SEARCHING FOR CALVIN (VANCE)

Family conversations, primarily between my wife and her mother, occasionally turned to ancestry. Her mother, "Miss Larry" Vance Hunt, never knew her paternal grandfather, but her Vance grandmother lived well into Miss Larry's adult years. Regretfully, grandmother Nina did not pass down what she must have known about her husband's side of the Vance family. William Calvin Vance would be a man of unknown parentage; his only known family connection being that he had married his Vance cousin, Nina. Although some particulars of Nina's life would prove interesting, would anything in her story reveal evidence of Calvin's origins?

Any discussion of Vance ancestry would include anecdotes and family lore about grandmother Vance. She probably had three given names as did her siblings--probably none of which were "Nina." Nina's first census reports identify her as "Lucy C." in 1860, and as "Ninnie" in 1870. In her petition for emancipation to early adulthood, she is "Laura E." She is also identified as "Nina Emily" in some rudimentary genealogy, probably done by her daughter-in-law, Mary Emily (Arnold) Vance. But all that matters little, because throughout her adult life, she was simply "Nina" Vance--both formally and informally. Although she would adjust her age by several years during her lifetime, there is good evidence that she was born in 1851. Census reports give her age as nine in 1860, seventeen in 1870 and twenty-nine in 1880. (The inconsistency in Nina's age in 1870--seventeen rather than nineteen--may have an explanation. Her father had desired in his will that Palmetto Plantation be sold when Nina reached eighteen--which had not been done.) Nina was born to Allen and Mary Chappell Vance at Greenwood in South Carolina's northwestern "up country." Allen was a planter of no small means. The 1860 population and slave censuses show his worth, which included ninety-nine slaves, to be \$200,000. Family legend is that Ninnie was a spoiled little girl, and that an old servant stood ready with saddled pony to satisfy any whim for a pony ride. As a child of ten, Nina saw her older brother and cousin go off to war. Her father died at the close of the war, and the family began its incremental move to a new life in Louisiana. Her brother John went first in 1865; then Calvin in late 1866 or early 1867. Nina and her mother came over in 1870. Sister Mollie had married her hometown beau, Captain "Chris" Waller, and elected to stay in Greenwood. When Calvin and Nina were married in 1872, wide disparities in age between husband and wife were not uncommon. Neither was it uncommon for cousin to marry cousin, although there was concern over marriages between first cousins. Indications are that this was not the case between these Vance "cousins."

Before the turn of the century, Nina had seen the death of a stepson, son and husband. When Calvin died in 1898, there was no will probated, and no succession filed. The estate was partially settled, by "partition." Riverside Plantation was divided between the two surviving children; with Estelle receiving "North Riverside," and Cal, Jr., "South Riverside." By agreement, Nina got full ownership of the family home on Fannin Street. Also, usufruct (fruits) of the children's undivided share of the 2,000-acre Willow Chute Plantation, and "adjoining lands" amounting to several hundred additional acres. The partition was made in January, 1902, and in February, Cal married Mary Arnold and took his bride to live on his newly acquired plantation. The discord between Nina and Cal's family may have originated herein, either by virtue of the settlement of the estate, or the marriage. Miss Larry could not recall ever seeing her grandmother until she was thirteen, when Nina moved back to Shreveport. She had gone to live with her daughter in New York City in 1920, and moved back when Estelle died in December, 1921. While in New York, a visiting Shreveport teacher inquired if a bright, talented young Shreveport man, Cal Vance, was any relation. When Nina returned to Shreveport, she made it possible for her grandson Calvin to attend Georgia Tech, where he received a degree in petroleum engineering. This seems to have fostered a reconciliation between Nina and her son's widow, Mary Vance.

Upon her return to Shreveport, Nina no longer had her mansion on Fannin Street. She went to live with her niece, Clare Vance Dalzell, on Stoner Avenue; her address, 543 1/2 Stoner, indicating that she had her own apartment. Shreveport was growing and changing. The Vance name no longer had its previous recognition and prestige. All five Vance doctors had died, as had her brother and cousin, state senators, John Chappell and William Washington Vance. Most of the Vance large land owners (excluding herself) were also gone. Mary Vance dutifully helped by escorting her mother-in-law on shopping and other excursions. Miss Larry recalled that Nina was overly fond of two old black dresses which had developed a greenish sheen. She would sometimes accompany her mother and grandmother to Dreyfuss Brothers Drygoods, where her feisty little grandmother was more noted for her merchandise returns and complaints than as a good commission customer. It was remembered that one floor clerk would get down behind a counter when they were seen coming in.

Nina and her Centenary "flapper" granddaughter didn't get along. Miss Larry would tell about the blunder she made after Nina had moved to her new home at 2230 Highland Avenue. She was talking on the phone on the second floor landing and Nina, who was supposed to be hard of hearing, was at the bottom of the stairs. When her grandmother told her to get off the phone, she said under her breath, "Go to Hell." From the bottom of the stairs, she heard, "I heard that!"

It was unexpected that Nina would have applied for a Confederate widow's pension--which she did, in 1931. The application questionnaire required personal information about herself and her veteran husband. Many volunteered additional

information to strengthen their case; all this making pension documents such good sources for genealogical research. Nina attested that she was born at Greenwood, South Carolina, on March 27, 1855, and that her maiden name was Nina Vance. That she came to Louisiana in 1870, and married William Calvin Vance, a Confederate veteran, on February 1, 1872. As requested, she estimated her monetary worth: "roughly \$100,000 much real estate & stocks hence uncertain." Her lawyer, Chandler Furman, in forwarding her application, assured the pension board that Mrs. Vance qualified under the latest amendment to the state constitution, apparently alluding to a previous requirement that a widow's property value and income place her in a virtual state of destitution. He attested that he had been told by Nina that a family bible verifying her birth had been destroyed, but she had the general appearance of being seventy-five, the age she claimed to be. Nina had a basic knowledge of Captain Vance's military service, to include his having been wounded five times. (There has been either documentation or reference to his having received wounds at Sharpsburg in Maryland; Bean Station in Tennessee; and the Wilderness and the Seven Days battles outside Richmond, in Virginia.) She knew his place and date of birth to be Spartanburg, S.C. in "1840 (about)." An appended obituary excerpt, probably from a South Carolina newspaper, stated that he was "a native of Spartanburg County, South Carolina." Calvin's place in the Vance family order, other than by marriage, was not required in the application process. However, lawyer Furman enlightened all by voluntarily explaining that Nina had not changed her name from Vance as she had married "a cousin of the same name."

When her son, Larry, was killed in 1898, Nina had him buried in Greenwood Cemetery, even though her mother, step-son and husband were all in Oakland Cemetery. Her other son, William Calvin, Jr., was seriously ill with pleurisy in May, 1910, and would die on June 3rd. He was also laid to rest at Greenwood. Before his death, Nina had made plans to reunite the family. The General LeRoy Stafford Camp #3, United Confederate Veterans, having accepted responsibility for the maintenance of Greenwood Cemetery, considered Nina's application for burial plots. The Confederate Veterans' decision is found in the minutes of their May, 1910, meeting: "The request of Mrs. Vance for 3 lots in Greenwood Cemetery plat was presented and discussed. A motion was made and carried that the sale of lots to the same person be limited to 2 (two)." The old gentlemen evidently did not want to record a retreat, as the matter was never again mentioned in subsequent minutes. Nina Vance, of course, did get all three family members moved from Oakland to Greenwood. When Estelle Vance McFarland died in New York in 1921, her mother brought her remains back to Shreveport for burial in the new, fashionable Forest Park Cemetery. In November, 1934, Nina must have felt that the end was near. Choosing Forest Park for the family's final resting place, she again disturbed Mary Matilda, Allen, Calvin and Larry for the move to Forest Park. Cal, Jr., whose widow was still living, was able to hold his ground at Greenwood. On May 15, 1935, Nina died and joined the family under one of the most majestic oaks in Forest Park. She had given the year of birth on Calvin's stone as 1842, and her own as 1855. Her obituaries gave her age as 82, which computes to a compromise year of birth of 1853.

Nina's co-executors guessed correctly that her last will and testament could be found in a safe deposit box in the vaults of the Commercial National Bank. Her executors were Allen Rendall, husband of a niece, Theo Vance Rendall; and Norwood K. Vance, only surviving son of her brother John (not Doctor Norwood K. Vance, who was a cousin). Nina's granddaughter was probably lucky that Nina had her property, and died, in the only state having a "forced heirship" law. Miss Larry was the only forced heir, and thus entitled to a one-third share of her grandmother's \$136,000 estate. Nina willed the discretionary portion of her property to an assortment of friends and relatives, favoring some above others. Her dear friends, the Hudsons, were well remembered--especially their minor daughter: ("I will and bequeath to my namesake Emily Nina Hudson... my residence and lot on which it stands on Highland Avenue..."). Other major recipients were Norwood and grand nephew, Collier Minge (Theo's son by her first marriage). Collier was given a two-thirds interest in the North Riverside Plantation (half of which had been inherited back from Estelle, and half purchased back from Estelle's widower, Mr. McFarland). To nephew Norwood went her 63/96 interest in the Willow Chute Plantation. Seventeen friends and relatives were recipients of cash legacies, none receiving less than \$500. Nina's nieces, Theo, Mary, Nina and Clare each received \$1,000. (Camille, the twin sister to Norwood and wife of hotel magnate, Leon Huckins, was not mentioned; however, was probably not in need of monetary award.) Other legatees included great-grand niece, Clare Vance Leary, \$1,000; Mr. & Mrs. T. C. Hudson, \$2,000; Collier Minge, \$1,000; St. Marks Episcopal Church, \$1,000; Mr. John A. Walden, a kind friend and cashier at the Commercial National Bank, \$1,000; and an otherwise unidentified, Rev. and Mrs. Luke M. White of Montclair, New Jersey, \$5,000.

William Calvin Vance, III, married and moved with his wife, Bernice, to Ponca City, Oklahoma, where he was employed by the Marland Oil Company. He died there in February, 1929, at age twenty-four, of spinal meningitis. He is buried in Greenwood Cemetery in Shreveport. His younger sister, Larry Arnold, was married to Joseph Manard Hunt in 1935. Their three daughters live in the area and all have children. Joani and husband, Michael Rowland, live next door to Larri and Dale on Vance Road. Suzie and husband, Russell (Rusty) Lester, live in Shreveport. They have a son and daughter, James and Lonnie; as does Joani and Mike, Joseph (J.V.) and Alexandra. Larri and Dale's oldest daughter, Laura, also lives on Vance Road with husband, David Rains and daughter, Stacy. Their younger daughter, Shannon and husband, Paul Crank, live in Belcher, Louisiana. Larry Arnold Vance Hunt died on June 2, 1997, and is buried in Hillcrest Cemetery at Haughton, Louisiana.

Of the three family plantations, Palmetto was sold first, in 1890. Most of South Riverside was sold by Cal, Jr.'s widow in 1915, and the remainder later. Miss Larry Hunt inherited one-third of North Riverside from her grandmother, and sold it to her cousin, Theo Rendall. Nina had the "fruits" of her children's, daughter-in-law's, and granddaughter's undivided interest in the Willow Chute Plantation from the time of

Calvin's death in 1898 until her own death in 1935. Mary Vance (now Stinson) and her daughter, Larry Vance Hunt, then took possession of their now divided 33/96 part of the plantation. Larri Jennings has faint, but fond, memories of early childhood in the old Willow Chute plantation house, which was across Benton Road from the present Benton High School. The descendants' residences on Vance Road are "hill land" remnants of the Willow Chute Plantation.

I like to say that I didn't marry Larri for her ancestors -- but I would have! I have used the six-part "Searching for Calvin" as a theme or common thread in writing a part of Larri's family history. You could say that it is also our "message in a bottle" to anyone out there who might be able to help with that missing piece of Calvin's past which would complete his story. LOUISIANA VOTER REGISTRATION 1898
BOSSIER PARISH

THE LARGER NUMBER OF LISTINGS IN THE 1898 VOTER REGISTRATION WAS ENCOURAGED BY THE 1898 CONSTITUTION, WHICH WAS EXPRESSLY WORDED TO DISENFRANCHISE NEGRO VOTERS. UNDER THIS NEW CONSTITUTION A MAN HAD TO EITHER OWN PROPERTY OR BE ABLE TO READ AND WRITE IN ORDER TO VOTE. IT ALSO INCLUDED A "GRANDFATHER CLAUSE", WHICH STATED THAT A PERSON COULD ALSO QUALIFY AS A VOTER IF HE, HIS FATHER, OR HIS GRANDFATHER WERE REGISTERED VOTERS AS OF 1 JANUARY 1867.

This is a new way to do genealogy. The U.S. Genweb project is basically organized by states and counties with each county having a coordinator maintaining a site of resources that are available for that county. The web pages are maintained by volunteers. You can access the USGenWeb site by going to <http://www.usgenweb.com>. One of our area counties that has a link on the USGenWeb is Harrison County, Texas. This web site is maintained by volunteer Mrs. Gail Brown of Marshall, Texas and it has "links" for queries and "lookups" in the Harrison County Historical Museum Research Library as well as other information. The research library contains over 1900 file folders in the vertical file as well as books containing deaths, births and marriages from around 1880 to 1915, and a cemetery index. Many of the file folders contain family histories of early settlers of Harrison County. The E-Mail address for lookups is Ollie8004@aol.com. Any information that can be looked up in the library and E-mailed back is free of charge. If copies have to be made and mailed the charge is 25 cents a copy plus postage.

Sports was begun in 1924 with Leo Hartman the first coach. However, there was a girls' and boys' basketball team as early as 1915. Volley ball and baseball were also played at that time, but not as an organized sport. The first football team was begun in 1927 with twenty-four boys going out for training. Only one boy on the team knew anything about football. Many had never seen a football game. The team was coached by Coach Almond. During the war, football came to a standstill. In 1948, James Tinsley started the game again and coached up until 1957. Present coaches are Chiles Carpenter, Frank Zametto, Malvin Ogden and E. J. Albritton. During the years baseball has been the leading sport. The school bell used for many years has an interesting history.

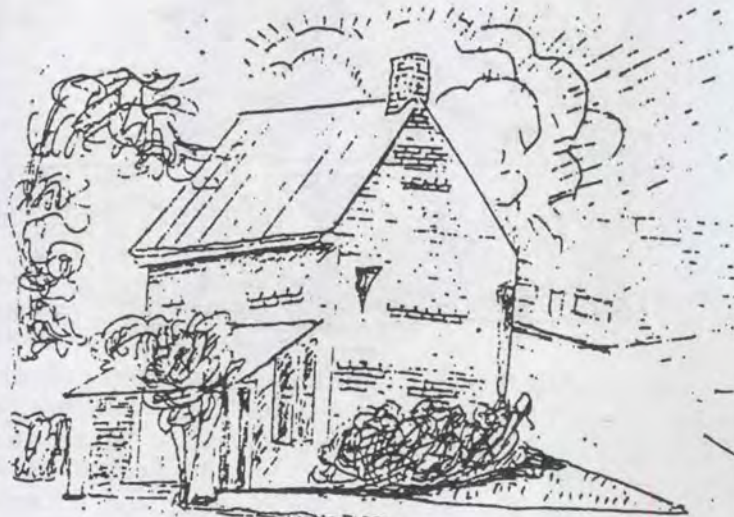
"Long before the Civil War-in fact, before Farmerville was founded- W. C. Carr had settled at Cherry Ridge, about twelve miles north of town, and like most of the planters of that time, he had slaves to work his fields and harvest his crops. These slaves ate, slept, and worked by a slave bell. Practically every slave owner had his plantation bell, located in a position where it could be heard for several miles.

Carr, who was Union Parish's first sheriff and Farmerville's first settler, sold this bell to the school trustees after the Civil War had forced the passage of the 14th Amendment, which forbids slavery, to the Constitution of the United States.

The bell was placed in the schoolhouse of that time and in subsequent schoolhouses". Today, over a century later, the bell is still in use, now on the grounds outside the elementary school building.

In 1939, there were forty negro schools in the parish. A few years ago a movement was begun to consolidate these schools. The Negroes in the western part of the parish now attend school known as Westside, which opened in 1957 between Bernice and Lillie. Those living in the eastern part of the parish attend one called Eastside, which is located between Farmerville and Marion.

The Union Parish School Board will soon occupy a new building located on the Marion Highway near the city limits of Farmerville. The present building was erected in 1928 and houses the offices of the board and the parish superintendent. Prior to that time they occupied one of the corner buildings on the courthouse square.



This northeast "corner building", built in

1870 on the courthouse square of brick from the first courthouse, and a similar one on the southeast corner were demolished when the present courthouse was built. They were once offices for the Police Jury and the School Board.

CHURCHES

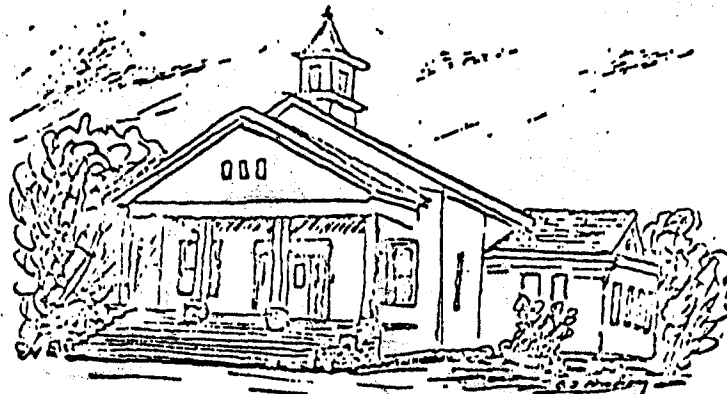
The churches of Farmerville have an important place in the early history of the town. The Baptists and the Methodists were the first denominations to establish churches.

The Baptist Church was established in 1847, with the Reverend Joe Milburn as its first pastor. He served until 1850, succeeded by Elias George, who served until the beginning of the War Between the States.

Baptists had no building for the first six or seven years, but met alternately in the old brick courthouse erected in 1842, and the old brick academy which was located where the present school buildings now stand. Farmerville First Baptist Church has always belonged to the Concord Association. The church was first called "Missionary Baptist Church". Throughout the old minutes it has been called "Farmerville Baptist Church of Christ", "The Baptist Church of Farmerville", "The Farmerville Missionary Baptist Church". It is now called "First Baptist Church of Farmerville".

The Reverend Luther B. Hall was the pastor from 1947 to 1966. The church saw considerable growth during his years of service. According to the 1958 minutes of the Concord Baptist Association, it had a membership of 839. That same year \$10,000 was given through the Cooperative Program and \$17,327 was given to missions through the church. In 1966, \$18,862 was given to the Cooperative Program and \$13,250 was given to missions.

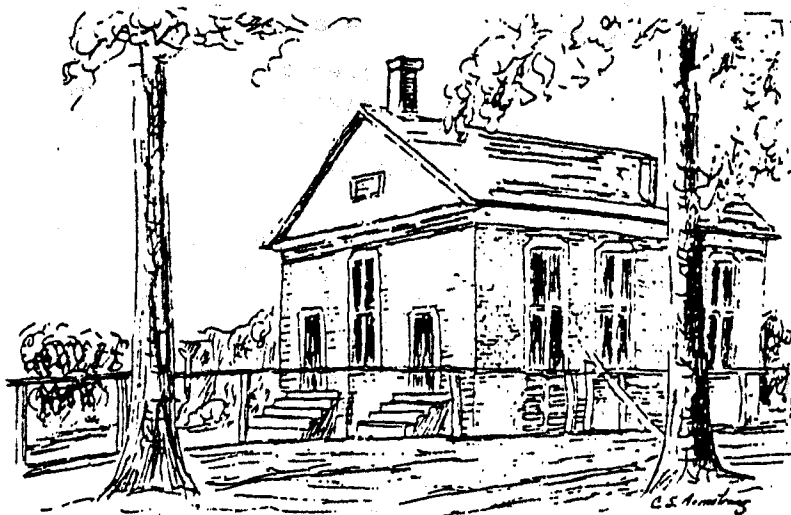
In 1949, a lot was bought on Main Street from Mrs. J. E. W. Pickel by the Baptists and a building was erected at the cost of approximately \$225,000. The building was occupied the early part of 1950. An additional educational building was constructed in 1957, costing \$44,000. Both buildings are completely air-conditioned. The present pastor is Rev. Larry Ramsour.



The Second Missionary Baptist Church, which burned in June 1966, was until 1950 the First Baptist Church. Built in 1853, on a lot 110 feet by 130 feet donated by Dr. William A. Milner, the church was later remodeled with wings and educational building added.

The Second Baptist Church was organized in November 1951. They purchased the property and building formerly occupied by the First Baptist Church in 1952. In 1966, their building burned, but it has recently been replaced by a modern brick structure and renamed the Franklin Street Baptist Church. The pastor for the past four years has been Rev. C. T. DeWitt.

The Methodists worshipped in the Baptist Church building for a long number of years, although one of the first acts of the police jury upon the organization of the parish in 1839, was to donate one acre of ground for the Methodist Church. For some reason they did not construct a building until nearly fifty years later. The present building is the third they have owned, the last erected in 1953, valued at about \$60,000. A sanctuary was added in 1959 at a cost of \$50,000. The Methodists received a donation of land from David Arent and his wife, both Jews. A portion of the church now occupies this plot. The Methodists now have a membership of 240 and are experiencing growth and progress. Rev. J. D. Corley is the pastor.



The Methodist Church of Farmerville in 1897 was located on the same site as is the present structure.

The members of the Church of Christ have worshipped in Ward's Chapel, five miles northeast of Farmerville for seventy-five or eighty years. In 1954, the members from this vicinity organized their own church in Farmerville, and erected a brick building valued at \$40,000. The Reverend Carol Bailey is the pastor and the membership numbers.

The Assembly of God Church was organized here in 1945, by the Reverend T. W. Wagnon, who is still the pastor. This church has its own building with 20 members.

The Church of the Latter Day Saints was organized in 1956. The membership of one hundred thirty-five met at first in the old Citizens' Abstract building, but have since built their own church. The branch president is Cedrick Rogers; First Counselor, E. E. Rugg; and Second Counselor, Ellis Lowery.

The Catholics met as a body for the first time in Farmerville on September

23, 1956. Thirty-one men, women and children attended this Mass, the first ever to be held in Union Parish. They met in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Murry Cole until they erected their own building, which has a seating capacity of one hundred fifty. The name of the church is "Our Lady of Perpetual Health." The Franciscan Fathers from St. Paschal's Church in West Monroe say a Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. The first Mass was held in the new church on June 7, 1957.

OTHER CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS

Another of the cultural forces of the day was the Masonic Lodge and most of the young towns began this fraternal organization early in their history. Farmerville was no exception. The Union Fraternal Lodge No. 53 F. & A. M. organized just six years after the town was organized. The original charter was granted in 1845. Evangeline Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, was organized in 1895, to be succeeded by Farmerville Chapter No. 207 in 1941.

Other civic organizations are worthy of mention. The Lions Club was organized in Farmerville in 1929. This group has done much charitable work and has endeavored to aid wherever the need has arisen.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce, organized in October 1955, has been a force for civic improvement and leadership training in the community. Their wives, the Jaycee Jaynes, organized in January 1956. These women and those of other clubs are constantly on the alert for any opportunity to add their contributions toward civic improvement.

The Owens Tubbs Post No. 149 of the American Legion was organized in Farmerville around 1932. Their primary objective is the care of disabled veterans and their families. Two boys are sent by the Post to Boys State each year to learn more about the government. They also sponsor American Legion junior baseball and take part in civic improvement. If a military funeral is desired for an ex-serviceman, members of the American Legion will conduct it.

EARLY HOMES

Most of the homes of one hundred years ago that were built in Farmerville were constructed of frame, were one story, and usually had raised floors and high ceilings to provide coolness. There were porches, both front and back, with a center hall, causing the house to be described as a "double pen". Many were of hand-hewn timbers put together with square nails. Later, some that



The home of Mr. and Mrs. P. L. Read at

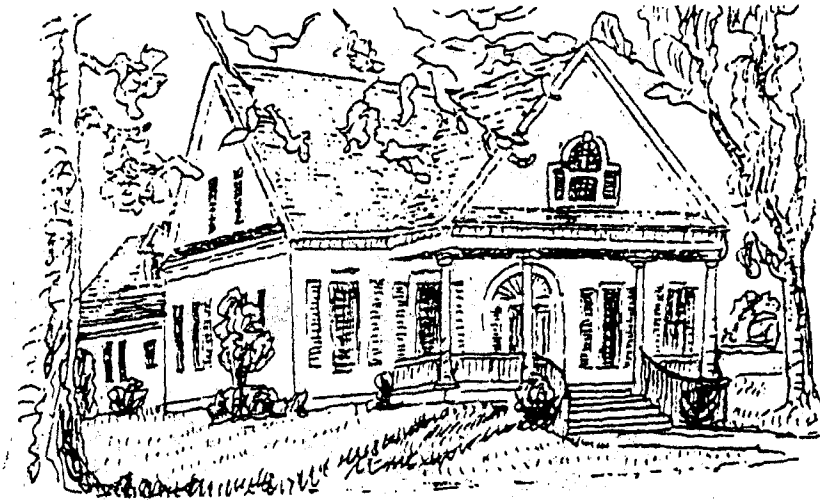
801 N. Main Street looked like this about 1938. It is one of the earliest houses in Farmerville.



The home of Mr. and Mrs. James Fentor at 301 Academy Street was once the home of Governor W. W. Heard. During the Civil War it was used as Headquarters and uniforms and caps for Confederate soldiers were made here.



Built about 1905 by Dr. C. H. Jameson one block west of the Farmerville Bank, this residence was purchased in 1916 by Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Smith, this illustrator's parents, who operated it part of the time as the Smith Hotel until it burned in 1943.



The home of Mr. and Mrs. Fred T. Preaus on Academy Street was built about 1905 by Mr. Preaus's grandfather, the late F. F. Preaus, local attorney.

Around the turn of the century several larger residences were built of even more elaborate design with columns and balustrades, but few of these remain today.

Edgewood, the Baughman plantation home located one mile west of Farmerville on the Bernice Highway, was built in 1902 by Jeff D. Baughman and his wife, Nan Fenton Baughman. In the midst of three thousand acres of timbered land, the house was built of cypress cut on the place, with other materials hauled from



Monroe by mule teams. Consisting of twelve rooms, enormous halls, all with fourteen-foot ceilings, the house remains today one of the show places of North Louisiana. Members of the family still living in the old home are Miss Fay Baughman and Mrs. E. A. Jones.

Timber and agriculture are the main resources of the section. Cotton is the largest crop with feed stuffs next. Some of the farmers have found livestock and dairying highly profitable.

Another source of income is found in the Monroe gas field, an apparently limitless source of natural gas which covers hundreds of acres in Union, Ouachita and Morehouse parishes.

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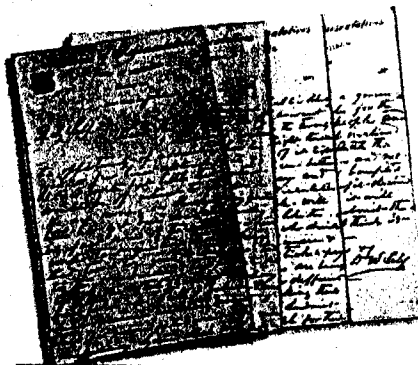

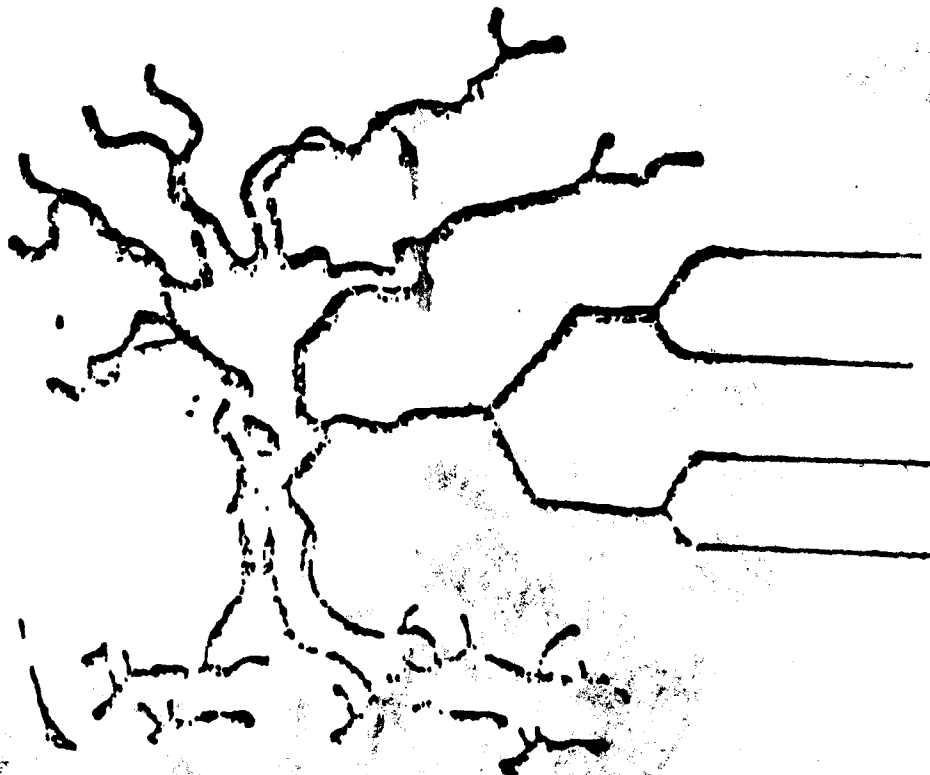
