CONFEDERATE VETERANS AT REST: ARCHEOLOGICAL AND BIOARCHEOLOGICAL INVESTIGATIONS AT THE TEXAS STATE CEMETERY, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS

(Reports of Investigations No. 107, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, 4200 Smith School Road, Austin, Texas 78744, 512-389-4800. Douglas K. Our 1st vice-president, Betty Jon Gorman submitted this information obtained from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in Austin, TX. It was printed in the Austin Genealogical Quarterly Vol. XXXVII, No. 3, Austin, TX. 1996)

This commentary is intended to describe the above publication rather than review it. Those of us who live in the Austin area are at least minimally aware of the Texas State Cemetery, located between Comal, Navasota, Seventh and Eleventh Streets. It was established in 1851 and according to the report it is the only official state cemetery in any of the 50 United States. It has become the final resting place for over 3000 important Texans and spouses, including Stephen F. Austin, many governors and outstanding citizens, and General Albert Sidney Johnston and veterans and heroes of the Confederate States of America.

Interest in the cemetery languished for decades but improvements were made in 1910-15 and the early 1930's. Any of us passing the Cemetery along Seventh Street during the past several months has been aware of considerable construction and renovation activity on the site. This activity was initiated by a state interagency effort coordinated by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. It was started in 1995 as a state project "to promote the cemetery as a historical site, to increase public access to and visitation of the cemetery, and to foster public awareness of the many important historical figures who are buried there." It is a commendable undertaking in which all Texans can share pride of accomplishment.

The impetus for the above-referenced report was the realization that implementation of the renovation would require the moving of 57 burials of Confederate veterans and spouses within the cemetery to allow for landscaping and other objectives. It is the TP&W's eternal credit that from the first they handled this task with utmost respect for the remains and their descendants. Most of the deceased veterans had been residents of the Confederate Veterans' Home in Austin. An extended effort was made to determine and contact next-of-kin for all 57 but was successful for only 11 from which permission for moving was obtained. As for the remainder, the Department requested the United Daughters of the Confederacy and the Sons of Confederate Veterans to represent them as next-of-kin. A number of other interested organizations, including the Austin Genealogical Society, were also consulted about the project.

This particular report, as the title indicates, covers principally the archeological and bioarcheological aspects of the movings and in that sense offers little information of genealogical nature beyond the names and birth and death dates (and causes) of the 51 Confederate veterans and 6 spouses whose remains were moved. Since it is a scientific study, there are graphic descriptions of the findings in each of the 57 re-burials, including such details as pathology, coffin hardware and extraneous objects. Of some genealogical interest is the information that there had also been burials

of Federal soldiers in the northeast part of the cemetery during the Reconstruction era. No current remains were found, and it has been determined from examination of various records that 62 burials in the National Cemetery on Paso Hondo Street in San Antonio had been moved there from Austin, possibly between 1880 and 1900. These records are being maintained at the Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery. The report presumes that no Federal troop burials remain in the State Cemetery.

AGS is grateful to Parks and Wildlife for sending us a copy of this report and are handing it along to the Texas State Library. No additional copies are currently on hand, but they should be available in P&W's new Visitor's Center here in Austin when it opens next year.

Reuben Tucker Raborn was born in 1841, in Amite Co., MS. In 1850, he moved to Bienville Parish, LA, near Lucky, with parents, Elzy and Martha Ann Mixon Raborn, and sisters, Thurza Ann and Meliss. He married Armenia Prothro on 11 January 1862, in Natchitoches Parish, LA. Her parents were Frances and J. Edmund Prothro from Orangeburg District, SC. R.T. and Armenia's daughter, Annie Tucker Staley Raborn was born in Natchitoches Parish on 20 September 1862, three days after her father was killed at Sharpsburg, MD.

Annie T. S. Raborn married Will Hugh Phillips on 11 December 1881. They are my grandparents.

(Letter from R. T. Raborn to his wife, Armenia)

April 25, 1862

Camp, VA.

My Dear Armenia

I take this opportunity of addressing you again. I would not have had this chance of writing but marching orders were countermanded. We are now within two miles of the base of Blue Ridge, having marched about fourteen miles yesterday. I was very much exhausted when I got here but better this morning. Think I am able for another one to day. I withstood the route as well as any of the company. The first march I took after I came to camp Buchanan on the Rappahannock nearly laid me up. It was about 25 miles through mud and rains all the time, and out on crossties besides. You never conceived of such a time. Old soldiers said it surpassed any thing they had ever seen. Since then I have set up all night in the rain without any shelter, except a little hay, nodding. Could not lie down without getting my whole side wet. So I took my sleep sitting up. The next day it snowed all day. We moved our encampment about halfmile to a better place. I know, Love, you will think that awful for me to stand but I have withstood it all without being sick except cold. But the boys were sick on every side of me. Near half of our Company is sick. But this weather is very fine now and I hope the boys will improve. The reason why we are here we are going to re-inforce Gen Jackson in the mountains. He is about 14 miles from us now. He had a fight 2 days before this but I do not know the result only that he still occupies the same position. The supposition is that we will be in an engagement in a few days but we do not know what we are going to do no more

than you. Do not trouble yourself love about my condition on account of the bad picture I have represented. Spring has began to open here. We have had but very little cold weather here since we came. But I could see snow distinctly on the mountain tops as we came along yesterday. We could not have come in a more favorable time for health, than when we did--. This is a beautiful country according to my conception. Everywhere look very old. All the land almost are cleared up and the timber all off it, but it grows fine grain. It seems as if the lands are as lasting as Red River lands. There is no scarcity of good water. The prettiest springs and brooks imaginable, except immediately in the mountains. A new Col was elected the other day Stafford (Hafford?) Some think a better selection could have been made. I think so myself. One of the Eight Reg stole a hog the other day and was caught. He had to carry it on his shoulders for a whole day nearly, through the rain and snow as retribution.

Some will not represent the true thing in their letters but what I write will be as near correct as I can make truth to you. I would not write anything that was discouraging to Ma. I can enjoy myself very well here, much better than I expected. I meet old friends ever and anon, which affords me pleasure. Bunyan has been trying to get his discharge arranged but the brigade has been in such commotions Since he got his certificate from the Hospital Surgeon that he has not been able to get it signed by the officers. I saw him day before yesterday but did not speak to him. During our first march through the mud I stopped at Orange. I was put up at a private house with him and Dr. Ari (?) Wright. I expect I would have been sick had I not stopped. My Goodness! the smoke nearly puts out my eyes. Johns are nearly blind from the smoke, to lazy to move out of it. I had the misfortune to loose my knapsack when we retreated from Rappahannok. I was out on picket duty when marching orders came. It was put among the other baggage on the cars and nobody was able to get their baggages. John lost his also. He sends his respects to you and says he is still able to claim the top side of the ground. The Jackson Grays and Maj Kavanaugh were all taken prisoners at Huntsville Ala But some have got away and came in this morning.

There were some of our company taken too. I expect from an act lately past, Sam will be brought in his own place so he can not relieve me. But I hope that I shall not want a substitute. I hope to return to you Love, soon, but no one can say. Our cause begins to look gloomy sure. And how awful will it be to come home and our nation whipped. The picture is too dreadful to contemplate. If Bunyan goes shortly and I can send a letter by him I will do so. I sent one to Pa by Old Col Walker. He left a few days ago for home. Grove Cook is our capt now. Give my love to all the family. Tell them to write. I would write to more persons than you and Pa but all the ink and paper I use I borrow. Write whether Laurine was in Corinth (?) fight or not. I cant hear. You know I am pretty close raw (?) for I had to go without a shirt until mine could be washed. You must write me all that you think would be interesting. Lt Kidd is going home and I will send this by him or to Richmond where he will mail it. I saw Tompkins the other day. In talking he said a man would loose all desire for home but when I cease to love home you may consider me another man. I will close Remembering your promise. I am your absent but loving husband.

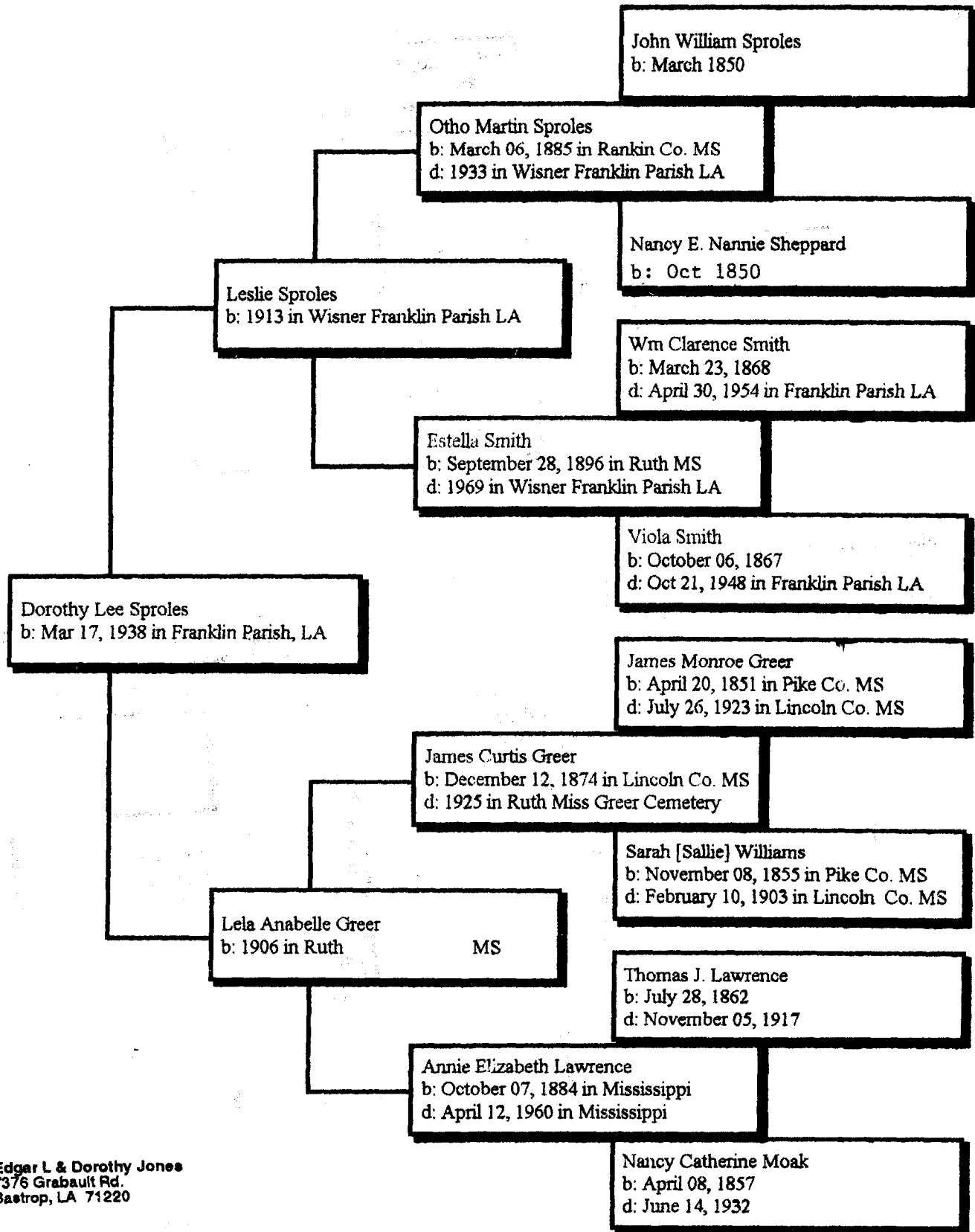

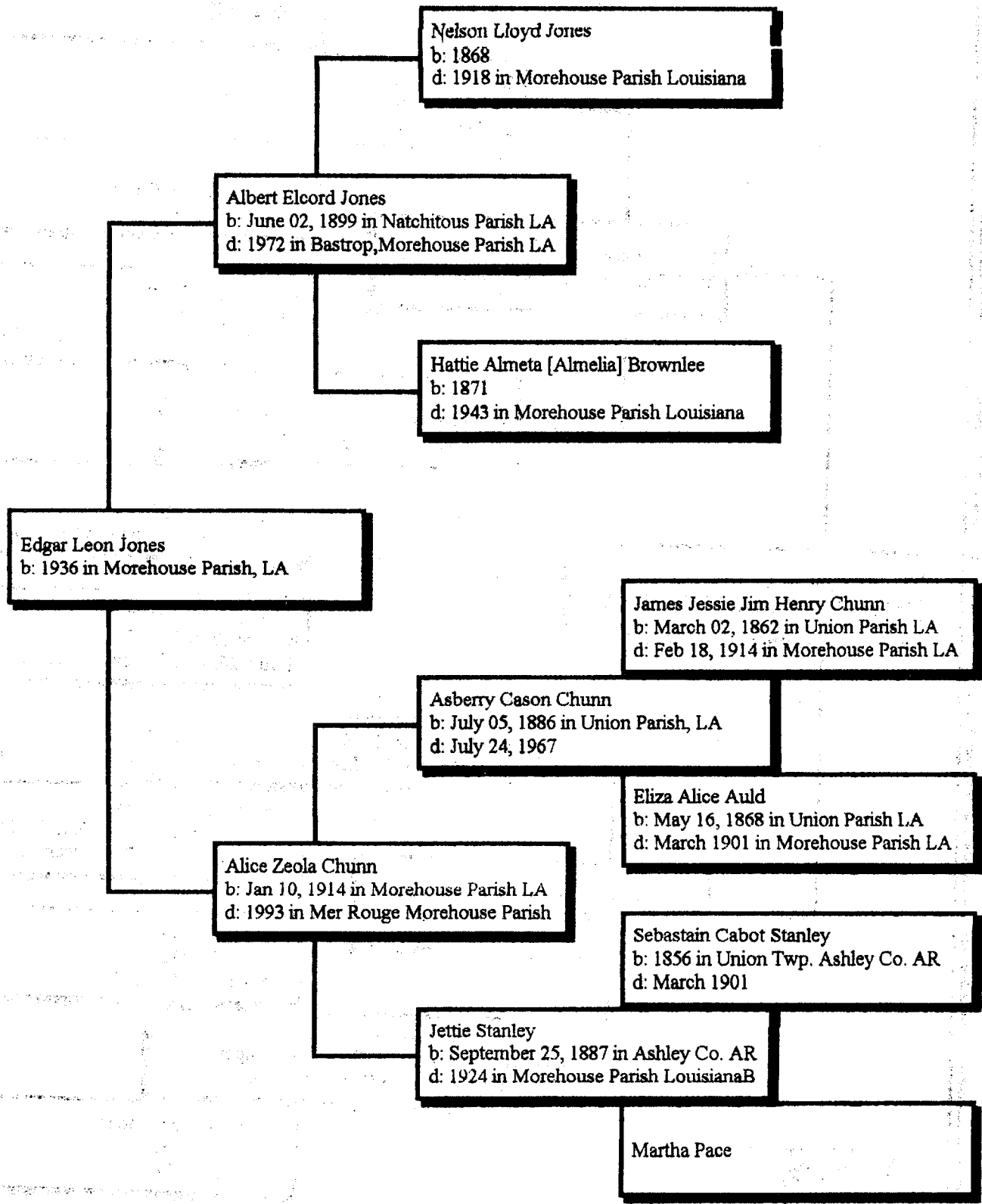

Less than a year later Baxter penned the words and tune to a song which he named "I'm A Ding Dong Daddy From Dumas." The Radio Station call letter is KDDD, which of course came from the song. The book is a pictorial history of the town with many of the old-time families furnishing the pictures. Buildings are in abundance in the book. The high school football, baseball and basketball teams are pictured and identified. FROM NATCHEZ TO BATON ROUGE

In the summer of 1789 as the Revolution raged in Paris and France, Manuel Gayose de Lemon began his eight years as Governor of Natchez. His wife, Teresa Hopman died there, and in December of 1797, he married his second wife's sister, Marguerite Watts, a native of Baton Rouge, LA. This was the year that he sold his plantation and home to the new (and newly Americanized) Governor of Natchez, Steven Minor.

Two Hundred and thirty-six English and American oaths of fidelity were pledged at Spanish Natches in 1787, following the fall of English rule at the end of the American Revolution. The document of their affirmation was signed by Don Louis Chacre and Carlos de Gran Pre'.

That Don Carlos retained his plantation in Greater Natchez while he was Governor of the West Florida Parishes, is clear. Quoting from H. T. Kane's Natchez On The Mississippi, "Governor Carlos Boucher de Gran Pre', a Frenchman, who served the Spaniards (until his death in 1809) and involved himself in many of the Natchez disputes.... The Spanish Governor had a Creole retreat at the Hope Farm in Natchez." This is where Captain Jose Vidal, who commanded the fort at Vidalia, earlier buried his wife. His "involvement" helps explain the relationship of Don Carlos and Anglo-Americans such as Samuel Steer of East Baton Rouge Parish. Samuel married the oldest daughter of Bernard Dinot of Natchez. Daughter, "Dutchess" Katherine, married Steven Minor. Daughter, Fanny, married "Adventurer" Philip Nolan. They were all involved in the eventual establishment of American rule in Natchez. As the Nineteenth Century arrived, the Spanish were waiting for the "Western" United States to fall away. Although Louisiana's Governor General Esteban Miro's Eighteenth Century dream disappeared, his successors Governor Generals Gayosa and Vidal managed to terminate Nolan's adventures in 1801. Then in 1810, the Spaniards tried to retain control of West Florida by appointing Spaniard Colonel Carlos de Hault/Delassus as Baton Rouge's Governor. But, power eluded them.

In 1808, Napoleon Bonaparte forced Carlos IV and his son, Fernando VII, to renounce their rights to the crown of Spain. He then installed "Intruder King" Joseph, who retained power until 1814. However, following the examples set in Spain, many Spanish West Floridians joined juntas supporting Fernando - temporarily. Most of these numerous Anglo-American residents, who had taken an oath of allegiance to Spain, were ready to join the Revolution. President Thomas Jefferson had sent troops to the West Florida "Border" in 1804. Following an abortive insurrection in 1805, a full-scale rebellion broke out. The West Floridian "Americans" marched on Baton Rouge, captured the crumbling fort, killed brave Commander Luis de Gran Pre', and declared their independence on September 26, 1810. President James Madison quickly sent troops to occupy Baton Rouge in order to "restore order".

It was not until 1819, that Spain relinquished its claims in the West Florida Republic - in exchange for a "clear" title to all of Texas.

FROM THE SPANISH WEST FLORIDA SEARCH

Several Sheltons are recorded as Kentucky residents in the early 1800s. After the territory became a state in 1792, many Sheltons migrated. However, the 1790 Census lists only Samuel Shelton, living in Mercer County. The county seat was named Harrodsburg, honoring Revolutionary War Hero-General Harrod. According to the Sons of the American Revolution, Kentucky Society Yearbook, Samuel Shelton also served in this war as a private in the Virginia Militia. He was born in 1759, married circa 1785, and at the age of seventy-five, on July 10, 1834, was on the pension roll of the war, receiving \$60.00 monthly.

The County of Mercer lies along the west bank of the Kentucky River, about twenty miles west of Lexington, and the Ashland Plantation. It is also just north of the site of the Civil War "Battle of Perryville".

Besides having their birth state being listed as Kentucky, John and Thomas Shelton are the correct age to be children of Samuel Shelton's 1785 marriage. When they arrived on the docks of Baton Rouge in 1806, these two men were aware of the land grants available to "gringos" under the Spanish West Florida government. They, then, would be able to use more money to build and develop their land.

The Codicil of the Last Will and Testament of the Colonel of the Royal Armies and Governor of Baton Rouge in West Florida (Carlos) Charles Louis Boucher De Gran Pre', was written and signed in Havana, Cuba on 14 August 1809. He had traveled there to defend himself against charges of infidelity. One of the executors, and the fifth witness of the codicil, was Juan Bernardino Dominguez, Sub-lieutenant of the Regiment of Louisiana. Most of the Gran Pre's seven sons were also in the regiment. Perhaps, in the eyes of the Spanish inquisitors, the real "crime" committed by Don Carlos in Spanish West Florida, was "fraternizing" with the Americans. The oldest of his four daughters, Helene married Samuel Fulton-who was governor delegated to have his "boxed heart" interred in the sepulchre "with my dear and beloved wife, Helen Page," in the Chapel of St. Joseph in the Cathedral of New Orleans. Or secondly, with "my dear friend Samuel Steer."

This family set the precedent for Isabella Dominguez-Burnell to feel free to marry John Shelton I, and after his death either Stephen or James O'Neil-shown in the census counts of East Baton Rouge Parish in 1830. The most likely father for Isabells is Juan Bernardino Dominguez. There was also a Jose Dominguez living in Baton Rouge in the 1800 era. Then too, Augustin Dominguez was named in a petition to the governor.

Did the Dominguez-Burnell family flee Paris, France because of the 14 Jul 1789 Jacobian Revolution" Was their first destination Napoleonville or Baton Rouge?

When an attempt at a "double" territorial exchange was made by Napoleon, to complete the Louisiana Purchase of 1803, the Spanish rulers refused to give up the land north of the twenty-first parallel and Lake Ponchartrain, and also lying between the Mississippi and Pearl Rivers-south of the Mississippi Territory. In March of 1804, William C. C. Claiborne became Territorial Governor of Louisiana; Carlos de Gran Pre' remained Governor of the Spanish West Florida Territory.

John Shelton and Isabella Dominguez-Burnell, with their new son, John II, were just getting well-settled on their plantation, when, on 22 September 1810, the "Americano" settlers deposed the newly-appointed Governor (Lt. Colonel) General De Hault Delassus, imprisoning him with twenty Regiment of Louisiana soldiers. Killed in this takeover, was the former governor's son, Sub-lieutenant, Luis de Gran Pre'.

The independent republic's governor lasted only three months before the United States Government appointed Governor Claiborne to rule. The Republic then followed the rest of the Louisiana Territory into statehood a few days after 30 April 1812.

No Sheltons were shown on the 1810 East Baton Rouge Parish Census. The only John Shelton shown in the Census of 1820 was in St. Tammany Parish, near the Pearl River. In the 1830 Census, Stephen Shelton was listed there. Not shown until the 1840 Census Count of East Baton Rouge Parish is Thomas Shelton. Was this Thomas II, or was he the fifty-four years old Kentucky native?

FROM DOMINGUEZ JUNCTION

Many years ago, long before there was a high school or state university near Dominguez Hills, as the Pacific Electric Red Cars rolled south out of Compton, California, it was a short run to Dominguez Junction. From there riders were either Long Beach bound or off to San Pedro.

Believing that hyphenated names give valuable clues to the Hispanic Family Researcher, one must ponder if and why the 1800s keepers of Dominguez records in the domain of Spanish West Florida, dropped the hyphen that once meant that the second surname in Isabella Dominguez Burnell was her mother's family name. Was it a matter of convenience for civil officials or the Dominguez brothers to discontinue using their mother's surname. Perhaps this was another statement of "resentment...toward the Spanish Rule and the obvious privileged status of those born in Spain", as Mimi Holtzman believes was then occurring in Mexico. Did these second and third surnames - connected by a "y" or a hyphen and then, perhaps a "de" before the family regional origin, represent ties that bound too tightly? Will one be the awaited conjunction that becomes a Dominguez Junction?

And too, if adding "ez" means "son of"---can the father of the Dominguez men of Assumption Parish's 1810 Census be "lonesome" Zeon Domingue of the 1810 East Baton Rouge Parish Census? If Isabella is their sister, will The Little Frenchman, John Shelton II turn out to be neither little or French?

In the history of the early nineteenth century along the lower Mississippi River, one result of Spain and France not formalizing "with precision" the borders of their North American possessions was that, from 1804 until 1810, the governors at Baton Rouge retained rule over the lands along Bayou LaFourche de Chitimachas in Assumption Parish. Included among the plantation owners there - mostly Spanish - were the Dominguez brothers.

A big French loss along the River was their failure to establish a trading post and port on protected Petit Gulf - now Lake Rodney. Not until that century's end did a "Big Muddy" meander isolate the lake and Rodney, the long-time port for bales of long staple, "single snatch" cotton.

Perhaps a much bigger French loss came from the belated message of peace in the War of 1812, when 8000 well-armed British Troops from the Battle of New Orleans (and Mobile Bay) reached the Duke of Wellington in time for the Battle of Waterloo.
