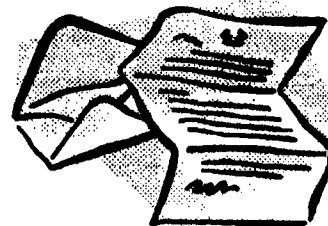
All members receive four issues of *The GENIE*, which is published quarterly.

The 1930 Census

The long awaited 1930 census was finally made public on April 1st of this year. But what makes the 1930 census different from other years. Well, there are a couple of reasons:

- a. One of the major changes for genealogist is the lack of indexes. The only states with complete soundexes are Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia. Kentucky and West Virginia were partially indexed.
- b. This is the first year the enumerators asked if the household owned a radio.
- c. Household members where asked their age at the time of their first marriage.
- d. As in previous censuses, the enumerator asked for information regarding the occupations of the household members. However, in the 1930 census, the enumerators took this one step further. The enumerators asked not only for the type of work a person performed, but also the type of industry the job was performed in. The census taker also asked whether or not each person had been to work the previous day to determine if they were unemployed or not.
- e. If a person was a veteran of a U.S. military or naval force, the enumerator also asked for which war or expedition they served in.

With the release of the 1930 census, researchers should be able to get a glimpse of what life was like during that time period.

I'm sure most of you, though, are asking, "When will the Genealogy Department be getting the 1930 census in?" The budget for the department only allowed for us to purchase the census and soundexes for Louisiana and Mississippi. We will have to rely on donations to purchase any other census records for this year. Thanks to donations that have already come in, we might be able to purchase the Arkansas soundex by the end of the year. The department is hoping to have the census records that we have ordered available by late summer or early fall. During that same period of time, we are hoping to be able to start renting the 1930 census from Heritage Quest (\$3.25/reel).

If you are like many of us and do not want to wait until later in the year to view the 1930 census, almost all of the National Archive Regional Centers have the census available for viewing. This includes the regional center in Fort Worth.

Stay tuned. We will be sure to get the word out to everyone when we receive our 1930 census. Until then, happy hunting.

PERKINS GENEALOGY AND LETTER

The Perkins were a prominent family in Boston during this country's early history and later. They were among the leaders in world sea trade as shippers and merchants before and after the American Revolution. Their firm was dominant in the early China trade, as well as in Europe, the Mid-East and the Caribbean. The Perkins family has been active in the social and civic fabric and economic growth of Boston. Of their many philanthropic efforts, best known is the Perkins Institute of the Blind.

The original of an 1883 Perkins letter was recently given to Sarah Perkins Geary, a descendant living in McLean, Virginia, by a 90-year-old New England Perkins cousin. Neither being able to read the handwriting, it apparently has not been published. I was given a copy of the letter with permission to publish it if I could transcribe it. Included with the letter are descent table and pedigree chart showing Sarah's Perkins lineage.

At the risk of boring you, I mean as you can not get at me to threap me, to write you something about the Perkins name and family in England.

Of the name. Until about 1400 surnames were very uncommon in England, and men were called Tom, Will, and soforth. To distinguish sons from fathers, the English word kin was added, not having the signification it now has, but that to which our junior is more akin. Thus Thomkin was Tom the son of Tom, and Wilkin was Will the son of Will, or Will junior, and so on.

Pierre de Morlaix, or Pierre de Morley, probably a Norman from Morlaix in France, was as it would seem, Steward of the Estates of the famous Earls de Spenser or Despenser at that time the most powerful family of that mark in the relm. The Office of Steward was it would seem hereditary in that family, for on the death of Pierre de Morlaix, his son succeeded him, under the name of Henry Pierrekin, or Henry the son of Pierre (de Morlaix).

The son of Henry Pierrekin succeeded his father, and was the Steward of the de Spencer Estates, when the heiress of the de Spensers married the famous king making Earl of Warwick, and many of his vast estates were transferred to that nobleman and the Steward signed them all, and formally make the name John Perkins. Perkins meaning really nothing but the son of Peter.

I dare say you know all this better than I can tell you but if peradventure you do not, it is really germain to what I still mean to affect you with.


The most believable of the traditions, and the one most consonant with known facts was the tale of Aunt Forbes, who got it from her grandmother Esther Frothingham. It is probably not true in all its parts, no traditions are, but as I remember it, here it is.

Edward or Edmund Perkins in the tenth generation had a son Edmund not the oldest son, who being sent to visit some cousins near Bristol found a pretty relative, Mistress Alice Perkins, a niece or cousin of that branch of our family, who came out about 1630 with Sir Richard Saltinstall and John Winthrop and settled in Ipswich. This cousin much to his father's disgust (she was poor) Master Edmund Perkins married and had by her three children Edmund, Hugh, and a daughter Alice. The husband died young and the widow turned to her own nearest kin, and crossed the ocean with her three children, and put herself under the care of Mr. John Perkins of Ipswich, who with his kinsmen Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, stout old Puritans, were with Saltinstall and Winthrop, the most noted men in the settlement. The son Edmund our ancestor, was cared for by old John, who seeing he had a taste for shipbuilding, had him taught that trade, and in time he became a master builder, returned to Boston about 1650, married Susan Hudson whose father was said to be a cousin of Henry or Hendrie Hudson, lived at the foot of Hanover Street, and left a son Edmund, who married Esther Frothingham aforesaid, and lived in Water Street, and had a son James, who married Elizabeth daughter of James Handasyde Peck, and lived in State Street, who had sons Thomas H., James, and Samuel G, who you know all about, James your grandfather being the oldest.

The oldest brother of Edward or Edmund Perkins continued to live on the family estate of Bunney Park? Ufton in Bucks? where the head of the family was in George II time the famous Sir Thomas Purkins as they then wrote the name, "Luctator" who wrote on the use of arms, and wrestling, from whom descended Lord Ranclief? Rancliet? the last of the oldest branch.

The tombs of very old Perkin's with gentlemen in armour and ladies in cuffs, coats of arms, and all that are still there, and my purpose is that if you have a chance, and the inclination to go there, and see the places of our old people, that you will do so, and tell me all about it when you come back. I hope to do it some day when _____ who can tell when wine is "much twixt the cup and lips" vin (?)

It would not take you long to go from London and it might repay you for the trouble.

I believe on those tombs, the error is made of showing on our coat of arms the Eagle displayed, with the fense dancette between six letters, only in a canton. . one now knows how it got there, but it is not probably right, and I shall never dare to use it again. Fancy the senior Herald of the Genealogy Society flourishing the wrong coat of arms!! Ehee. He would deserve the fate of the make believe Herald in Quinton Des _____.

Pretty widow Alice it is believed consoled herself in this country by marrying her relative Isaac Perkins of Ipswich, quite a rich man there. Old Mr. Hudson our ancestor was said to have sailed for a number of years with his famous kinsman, and possibly was with him when he sailed up the Hudson river. A tradition but possible. He was a tough old sea dog at any rate, and his tomb stone is still to be seen on Copps hill.

I am not quite sure of my geography of England. One says Bunny Park is in Nottingham County. One says Ufton in Bucks. Perhaps they are now together and thus confuse one ignorant of locality.

From my as yet unfinished work I have no doubt made some mistakes but the pedigree is in the main correct, but I am not able to find if the church in which the old tomb with the coat of arms and figures are in the church at Ufton, or at Bunny Park. It may be my good cousins, that some fine day you will be able to explain.

I of all things wish to be correct, and you will observe I use the phrase, "it would seem," when I make an assumption. We may be guileless but we strive to get at the truth nowadays.

Let me know if you get this longwinded scribble and with best wishes for you and kind regards to Sallie and Lillie.

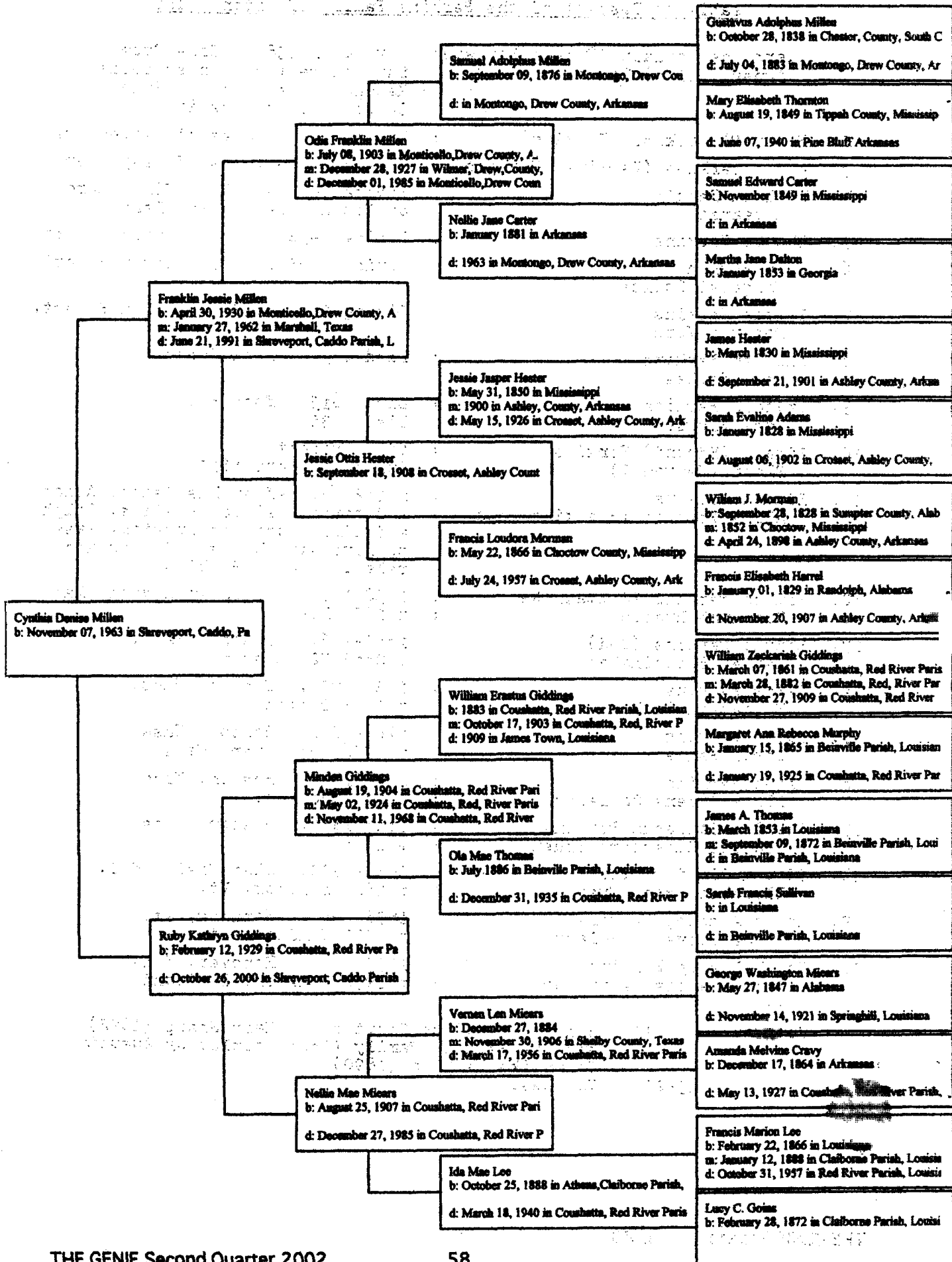

Refer to the periodical for the contents of the book and ordering information for that book if you feel it will help your research.

"Yell County Historical & Genealogical Association Bulletin" Vol 27.1, 2002, published by the Yell County H & G Association, Dardenelle, Arkansas, has several families of interest included. Page 1 has the **Boyce Family** originally from South Carolina. Page 9 has the **Crow Family** originally from Northampton County, Virginia. Page 36 has the **Caffer Family** originally from Georgia. "WCGA Bulletin" Vol X.4, Winter 2001, published by the Warren County Tennessee Genealogical Association, McMinnville, TN, has several families of interest included. Page 5 has the **Mansfield Family** originally from Virginia but migrated through North Carolina and Tennessee. Page 20 has other families of Warren Co. Tennessee who have Virginia roots, among them the **Farley, and Hammons Families**.

"Tennessee Ancestors" Vol 17.3, December 2001, published by the East Tennessee Historical Society, Knoxville, Tennessee, has on pages 195-228, **The Story of the South of the French Broad Settlements, 1783-1829**. 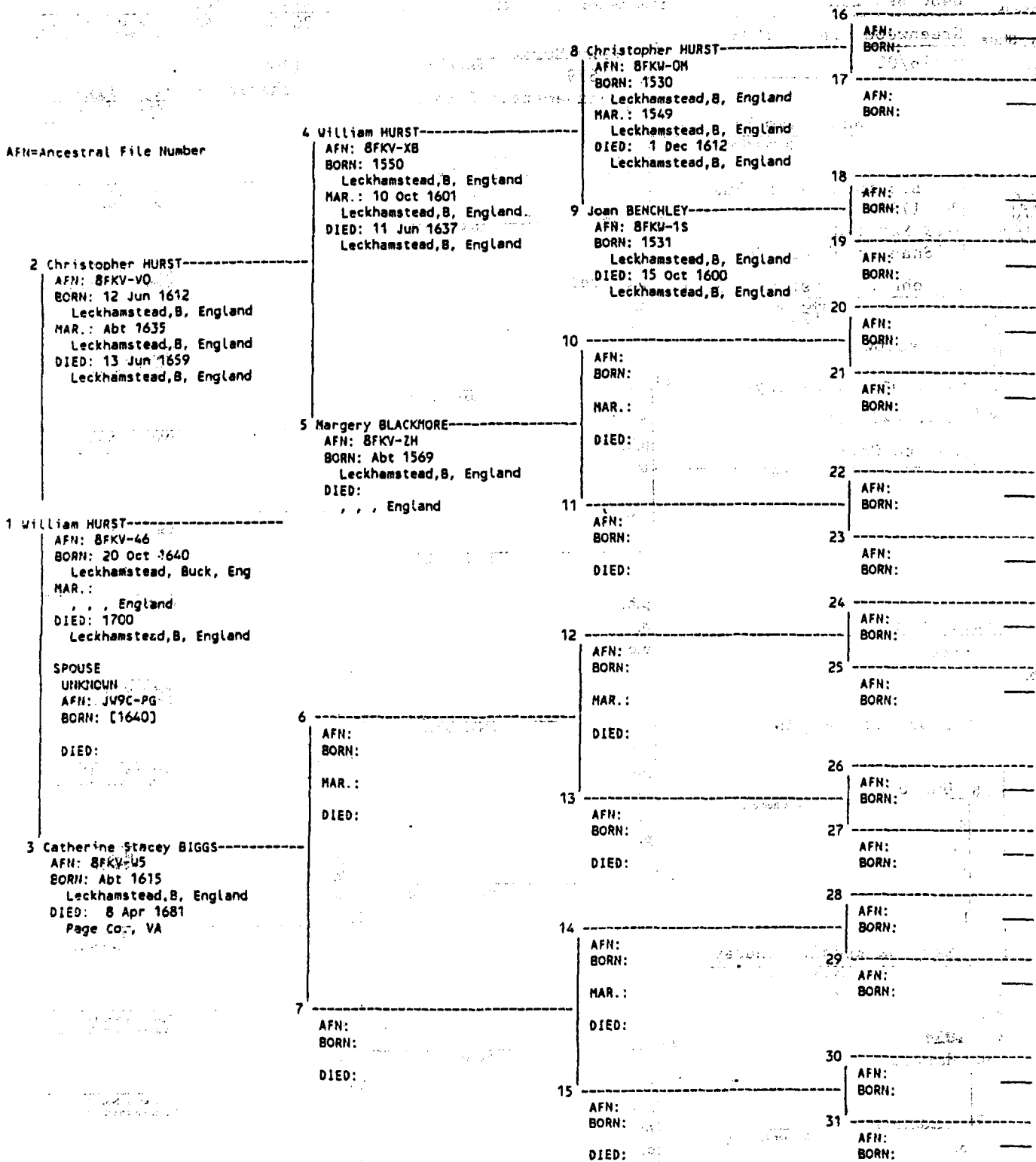

Following was found in the book "NOT SO WILD, THE OLD WEST" by Clara Toombs Harvey in 1961. The book is about early day settlers in Union County, New Mexico.*

TOOMBS - Page 339 - 366

Oscar T. Toombs was born in Yazoo County, Mississippi in 1860. His father was Alan Toombs, a prosperous plantation owner. They delivered cotton to New Orleans each year by riverboat down the Mississippi River. Alan Toombs was killed in the Civil War, his widow remarried and Oscar did not like his new step fathers children. He ran away from home at age 14 and found his way to Bryan, Texas. Later he would go to Greenville, Texas. There he met Miss. Mary Julia Priest, the daughter of a Baptist Minister. They were married in 1888. Miss Priest was a teacher in the Greenville Schools. Oscar studied to be a lawyer while his wife supported them. After getting his law degree the couple moved to Channing, Texas in February 1891 and on to Union County, New Mexico in 1895. He later became a Judge and served in both the House of Representatives and the Senate of the State of New Mexico. The children were: Cyrene Julia, Clio and Clara. Judge Toombs died on June 26, 1938. Mary Julia Priest was born in 1865 near Troy, Alabama and died October 31, 1958. Both are buried in Clayton, New Mexico Cemetary.

JIM DEAM - Page 366

Jim Deam was the son of A. D. Deam who was born in Bavaria and his mother, in Alsace Lorraine. They came to the United States with their parents, met and married in Indiana. The A. D. Deam family was travelling to Texas using ox carts and had to stop in Bowie County, Texas where Jim Deam was born in their covered wagon the night they arrived there. Jim became a saddle maker under L. B. Howell in Lancaster, Texas. In 1896 Mr. Deam came to Union County and bought a relinquishment to a homestead. He returned to Bowie County in 1899 to claim Miss. Rebecca Bailey as his bride. The Deam's had one son, Arthur. Mr. Deam passed away in 1958 and his wife several years earlier. Both are buried in the Clayton, New Mexico Cemetary.

This was found in the book "Montezuma Memories" published by the Montezuma Club in 1972. Montezuma was a small college near Las Vegas, New Mexico, which opened September 1922 and closed in 1930.

MARY WATTERS - Pages 43-49

Mary Watters was born in Haynesville, Louisiana, on January 24, 1896, the daughter of William A. and Leila Kate Cleaver Watters. She received her A.B. degree from Ouachita Baptist College in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, in 1917, she taught at Montezuma College 1923-1926.

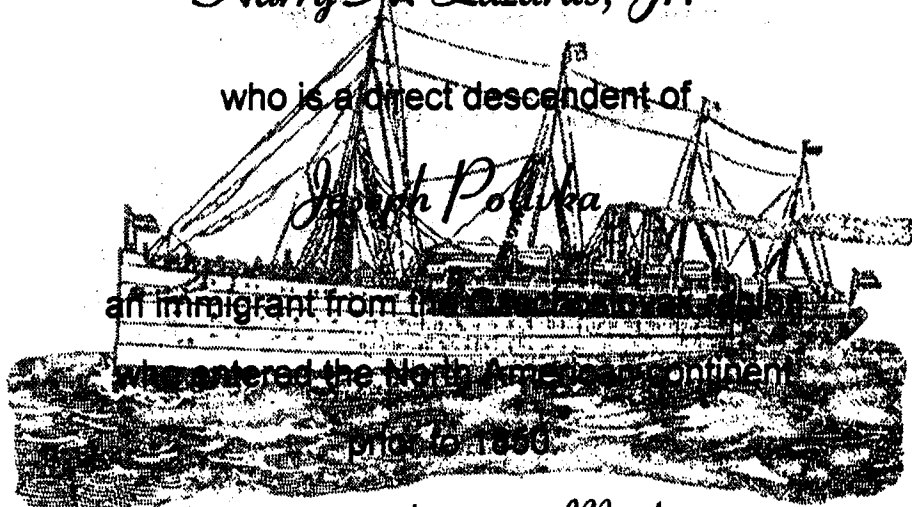

The information on the plaque includes the dates of 1806 to 1899 and states that he was a **Pioneer Baptist Preacher from Georgia who migrated to Louisiana.**

The Dupree Family held a reunion in Martin on April 8, 1979 and dedicated the plaque there in honor of the Rev. John Dupree. News coverage of the event is found on page 3A of the April 19, 1979 issue of the "Coushatta Citizen" newspaper.

Rev. John Dupree's Grandfather, also named John Dupree, came from Virginia and settled in Jefferson County, Georgia. The time of this move is not stated, only that he was in "the prime of life". His Grandmother was **Rebecca Jordan**. John and Rebecca (Jordan) Dupree had several children, one of which was a **Thomas Washington Dupree** (Sept. 14 1774 - July 3, 1816), born in Brunswick County, Virginia before the move to Georgia.

Randal and Jamime (Lanier) McDonald of North Carolina came to Jefferson County, Georgia about this time. With them were their daughter **Cynthia McDonald** (July 12, 1786 - Sept. 21, 1852) who became acquainted with and later married **Thomas W. Dupree**.

Thomas W. and Cynthia (McDonald) Dupree are the parents of the subject, **Rev. John Dupree**. John was born in Burke County, Georgia on March 26, 1806 and married **Mary Ann Taylor**, the daughter of **John and Sarah (Day) Taylor**, of Laurens County, Georgia, on January 3, 1828. The other children of Thomas and Cynthia Dupree were **Thomas W.** (June 6, 1812 - August 14, 1885) who married **Olive Fordham** on December 27, 1833, **Mary** who married **William D. Coney** on February 9, 1834 and **Sarah** who married **James R. Billae** on November 26, 1833.

Rev. John and Mary Ann (Taylor) Dupree raised to adulthood three sons, **Daniel Ivy** b. 1831 (m. Susan Hogan), **Stewart** b. 1840 (unm), **Newton** b. 1844 (unm), and six daughters **Elizabeth (Missouria)** b. 1834 (m. Jim Upshaw), **Nancy Jane** b. 1835 (m. John W. Bishop December 28, 1851), **Sarah** b. 1837 (m. William A. Cannon October 5, 1852), **Martha** (m. Henry Willcox), **Cynthia Ann** (m. William Breedlove November 19, 1850), **Mary D. (Polly)** b. 1838 (m. Alexander Rawls).

The book "Baptists in Georgia" has some facts about John Dupree. He was quite a rounder in his earlier days but marriage settled him down and he began a relationship with the Lord God. In July 1832, he united with the Baptist Church at Poplar Springs, Laurens County, Georgia. His wife joined the church in the fall of that year. He soon felt the call to preach but did not do so until September 1841. He was ordained as a

Minister in 1842 at the Big Sandy Church in Wilkinson County, Georgia and pastored there for some eighteen years. He was instrumental in the building of many churches in Georgia from Baldwin County to Ware County while he pastored at Big Sandy.

He came to Louisiana around 1860, spent a short time in Texas, but felt he was needed in Louisiana where there was an area east of the Red River that had no churches for a hundred miles. He began work in that area of Louisiana about 1862 and helped to organize some sixteen churches throughout the area. He received no adequate support during this time he was acting as a Missionary. He was always ready to preach. He was highly esteemed by the church and community wherever he was known. He gave some fifty years of his life actively involved in the cause of Christ.

John Dupree died on June 16, 1898 in Laurens County, Georgia, and is buried in the Nash Family Cemetery, Wilkinson County, Georgia. His wife Mary Ann Dupree born in 1807 and died 1881 is buried in the Liberty Cemetery, southeast of the Martin Community, Louisiana.

The Red River Heritage Society published a book entitled "Red River Parish, Our Heritage", Vol. I, 1989, and it contains a more detailed history of the DuPree family.

Dr. Daniel Ivy Dupree, a son of Rev. John Dupree, founded the Clear Springs Baptist Church in 1897. There is a very interesting account of the "founding" of this new church on page 1B of the May 26, 1988 issue of the "Coushatta Citizen" newspaper. The individuals that formed the new church came from the Liberty Baptist Church, which Rev. John Dupree had founded, with membership letters being granted on the 3rd Sunday of June 1897 for the following to organize a church of like faith and order:

This site is a research project of the Historisches Museum Bremerhaven and will eventually have all European emigrant records to North America via German Ports from 1820-1939. Currently in the data files are the years 1850-1891, 1904 and 1907. File content is being added to as transcriptions are complete.

Currently direct access to the data base is limited to the computer terminals located at the Bremerhaven Museum, however, the site does have a request form which you can download and send to the Museum staff, who for the specified fee, will search the data base for you and reply to your request.

From the time Tennessee was a territory of the United States (1790 - 1796), its legislature has passed laws affecting the lives of its citizens. From acts legitimizing children to those granting divorces, from authorizing turnpikes & ferries to compensating a citizen for services rendered the government, the legislature has touched the lives of citizens in thousands of ways in its 200-plus years.

This name index to the Acts passed by the Tennessee legislature is intended to help provide access to this vast source of early Tennessee history & genealogy. Used in conjunction with the journals of proceedings of the Tennessee House and Senate, and the petitions of citizens to the legislature, the index can provide the means to interpret some of Tennessee's richest source material.

The index covers names in the first 50 volumes of the published Acts. The index is divided into two parts: 1796 - 1830 and 1831 - 1850. The names of members of the legislature were not indexed. Go to their Webpage at

1930 Census Enumeration Districts

Searching the 1930 census, if your ancestors lived in a rural area, is merely a matter of cranking through the census film searching for a township name. If your ancestors lived in a large city, which is divided into Enumeration Districts, the task can be very hard. However, there is a site on-line for these larger cities, containing street names. Following the instructions at the Site, you enter the State, then the City and the Street. It will give you the ED; if the street is only in one ED you are finished, if not you may enter additional cross streets and the website will list all ED's common to those streets, don't give up, keep working and finally you will end up with a single ED for your location. On the screen is a link to MapQuest where you can see a detailed street map for the intersection you have selected.

We regret says the Selma Sentinel, of the death of **Dixon Hall**, who is well known in Autauga, and who for many years represented that county in the Alabama legislature previous to 1840. He died at his residence on Bayou Bartholomew, in **Morehouse Parish, Louisiana** on August 6th, 1857...

March 25, 1881: Page 81

Letter Of Interest

October 17,2001

Dear Phyllis and Paul,

We cannot thank you properly for your warm hospitality except perhaps by welcoming you here. More on that thought later.

We really enjoyed our laid back time with you. I guess we knew that we would because on the (cruise) ship we felt that all our souls touch gently. My dear old Dad loved to remark that the whole world is full of good friends that we just haven't met yet. He meant it and lived it in such a way that he could never resist the impulse to be welcoming and generous. In later years it used to unnerve Mother when he stopped to help a stranger. But remembering his character was a great source of comfort to her in the exactly ten years that she lived after Dad's passing. I heard her tell over and over how four complete strangers saw him fall on the sidewalk. One was a doctor, another a nurse and two others assisted by getting an ambulance and helping as much as they could, but he had passed from this life to the next despite that excellent help. She felt that all the bread he had put on the waters all those years had come back hundred fold in his lifetime and most especially in that last difficulty. Although it is past a score of years, I miss him and, of course, I miss Mother as if it is no time at all. They gave me sturdy roots and good strong wings.

Please remember my comments about your beautiful quilts to your dear sister. She is an artist of the first order. I cannot remember if you said that she did the embroidery work on the flowers quilt, too. Mom would have pondered each square at length because she made a flowers of Canada quilt - but only twelve blocks and no names for the provinces and two territories. Quilts are so very precious when they are pristine new and in a different way, even more precious when they have been used and used. I'll look forward to seeing a picture of the machine blocks that you are going to prepare for your grandchildren.

We had good luck getting along the streets and freeways to the Vista Centre on the state line. Every time I visit one of those I am consumed by a desire to go to every interesting place that has a brochure available! We chose maps and folders carefully and headed off to Henderson, Texas for lunch. It would be a nice town to live in, I think. I read once that the 82nd from most common name in the U.S. in, 1950 was "Henderson" so it would be pretty hard to trace the bloodlines that connect the founder of the town to my fore fathers. A good feeling anyway. Historically, the Henderson's were chased out of Scotland during the highland clearances. Many left for the New World then; many could only get as far as Ireland. Being peasants, the latter were the first to starve in the potato famines of the mid-nineteenth century. My great-granddad came to Listowel, Ontario in 1848, thanks to the blight. The three oldest boys left for the West one after another in the 1860's in search of homesteads. When great-granny was widowed. She took her younger children out to (Morden, Manitoba) join her grown boys. My grandpa was one of the younger ones, so by time he turned 21 he had to go a hundred miles west to the Killarney area to find a homestead and his bride who had come there from Scotland. In 1894 my father was born on that homestead, near The Line, which is what he called the U.S.-Canada border. Mother was also born on a homestead nearby to English (Mather, Manitoba) immigrants in 1899. They were married in 1921, the year Stan was born, just two years older than my brother David. I suppose that that is a large part of my immense comfort level with him. In many ways we are contemporaries despite the difference in years.

Oops, I am inflicting stream of consciousness writing on you! The direction I really meant this letter to take is the here and now, but you might pass through one or both of these villages if you drive north on I-29 when you come to Alberta. We were out for dinner with Stan's sister last night. You would smile to hear the two of them recounting the harvesting of cotton. Dorothy was on a bus tour years ago when the driver spotted combines at work and halted the bus. In LA you could not have taken us to a more interesting agricultural operation; and what good luck that Stan was able to see the gin at work. He will speak with authority about this and be moved to read about it many times. The cotton bole is in a glass jar ready for inspection by any who pop along.
