughters Susie and Sadie died in 1887 and 1891, respectively. Two other daughters, Mary Lee and Lavina Vance, had been born to the Zeiglers.

Samuel Zeigler envisioned a town on the Arkansas and Shreveport Railroad line to serve the area of the Gilmers' Plain Dealing lands. Samuel operated a store near the old George O. Gilmer homesite at which site he proposed to establish a

town. He promoted an auction to which he attracted prospective buyers from a large regional area, bringing them by excursion trains from Shreveport and Arkansas. He auctioned 348 lots from the depot on July 25, 1888, for the town site which would become Plain Dealing. Plain Dealing has survived Collinsburg, Bollinger, Red Land, Gilmer, Antrim, and Cottage Grove in competition as a trade center for north Bossier Parish and is still a thriving town.

Sallie Vance Zeigler is buried in the family section of the Plain Dealing Cemetery along with Susie, Sadie, and Samuel Vance Zeigler. Samuel J. Zeigler deeded the cemetery to the town of Plain Dealing in 1891. Samuel married Miss Howel McIntosh of South Carolina in 1887, and two children were born to this union. A series of international financial panics, combined with local floods and crop failures, in the early 1890's finally brought about Mr. Zeigler's financial ruin. This man whose business and civic accomplishments have not been fully described here returned with his family to South Carolina.

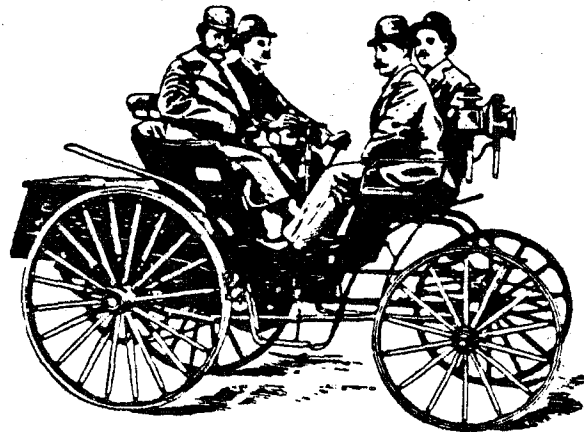

WORLD WAR I DISCHARGE PAPERS
Union Parish, Louisiana

Beginning with this edition, THE GENIE will publish military discharge information of men who served in World War I from Union Parish, Louisiana. After World War I, information from the Discharge Certificate in the possession of the former service member was transcribed to a printed form at the Union Parish Court House. These records published in THE GENIE as they appear in the Court House, except they have been reduced to approximately 85% of their actual size.

These Discharge Records are filed: (1) Officers, all services; (2) Enlisted, Army; (3) Enlisted, Navy and Marine Corps; (4) Wounded, all services. They are published in the same order.

Deputy Clerk of Court, Sue Buckley, has been in charge of this project, assisting members of the Ark-LA-Tex Genealogical Association in their efforts. We thank Ms Buckley for her cooperation. Also thanks to Betty and Carroll Goyne for their interest.

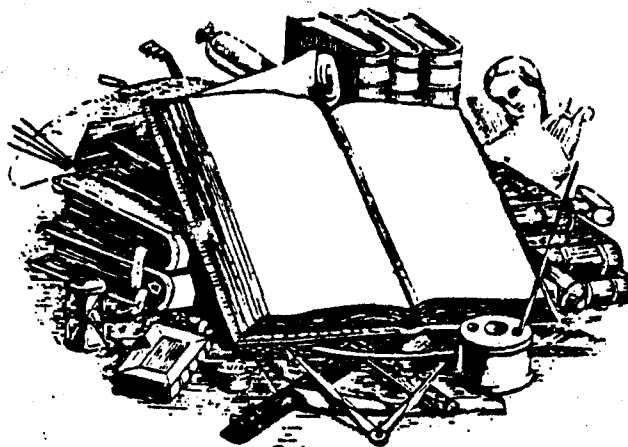

INDIGNANT YOUNG WOMEN

When it was rumored in the 1840's that the Republic of Texas was to be annexed into the Union, the ladies of Boston, Massachusetts protested. Three thousand indignant young women signed a petition published in the Boston Nation stating that the men of Texas were wild and given to dueling. The bachelors of Houston and vicinity responded by writing to the Boston paper describing the resources of the Republic. They proposed marriage to the ladies and promised each new bride two-thirds of a league of land. No word on how many young women responded.

"On March 22, 1810 he was married to Miss Jemima Coleman, _____. To them were born twelve children-six daughters and six sons-eight of whom are now dead-the living are three sons-Wm. Moultrie Griffin of Bethany, Louisiana; Dr. Thomas Coleman Griffin, Lake City, Florida; third son; and Mrs. Dr. Stuart, of Ninety Six, who is the youngest, save one, of the children.

His sons and grandsons took an active part in the late war, and distinguished themselves for gallantry on the field of battle, and for their cheerful endurance of the hardships of the camp. His son, Larkin Griffin, and his grandson, Leonard White, were killed, and John S. Griffin died soon after the surrender of diseases contracted by the exposures of the camp; while another grandson, Major James L. White, who fought in the army of the West _____."

WHITE HOME IN CLAIBORNE PARISH, LA.

(This description of a family and home in Claiborne Parish was written by William White's granddaughter, Elizabeth White O'Neal on 6 Feb 1967. The article and Bible Records were submitted by Veda Thornhill.)

In the late fall of 1851, William White departed from Perry County, Alabama for Claiborne Parish, Louisiana, with his wife, Sophia M. Findley, their children and slaves. He acquired a tract of land located four miles from Lisbon on the Homer-Lisbon road, where he pitched his tent, cleared and farmed his land.

After one year of living in the tent, William White began the construction of his home. The spot he chose for the house is pleasantly located on a rise of a hill on the main road with the expanse of the entire place shaded by a beautiful stand of white oak trees.

The house is of the smaller, intimate type, with more simple charm than architectural merit. It is of frame construction, painted white, and built to fit the needs of the climate and suitable to the materials which were found at hand - cypress and heart pine. The three main sills, front, middle and back are 36 feet long and 1 foot square, and are made of cypress. The inside walls are hand-dressed, hand-matched heart pine. Slave labor was used along with outside carpenters, who were paid \$1.00 per day. It took one year to complete the construction.

The two front rooms, 18 x 18, with end chimneys, made of handmade brick, fired by slave labor, open onto a wide gallery, which extends across the entire width of the house, with four large, square columns, which support the high-pitched roof. On the back of these large front rooms are two smaller rooms. The two entrances on the front gallery have overhead transoms, flanked by two windows on each side. The doors are the original, retain the original hardware, and the transoms and windows contain the original panes.

The heart of this old-time house is the outside kitchen. It has two comparatively large rooms, one for dining and one for cooking, divided by the double fireplace wall. The two rooms served for many household chores in days when household necessities were often made than bought. The window openings were equipped with shutters of batten construction. In the kitchen there was a huge cupboard with shelves for storage of food and a compartment that held 100 pound barrels of flour and sugar. When company was expected, the shelves of this cupboard were filled with baked pies, cakes and other delicious food.

In the center of the foundation of the main house is a cellar which consisted of one large room with fireplace and two smaller rooms for storage. The walls of the large cellar room were brick and the smaller rooms were of heart pine. At times the large room was used for a dining room, and it is said the slaves carried the trays of food from the outside kitchen to the cellar on their heads, and also that the Master of the house required them to start whistling as they prepared to bring the food - in this way he would know they were not eating the food.

In 1864, Sophia M. Findley White departed this life and was buried in the family cemetery behind the house. August 15, 1865, William White married Mrs. Nance E. Foster Killgore, who had one son, William Wade Killgore. An interesting anecdote is told that Mr. White's only marital intention shown to the pretty, young widow was when he helped her mount her horse and said, "Would you like to carry the keys to my pantry?". William White died July 21, 1895, and was buried in the family graveyard by his first wife.

Early in the 1900's, the place changed hands and was bought by William Wade Killgore and his wife, Dollie Gilbert. It has remained in this family ever since. The present owners are granddaughters, Miss Dorothy E. Killgore, Mrs. Charlene Patterson and Mrs. Joyce Haile. The house was remodeled several years ago by the addition of a bathroom and a modern kitchen.

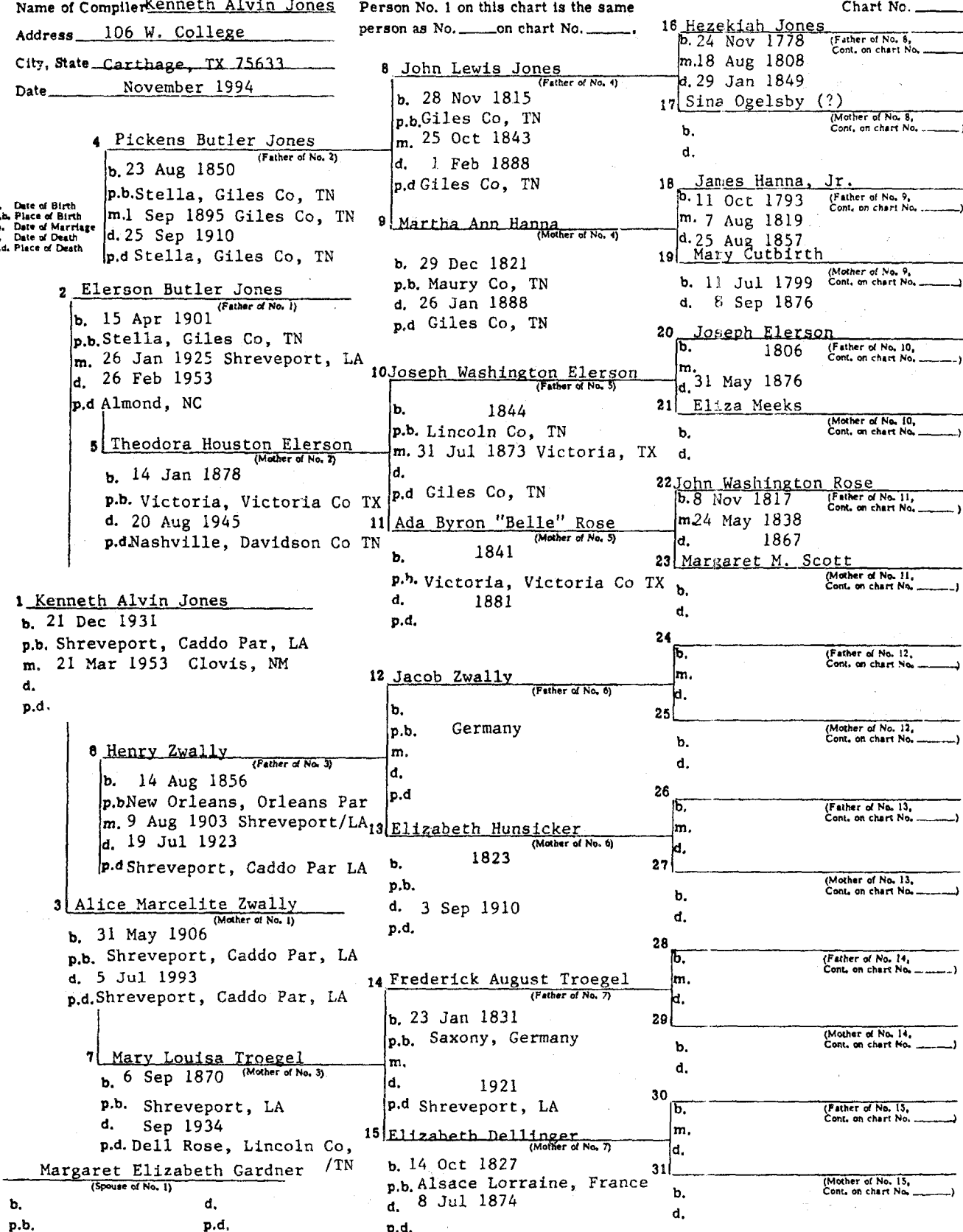

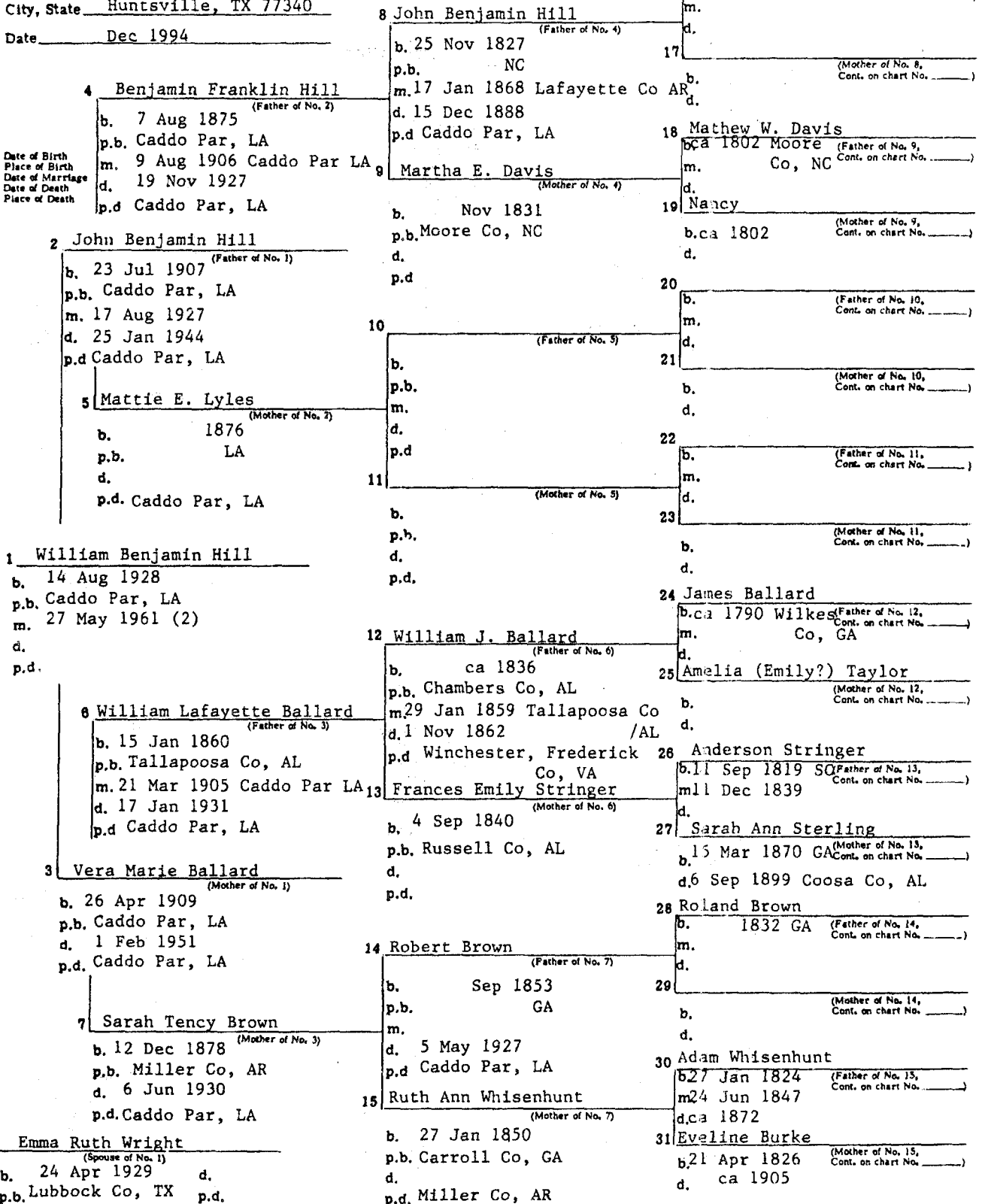

TITLE: INDEX TO DEATHS AND BURIALS RECORDED IN MARSHALL, TEXAS REGISTER OF DEATHS AND BURIALS 1880-1905. Compiled by Harrison County Genealogical Society.

The introduction states that on 15 May 1880, the City of Marshall passed an ordinance requiring permits for burial or removal of any deceased for burial elsewhere, and required that a Register of Deaths and Burials be kept by the City Recorder. Sixteen pieces of information were to be recorded, but many blanks were not filled in. This is an alphabetical index of this Register. It gives the name, age, race, sex, date of death and cemetery of disposition of the remains. It contains both whites and African Americans. The original register is in the Harrison County Museum, but a microfilm copy and hand-transcribed abstracts are available for research. This is a must have for Harrison County researchers as it predates vital statistics. Size 8½ x 11. Paper Bound. 87 Pages.

POLYGAMY IN GERMANY

The Eastern Nebraska Genealogical Society, Roots & Leaves published an article based on an article in Antique Week's Genealogy Dept., 16 May 1994 regarding polygamy. It describes the years following the Thirty Years War, 1618-1684, when the population of what is now Germany fell from 16 million to about 4 million people. In order to repopulate devastated areas, teenagers were encouraged to marry young, priests were permitted to marry to raise families and polygamy was advocated and sanctioned. A law in 1650 gave men in northern Bavaria permission to have up to 10 wives at the same time. In your research from 1650-1700, keep the possibility of polygamy in mind. (Source: CGSA Newsletter, Oct. 1994).
