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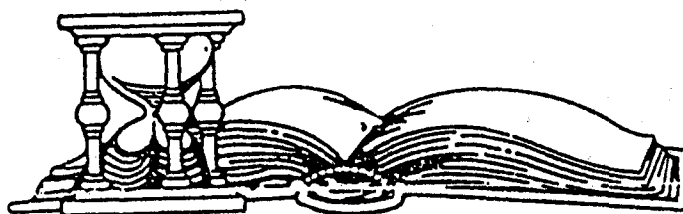

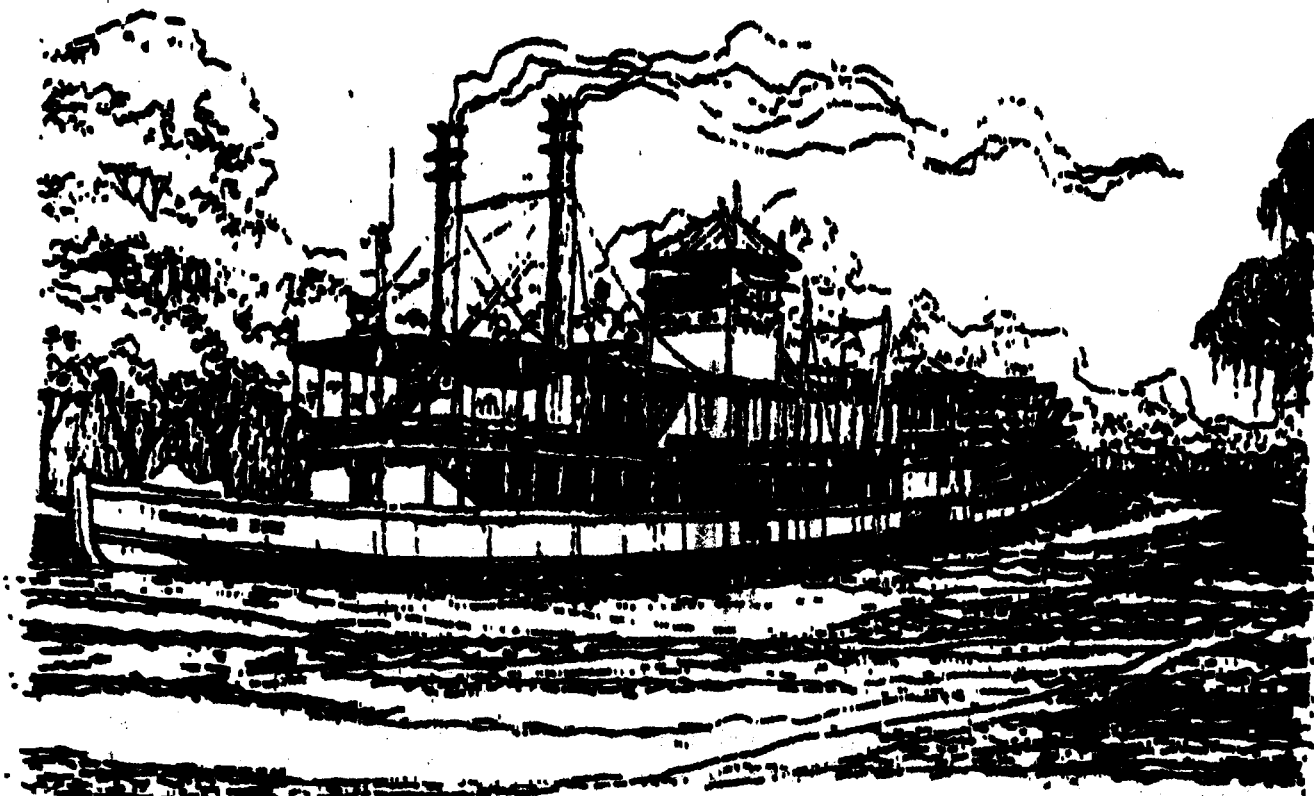

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CASH POINT PLANTATION

Cash Point straddled the Red River some eight miles above Shreveport in the northwest corner of Louisiana. It was typical of the large river plantations that evolved there in the mid-nineteenth century, and reflects the history of that region. The region was settled relatively late owing to the obstruction of the river by the "Great Raft." This tangle of fallen trees, logs and other debris impeded navigation for some 110 miles--from far below the site of Shreveport to well above the Cash Point location. Clearing of the river began at the foot of the raft in 1833 and progressed upriver, leading to the 1836 founding of Shreve Town (Shreveport). The state's upper Red River watershed was surveyed for public sale in 1837 and 1838. Before Federal land auctions could proceed in 1839, all land grant claims had to be resolved, and tracts set aside for the state to help fund public education.

Cash Point Plantation would be successively owned by some of the largest land owners of the region; the Gilmers, Picketts and Sentells--and later on the east side of Red River by the Vances, Logans and Stinsons. Nineteenth century Americans were alert to circumstances and events which opened up new land on the frontiers. The clearing of the Red River, and the availability of its broad, fertile river plain, attracted moneyed entrepreneurs from the Old South and elsewhere. James B. Pickett of South Carolina was an early arrival and one of the original investors in the "Shreve Town Company." George O. Gilmer and his grown son, James B. Gilmer, came from Alabama in 1839 with the assets to match their appetite for river land. They and Pickett bought both public and private land in assembling their many large plantations on Red River.

Louisiana was a federal domain state. The beds of navigable waterways were inherent to the state; but, state and private title to all other land was derived only by specific transfer from the United States Government. The region's vast acreage was surveyed by utilizing a system of bisecting "township" and "range" grid lines which formed townships. Each township contained 36 sections--each of which was one square mile in size and contained approximately 640 acres. Few sections were acquired intact in the 1839 bidding. Tracts were typically acquired in 160-acre quarter sections and 80-acre halves of quarter sections (i.e., W1/2 of NE1/4 of Section 26, Township 19 North, Range 13 West). As can be imagined, resultant land acquisitions by large land buyers were irregular and fragmented. Some tracts would be scattered, while others could be consolidated into sizable plantation, supplemented by the purchase of adjacent private and state land. (This better describes the formation of George Gilmer's vast Plain Dealing Plantation, miles to the north.) The state was given the sixteenth section of each township to support local education. It also acquired random parcels of "seminary land," which were sold off to fund the state's institutions of higher learning. Gilmer's Cash Point Plantation was pieced together entirely by direct

and indirect purchases of seminary land, and the purchase of private land obtained earlier by others at federal auction.

George Oglethorpe Gilmer made his first Cash Point buy -- Sec 29, T19, R13 -- on June 28, 1839, from "Reason Pleasant" Bowie of Iberville Parish, Louisiana. Bowie had been able to purchase the entire section at U.S. Government land sale the day before--perhaps by arrangement made with Gilmer. The Natchitoches District Federal Land Office tract book records the tract's buyer as "Richard Pleasant" Bowie. There was much confusion over the name of James Bowie's brother, Rezin Pleasant Bowie. He appears as "Resin" and "Reasin" in other conveyance records; but, is listed correctly as "Rezin" on census reports. No "Richard" or "Reason" Bowie appears on any census record. According to highly respected Bowie biographer, William C. Davis, James Bowie and his brother, John, were heavily involved in fraudulent Louisiana and Arkansas Spanish land grant claims in the 1820's and 1830's. It is Davis' contention in his book, "Three Roads to the Alamo," that it was Rezin who crafted his brother's first Bowie knife; and also dealt extensively, but honestly, in land titles. According to Davis, Rezin moved to Iberville, and then to New Orleans where he died in January, 1841. (Davis says that before going to Texas, James Bowie had lived in Central and South Louisiana since prior to the Louisiana Purchase. The name, "Bowie," is conspicuously missing from the downtown Shreveport streets named for the martyrs of the Texas Revolution. Angus McNeil, one of Shreveport's founders, had been Bowie's lawyer before coming to North Louisiana.)

Gilmer skipped over Section 30, to the west of Section 29, and bought a part of Sec 25, T19, R14 -- one mile away -- on Section 30's west line. He then connected these two tracts by buying up Section 30, in four separate purchases. This parcel of Section 25, purchased from Benjamin Prevost in 1841, was a 100-acre tip of land formed by the river's turning west--then back eastward. Like the other property, this "point" was "north of Red River," in Claiborne Parish (Bossier, after that parish (county) was formed from western Claiborne in February, 1843). Although the river flowed generally from north to south, all land records describe the Bossier side as "north of Red River" and Caddo as "south of Red River." There may be some early history, not yet learned, connected to this point of land on the Bossier side of Red River. Its first buyer, Prevost, who could not write his name, seems to have come and gone with little trace.

Another addition to George Gilmer's Cash Point Plantation was the 1846 purchase of a small piece out of his son's Buck Hall Plantation in Section 19. This parcel, on the river above the Point, was described in a subsequent conveyance both as "five acres of land north of Red River that was sold to George Oglethorpe Gilmer by James Blair Gilmer to build upon," and as "the five acres which was originally built upon and that was detached from the Buck Hall tract." This apparently was the location of the first Cash Point residence, although the only verifiable plantation house on this side of the river was located out on the plantation's point.

George and James Gilmer were two of the wealthiest men in Northwest Louisiana. (Paulina deGraffenried Pickett, widow of James Belton Pickett--and then married to and divorced from James Gilmer--may have been wealthier than both.) The Gilmers harbored a dislike for Louisiana's "forced heirship" laws, preferring to deed their property to their intended heirs while still above ground. Shortly before his death in 1849, George donated his plantations to his three youngest children. Cash Point Plantation was donated jointly and undivided to his two daughters and youngest son. In 1854, young George Edwin Gilmer was emancipated and sold his one-third interest in Cash Point to his older sisters. Mary Ann Elizabeth Gilmer Sandidge and Sarah Mildred Gilmer Spyker (known as Sally) agreed upon a division of the plantation. An irregular line was surveyed through the middle of Cash Point, roughly corresponding to the section line between Sections 29 and 30. Sally received the west part which retained the name, Cash Point. Mary took the east half, which became the Shady Grove Plantation.

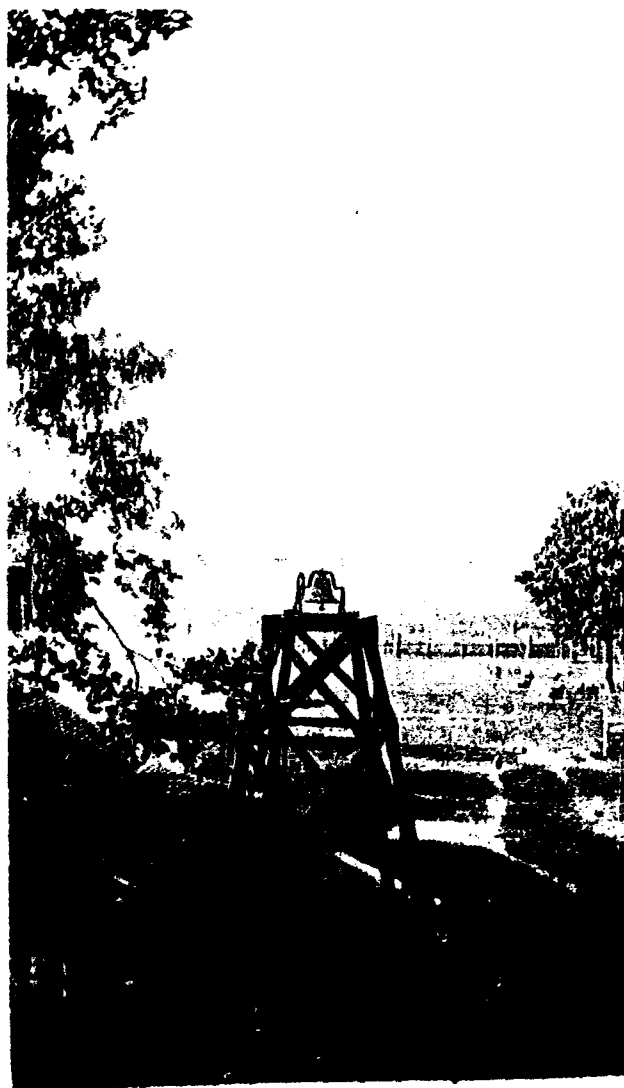
Legend is that Cash Point took its name from being a point on Red River from which cotton and other produce was loaded, and paid for in cash. This explanation does not seem to ring true. It would seem more believable that the name might have derived historically from a "cache" point on the river. It may also have originated from the family name, "Cash." There was a Patrick B. Cash, who was closely associated with George Gilmer. It is not known how early Cash came to the area, but he was appointed as Ward 3 Captain of (slave) Patrol at the first meeting of the new Bossier Parish government in June, 1843. Bossier Parish historian, John A. Manry, tells us that George O. Gilmer first employed Mr. Cash as tutor, and then as his overseer. Mr. Manry doesn't say on which plantation Cash was overseer. One of Mr. Manry's many correspondents wrote him that Patrick Cash's family migrated west from Virginia; and that many settled near "Cash Point," Franklin County, Tennessee. (John Manry Collection, LSU-S Archives) Patrick Cash became a family man and a well-respected and prosperous planter. His plantation was close to both George Gilmer's Plain Dealing Plantation and the Spyker's Hard Times Plantation (another gift to Sally from her father). Leonidas Pendleton Spyker, Sally Gilmer's husband, began keeping a daily journal at Hard Times on July 1, 1856. Some journal entries below were selected for their relevance, and others for their general interest. (Transcript of Spyker's journal, Bossier Parish Historical Center)

- July 2 - Saw John Pickett--have some hope of selling our lands to his uncle, T. De G.
- July 7 - Rode around the plantation with John Pickett, and sold him both this and Cash's Point, the latter for his uncle, Thos. De Graffenried, for forty thousand dollars, that is to say six thousand for the hill place and thirty-four thousand dollars for the Cash's Point tract, the payments to be made on the same time and terms that I have to make when I purchase, which I hope to do in the Parish of Morehouse. . . . Hastings came from Cash's Point for white oak & brought a fine watermelon." (The sale of Hard Times and Cash Point would not be closed upon until the end of the year.)
- July 8 - Went to Cash's Point. Found all well.
- July 9 - Returned from Cash's Point.

- July 20 - Mr. & Mrs. Cash called at the gate on their way to the old lady's (most probably the widow Gilmer, Spyker's mother-in-law).
- Aug 11 - Mrs. Cash and children came soon after breakfast.
- Aug 22 - Sent hands to raise Cash's gin house.
- Sep 8 - Andrew returned from plantation; brings a note from Lane who says it is reported that James Gilmer is dead. Hope it is not true.
(Spyker's brother-in-law had died of yellow fever while on a plantation buying trip to Cuba. Lane was Spyker's overseer at Cash Point.)
- Sep 9 - I am going to the plantation this morning. Reached there just after dinner. Death of J. B. Gilmer confirmed. Saw Dr. Vance. He had been to Shreveport to see Hodge. (Although Dr. S. W. "Whit" Vance was James Gilmer's son-in-law, this was probably Dr. J. W. "Wash" Vance, Gilmer's good friend and the executor of his will.)
- Oct 5 - Preston and I started at sun up, went to Cash's Point to dinner and to Shreveport in the evening.
- Oct 6 - Remained in Shreveport until 10 a.m. Came back to Cash's Point. Staid all night.
- Oct 7 - Left Cash's Point before sun up and got home before dinner.
- Oct 27 - Cash came. He and myself went to Parson McDonald's to see Mr. Hancock, the man who was suspected of being engaged in the negro insurrection in Arkansas.
- Dec 4 - Dr. Vance agreed to hold an interview with the old lady and myself. (George Gilmer's widow, Martha, was soon to die, and had asked Dr. Wash Vance to settle her estate.)
- Dec 7 - Sally and myself walked over to the Cash's.
- Dec 23 - F. Smith and myself went to Shreveport together; he was to take the steamer Swan for New Orleans at night. Geo. Gilmer was then on his way to Cuba for J. B. Gilmer's remains.
- Dec 24 - After breakfast came to Willow Shute (sic), where I met Cash, and we appraised 84 negroes for Mrs. P. Pickett, which she donated to her son James.
- Jan 14, 1857 - Probably our last day at Hard Times. I shall leave it with regret. Injustice has been the cause of driving us from here and J. B. Gilmer has been at the bottom of it."

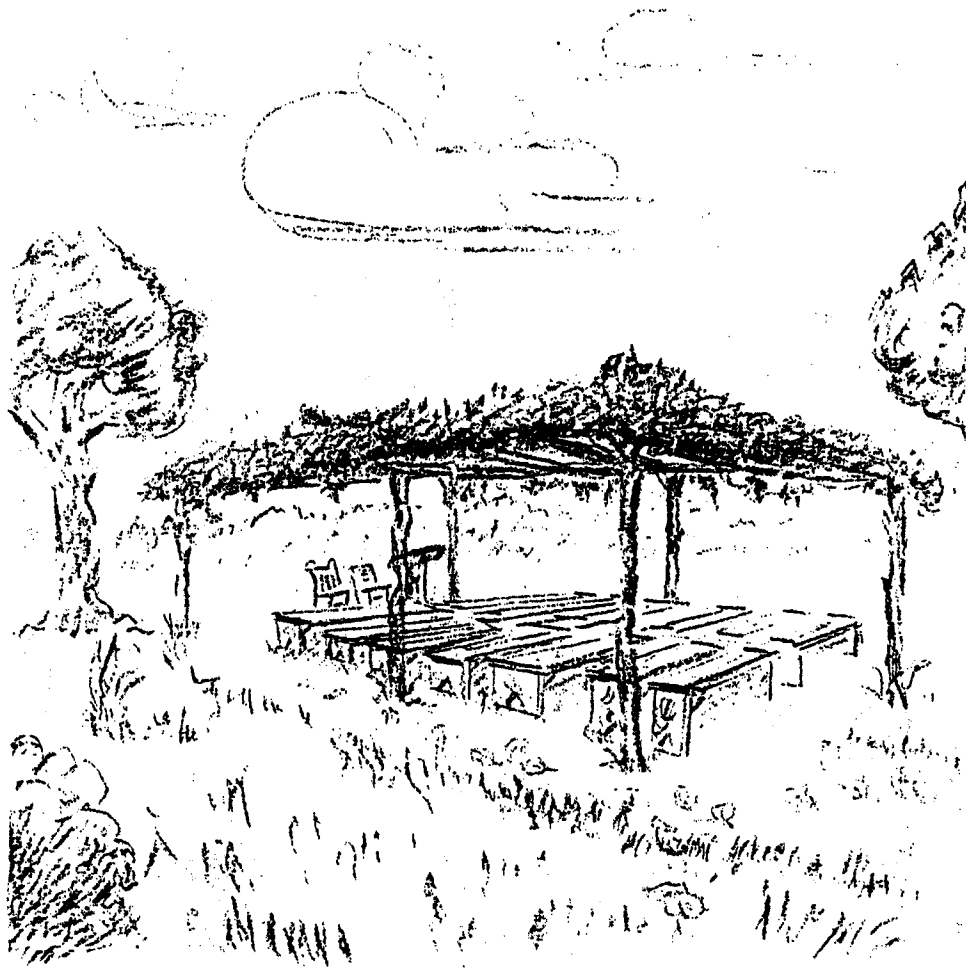

BRUSH ARBOR 1820-1940

Brush arbors are shady areas constructed of poles made of felled trees and covered with leafed branches. Initially they were an important part of frontier life where it could provide temporary shelter while a permanent home was built.

Later on they were used for camp meetings where preaching and gospel music was heard. They were also characterized by testimonies, which were confessions of sin or conversion experiences. Testimonies were often made by women and this opportunity to participate and speak in a group setting was one of the earliest expressions of women's rights.

Brush arbors generally had pine straw on the ground to act as carpeting. Benches were made of split half logs, generally notched in order to rest a shotgun during the meeting. People usually drove in wagons to meetings and women would bring their own chairs from home. At night, pine knot fires illuminated the arbor, which were replaced by a pump gasoline lantern.

LOUISIANA VOTER REGISTRATION 1898
WEBSTER PARISH

THE LARGER NUMBER OF LISTINGS IN THE 1898 VOTER REGISTRATION WAS ENCOURAGED BY THE 1898 CONSTITUTION, WHICH WAS EXPRESSLY WORDED TO DISENFRANCHISE NEGRO VOTERS. UNDER THIS NEW CONSTITUTION A MAN HAD TO EITHER OWN PROPERTY OR BE ABLE TO READ AND WRITE IN ORDER TO VOTE. IT ALSO INCLUDED A "GRANDFATHER CLAUSE", WHICH STATED THAT A PERSON COULD ALSO QUALIFY AS A VOTER IF HE, HIS FATHER, OR HIS GRANDFATHER WERE REGISTERED VOTERS AS OF 1 JANUARY 1867.

OLD LINDSAY

(This interesting book was brought to the editor's attention at the summer classes in 1999 that were held at Shreve Memorial Library. Ted Lindsay shared this information with me and he is the great-grandson of Old Lindsay.)

(This is not a Sunday School Book, but a sort of Autobiography by Old Lindsay of Arkansaw. Part one.)

(Old Lindsay takes us back to the last century, providing rich insights into that vanished era of horse and buggy. When he lights in Dallas, county seat of Polk County, he is already a seasoned observer, having weathered through many of life's trials and tribulations. Through his eyes we see the coming of the KCS and the birth and early growth of Mena (AR). Old Lindsay represents a lost tribe- his wit and wisdom and zest for life, his outlandish frankness and uninhibited use of language seem somewhat alien to our own time. The Looking Glass is indebted to Paul Gore of Mena for the loan of this remarkable little book. Paul is a lover of "old things" and possesses that rare ability to appreciate others' opinions. We hope our readers will also enjoy this "sort of" autobiography of Old Lindsay.)

Old Lindsay was born at Springfield, Illinois, March 12, 1846, son of Morris and Sarah Lindsay. My parents lived in Springfield until November 1861, when they then moved to a fruit farm about 6 miles south of Carbondale, Jackson County, Illinois.

My father bought lands and planted several orchards there. We lived on the farm till the fall of 1864, when he bought a home at Carbondale and a 40-acre tract a half mile west of the depot of the Illinois Central Railroad.

Some times we lived at Carbondale, some of the time at Springfield and every now and then on the farm.

Until we went to the farm...after I was six years old...I attended school at the Illinois State University-then located at Springfield-except a term or two that Pa let me go to the Public School. I was not a brilliant pupil but in some way managed to reach the Freshman Class before I was 15 years old.

My "school" education ended with our moving to Jackson County. My mother wanted me to be a Baptist Preacher, so she raised me in the nurture and admonition of the Lord according to the peculiarities of that sect. I was one of the good Sunday School boys and at the age of 14 was baptised as a member of the Baptist Church one cold March Sunday..Gosh but the water was cold and as it crept up my legs and body I couldn't help but "sorter" wonder why I was there. The cold water started me to thinking and I have since given religious matters considerable study. Had the water been warm I might have been a Baptist till yet.

My father wanted me to be a Lawyer but someway it didn't strike me as being a profession suited to my makeup so I shied from the Law. What I really had set my mind on was to be a Carpenter. In 1866 a compromise was reached and I went into the office of Dr. C. G. French at Springfield as a student of dentistry. I was with him more than a year, then he said I was fully competent to go practicing on my own hook.

In the latter part of 1867 I spent say \$500.00..my Dad put up the money..for an outfit and set up at Carbondale, but the family went to the farm in the spring of 1868 and being a "sorter" out-of-doors man I just took the layout and went there too, when I couldn't get out of it I did some practice while on the farm.

My father died in March 1869 and in 1870 I went security on a man's note and about 14 months later I paid the note, it just about cleaned me up to make the settlement. I reckon the man is dead by now as he was several years older than I, and he had cut his wisdom teeth before he got my bank roll.

On my 25th birthday I started South and on the 16th of March I landed at Des Arc, on White River, Arkansaw. I prospected around a bit and finally stopped at Hickory Plain in Prairie County. I was there six months and then made a couple trips back to Illinois to "sorter" scrape together what I could and to pay off the note on which I was security.

On January 8, 1872 Dora Moore and I were married at the home of her parents near Hickory Plain, Arkansaw. I put what money I had left into lands and tried to raise cotton but being neither an agriculturist nor a cottoner, it only took a few years and a "hay" of a drouth to clean me completely out of money but I froze to the land.

Morris William was born in a log cabin August 10, 1873. Charles Albert too was born in the log cabin July 13, 1875. Both born on Grand Dad Moore's place.

The drouth of 1874 and the lack of farming knowledge was what knocked the socks off me as a farmer.

In 1875 I went back to Springfield and buckled down for a new start. I put in 4 years there and "sorter" got my nose off the grindstone.

While at Springfield Emma "Mose" was born September 4, 1878, and within two blocks of my birth place. In Illinois both nigger and white children attended the same public schools, so dad gum it I just picked up and returned to Arkansaw where there are separate schools.

After my return to Arkansaw in 1879 I got into a sort of composi Drug and Grocery business and for a while it looked like the Lord was going to get on my side.

Idlum E. was born at Hickory Plain November 22, 1880. The summer of 1881 was a "hay" of a dry one, there was no rain from April 28 till the first Sunday in September so there were just about no crops made and as the feller said, "Nobody could pay nuthing in." I had credited out about \$1,900 and didn't collect quite ten percent of that so I was sorter in the nine hole with my creditors but I managed to pull through till the fall of 1882 when I turned over everything, except my land, to my creditors and lacked about \$500 of getting in the clear. I didn't have a nickel but I had a barrel of sorghum.

I got a job at a cotton gin and held it until I couldn't see to tell a horse from a cow at 25 feet. While at the gin my wages were 50 cents a day and my board. After a month or so I got the family on the farm and my wages got to 75 cents a day and I boarded at home till I had to quit the gin job. I had to have grub for the family so I cut cord wood at 75 cents a cord by buy corn meal at sixbits a

a bushel..Corn Bread and Sorghum Molasses make a good combination..when it's all you have.

By the summer of 1883 I had regained the use of my eyes so as to be able to read print and in the late summer got the agency for a book and in a few months made money enough to get entirely out of debt.

The boys, Pike and Charley, worked like tow-heads and we made five bales of cotton and say 300 bushels of corn besides a lot of other truck. I might have continued in the book and farm business but I took the real old Army dysentery and that got so bad that for over two years I was unable to do any work or to even ride horseback.

In November of 1885 I had got down to 122 pounds in weight and a bunch of four doctors held an "inquest" over me and decided that I had better make my peace with God as the best they could give me was that I would not live more than three weeks.

I asked if that was their ultimatum, they said it was. Well I told 'em that if that was the case I wouldn't take any more medicine and darned if I was going to die as I had a bunch of kids to raise and that I couldn't pay any more doctors bills so they left me to my fate.

My "Big Sis" Allie Lynch was then living at El Dorado, Kansas and had been writing for me to visit her a while as she thought it might be beneficial for me. I took "Mose" and went to her, she put me on a diet of rare broiled beef steak, dry toast bread and boiled milk till I like to have foundered. I was there six months and got to be a well man and weighed 186 pounds.

During the time I was there I was the most of it in the office of Doctors Lynch and Browne..two of the best dentists I have ever known. They got me sorter in the notion to re-enter the practice, which I did after I returned to Hickory Plain.

Emmett L. was born August 15, 1886 at Hickory Plain. I went in debt for an outfit to practice dentistry which brought my debts to say \$1,000 and that did look awfully big to me. I set up for practice at Hickory Plain and in six weeks did over \$400 of business. Then I was at Des Arc a few weeks and did well there. In 1887 I moved the family to Beebe, Ark. My practice there paid so well that by 1890 I was out of debt and had bought a home.

Pike had been the "Devil" in the "Argus" office for a year and had decided that he was an A-1 printer and found that the "Hub" print shop could be bought at what he considered a very reasonable price. Well he finally persuaded me into the deal and he went in as shop foreman, and I took the "job" of editing.

I threw away the "Hub" subscription list and the name and started the "Beebe Index" a straight-out Blue Hen, stink finger, barn burning Democratic paper of the old time States Rights sex, and with only 18 subscribers. The "Hub" had been a Union Labor sheet.

In a short time I had worked up a list of about 700 subscribers. My method was to give 'em a pretty darn good paper and to take pay in any thing except.."butter, onions or bitch pups"..and some of 'em have never paid anything to this day, but the dental practice was able to keep the "Index" going. After running the "Index" a year or so it began to look like them dad gum Populists were on the right road to lead the people to prosperity, so in the Spring of 1892 I just got right down off the fence and came out as a

"Middle of the road" Populist, and had to refund to but one unexpired subscriber.

In November of 1892 I got sort of "Invigled" into buying the "Arkansas Farmer" at Little Rock. The deal didn't pan out very well for me for in about four months I went out a "blowed up sucker" to look for a new "Swimmin' hole".

I turned loose of every thing I had except my dental outfit and a mortgage that H. N. Beam at Beebe had on the "Hub" layout. That was the reason my creditors wouldn't take the plant but the home went.

While at Little Rock I met Rev. John T. Miller, the Populist representative from Polk County. He thought that if I would go there it would be a good place to publish a Populist paper.

I scraped together what money I could, sent a part to my family, and lit out prospecting. I sent my dental outfit to Jenny Lind, a coal mining town south of Fort Smith and stopped there a bit but didn't do much practice. While out prospecting..Dudley L. "Bill" was born at Beebe, Ark., March 9, 1893.

I went to Waldron, Scott County, for a while.. I was heading for Polk County all the time. The business at Waldron about met expenses.

I wrote to Dallas for some one to come after me and the dental outfit. Dill Lane came, his charge for the trip was six dollars. I had but three. Well, he said he would take me as he had to go home any way and was satisfied that I would pay the rest sometime.. I did.

The author has gathered much information about the Wright family in southern Virginia. His research on the Wright's in Bedford County, Virginia has been published in four books which are available through Heritage Books. The other three books are: Births 1853-1917; Marriages 1770-1900 and Land Records 1762-1900. You may search their on-line catalog for prices, etc., at www.heritagebooks.com. In this book the death records are arranged chronologically from 1853-1918, the cemetery records are grouped together by cemetery and probate records are chronological from 1763-1900. Each of the three sections is separately indexed and there is also an overall index. Each entry has an identification column which will identify the specific Wright family from which that person descends. If you are researching Wright's in Bedford County, VA, this is certainly the book for you. 1999, 8½ x 11, 125 pp., index, soft cover.

This book contains a lot of information extracted from microfilmed copies of "The Banner" newspaper, published in Clanton, Chilton County, Alabama. It is complete for 1893 except for 5 days. Some articles, which do not contain genealogical information are mentioned. However, all articles of genealogical value have been transcribed. Variations and inconsistencies in name spelling are included as they appeared and each name variation is included in the index. The contents of these articles paint a vivid portrait of the life of local residents, rich with names, and reflecting the priorities and interests of their era. If your search is in Chilton County, you will want to review this book. 1999, 8½ x 5½, 356 pp., original full-name index. paper cover.

This is a reprint of an 1844 published book. This volume comprises a collection of transcribed documents focusing on colonial Virginia. Dates range between 1610-1688. They provide unique views of Virginia's colonization, settlement and development, both political and economic. The documents will aid you in a study of historical Virginia, but very little material of a genealogical nature is included with the exception of one document which is "A Declaration of the state of the Colonie and Affaires in Virginia: With the names of the Aduertvrrors" (with an alphabetical list of names) There may be other names buried within the documents, so if you are searching in Virginia during the colonial period, you will want to check this book out. ELIZABETH LONG COLLINS DANIEL ORR

(This is a story about the Orr family of Red River Parish, LA. Descendants still live in this area. This article was compiled in December 1967 by Emily Virginia Dupree Joyner from information secured from Guss Orr, a son of the above William Homer Orr and great-grandson of William Orr and Elizabeth Long Collin Daniel Orr)

Elizabeth Long was born in 1816. Her parents were Henry Long and Blanche Holcombe. Henry Long was born in Charleston, SC, date unknown. He moved to Jones County, GA and owned slaves. He and his family were quite well-to-do. Either he or his wife is believed to be descendants of the French Huguenots, who settled there in the 16th and 17th centuries. Elizabeth's brothers and sisters were: David, James, William, Philip, John, Tabetha, Martha and the baby, Elizabeth, herself.

Elizabeth first married George Washington Collins and they had five children: John, Phillip, Martha, Mary, fifth unknown. She had black curly hair and black piercing eyes and was a small person. When she married Collins her parents disowned her, their chief objection-she had married beneath herself.

After her marriage to Collins, they settled on a 40 to 80 acre tract of land about one mile from Brundidge, Pike Co., AL. From the records in the court house in Troy, AL, the county seat, George W. Collins acquired the land in the 1830's from homesteading. Sometime before 1848, Collins died.

On October 1848, the court house records in Troy show that she married Isaac B. Daniel, who had been married before and had a son named Philip. Daniel served some time in the Indian Wars in Florida. On one occasion, he was given forty acres of land by the US government to compensate for his services. This certificate is in the hands of Guss Orr (1967), and is a land grant. The date of Daniel's death is not known, but on 7 Feb 1852, Charles Graves (Justice of Peace), William Orr, E. P. Graves and Samuel Smith met at the residence of the Daniels for the purpose of appraising the personal estate of the late Isaac Daniel, which they declared to be as follows: 15 bushels corn (\$11.25), 4000 lbs seed cotton (\$60), 1 promissory note on Richard Daniel (\$5), four measures and 2 jugs (\$1), 1 "sythe" (\$1.50)-a total of \$73.75. (See page 689, Record, Appraisement, Book C, 1851-1856, Court House, Troy, AL).

Elizabeth Long Collins Daniel did not remain a widow very long. With five Collins children and one Daniel daughter, she married William Orr on 24 Oct 1852. William was 61 years of age and Elizabeth was 36. (Marriage Record 1851-1853, Troy AL Court House).

William Orr left his wife, Elizabeth, some time about 1858. Elizabeth decided to leave Alabama. From information on file in the Troy Court House, Elizabeth sold the properties in Alabama for \$600 (See Record F, p 304, Acts of Deeds, etc.) She gave this money, or most of it, to her second son, Philip Collins, who came to Louisiana before the

Civil War, looking for a place to settle. With this money, he obtained title to a large tract of land in Red River Parish, the rights to the land, etc., having been cleared in Natchitoches, Louisiana. (It appears that Red River Parish was at this time Natchitoches Parish).

When Elizabeth received word that Philip had purchased the land in Red River Parish, she and the other children left Brundidge, AL, traveling by ox cart to Mobile, where they went aboard a boat for New Orleans. They took a boat for Coushatta, moving up the Atchafalaya River to the Red River and thence on to Coushatta, a stop along the river at that time. The exact year is unknown, but it was sometime after 1858, and before the beginning of the Civil War in 1861. Philip Collins stated that on meeting his mother, that he found her with a baby in her arms (James Alonzo Orr).

Elizabeth settled on a farm not far from Clear Springs and the present Martin High School. Today (1867) it is owned in part by heirs of the Lee Rigdon and Gene Kitchen Family. She occupied a house provided by Philip Collins. The older Collins children soon married or left, leaving Catherine Daniel, Samuel Collier Orr and James Alonzo Orr with their mother. Philip presumably had married and occupied a separate residence or built one especially for his mother and the three remaining children. Philip worked his land along with his mother's on the farm. Life was not easy, especially during the Civil War, for Philip, along with another brother or so was in the war, having been wounded in it. Samuel and Alonzo grew up as farm laborers for their half-brother, who treated them as such. Samuel Collier Orr was more tolerant of the hardships which they suffered than was his brother, James Alonzo, whose regard for Philip was akin to hatred. Both received very little education.

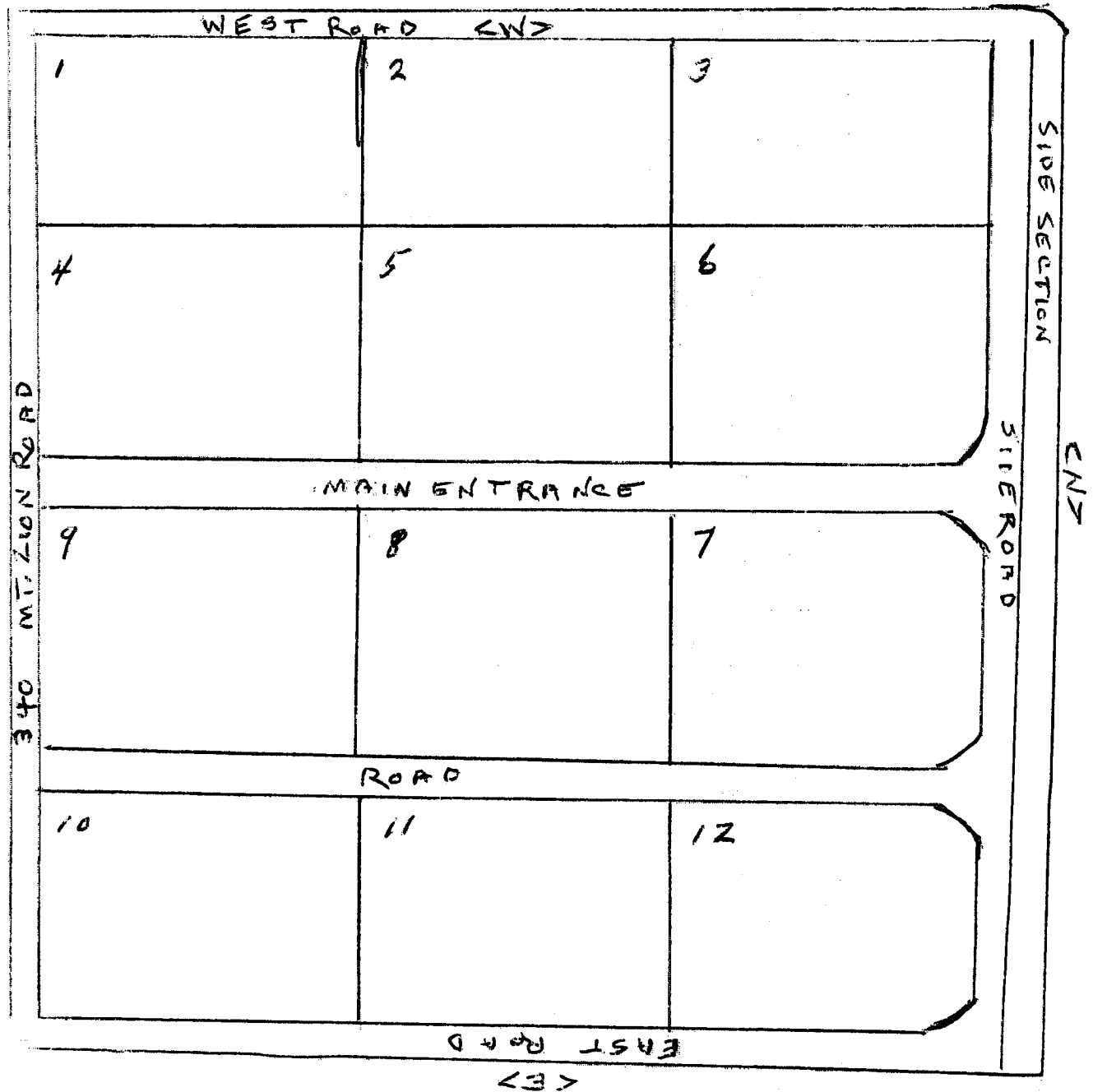
Samuel Collier grew to manhood on the Philip Collins farm (rightfully the property of Elizabeth and the other Collins children) and in time married Almedia Fletcher. James Alonzo was said to have borrowed money from Philip, and with it left Red River Parish for Texas. He never repaid this debt, hence with Philip's death in the 1920's, his estate was divided so that James Alonzo or his children were disinherited. There is, of course, another story concerning the omission of James Alonzo's children from sharing his estate.

Upon the death of Elizabeth, who was buried in Clear Springs Cemetery, her daughter, Catherine Daniel, went to live with her half-brother, Philip. During her stay there, Henrietta (called Nan), the wife of Philip, became insane, tho not violent. She longed to commit suicide and because of this had to be watched. One night, however, she stole from her bed and drowned herself in a pond near the Collins' home. Catherine Daniel then kept house for Philip and other relatives who came to live there, some being James and Philip Elliott, twin sons of Martha Collins Elliott (a half-sister to Catherine). These twin sons, although brilliant and promising young men, became insane. Their last days were spent living in the asylum in Pineville, LA. After Philip's death, Catherine lived with Samuel Collier Orr, and upon his death, lived with William Homer Orr, Samuel's son. She died under his roof in 1943. She is buried beside her mother, Elizabeth, in Clear Springs Cemetery.

MOUNT ZION CEMETERY

This cemetery was copied, as were others, in 1973 by Gwen Sealy and Children of the American Revolution. (See Lest We Forget by Gwen Sealy). Many people have been interred since then and your editor has an interest because of her grandson's 2nd great grandfather, John J. Gay, CSA. We decided to copy it as it lays instead of alphabetically. Many thanks to Ann Garrett and Jimmy Harper from Hall Summit who helped in copying. They also have close connections to this cemetery. If you would like to visit this well-kept cemetery, take 71 south from Bossier City to 514 E. to 783 South to 340, (Mt. Zion Rd.). After turning on 340 it is 1 mile to the cemetery.

STONEWALL CEMETERY

Southeast of Bossier City, Louisiana

Stonewall Cemetery is only one of two cemeteries in Bossier Parish known to have been moved. It was originally located where the Barksdale Base Commissary is now, but was moved in the 1950's to its new location. The easiest way to describe the new location is that it is a few hundred yards due south of the Ebenezer Baptist Church Cemetery off of Goat Hill Road in southern Bossier Parish. It is legally described as Government lot 13A, Section 36, Twp 17 North, Range 12 West.

I was taken to this site on March 27, 1999, by Murray Jones of Bossier City. He had seen my cemetery book and had noticed that I did not have Stonewall listed but had referred to it in my site locations. I wasn't able to clearly comprehend his description of the location, so I had to wait until he had time to take me there.

The cemetery is unkept and needs attention. It contains 80 readable markers and many, many wooden markers placed there in the 1950s when the burials were moved to this site, on unidentified burial sites. The oldest headstone there is that of Mary Ann Woodard, who was born October 9, 1859 and died September 21, 1892. Her headstone records she was the wife of T. M. Woodard. The earliest born person buried there is most likely Louis A. Taylor, who was born about 1820 and died December 12, 1900 at 80 years of age.

The most unique headstone is that of Nathaniel Louis who was born November 14, 1878 and died August 14, 1909. His headstone is marked 777, then 333, then UKT. The deaths of Joe and Lemmon Brown both occurred on March 24, 1944. They may have been brothers, as they are buried side by side and have identical headstones. The headstone of William Rogers reads.. 'Earley Blest' instead of 'Early Blessed'. The headstone of Sillar Wesley reads that he was 66, but by his birth and death dates, he would have been 57, I don't know which is correct.

Interested Civil War historians will want to notice the headstone of Dave Conway. Dave Conway is the only known Union Soldier buried in Bossier Parish. He served in the Colored troops during the Civil War.
