Queries are free and encouraged. Please submit them typed or very plainly written. Space is limited. Please be brief and concise, using no more than 70 words per query. The editor reserves the right to edit or reject queries not suitable for publication.

THE "VANCE" IN THE VANCE GUARDS by Dale Jennings

When I became interested in my wife Larri's Vance ancestors several years ago, one of my first research projects was to learn the family's connection to the Vance Guards. The First clue was readily available in Miss Lizzie Dickson's speech in presenting the flag to the officers and men as they departed for the war. Her speech in Bellevue that September 1861 day no doubt reflected the prevailing sentiment in Bossier Parish, Louisiana, and probably throughout the South.

"Louisianians, Patriots and Soldiers;"

"It is my pleasant duty, as the representative of the ladies of our parish, to present you on the eve of your departure, this emblem as a manifestation of our regard – feeling inwardly conscious that it will be borne where duty calls – to trail the dust only when there shall be none left to defend, or effect its rescue from the conquering foe.

Your cause is esteemed by all as a just and holy one. You are challenged to the contest. You buckle on your armour, not for the purpose of conquest, or acquiring military fame, but to defend your homes, your firesides and your altars from Northern aggression, and by the sacrifice of your precious lives – if need be – maintain Southern Rights, Southern Independence, Southern Freedom and Southern Liberty.

Soldiers! We, the women of the South encourage you to go forth with manly hearts to battle for our rights – to tear down and trample under foot the blood stained banners of the Northern vandals, and with one fell swoop rid the earth of the hated invaders of our soil, who seek, with dastardly feet, to desecrate the home and grave of our ever immortal Washington. Yes, strike for us and your bleeding country. History and the gratitude – blessing and prayers of an outraged and downtrodden people – will reward you!

Officers and soldiers of the Vance Guards, you have every incentive to action! Bearing the name of one of our most patriotic and loyal citizens; animated by the justness of your cause; cheered by the prayers and kind wishes of your mothers and sisters, can you fail? No! Never! Never!! Never!!! This flag – the insignia of our beloved Confederacy – we intrust to your care, most gallant patriots, charging you to be firm and unyielding in its defense. But should you be overpowered by the multiplicity of numbers, and liberty be driven from our land, take this flag of our country, and with a brave arm and patriotic heart, plant it upon some eminence, so as to indicate to the stranger, who may come in afterdays, the spot where the Goddess of Liberty lingered last and wept, before she took her flight from a people once prosperous and happy.

Advance, noble Captain, and receive this flag – the patriotic gift of the daughters of Bossier – and as often as its graceful folds are unfurled to the breeze, remember that the prayers of the donors will ever ascend the Throne of the Most High, for the well being of you and your command, and the success of your arms. Take your flag and let it be a beacon of light and hope to you and every member of your enthusiastic corps. And when the independence of our country is achieved, peace restored, and the Stars and Bars recognized by every civilized nation of the earth, bring back its glorious relics, and let it have its share of reward, as it will have had its share of trouble. Then, and not until then, will we meet you at

the threshold, and prepare for you a triumphal entrance to our parish.

Louisianians and patriots; Salute the flag of the Southern Confederacy! Long live Louisiana! Long live Beauregard and Johnston! Long live Jefferson Davis, the second Father of our Country! May God bless him, and our Sunny South!"

The membership and brief history of the Vance Guards was obtainable from various sources. No Vances served in the unit. The facts surrounding the sponsorship and naming of the local companies had not been well preserved. Many such aspects of local history, once common knowledge, are now difficult to recover. When the company was organized there were five Vance men living in Bossier Parish, four of whom were doctors. Two of the doctors had the means to have sponsored an infantry company. Doctor James Washington Vance had lived in the parish since 1840, and by this time had amassed considerable wealth, primarily in river plantation land and slaves. His nephew, Doctor Samuel Whitfield Vance, like his uncle, was a cotton planter with considerable land and slaves, and the additional resource of having married a daughter of the very wealthy, and now deceased, James B. Gilmer.

Miss Kathleen Mitts of Tupelo, Mississippi, submitted a query to the "Ancestor Hunting" column of our local newspaper in 1963. She was seeking a link between her Samuel Vance, who went from Virginia to Surry County, NC; and the early Vances who came from Scotland, to North Ireland, to Pennsylvania and Virginia. Our local amateur historian, John Ardis Manry, came across the old query in 1972, and initiated a correspondence with Miss Mitts. Part of that correspondence was later placed by Mr. Manry into the Manry Collection in the LSU-S Noel Memorial Library Archives and Special Collections. Mr. Manry invited Kathleen and any of her Vance descendant kin to attend an upcoming local event. The Sons of Confederate Veterans were sponsoring a grave marker dedication, and roll call for the old Vance Guard members, to be held in conjunction with Confederate Memorial Day on June 3, 1973. That prompted a discussion about the creation of the Guards. Kathleen's half of this exchange was preserved, and reads in part, "Since Dr. Jas. Washington Vance was said to be a wealthy bachelor and lived in Bossier Parish area – he may have outfitted Company A in 9th La Infantry (sic) – (as you suggested)."

The printed program for the Vance Guards ceremony at Cottage Grove Cemetery included Lizzie Dickson's speech. It also contained an article entitled, "History of the Vance Guards, Part One," by John Ardis Manry, a member of the sponsoring General Richard Taylor Camp. The article concluded with, "The history of Company A is being written at this time, but suffice to say it saw action at Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, Atlanta and many other engagements in Mississippi, Tennessee and Georgia. It was paroled at Meridian, Miss., May 19, 1865." (Manry also referred to the battle of Shiloh in his text). I can find no indication that Mr. Manry ever finished his history of the Vance Guards, Company A, 19th Louisiana Infantry. Rural Bossier Parish raised five companies for the Confederacy. Bossier's Vance Guards and Robins Grays, Company A and Company B respectfully, were regimented with seven other northwest Louisiana companies to field the Nineteenth Regiment. The Guards suffered heavy losses at Shiloh, Corinth, Chickamauga and Atlanta. They were engaged in the siege of Spanish Fort near Mobile when the war ended.

The Sons of Confederate Veterans, Gen. Richard Taylor Camp # 1308, will erect a marker to the grave of Captain B. B. Matlock (previously unmarked) and will call the roll of his Company A, 19th Louisiana Infantry, known locally as the Vance Guards, which he led in the battles of Shiloh, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge and many other engagements in Mississippi, Tennessee and Georgia. If you are descended or related to any in his command please plan now to be present and answer "present" for him. Eulogies will be delivered by prominent Louisiana historians, and the Stars and Bars will once more be raised.

I submitted my own Vance Guards query to "Ancestor Hunting," with little expectation of a response. I soon received a call from a local history buff, Connie Adams, who made me aware of the Pelican Reb News. The publication had been initiated by the newly elected Louisiana Division Commander, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Mr. W. H. Rutledge (who not by coincidence lived on Robert E. Lee Place, in Bossier City). In the spring of 1973, he instructed his Director of Information to publish a divisional newspaper to foster better communication between the state camps and to preserve aspects of Confederate history. Connie sent me Vol 1, No. 1, dated October 1973. The lead article was "Manry Tells History of the Vance Guards," written by its editor, John Ardis Manry. This first issue of the Pelican Reb News was essentially a replication of the June 1973 Vance Guards event program, to include Lizzie Dickson's speech. Mr. Manry had altered the speech by inserting "**(Dr. J. W. Vance)**" after the phrase, "Bearing the name of one of our most patriotic and loyal citizens."

The matter of the naming of the Vance Guards rested there until a friend, Ann Graham, gave me a very interesting item. Her copy of three typed pages identified the writer, not by name, but by content as James Turner Manry, the father of John Ardis Manry. It was written at, "Plain Dealing, La. Feb 11," and its content was prefaced with, "Since the article appeared in *The Journal* of Oct 6 in relation to the orchard and the various operations of the late James Blair Gilmer, friends have furnished many interesting facts....." Mr. Manry referred to a letter from James Gilmer as, "written to his same son-in-law the late Whitfield Vance. **He it was the Vance Guards were named for.**"

Ann Graham is descended from a sister of the wife of Dr. "Whitfield" Vance, both the daughters of J. B. Gilmer. Ann believed that she had obtained her copy of the aforementioned material from the Manry Collection at the Noel Memorial Library. While working on my Vance Guards project, I misplaced my copy of the pages. Rather than bother Ann, I decided to make another copy at the university archives. The document was not to be found there, but I did find my own copy; and provided a copy to the Noel Memorial. It might be concluded that it was not in John A. Manry's possession when he donated his, and many of his father's papers to the archives, and he may not have known about, or may have forgotten about, its existence.

There is reason to believe James Turner Manry's claim that the Vance Guards' namesake was Samuel Whitfield Vance. In 1926 Mr. Manry wrote about his epic journey, as a young man in 1876, from Mississippi to the home of his uncle, Judge Richard Turner, near Bellevue, Louisiana. This was the same Richard W. Turner who, as a young Bellevue lawyer and suitor of Elizabeth Ann Dickson, accepted "Lizzie's" banner for his company. When Captain Turner was promoted to regimental colonel, he was succeeded by Berry Matlock, the future recipient of a grave marker on a Confederate Memorial Day in 1973. Colonel Turner lived until 1883, and probably told his nephew, later to be a local history buff, about his early days with the Vance Guards.

FLANIEN FAMILY SHENANIGANS

Julie Perry of Moore Haven, Florida, provided this from research done on her Flaniken family line. Her progress on this line came a little too late to inherit through that kinship, but she did meet some helpful new cousins, and obtain an interesting old letter concerning a family domestic matter.

Julie had traced her Flanikens back seven generations to James Flaniken (Flenniken) in Pennsylvania. The Scotch-Irish Flanikens migrated from Pennsylvania through North Carolina, Alabama, and Mississippi to Texas. She was near completion of her research when she acquired an old family letter from the DeGolyer Library, Southern Methodist University. It was written from Greenwood Springs in Julie's home state of Mississippi by her ancestor, Eliza Tittle Flaniken, to Eliza's brother-in-law David Flaniken in Bell County, Texas.

Greenwood Springs Feb 6th

Mr D. Flaniken

Dear Brother

Will you please write me a few lines to tell me what has become of Joe and what he is doing and where he is, if he's sick or well, whether he's got his arms broke or is he so disable that he can't write. I must tell you now if he was to get sick and die out there and you all not send me word, I would sue you all for ten thousand dollars damages, because it is pure stinginess and lazyness in all you Flanikens that you don't write to me. I know I've always treated you all right, and you can't possible have anything against me, it is your own selfishness. I know you will say Eliza is on a high horse, well you bet I am I ask Joe to let me come out there two or three times and he would not answer my letters. I don't want to live off anybody, but asked him to get me a house in town where I could get some boarders so I could make my living **and send my two youngest children to school**, now do be honest John and tell me if you don't think that was fair offer as I could make and don't you think I've stood more than any other woman in the world.

I am truly mad now if he's well but if he is sick I am not, but I don't want you to tell me story about it. I shall not say anything about health or how we are getting along because you all don't care whether we live or go the way of Wards ducks if you don't answer this I write another and send you a stamp. Tell Bro Elias he's got some religion maybe he can tell me some things I ought to know. I am going to schorch you every week if you don't write every week you lazy thing if you are mad when you read this send for me and I will come and fuss you but I will have to walk.

If I could get a house out there and some boarders and **Ada could get a school I** could make a living.

“Joe” was Julie’s gr-gr-grandfather, Joseph Livingston Flaniken, who was the gr-gr-grandson of James Flenniken. “J.L.” was a multi-talented man, having been a lawyer, surveyor, retail merchant and a big land owner there in Monroe County, MS. The date of the letter and its content can be put into some context by looking at the 1880 census for Monroe County.

Joseph’s brothers Robert, David (Dea) and Elias had gone to Texas, as obviously had Joseph and his family. Joseph had now returned to Texas and for some reason was not corresponding with his despondent and perplexed wife. The result of Eliza’s effort is unknown, but both died in Bell County, Eliza in 1898 and Joe in 1904.

Julie Perry, the consummate genealogist, was not through researching the Flanikens. Looking through the telephone listings for Texas on the Internet, the name “Texas” Flaniken stood out. There were two. The first didn’t answer the phone, but the second in Austin answered to the name, Texas Flaniken. She was told bluntly: “That estate has been settled.” Julie could not convince “Tex” that she knew nothing about an estate and was only researching their common line of ancestors. Promising to hang up, she wanted only to send her research and then call back. This she did, and was well received and invited out to Austin. She went, and when their relationship became that of cousins, Texas Reginald Flaniken explained the aforesaid “estate.”

Josephine Flaniken Golightly had died on February 29, 1995. In a letter dated December 2, 1997, the senior trust officer of her estate addressed the heirs which included Mrs. Golightly’s maternal lines of Moffett, Hutchings and Collins:

“The administration of the Josephine Golightly Estate has been an experience. After the death of Mr. Lester Golightly the Waggoner National Bank was appointed by the County Court of Wilbarger County, Texas as successor guardian for his wife – Josephine Golightly – who was unable to manage her personal and business affairs.

Following the death of Mrs. Golightly the Waggoner Bank was appointed Administrator of her Estate because Mrs. Golightly had never executed a will. I was advised by Mrs.

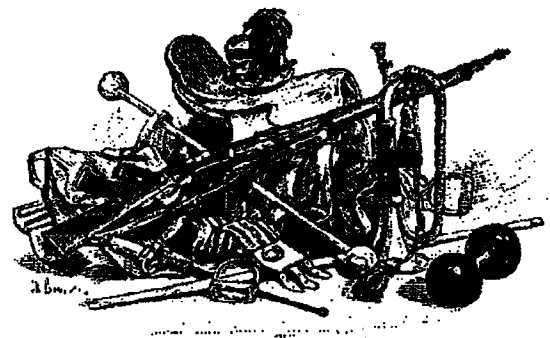
Golightly's long term attorney, Mr. Warren Pruitt, that Mrs. Golightly had told him over the years that she had no heirs. During an inventory of personal effects after the death of Mrs. Golightly my staff found an application for membership for Mrs. Golightly and her sister in the Daughters of The American Revolution. Said application detailed family history for several generations. Shortly afterwards we were approached by Mr. A. L. Huston of Research Services International, Inc. who had done extensive research as to the heirs of Mrs. Golightly.

The County Court of Wilbarger County authorized a contract with Research Services International, Inc., granting a fee of 40% of the net assets of the estate for their services in locating the heirs at law of Josephine Golightly. All assets have been gathered and liquidated and all business matters including the settlement of a lawsuit concerning an oil and gas lease has been handled.”

The net distribution to the heirs after all settlement fees was \$197,490. The Flaniken heirs numbered 74. The Moffett, Hutchings and Collins lines totaled 134 (a few had double lines and collected from both). Individuals collected from \$122.02 to \$4,993.00. Texas Reginald Flaniken, Jr., received \$2,146.63 and his nephew, Texas Reginald Flaniken, received \$268.33. It seems that Julie's share could have been something in excess of \$1,800.00 if she had been some six months farther along on her research trail.

Research Services International endeavored to trace every qualifying descendant of James Noble and Eleanor Hood Flaniken (parents of Joseph Livingston Flaniken and his six siblings) as well as the Moffett, Hutchings and Collins descendants. They were able to identify Julie's grandfather, Murry Preston Greene and three of his five siblings, all deceased, but could go no farther. Julie's grandfather Greene was the son of Cora Lee Flaniken Greene, daughter of "Joe" Flaniken.

Julie met both of the Texas Flanikens, the younger in Austin, and his uncle in Freeport, Texas. The obvious question arose about the naming of the first Texas Flaniken. It was explained that the parents were in no hurry to name the boy, so just referred to him as "the Texas baby." After a time this was shortened to "Texas." So it would come to pass that the Texas Baby became another of those research clues that make genealogy so interesting.

This book is a list of deaths recorded in the city's registers and death certificates now housed at the Louisiana State Archives in Baton Rouge. Information extracted includes the deceased's name, age, date of death, parents' and spouse's names (when given), page number in the death register, and death certificate number. The book is not limited to Shreveport residents. Found among the death records are individuals from other areas of the state as well as from Texas, Arkansas, and other states. Many individuals were brought from outlying areas to the Charity Hospital while others were simply visiting or passing through when they died. The Ringlings' Milwaukee Roots

Although the Ringling Brothers of circus fame are generally associated with Baraboo, Wisconsin, as the cradle of their great entertainment enterprise, the family also has roots in mid-19th century Milwaukee.

August Ringling, the father of the famed five Ringling brothers, resided in Milwaukee from 1848 to 1855, pursuing his professional trade as saddle maker. The family name was then spelled "Ruengling," although at the time August filed his declaration to become a United States citizen in April 1850, he signed his name as "Ringeling." On February 16, 1852, he married Salome Juliar, the service being performed by the Reverend Ludwig Dulitz, pastor of St. Johannes Lutheran Church, then located on the corner of present-day North 4th Street and Highland Avenue. At the time of their marriage, the couple resided "near the market" (i.e., the old public market on the site of today's City Hall).

According to the 1850 census, the Ringling household then consisted of Henry and Rosena Ringling, August's parents, the 23-year-old August and his 17-year-old-sister, Wilhelmina. Henry Ringling died that same year in Milwaukee during a cholera epidemic. Nicholas Juliar, the father of August's bride, was a native of the Alsatian town of Ostheim and a veteran of the Napoleonic wars. He immigrated to the United States in 1844 and filed a declaration for citizenship in Milwaukee in April 1847.

This year's Circus Parade on August 2 is a continuing link between this famed circus family and their early associations with Milwaukee.

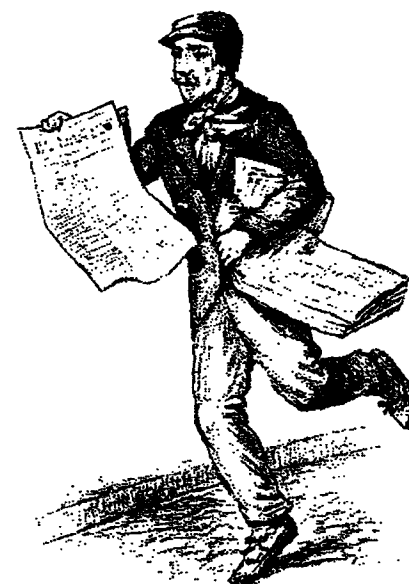

The Library of Congress has several new collections at the American Memory home page. The Web address is: <http://memory.loc.gov/ammem/amhome.html>
Then click on "Whats New". Two of these new collections will be of special interest to African American researchers.

The First American West, Ohio River Valley 1750-1820 includes 15,000 pages of original material pertaining to the land, people, exploration and transformation of the Appalachian West from the early nineteenth century and before. It includes comments on politics and regional conspiracies, and documents lives of African Americans, mostly slaves, the position of women, and function of churches, schools etc.

Slaves and the Courts, 1740-1860 includes published information concerning the experiences of African and African-American slaves in the American colonies. It includes some of the defendants' and plaintiffs' stories as well as those of abolitionists, politicians, slave owners and fugitives.

Always search the periodical published in your geographical interest area, but don't overlook other periodicals that may include articles of general interest to the researcher or about families that have migrated. These periodicals are located at the Broadmoor Branch Library, Shreveport, in the Genealogy Section.

"The WCGA Bulletin, Vol XI, Numbers 1 & 2, Spring/Summer 2002" published by the Warren County Tennessee Genealogical Association, has on page 3, the history of the GRIBBLE family in Warren County, these Gribbles came from Mecklenburg County, NC. If you have the somewhat uncommon name of Gribble in your tree you will want to check out this article. Pages 15-22 has sketches of several Warren County people who moved to Texas.

"The Le Raconteur, Vol XXII, Number 2, August 2002" published by the Louisiana Archives, Baton Rouge, La. has on pages 91-113 the Shreveport Sexton's Reports for 1862-1869. These are the deaths that are recorded in the Shreveport City Council Record Books B (1852-1868) and C (1868-1871). Cause of death was copied as given.

The inside back cover of the same periodical is a Caddo Parish 1862 survey map of Township 18 North, Range 14 West, of the Northwestern District. Shown is the land of Larkin Edwards which is now downtown Shreveport.

"Legacies & Legends of Winn Parish, Vol 6, Number 2, August 2002" published by the Winn Genealogical and Historical Association, Winnfield, LA has on pages 82-84 an article by Gregg Davies on **"Cemeteries and Louisiana Law"**. Article deals with the Louisiana Revised Statutes Title 8 and Title 14. This is a very informative article and is intended to help the genealogist who finds himself faced with cemeteries on private property, uncooperative land owners, abandoned cemeteries, desecration of grave sites and other situations to understand the Louisiana law in these instances.

"Ash Tree Echo", Vol XXXVII, Number 2, June 2002" published by the Fresno County Genealogical Society, Fresno, CA has on pages 54-55 and article entitled Twenty Ways to Avoid Genealogical Grief. These are helpful reminders on how to prevent misfortune in your research. Many of these tips are "old hat" too experienced genealogists, but it is always good to remind ourselves of the basics of sound research. It was furnished free to all members of the Society and a copy is available at the Broadmoor Library for your use.

The "TREE TALK, Volume 27, No. 4, Summer, 2002" published by the Cherokee County Genealogical Society, Jacksonville, Texas has on pages 120-121 an interesting article by José Casas y Sánchez on Learning the Spanish System of Surnames. If you ever wondered about the rather lengthy names of Spanish people this should enlighten you on the subject and help you to know that a family history may be as close as a person's name if you are of Spanish descent.
