I feel we will continue to grow as more and more people become interested in looking for their roots---Happy Hunting:



LOUIS FRANCOIS MOUGEOT FROM FRANCE TO LOUISIANA

(My grandfather by Stella Mougeot, ALTGA member from Bossier City, LA)

Louis Francois Mougeot was born in Sainte-Marie -Aux Mines, Haut-Rhin, France on 14 Jan 1829, the fifth of eight children. His parents were Jean Dominique Mougeot aged 35 at time of his birth and a merchant, and Odile Spiess aged 24. His paternal grandparents were Joseph Hubert Mougeot and Marie Madelaine Kuhn. Maternal grandparents were Norbert Spiess (Tinsmith) and Charlotte Resch. His paternal great-grandfather was Jean Dominique Mougeot.

Sainte-Marie -Aux-Mines is in an area that has mines supplying silver, lead, copper, cobalt and arsenic, which gives the town its name. The weaving of fine woolen cloth has been the source of its prosperity since the eighteenth century.

When Louis was eighteen years old, he applied for a passport, showing his "occupation" as "Brasseur" (worked in cafe), place of origin St. Marie Aux Mines, destination, New Orleans, USA. Emigration date was 26 Jul 1847. He was the only member of his family to leave home for life in the New World, showing that he was undoubtedly a very courageous young man. He arrived in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1847. The next record found was the 1850 Census of the United States, Waterloo, Pointe Coupe Parish, Louisiana. (Page 52, household No. 453.) He was listed along with six other persons as family No. 453. Three of these people were also from France and their occupations were cooper. Of the others living in this household was Eugene Major, aged 16, a brother of Aspasie Major, whom Louis married later on. From this I assume they were living in a boarding house at Waterloo.

At that time, Waterloo was a thriving river town, which shipped out sugar and other products from the rich plantations that lined False River in Pointe Coupe Parish. As an old port town, it was active in the 19th century, and most of the commerce that went on in the New Roads area was shipped out via the Mississippi River from this port town, which probably is the reason Louis settled there.

In May 1852, P. Joffrion, guardian of Aspasie Major (minor) wrote to the Clerk of Court granting his permission for the marriage of Aspasie to Louis Mougeot. On May 5, 1852, Louis Mougeot and Aspasie Major were married in a Civil Ceremony. Aspasie's parents were Benjamin Major dit Bosseron and Eugenie Joffrion. Of this marriage the following children were born:

On 11 Jun 1855, Louis Mougeot was admitted as a citizen of the United States and improvements at Waterloo, Pointe Coupe Parish, Louisiana fronting 56' on the Mississippi River, 11 Feb 1863, and also purchased an arpent of land at Waterloo on 27 Feb 1871. This was where the family resided until the turn of the century, when railroads came and the town was abandoned. The Mougeot home was moved to New Roads around 1895. Louis also purchased three arpents of land on the Island side (now Ventress, LA) of False River, because when the Mississippi River flooded, the family would move there. This house is of similar construction/design as the one built in Waterloo and moved to New Roads. Descendants of Justine Mougeot (who married Bernard Swindler) continue to live in this same house. He died 14 May 1881 at age 52, resident of Waterloo.

Aspasie Major Mougeot died 15 Jan 1898 at age 63, a resident of New Roads.

OLD RED RIVER CEMETERY Bossier Parish, Louisiana

To reach the Old Red River Cemetery, drive north from Bossier City on Airline Drive. After crossing I-220, drive approximately six miles and turn right on West Linton Road. After approximately three miles, turn left on a dirt road identified as Deville Road. Appearing almost immediately on a little rise on the right is the cemetery, dominated by two tall tombstones inside a wrought iron fence. The general site is known as "Wallace Spring" for an old spring just to the east across Linton Road.

The cemetery is known to have existed at least as early as 1860, although the earliest date of death recorded on any of the existing grave stones is 1866. Many of the grave sites are no longer marked. Nearly half of the tombstones are located inside the wrought iron fence. These are the Arnolds, Brownlees, and members of related families, ancestors and relatives of Larri Jennings, wife of Association member, Dale Jennings. Most of the others are dispersed along an old road just to the west of the fenced graveyard.

The known chronology of the Old Red River Cemetery is as follows. On August 25, 1860, J. J. Knight and A. B. Hughes donated to Deacons Richard Whitehurst and William Perritt of the Red River Baptist Church, one and a half acres at "the Red River grave yard and where the Red River Church now stands." The Red River Baptist Church was established in 1849 at the "Willow Chute" neighborhood near Red River just south of Benton. It had moved to the Wallace Spring site to jointly occupy a building with the Methodists.

On September 4, 1860, J. J. Knight and A. B. Hughes donated unto all religious denominations for religious and educational purposes, four acres "where the Red River Church now stands." This was done and signed in the presence of William J. Arnold and Charles W. Arnold, who witnessed and attested to the conveyance. The Arnolds and Brownlees were predominately Presbyterians although the name Charles Wesley Arnold suggests a Methodist background.

On June 7, 1861, Deacons Whitehurst and Perritt were tasked by the church to acquire a tract of land on which to build its own facility. Such a site was located at a spring near Brother Whitehurst's house about a mile to the north. A donation deed for three acres was obtained from John A. and Mary J. Brownlee. The deed contained a reversion clause in that if the land ceased to be used for its intended purpose or if a grocery or drinking place were to be erected on the grounds, title would revert back to the Brownlees. There is no indication that this new location was ever utilized. The church later relocated to Pine Grove, and later, in 1902, built on its present location across

Cypress Bayou (now Cypress Lake) at the community of Linton. The present Red River Baptist Church at that site has a cemetery (Lay Cemetery) which is sometimes confused with the old cemetery.

on April 12, 1876, Charles R. Griswold conveyed unto C. W. Arnold and William R. Prather, representing the trustees of the North Bossier Circuit, Shreveport District, Louisiana Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church South, the forty acres containing the Red River Cemetery. On January 16, 1895, the Methodist Church sold to J. W. Wallace the forty acres "less five acres reserved for the purpose of a graveyard, said five acres to be located where the present graveyard known as the Red River graveyard is now situated." The Methodist Conference presently owns and holds a tax exemption on the cemetery seperoperty*

CIVIL WAR LETTER OF DR. W.M. JEFFRESS

Willis Marion Jeffress was born in 1827 near Brookhaven, MS, the youngest of five children born to Rev. Jim Jeffress and Mary Parks Jeffress. His father was a Methodist minister and is said to have organized the Methodist church at Bethel, a community four miles east of Jonesboro, LA. It is now the Center Point Methodist Church which has been moved from the original site.

Willis Marion Jeffress married Marinda Wright, a school teacher, on 1 Jan 1852 in Lawrence County, MS. Willis and Marinda moved to Jackson Parish soon after their marriage and had the following children there:

- 1) Julia Jeffress b. 7 Jan 1854, d. 10 Dec 1938, married Reuben McDonald 21 Jun 1882. Their children were Alice, Esther, Willis B., James, Bessie, Faedra, Foster, and Jeffress McDonald. Julia was known as "Granny McDonald" and lived her entire life within a few miles of her birthplace in Jackson Parish. She is buried in the McDonald Cemetery near Jonesboro.
- 2) John Jackson Jeffress b. 1855, d. 12 Feb 1902, married Bettie E. Carroll 30 Oct 1879. Their children were Callie Elizabeth, Minnie Vera, Laurine Leslie, Charles Wilburn, Willis David, Rex Coleman, Eva, Walter Neville, and John J. Jeffress.
- 3) Robert P. Jeffress b. 9 Feb 1857, d. 25 Feb 1925, married Ada Callie Anders. They had May Olive, Carl, Emmett, and Raymond Jeffress. Robert was a plysician and practiced in Jackson, Winn, Bienville, and Lincoln Parishes.
- 4) William Jeffress b. 23 Jan 1859, d. 4 Jan 1945, married Alice McDonald. Their children were Lovie, Mary, Ed, Tip, Elizabeth, Robert, Walter, Margaret, and David Jeffress. William was a successful businessman and lived for a time in the Rio Grande Valley near Harlingen, Texas. He is buried in Jonesboro Cemetery.
 - 5) James Franklin Jeffress born 26 May, 1860, d. 22 April 1862.
 - 6) Willis A.M.M.P. Jeffress b. 23 Feb 1862, d. Sep 1863.

Willis Marion Jeffress was a doctor in the Confederate Army during the first year of the Civil War according to Jewell M. Jeffress and Alta M. Jeffress, compilers of the "Jeffress Family History", source of the above family data (Jackson Parish Library, Jonesboro, LA). He was attached to Co. D of the 12th Regiment of Louisiana Volunteers. The following is a letter he wrote to his father-in-law, Major James Wright. Permission to publish this letter was graciously given by Mrs. George Rogers of Saline, LA. She is the great-granddaughter of Willis M. Jeffress,

granddaughter of Julia Jeffress and Reuben McDonald, and daughter of Henry and Esther McDonald Scroggin. Mrs. Rogers has possession of the original letter. Dr. Jeffress died 28 April 1862, not many days after writing this letter. It is not known if he was killed in battle or died of disease, as so many did.

His letter differs from the normal 'How's Aunt Sue and the corn doing?' type. Apparently his father-in-law was, or had been, in the military, therefore he concentrated on relating military matters of interest to him, making this letter historically significant.

Fort Pillow, Tennessee
March 23rd, 1862

Dear Father.

I improve the present oportunity in writing you a short epistle to let you know that I am well and give you the news from this part of the Army. In order that you may know all about our trip from home to this place I will commence from Jackson, Mississippi. When we got there we were told that Columbus was evacuated but our Maj. would not believe it so he telegraphed to Gen. Beauregard to know when to go. Beauregard telegraphed back for him to go on to Columbus, but when we got to Grand Junction we found out for certain that Columbus was evacuated and that our Reg. was at Island No. 10. We turned for Memphis. I found Memphis to be a considerable city with some of the finest buildings I ever saw. We got on a steamboat and left for our Reg. When we got there we found our Troops in great excitement expecting an attack from the yankees, which were in sight of New Madrid, a little town in Missouri about 10 miles below Island No. 10. In order that you may better understand where these places are I will give you the best geographical description that I can; Island No. 10 is a small island in the Mississippi River oposite New Madrid Bend, about one mile one way and 1/2 mile the other. Our Reg. with a good many others were stationed on the bank of the river oposite the Island. Where we were stationed was in Tennessee near the Kentucky line about forty miles below Columbus. I will now tell you something about the bombardment at Island No. 10 and New Mardrid Bend which commenced on Saturday the 15th. Just the gun boats came down in sight of our batteries and opened fire on them but were too far off to do any damage and our men concluded not to return the fire until they got closer. So the yankees kept up the fire that day and the next day without being interupted by our batteries. The next day, Monday, they advanced a little closer when our guns opened fire on them. After five or six shots from our guns two of the gun boats were struck and one was about to sink

when they sent two other boats down and carried her off. In the mean time one of their tug boats came down to pull an old boat out of the way that our men had partly sunk in the river on a narrow pass to keep them from passing and one of our gun boats put after her and hauled her in. During all this time they (the yankees) had done us no damage and up to the last heard from there, they had done us no damage and all the damage that was done on our side was by one of our cannon bursting which killed 3 of our men and wounded 7 more. We were on the bank of the river when the cannonading commenced. The bomb shells would burst over us high up in the air, too high to do any damage. We were ordered back from the river about a mile from under the shells. We stayed there one day and then ordered to this place. This place is the best fortified that I ever saw. It is on a high bluff with a breast work on the river for about 1/2 mile and cannon planted all along, and a breast work commencing at the lower end and running back for about 2 miles from the river and extending all around all of our Troops and back to the river, and all the timber cut down for some distance beyond the breast works so that the vankees cannot have the timber for a shelter. We have about 10 or 15 thousand men here, enough I think to hold it against 50 thousand yankees. [Southern arrogance at it's best] Gen. Beauregard and Jeff Davis is concentrating a large force at Jackson and Corinth. They have been expecting a big battle in that country and we expected to be ordered out there but we have just heard that Gen. Buel has fallen back so we may stay here for sometime. I have nothing more interesting to write at present. I want you to write to me as soon as you receive this. Direct your letter to Fort Pillow, Tennessee to the care of Capt. J.H. Seale, Co. D, 12th Reg. La. Volunteers. Give my respects to enquiring friends and accept my love and respects for yourself.



This book contains abstracts of examinations in the High Court of Admiralty with references to Colonial America. These Abstracts were taken from Examinations in Equity Cases which are depositions taken in London in support of the allegations of plaintiffs and defendants. Examinations by Commission which are depositions taken outside London, Examinations in Criminal Cases and Interrogations which are questions asked of witnesses. The cases are listed here and followed by abstracts of the depositions taken. Admiralty Courts had jurisdiction over cases involving the high seas, but also in the Colonies could, by quest, hear cases involving people who lived within the tidal zones on rivers. erefore, your ancestors can be mentioned in Admiralty Court Records without owning a ship, a part of one or being involved with the high seas. Due to lack of communications, poor roads and very sparse rail and telegraph connections across Texas during the mid-nineteenth century most news was carried by newspapers. These newspapers belonged to an "exchange list" and editors picked up news that was of interest to their readers from these other papers and printed it. This book, which abstracts death records from 40 Texas newspapers, contains over 800 deaths from 18 other states and reference is made to 56 newspapers published outside of Texas. Many of these death abstracts give beside place and date of death, either place of birth or residence, often the cause of death. Some give the age, and frequently the spouse is mentioned. This book is a Hutchins encyclopedia and a gold mine to everyone researching these families. It provides missing links to tie families to the earlier generations.
