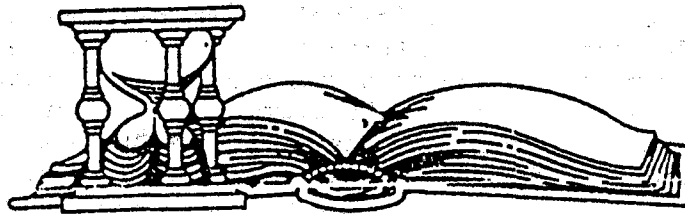

LOUISIANA VOTER REGISTRATION 1898
BOSSIER PARISH

THE LARGER NUMBER OF LISTINGS IN THE 1898 VOTER REGISTRATION WAS ENCOURAGED BY THE 1898 CONSTITUTION, WHICH WAS EXPRESSLY WORDED TO DISENFRANCHISE NEGRO VOTERS. UNDER THIS NEW CONSTITUTION A MAN HAD TO EITHER OWN PROPERTY OR BE ABLE TO READ AND WRITE IN ORDER TO VOTE. IT ALSO INCLUDED A "GRANDFATHER CLAUSE", WHICH STATED THAT A PERSON COULD ALSO QUALIFY AS A VOTER IF HE, HIS FATHER, OR HIS GRANDFATHER WERE REGISTERED VOTERS AS OF 1 JANUARY 1867.

SEARCHING FOR CALVIN

(This is segment four in the search for Calvin, Larri Jennings' Vance ancestor. Dale and Larri make their home at 194 Vance Road, Benton, LA)

After the Civil War, the Vances migrated from South Carolina to Bossier Parish on the Red River in northwest Louisiana. Here Calvin bought adjacent plantations from the estates of his cousin Nina's uncle and father; later, buying a third, adjoining plantation. He and Nina were married, and added two sons and a daughter to their one son from Calvin's first marriage. In 1887, after that son's death, the family moved across the river to Shreveport, selling Palmetto, the plantation obtained from the estate of Nina's father. My search for Larri's great grandfather, William Calvin Vance, has been twofold in nature. I have sought to discover who Calvin was genealogically, as well as who he was as a person and how he played his role in life. Being unable to identify Calvin by his ill-defined kinship to his "cousin," Nina, I have been ever watchful for the existence of, and link to, any other definable relative.

In August, 1891, Leonard K. Vance came to Shreveport from Columbia, South Carolina, by way of Timpson, Texas, saying that he was broke, unemployed, and a cousin to Calvin Vance. Upon arrival in Shreveport, he had a little too much to drink, and found himself next morning in a pile of hay behind Cooper's livery stable. "L. K." encountered policeman Boynton on the street and recounted how he had awakened to find most of his clothing and other property missing. In response to his inquiry about employment, he was told that Mr. Monroe had a stock raising, planting and mercantile operation ten miles from town and frequently hired extra hands. Leonard was hired by Monroe with the understanding that his wages would be contingent on his work performance. At the end of the week, he inquired about his pay, and was told by his employer that he knew no more then about his worth than the day he hired him. Leonard's foreman was equally unsuccessful in getting any determination about his wages, but persuaded Leonard to stay on another week. During the two-week period, L. K. twice drew clothing and tobacco, worth \$5.30, from the plantation store against his anticipated wages. At the end of the second week, still with no resolution about his pay, Leonard sought other employment. He was soon arrested and charged with violation of labor agreement, and receipt of goods in conjunction therewith. Upon his being placed in a jail room with a boy accused of theft and "Johnson," a suspected murderer, he summoned Mr. Herndon from his law office across the street. He requested that lawyer Herndon contact a relative, Calvin Vance, in hopes that Calvin would make his bail. Herndon learned that Captain Vance was across the river visiting one of his plantations. The "Cotton Belt train" was delayed, but upon its arrival in Shreveport, he met with Calvin and relayed his anxious client's request--to which Cal unhesitatingly said, "Yes - I will go his bond." Leonard Vance was acquitted by the court, with an opinion by the judge that a better case could have been made against Mr. Monroe; but, since no such charges had been brought, the case was dismissed. Leonard did bring suit against

Monroe for malicious arrest, prosecution, and deprivation of liberty. Monroe's defense was that he had contracted for Mr. Vance's services for a three-month period, after which time he was to be compensated. This account did not stand the test of logic or witness testimony, and Leonard was awarded \$200, although he had sued for \$1,500. Leonard was no doubt a "cousin" to Calvin, but research disclosed that he was more specifically the grandson of William Vance, a brother of Nina's father, Allen. He became yard foreman for a local oil company, and died a bachelor several years later. His brother, Carr Vance, in east Texas enlisted Shreveporter, Doctor Norwood K. Vance (also a bachelor and grandson of another of Allen's brothers) to act as administrator for the disposition of Leonard K. Vance's modest estate.

Calvin's life during the 1890's, if not uneventful, was at least such that not much about him seemed to have warranted preservation in print. He and Nina reared their children to young adulthood in the 1890's. None lived a normal lifespan, and only one produced progeny to carry on the family line. This shortness of longevity in the lives of Calvin's four children broke the chain by which the family history might have bridged the generations. The last link between the generations which might have preserved Calvin's identity was that between Nina and Larri's mother, Larry Arnold (Vance) Hunt. "Miss Larry" attained adulthood before her grandmother, Nina, died in 1935, but unfortunately they had a soured relationship not conducive to discussion of personal or family matters. Much of Calvin's lifethread - his attributes, personality and participation in events - relies heavily on what was said of him at the time of his death.

The Shreveport Evening Journal, hurrying to meet press deadline, broke the news first, on October 6, 1898: "Capt. W. C. Vance died suddenly at his home on Travis Street, (sic) this afternoon a little before 1 o'clock of heart failure. Capt. Vance was one of the best known planters in this section of the state, and his sudden taking off will be a blow to his friends, who by a lifetime association have learned to love him for his many good qualities, and devotion to his friends. Capt. Vance served through the war, and was one of the heroes, who by their courage and daring, won for our hungry, half-clad army, the respect of foe and endeared the memory of the "lost cause" to the heart of every true son and daughter of the South."

The Shreveport Daily Times, in its October 7 obituary, and tribute of October 8, included these remarks: "Yesterday evening, this city was shocked and sorrow stricken to learn of the sudden death of Captain W. C. Vance, which occurred at his residence on Fannin Street at 1 o'clock in the afternoon. For the past several weeks Captain Vance has been suffering with heart trouble, but not even his physicians or his family dreamed that the end was near at hand. On the night of the election he left his family fireside and came downtown to hear the results of the election and discuss the situation with his friends. he expired while sitting in a chair and his death came without a quiver or a struggle, but silently and calmly he passed into that peaceful rest which knows no awakening until the Master calls. Captain Vance was not only a prominent citizen and a successful farmer, but he was a man of untiring energy and thrift, who was always on the move and who lived an active, energetic life throughout his days. While it is true that Bossier Parish was his domicile and the principal portions of his possessions

were in that parish, yet he had interests in Shreveport and his home on Fannin Street is an ornament to this city. There was no pretense about him. He came and went, appearing and wanting to appear just as he was, and as he thought and as he acted. Deceit was foreign to him and he scorned it in others. He was above petty littleness. It merited and received his hearty contempt. If he liked you, he met you with a winning smile and a cordial grasp of the hand which meant the pressure it gave. He may have been brusque of manner and careless of appearance, but in a manly bosom beat a big and brave and generous heart."

Shreveport's Progress reported that: "The news that Hon. W. C. Vance had died suddenly at his residence, spread like wild fire over our city Thursday. It seemed incredible, as too shocking, too sudden to be true. But it was true; and the well known citizen in Bossier and Caddo is dead. Apparently taciturn and non-communicative, his nature was just the reverse. Those who knew him well, knew him as a genial, whole-souled, liberal man, true in his friendship; firm in his convictions. He always took an active part in politics and while generally opposing the Progress factionally, we here attest to his sincerity and honesty of purpose."

The Bossier Banner announced the death of Capt. W. C. Vance on October 6, 1898, at age 58, remarking: "Capt. Vance was born at Spartanburg, S. C. He attended school first at Columbia, and later finished his education at the Citadel in Charleston. From there he went with a corps of cadets to fire the first gun of the war on the "Star of the West," when that ship attempted to reinforce Fort Sumpter (sic) Jan 9, 1861. From Charleston Captain Vance went immediately to Virginia, where he was wounded several times in service of his country, a severe cut on his face telling the tale of his gallantry and devotion to the land that he loved For nearly thirty years he has been employed in farming, and until a few years ago, lived on one of his plantations, a few miles below Benton, when he moved to Shreveport, but claimed his citizenship in this parish. A gallant soldier, a successful business man, a loyal citizen and friend, a devoted husband and father, a splendid manly man, the part he played in his country's affairs was an important one, and he played his part well. He will be missed."

Reverend W. T. D. Dalzell conducted the services at the Fannin Street residence, after which William Calvin Vance was buried in the family's dedicated plot in the Confederate section of Shreveport's Oakland Cemetery. There he joined in rest with Allen, his son, and Mary Matilda, most recently his mother-in-law, but whose even closer relationship was deeply rooted in his childhood. Numbered among Cal's pallbearers were old friends, associates and comrades-in-arms, to include Judge, and later governor, Blanchard, Doctor Schumpert, Captain Murff, and other good men on both sides of the Red River.

Calvin went to his grave with the secret of his descendency. Whereas modern obituaries are liberal with such information, such was not the custom of that time. Calvin's life has ended, but the search for his identity continues through the lives of his widow and descendants.

THE POSTMASTER OF McMILLAN'S POST OFFICE, TEXAS

On January 13, 1848, William McMillan's home in Panola County, Texas, officially became McMillan's Post Office, Texas. From that date on all new atlases and maps for the United States located his home as McMillan's Post Office. William was the postmaster. The mail and postal money were stored in a chest of drawers in his home. The chest of drawers was burglarized. Holes were bored through the front of the drawer. The chest was never repaired and remained in the McMillan family for many years. There is no information available concerning the burglary.

In January 1846, the Republic of Texas, then an independent nation became a state in the United States. Just two years later McMillan's Post Office opened. On July 1, 1847, the first federal "adhesive" stamps were issued. A five cent and ten cent stamp were issued. The five cent stamp bore the image of Ben Franklin, the nation's first Postmaster General. It was fitting too, that on the ten cent stamp, George Washington, first president and "father of his country", should outvalue Franklin two to one.

Prior to 1847, the federal postal system had operated without stamps. Mail traveled postage due. The addressee paid the postage. A stamped letter or prepaid letter was sometimes seen as a way to insult the recipient suggesting that the recipient was too poor to pay for it himself. People clung to their old stampless way. In 1855, Congress finally passed a law making the use of stamps compulsory.

Paying for a letter was like receiving a collect telephone call from China. A single-sheet letter from New York City to Buffalo cost 25 cents, a prohibitive price in a time when a good day's wage for a laborer was rarely more than one dollar. Add a couple of enclosures to the missive and the cost jumped to 75 cents. In the 1830's, one disgruntled individual harassed an enemy by sending him letters stuffed with blank pages.

Excessive costs probably kept some Americans from communicating through the mails. Many people who did receive mail simply refused to pay, rejecting the letter outright, which meant big headaches for the Post Office in mountains of dead letters. These had to be returned to the sender for two deliveries with nothing in return.

Before 1845, distance and weight had determined the cost of a letter via a complex and byzantine price system under which each piece of mail was individually accounted for and marked with debits and credits. The new system guaranteed a uniform rate structure at last. Half-ounce letters would cost 5 cents for traveling under 300 miles, 10 cents for more. In 1866, William McMillan died at the age of 78. The McMillan's Post Office was officially closed on November 5, 1866. The hand-written records for the McMillan's Post Office were obtained from microfilm records at the National Archives, Washington, D.C.

William McMillan and Elizabeth Wren were both born in South Carolina in 1788, and were married in Alabama about 1824. Both would have been then about 36 years of age in 1824. A severe panic (depression) around 1837 caused the southern economy to collapse.

There was a decline of cotton exports to England. The south had a cotton economy. The word was out that the Republic of Texas was the place to go. To move from Alabama to the Republic of Texas was a great adventure, like a grand camping trip. The crossing of the Mississippi River on a ferry with all of their worldly possessions included wagon, team, cattle, hogs, etc. It was not only expensive, but dangerous. Many people failed to make it across. There were no improved roads and often homes along the way were 20 miles apart. They would be traveling through swamps, fording streams, creeks and rivers through virgin timber areas.

In 1836, Texas became the Republic of Texas and offered free land to the people coming to Texas. The offer was that a man with a wife could select a homesite, build a house, clear land and start farming, and claim 640 acres of land. As late as 1845, 1000 wagons entered Texas on one trail during one six week period. On December 27, 1837, William McMillan sold 80 acres of land in Dallas County, Alabama. Some people believe that William McMillan and his family traveled through Arkansas to Texas.

The Republic of Texas Land Grant records reflect that William McMillan, who arrived in Texas prior to 1840, received a grant for 640 acres of land in Harrison County (now Panola County). William and Elizabeth had the following children, all born in Alabama, when they arrived in Texas: William, Jr., born 1824, Elizabeth Ann born 1828, Matthew born in 1829 and Marshall born in 1835. The land grant, a Republic of Texas Land Patent was for land on the south side of Mill Creek about 8 miles northwest of where the United States and Texas boundary leave the Sabine River, and two miles west of said line on the east side of the Sabine River. The land was surveyed and described in vares. A vara is a linear measure for land in many Latin countries, varying in length from 31 to 43 inches. In the Republic of Texas, 33 inches.

The Great Seal of the Republic of Texas and the Seal of the General Land Office were affixed to the land patent. "Done at the City of Austin on the twenty-eighth one thousand eight hundred forty six and the year of the independence of said republic the tenth". 1846 was 10 years after 1836. The land patent was signed by Anson Jones, President of the Republic of Texas. The original copy of the hand-written land patent has survived and is in the hands of the McMillan family.

By letter dated April 6, 1990, the Archives and Records Division of the Texas General Land Office, Austin, Texas photostatic copies of the following hand written documents from their records for William McMillan Sr. Harrison 3-74,

1. District Court Certificate No. 25, September 24, 1841, Harrison County District Court, William McMillan, Sr. a citizen of Harrison County residing near the boundary line of the United States, is entitled to 640 acres of land.

2. Undontitional Certificate no. 35, August 1, 1842, Harrison County, entitled to 640 acres of land by virtue of Certificate no. 25 issued by the Harrison County District Court in September 1841.

3. Field Notes, description of the metes and bounds of 640 acres in Harrison County surveyed September 24, 1841.

4. Power of Attorney. September 1, 1845, Harrison County, William McMillan, Sr. appoints David Hill as his attorney signed Wm. McMillan.

5. Patent. Final title issued January 27, 1846. Patent 444 volume 1.

The available information indicates that William McMillan and his family

just came to Texas, looked around and selected a home site, built a house, cleared land and started farming and then claimed 640 acres of land. It is interesting to note that the records show that the land was surveyed on September 24, 1841, and that on the same date the Harrison County District Court issued Certificate #25, that William McMillan, a citizen of Harrison County, residing near the boundary line of the United States was entitled to 640 acres of land. On August 1, 1842, almost a year later, he was issued an Unconditional Certificate #35, that he was entitled to 640 acres of land virtue of Certificate #25. After that time, apparently nothing happened, so three years later on September 1, 1845, William appointed David Hill as his attorney. On January 27, 1846, William was issued the patent for the land, the final title to the land. The patent for the land was issued less than one month before the Republic of Texas ceased to be an independent nation and became a part of the United States.

The boundary line between the United States and the Republic of Texas, where it leaves the Sabine River, has an international boundary marker. It is a unique historical marker, a one-of-a-kind. This is a granite shaft set on April 25, 1841, to settle once and for all a boundary dispute for almost two hundred years. No other American boundary has gone through contests between France, Spain, United States and Republic of Texas. The marker bears the date 1840, but due to difficulties in getting through the wilderness, the actual raising did not take place until the spring of 1841. A three acre park has been dedicated by officials of both Texas and Louisiana as a Bi-State Park around the marker. The location of the marker is about 50 yards north of Hwy 31 at the Texas-Louisiana State line, between Deadwood, Texas and Logansport, Louisiana.

Prior to the establishment of the boundary line between the United States and the Republic of Texas, the area along the east side of the Sabine River had been declared Neutral Ground, for many years starting with Spain. The Neutral Ground would not be subject to either authority. Hunters, trappers, Indians and persons fleeing jurisdiction of the United States or Spain, lived in this lawless area without external restraint. The region that comprised the so-called Neutral Ground remained a problem in law enforcement for American officials for many decades.

In November 1838, the Natchitoches Herald, Natchitoches, Louisiana, carried a story with this headline, "Invasion of the United States by Texas". Shreveport, Louisiana was invaded by the Republic of Texas Army, a foreign army. Caddo Indians had gone on the war-path in East Texas, and were chased across the border into the very heart of Shreveport, where the Indians were disarmed. The Texas Army returned to Texas.

In 1837, the Sabine River course was chartered up to Logansport. A year later steamboats were navigating the Sabine River. The people living in the area of McMillan's Post Office would have sold cotton and bought merchandise in Logansport, which was twelve miles from the post office. Steamboats on the river hauled cotton and other merchandise before the railroads came to Logansport in 1897.

John McMillan, a brother of William, who was born in 1810 in South Carolina, joined William in Texas about 1840. John had two sons, both born in Alabama: Benjamin born 1832 and Anthony born in 1834. John apparently was the banker for the area. When he died in 1855, he left a ledger indicating that he had \$17.50 cash on hand and accounty on 13 individuals for a total of \$125.50 owed him. As the administrator of John's estate, William sold

among other items, a yoke of oxen for \$80.00, a yoke of oxen for \$60.00, two feather beds for \$40.00, 53 acres of land for \$193.00 and 33 acres of for \$33.00.

By a deed December 10, 1851, William sold his son, William Jr., 183 acres of land for \$100.00. By a deed dated November 6, 1856, William gave his son, William, Jr., a negro slave named Henry, who was 10 years of age. It is noted that the sale or transfer of ownership of slaves were by a deed officially recorded. There is no record of the number of slaves owned by William. By a deed, dated December 4, 1849, William sold to his brother, John, 150 acres of land for \$200.00.

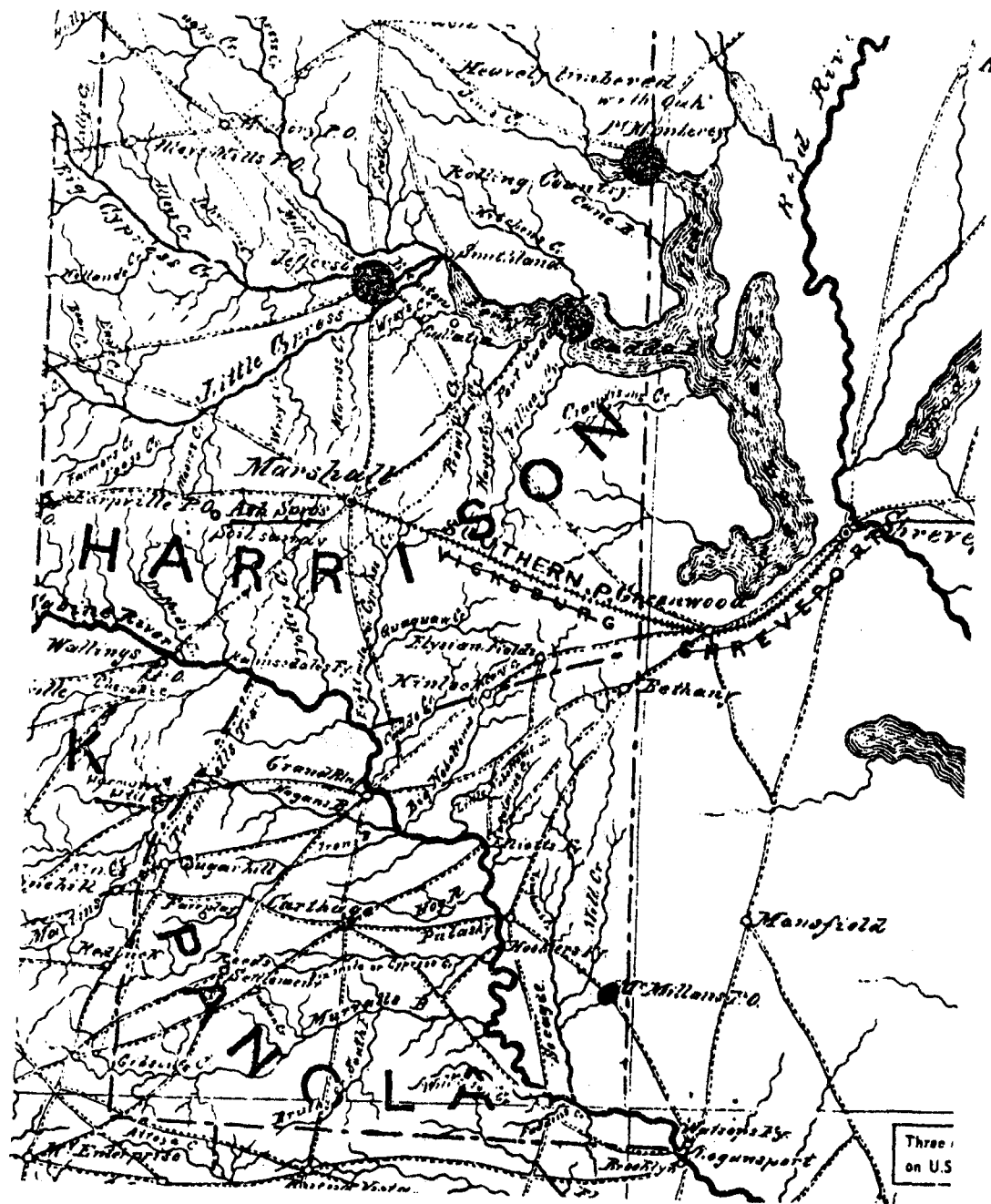
An article of agreement between William and his son, Marshall, was recorded in Panola County on January 13, 1866. This agreement indicated that William had recently died. The agreement was dated November 11, 1856. Elizabeth, his wife, did not sign the agreement, indicating that she had died prior to the date November 11, 1856. The agreement stated that Marshall was to take care of and support William during his natural life, to furnish food, clothing and to pay doctor bills, etc. William delivered to Marshall all of his household furniture, farm equipment, all of the present crop, all of his hogs, cattle, one yoke of steers, a wagon and one blind horse. This agreement also indicated that after November 11, 1856, William would live in the home of Marshall. The witness to the sale of 280 acres of land recorded in 1864, was Emily McMillan. Emily was the widow of Benjamin McMillan. Benjamin died at Delhi, Louisiana on November 17, 1862, due to "camp fever" while serving in the Confederate Army. Marshall and his brother, Matthew, served in the Louisiana Infantry, Confederate Army with Benjamin. Matthew died January 28, 1863 of typhoid pneumonia at Rosedale, Louisiana.

Elizabeth Ann, a daughter of William and Elizabeth, married James F. Elliott on September 21, 1848. They had six children born in Texas. The children were: Demosthenes born 1849, Plato born 1851, Elgiza born 1853, Elizabeth born 1855, Erbises born 1858 and Nancy born 1860. James F. Elliott had served in the Republic of Texas Army from 1836 to 1838. In 1859, James was a trustee of the Old Prospect School District. The school was housed in a log cabin 18 feet by 12 feet. No floor. Seats were benches of split logs.

Plato Elliott was a very religious man, a Methodist preacher, who raised cotton and horses for surrey racing. According to his daughter, Ira, he said, "Sallie (his wife) may not believe as I do, but this Plato, he is going to heaven". His last words (which are inscribed on his tombstone) were, "I am willing to go. I trust in God. Meet me." Plato died of typhoid in 1902. He was buried in the Reeves Cemetery with a Woodman of the World headstone.

Marshall McMillan married Hardenia Bounds in 1854. Their children, all born in Texas in Panola County, were: Marshall Bird, Jr., born 1855, Annette born 1856, William born 1859, Virginia America born 1861, Cornelius born 1873, Franklin Parson born 1875 and Julia born 1881. Cornelius McMillan married Catherine Jane Fargerson in 1894. They lived on and farmed the land where the McMillan's Post Office was located. They had the following children: Cammie, Lex, Flem, Audrey, O.D., Cleveland, Conway, Chester and Crandal.

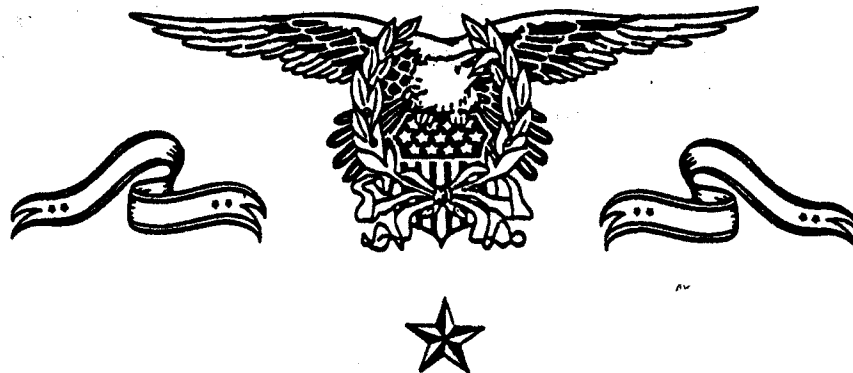

John A. Rittgers immigrated from Prussia around 1795, to escape the turmoil of war there, married Catherine Comer and settled in the area of what is now Luray, Virginia, staying there until 1816, at which time he and his family moved to central Ohio. John and Catherine produced nine children, and these form the second of nine generations of descendants who spread from Ohio to various other states, such as Indiana, Iowa and Missouri.

Most of the book is about these descendants, following which there is an appendix of five generations of the ancestors of Catherine Comer. The main portion of the book uses a combination of the formats known as the Modified Register System and the Henry System, so that each descendant's name is accompanied by a number which indicates the person's generation and his or her position within the nuclear family. This book is called "Volume 1" in the hope that as a result of its exposure, readers will contact the author with additional information which might one day permit the compilation of a second volume. The full-name index contains about 5,000 names, of which 1,838 are Rittgers descendants. Primary counties in Ohio are Darke, Fairfield and Hocking. Some of the associated surnames are AMSPAUGH, BIGHAM, BRIGHT, BUTT, FINDLEY, GROVE, MAST, NOSLER, RORABAUGH, RUFF, RUTTER, STROHL and WILSON. 1998, 7½ x 10½, 294 pages, index, softcover.

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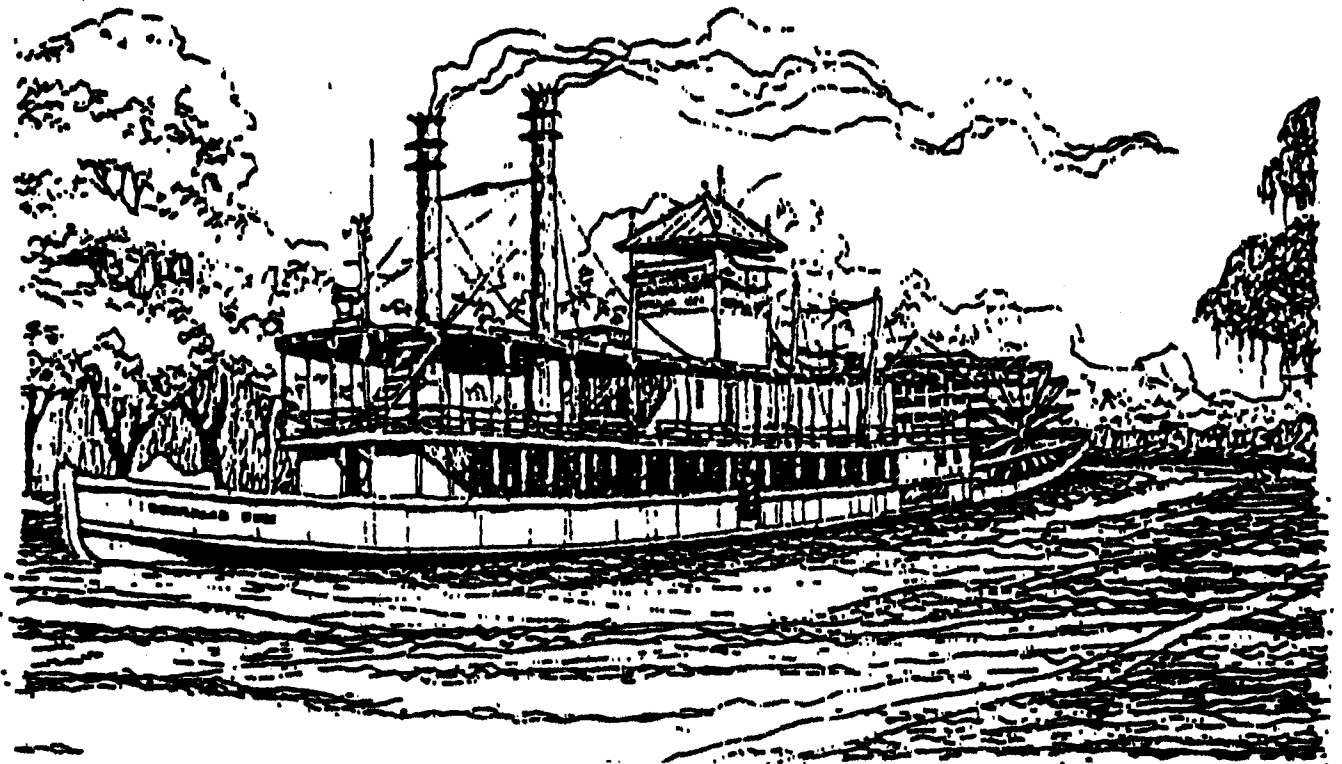
