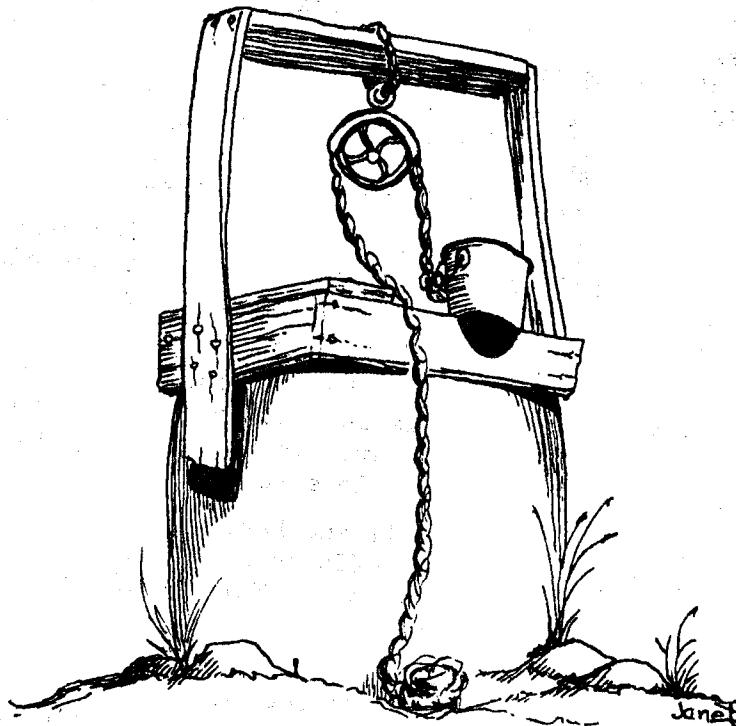
My doubts have melted. I have come to see that ALTGA has a life of its own. I am very excited about the coming months. I would welcome any suggestions from our members as to future programs, etc.

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# 1850 UNION PARISH LOUISIANA CENSUS, MORTALITY SCHEDULE

Timothy D. Hudson

(Our member in Winterville, NC)

## 1. INTRODUCTION

Each of the federal censuses between 1850 and 1880 contained several different parts, called *schedules*. In all four years there were population schedules (which most of us simply refer to as "the census"), agricultural schedules, manufacturing schedules, and mortality schedules; in 1850 and 1860, there were slave schedules. The schedules were usually enumerated all at once.

The mortality schedule of the 1850 census was supposed to list the name of each person who had died in the year between 1 June 1849 and 31 May 1850. Besides the name of the deceased, the census enumerator recorded the place of birth, the age, sex, occupation, marital status, and cause of death of the person who died. The given names of the slaves who died are also given. Unfortunately, the enumerator of Union Parish Louisiana did not list the name of the owner of the slaves who died as was done in some other parishes. However, in some cases a surname was given for the slave, probably the surname of the owner.

## 2. ENUMERATOR'S REMARKS

At the bottom of each page was a space for remarks by the census enumerator. George A. Hammonds was the enumerator for Union Parish, and here are his remarks:

The small-pox and cholera raged to some extent in the Parish; they were brought here by immigrants who contracted them in New Orleans. The small pox extended over a large portion of the Parish but did not prove fatal in but few instances. The cholera was confined entirely to the immigrants and persons living on the Ouachita river. The land is of a light grey color with a Sandy foundation and very much broken, but is well adapted to raising cotton and corn.

The water is free-Stone impregnated with Sulpher and iron. The principle growth on the Hills is pine and white oak, and on the Bayous Sypress [sic]. The Rocks are composed of sand and iron.

## 3. ANALYSIS OF DEATHS

There were 114 recorded deaths in Union Parish in the year from 1 June 1849 until 31 May 1850. The leading cause of death was pneumonia, followed by deaths from unknown causes, consumption (tuberculosis), and cholera. Of the 11 reported deaths attributed to cholera, 10 occurred between January and March. There were five deaths from cholera in January and February 1850 that appear to be one group of people: a merchant named John D. Rimes, aged 46, and four slaves, Spencer, 28, Rachael, 40, Jessee, 50, and Jacob, 60. In addition, a

husband and wife died of cholera in March 1850; he was a physician. All cholera deaths were listed together, so as the enumerator indicated, they must have occurred at the same place.

Age and race appear to have played a factor in the deaths. Only 48 of the 114 people who died were aged over 15. There were 50 children aged 5 and under who died, and 38 of these were aged 2 and under. There were 74 white deaths and 40 black ones, and only 15 of the 40 total black deaths were aged over 15. Of the 38 children aged 2 and under whose deaths were recorded, 22 were black. Thus, it appears that young black children had a much higher mortality rate than their white counterparts.

All deaths attributed to whooping cough were young black children. In May 1850 alone, 5 slaves aged 1, 2, 2, 4, and 6 died from whooping cough. Does this indicate better health care for the whites or were the blacks more susceptible to whooping cough? Unbelievably (by twentieth century American standards), there were 3 deaths of black children aged 1, 1, and 3 attributed to worms.

The precise breakdown of the various causes of death and the number of deaths attributed to each of these causes is as follows:

### 4. THE MORTALITY SCHEDULE

Below is a verbatim transcription of the 1850 Union Parish Louisiana Mortality Schedule. I have used the original (and at times, arcane) spelling. There are 4 pages of the original records, and they were later numbered as 728, 729, 732, and 733. As the enumerator said there were only 4 pages, none are missing in spite of the gap in the page numbers..

There were 11 columns on the original, but since all the non-white deaths were of slaves, I have omitted the "free or slave" column. The column abbreviations are as follows:

s — sex of the person who died

c — "colour" of the person who died

"b" means "black" and "m" means "mulatto"; only the non-white people had a mark in this column

m — marital status of the decedent

"m" means the deceased was married and "w" means widowed; single people and slaves had no mark in this column

b — this is the state of birth of the deceased

I have abbreviated the state names from the originals; in one case the place of birth was given as "unknown" and I used "UN" for this

died — this is the month in which the person died

occup — this was the profession, occupation, or trade of the person who died  
it was often left blank

cause — the disease or cause of death

I have used the exact spellings on the original records except that the enumerator used "C" for consumption at times and I have written the word out

days ill — this is the number of days the deceased was ill before death

Unfortunately, in this census year there was no direct correlation between the mortality and population schedules. However, by comparing the two schedules, in most cases it is easy to determine to which households the deceased white people belonged. In a few cases, when a surname was given for a slave, it is possible to determine the household that was most likely the owner of that slave. I have listed that information immediately below each entry, giving the household number from the population schedule and the ages of the apparent relatives/owners. This information is not proven, and should be verified with other sources.

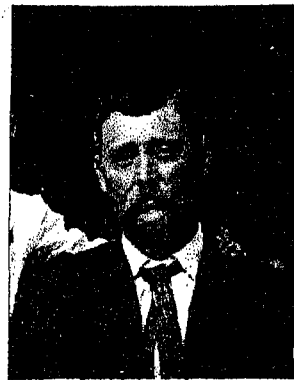

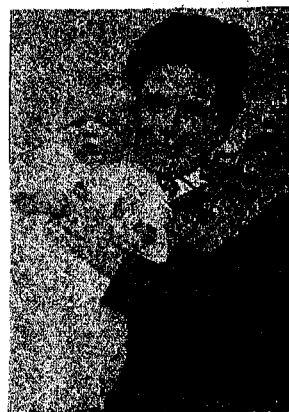

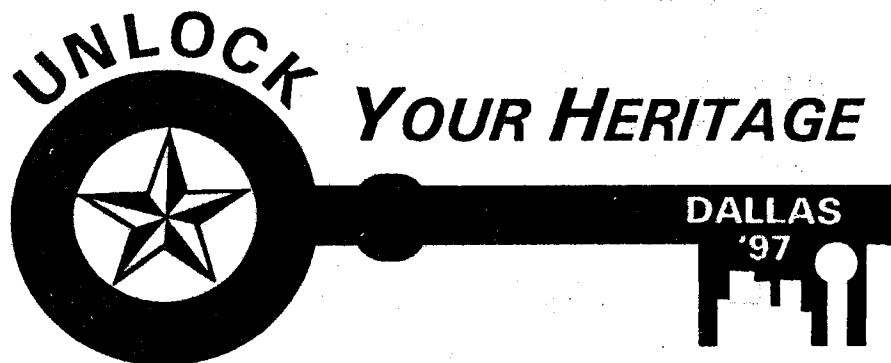

This is a volume of 6 of the author's series in linking the Cherokee Nation of 1851 "The Drennan Roll" and of 1906-10 "The Guion Miller Applications". Each of the 6 volumes deal with different districts. This one is of the Tahlequah and Skin Bayou Districts, which is basically Cherokee and Sequoyah Counties. If you have Native American ancestry from these locations, you will be rewarded by checking this volume. 1995, size 8½ x 11, 169 pp, indexed, soft-bound.

These are covered in the first eight chapters of the book. Each of these chapters has its own index, there is no master index. The remainder of the book contains photographs, family histories, documents of significance, cemetery listings and a namelist of the GEDCOM data base. He has also included a diskette of this data base in the notebook back pocket. It includes all the death notices and mentions those found in the available issues of the White River Journal. These newspapers are on microfilm at the Arkansas History Commission in Little Rock, AR. Each 25 year period is an alphabetical listing naming the deceased, other facts available, such as burial location, spouse name, maiden name, parent's names and survivors. Each section of 25 years has its own index. You will want to read the compiler's instructions very carefully before accepting the entries as fact. 1996, size 8½ x 11, 73 pp, index, softbound.

Reta Mae Collins' grandfather lived in Rapides Parish, but when her father, M. I. Collins, married Ann Lee of Vernon Parish, the couple remained there and the stage was set for the joining of the Bennett and Collins families in Simpson, LA.

The book is in three sections with Section I being the Bennett Family. Section II being the Collins Family and Section III being a list of cemeteries and the family members buried there.

This is one of the most interesting and well written books I have had the privilege to review. The story of the life of Alexander Ringhoffen comes alive and you can easily feel and experience the events of his life. He was born in Hungary and came to the U.S. at age 17, with his parents, in 1887. His first job in the U. S. was driving the Texas Governor's carriage while his father worked to construct the Texas Capitol building. Completion of the building found the family moving to the Center, Texas area where he became involved in mining. His first mine was at Loving, Texas in 1910. Later he was in Young County, Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Colorado before settling in Salt Valley, Utah, where he discovered and named the Devil's Garden, in what is now Arches National Park.

This book is a look by his grand-daughter into all aspects of his life, marriage, children, his work as a miner, prospector, trail blazer and dabbler in many other things. The State of Louisiana established a poll tax in 1868 as a requisite to voting. The tax applied to all males over the age of 21. The proceeds were for school and charitable purposes. The tax was abolished in 1934.

New Orleans was divided into 11 Wards and some ward records are not available. The 1869 rolls consist of Wards 2, 3, 5, and 6. The 1870 rolls consist of 3 additional wards-7, 8 and 9. This book contains the names of 26,401 individuals who were assessed a poll tax in these two years. The names are listed alphabetically followed by two numbers, the first is the ward (district) followed by the page number in the original book. If you locate the name in this index, the original book may be checked for the individuals address. This address may give you a clue as to closest church he may have attended or his residence when the 1870 Federal Census was taken. 1996, 8½ x 11, 252 pp, softcover.

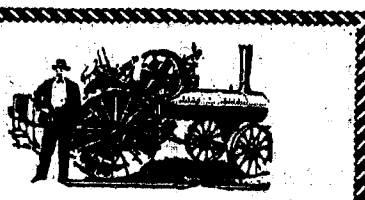

If you or someone you know lost a loved one during WWI or WWII, whose body was buried overseas, the following may be of interest to you.

The American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) is an independent agency of the Executive Branch of the United States Federal Government. It is responsible for commemorating the Services of American Armed Forces where they have served since the United States entered WWI on April 6, 1917. Their function is to erect, operate and maintain memorial shrines and permanent American Military burial grounds in foreign countries. Each grave site in the American World I and II cemeteries is marked with a white marble cross or a shaft surmounted with the Star of David.

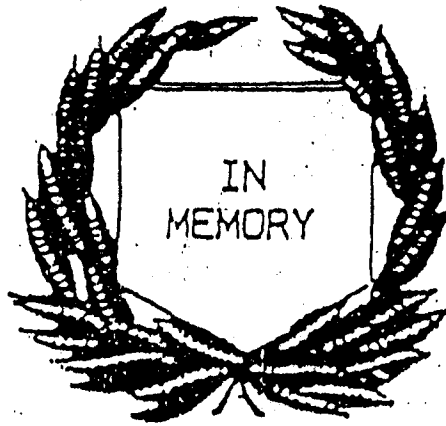
